Minutes of previous meeting approved as read

A communication from the National Officers Association regarding a subscription to a publication was read. On motion received and filed.

T. J. Cotter addressed the board on the housing of juvenile delinquents and employment of a child welfare worker.

Supervisor Staffeld brought to the attention of the board the matter of providing suitable hangars at the airport and asked for an expression from the board. General discussion.

Motion that the Aviation Committee be authorized to build and construct hangars at the airport on a rental basis, CARRIED.

AVIATION COMMITTEE-AIRPORT MANAGEMENT

The following Report No. 6 was read:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WIS. Gentlemen:

During the last meeting of the County Board, the Aviation Committee was requested to secure all the information possible regarding the management and maintenance of the Winnebago County Airport. The board asked that they consider the subject from every angle and report back at this April meeting. As Chairman of the Aviation Committee, I wish to make the following report:

In addition to doing considerable private investigation on their own, the committee has had several meetings at which they have called in various people whom they felt were familiar with the subject of airport management, and among them was a member of the Civil Aeronautics Administration, who visited Oshkosh, and met with the committee.

It is not my intention at this time to make a long, detailed report, but rather to give the board the highlights of the committee's findings.

There are three possible ways in which an airport could be operated:

1-The county operated plan of airport management.

2—The direct lease plan of airport management.

3—The manager-operator plan of airport management.

The committee has the detail of all these plans on file, and has given them careful consideration.

In brief, under the county operated plan of airport management, the county would assume full management of airport operation, hiring a manager at county expense, providing necessary equipment and hiring necessary help to mow grass, plow snow, and do general maintenance. The county would assume all liability and, of course, would be obliged

to carry insurance covering the various phases of responsibility. They would also receive any income from the airport.

The committee rejected this plan because they did not feel the county is ready for a plan of this kind, but should adopt a plan by which the airport management and maintenance would be taken care of without any liability or expenditure on the part of the county.

Under the direct lease plan, the County would attempt to relieve itself of practically all phases of Airport management and lease the Airport with all its concessions to an operator for a definite period of time.

The Committee also rejected this plan because it would tie up the Airport to one party who may not prove to be a desirable tenant and it would eliminate the idea of having the Airport open to all those who wished to conduct an aviation business from the Airport,

The third plan, or the manager-operator plan, is the one which the Committee unanimously recommends for the Winnebago County Airport.

Under this plan the County Board, through its own Aviation Committee, would have direct control of the Airport at all times. The manager-operator would operate and manage the airport, furnish the necessary equipment at his own expense, and take care of the maintenance of the Airport, exclusive of airline requirements, without any expense whatsoever to the County. He would also pay the County for the use of the present facilities.

Under this plan the Airport would be open to anyone who wished to conduct an aviation business thereon, providing they meet certain requirements set up by the Committee, including paying their share of the management maintenance expense.

The contract entered into will contain a re-negotiation clause, so that as conditions change the contract may be adjusted to meet them.

The County Board should select one of the above methods for the management of the Airport.

There is an increasing interest and demand from individuals and companies for facilities for private flying and company operation, and it is necessary for the County Board to adopt a policy of operation either lease land to them, and allow them to erect hangars, or the county to erect the hangars for rent.

The time needed for the Committee to work out a contract, after the Board selects a plan of operation, makes it necessary that the Board meet in about thirty days to approve a contract, or, in the alternative, they can give the Committee the power and authority to enter into a contract, in behalf of Winnebago County.

The Aviation Committee therefore recommends the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Aviation Committee needs further time and study before entering into a contract for the leasing of the Airport, and

INSTITUTIONS COMMITTEE—WELL AT COUNTY HOME

The following Report No. 9 was read:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WIS. Gentlemen:

The question of adequate water supply for fire protection for the County Home and Asylum properties has been a matter of great concern to your Committee for a considerable length of time.

The experience with two fires has prompted the Trustees and your Committee to make a study of the matter, and present the following facts for your consideration.

At this time there are two wells on the property, an old well at the Asylum building, which is only a 6-inch hole for 64 feet, then reduced to 5 inches with a bend in it, where the size was reduced so that the pipe can only go down 64 feet. This well only produces about 60 gallons per minute.

Professor Bean, of the State Geological and Natural History Survey, adivses not to spend any money trying to improve this well.

