- WIC checks can be used for fresh herb, fresh vegetables (no prepared foods such as egg rolls)
- Fit Families fully enrolled in program and follow-up continues.

- There is a vacancy in Environmental Health for a Specialist
 - Kudos to the EH staff for getting all their inspections done when they are running with only half of their staff.

- There were 16 deaths in the 2010-2016 time period. There is 1 so far this year
 - o Recommendation lethal means restriction
- Keep safe at home
 - Medications
 - o Guns
- Gunshop project founded in New Hampshire
 - Educate gunshop owners on how to spot someone purchasing a gun for suicide.
 - Educate shooting range employees on how to spot someone looking to commit suicide with a gun.
- Develop a suicide investigation form
 - Improve data collection of contributing factors in order to assist in preventing suicide in both adults and youth
