We currently case manage 22 out of county SSTOP participants with Outagamie County being the primary referral. Previously all Outagamie County documents were sent to their case manager to approve and then forwarded on to the courts, recently a change was made where our case managers save time in the process by sending documents directly to the court.

Teen Court has made some positive changes since coming over to the Human Services Department. The program now has participants on a treatment plan and participants have the opportunity to continue to attend all hearings until they have successfully completed the program. Teen Court now has an active attorney training that the participants and volunteers can participate in to help them better understand the legal system. The program also obtained a \$2,000 grant last year to help fund the sustainability of the program and was recently awarded the same grant for 2016. The program will be starting a Google Group in the future to allow participants to be updated on hearings, and turn in their homework and monthly reports.