The well at the power plant is a 16-inch hole, down 41 feet, with an iron casing 33 feet driven into the rock, and from that point down to 446 feet it is a 12-inch hole. This well now produces about 167-185 gallons per minute. After studying the log of this well, Professor Bean

says it should have been drilled at least 200 feet deeper into the softer sandstone as it now ends right in the hard granite where the water in the veins is not so abundant. Professor Bean's recommendations are to drill a new well, about 800 feet away from the present well, to a depth of 700 feet, and build an underground reservoir of concrete, with a capacity of about 80,000 gallons, with connections, so that the City Fire Department can draw water direct from the reservoir. This would require an additional well pump and a booster pump to pump from reservoir up into the elevated tank.

Acting upon the recommendation of Professor Bean, your Committee had the McMahon Engineering Company, of Menasha, Wisconsin, furnish an estimate as to the cost of a new well, a 60,000-gallon reservoir, together with necessary pumping facilities. The figures furnished indicate that the cost of this project would amount to \$41,890.00.

Your Committee, as well as the Trustees, do not feel justified in recommending an expenditure of this amount, and, after further consideration, are informed that the State has agreed to replace the 4-inch section of the main with a 6-inch section, thereby giving us a 6-inch main in its entirety, and increasing the available capacity direct from the lake.

In view of this development, it was concluded that by building a 60,000-gallon reservoir, a pump house, together with necessary pumps and utilizing the present well, would give us a storage capacity of 140,000 gallons, namely, 60,000 gallons in the reservoir and 80,000 gallons in the elevated tank, plus the amount available through the main. This supply should be adequate for fire protection.

Your Personnel Committee begs leave to report that they have prepared a salary schedule for the year 1947, and that except for adjustments due after customary six months or year of apprenticeship service, no general raises in salary are being recommended at this time.

In one or two instances, however, an increase in total salary paid for job will be noted, but in these cases the total salary is either set by State Statute or the State's contribution was increased. In other cases an upward revision was made in salary to compensate for additional work or added responsibilities.

We recommend the establishment of several new positions, which in all cases were made necessary because of greatly increased activity in the departments for which they are recommended.

Finally, we wish to point out that while the Chairmen of various committees felt in certain instances that some salary adjustments were due in their respective departments, that the over-all salary recommendation was arrived at with a minimum of dissention, and that it is the wish of the Committee that the heads of the various departments follow strictly the rule laid down earlier in the year "That all employees to be hired at a starting salary at least \$20.00 per month less than the figure set for the tried, proven, and experienced help in the respective positions."

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY CHILDREN'S BOARD, Nov. 1, 1946

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

We hereby present a brief report of the activities and expenditures of the Winnebag County Children's Board for the period of January 1, 1946 to November 1, 1946.

During this, the fifteenth year our board has been serving the county, there has been no change in personnel of the board.

We have continued to hold our regular monthly meetings at which approval of licenses for foster homes, reports on case work, child delinquencies, and bills are considered. Also in these meetings we receive advice and other aids from Miss Rennetta Meyer, representing the State Department of Child Welfare.

More time is given to foster homes than to any other phase of our work. We have at present 34 such homes caring for 61 children, and we are justly proud of our foster mothers. They are an intelligent and interested group doing a difficult but necessary job for the neglected and devendent children in our care.

We must again ask your assistance in finding new homes. The supply is never so great as the need. Please give us the names of any

persons you may know who might be interested in the work.

The Children's Board desires to thank the County Board of Supervisors for the cooperation shown in providing the assistant to Mrs Jamieson and the additional stenographer in the office. Mrs. Vadna Kinney is doing a very fine work for the county and we could not afford to lose her services. Though it was difficult to secure a new stenographer, at last one was found and her work is of great value there

We wish also to express our appreciation of your providing for the services of Dr. Elizabeth Kane for two days per week, and to ask for a full time Guidance Director for 1946 with the necessary help and other expenses. This we hope can be covered by the additional \$1.000 which we have asked added to our budget for guidance work.

We are grateful, too, for the \$500 appropriated for the use of our Board. Since there was no additional stenographer in the office until recently, much of our money had to be used for supplies and stenographic work for Dr. Kane. We ask for a like appropriation for 1947.

Your Special Asylum Building Committee beg leave to report that plans for the proposed new County Asylum are nearing the com-pletion stage; and while the task of scrutinizing these plans and ultimate specifications still lies ahead, we are, however, informed by Mr. Henry Auler, architect, that after a few more minor details are worked out with the State Welfare Board, the proposed plans and specifications will be submitted to your committee for study and analysis.

With economic conditions as they have been thus far, it is difficult to determine definitely as to when it will be possible to secure bids. It to determine definitely as to when it win be possible to section should become more stable along about the middle or latter part of 1947, at which time it should be possible to advertise for bids. It is, however, impossible to determine at this time exactly what conditions will be at that time, and, of course, the final decision as to the actual beginning of construction will rest with the County Board as a whole after time lates will have been submitted for your approval.

final plans will have been submitted for your approval.

Your Committee, however, feels that construction should be under-Your Committee, however, feels that construction should be unuertaken as soon as conditions will permit since there seems to be a growing need for accommodations for the aged and the transition of the present asylum building into a County Home cannot be undertaken until after the new building is completed, which means that if construction of the new asylum building would be undertaken during the coming year, we would in all probability not be able to do any renovating of the old asylum building until some time in the Fall of 1948 or early 1949. Then, too, there is the question of how soon some one or more of the counties now boarding our county home patients may ask to be relieved of this obligation thereby presenting a problem of ask to be relieved of this obligation, thereby presenting a problem of replacing such patients in the face of present overcrowded conditions in all such institutions.

With respect to the item of \$150,000.00 in the tentative budget to augment our present asylum building fund, we wish to point out that our primary reason for the inclusion of this amount was to qualify for an appropriation should the County Board so desire. At the time the an appropriation should the County Board so desire. At the time the tentative budget was formulated, actual construction was not contemplated during 1947, consequently our only object was to build up the fund and thereby apportion the cost over as long a period as possible. However, at the present time it appears that construction can be undertaken during the coming year; and, since in order to qualify a contract it will be necessary to appropriate or at least arrange for the entire cost of the building, we believe that the incoming County Board should, when actual figures are known, pass an enabling resolution calling for a bond issue or loan authorization to qualify the contract. Under the circumstances, therefore, and in view of the already excessive budget, we hereby withdraw the request for \$150,000.00 as set up in the tentative budget. set up in the tentative budget.

Your Taxation Committee begs leave to report that after a thorough investigation of the request of Francis I. Allen for reimbursement of \$7.60, an amount paid to Winnebago County for abstract services, we find as follows:

That: Originally an old-age lien was placed on an abstract covering period belonging to Francis I. Allen of 65 Franklin Ave., City of Oshkosh.

That' It appears that sometime during 1942 said Francis Allen of 65 Franklin Ave., Oshkosh, wished to re-finance a mortgage on her property at that location.

That: An outside abstract firm was employed to make a search, and finding that a certificate of old-age assistance had been filed against one Francis Allen of 276 Broad Street, caused same to be entered against Francis I. Allen of 65 Franklin Ave.

That: As a result foreclosure proceedings were begun by a local attorney without checking thoroughly as to whether Francis Allen of 65 Franklin Ave., was actually the recipient of pension monies, or which attachment or lien was filed.

That petitioner Francis I. Allen was caused much embarrassment and put to considerable trouble and expense to clear her title, but we cannot recommend that the county pay the attached claim because payment in the amount of \$7.60 was actually for work done to rectify previous errors, and we suggest that claimant should look eleswhere for reimbursement.

REPORT ON ABSTRACT DEPARTMENT

The folowing Report No. 55 was read: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Gentlemen:

Your Taxation Committee respectfully reports they have attempted to make a thorough investigation of the unsatisfactory situation that has developed in Winnebago County which requires a long period of time in obtaining abstracts. We have found several months elapse between the time an abstract is ordered and the date of its delivery. This is due to volume of business and is a situation that has been gradually coming about and has been in evidence for about the last three years. We have found the County Abstractor has not been able to keep important records up to date as far as making proper and immediate entry is concerned, Reliable information indicates there is hardly a probability of this situation being corrected with present facilities and personnel.

The number of abstracts produced by the County Abstractor according to the Abstractor's report has been diminishing, and it is doubtful if this business is on a paying basis. On the other hand, Winnebago County has not been put to any cost in keeping up the tract index.

The Committee visited several abstract departments in neighboring counties and found the volume of work in the abstract business runs about parallel to Winnebago County, but in no instance did we find any counties who were as far behind in abstract work as Winnebago County. It seems other counties have more abstractors actively operating than Winnebago County. Some counties operate their own abstract department and in some cases there is substantial profit. Other counties make no attempt to compete with private abstract companies, and only

assume the responsibility of keeping the tract index up to date.

The Committee has discussed the situation with the County Abstractor and other people, including attorneys who are familiar with the situation, and from expressions of these people an immediate attempt should be made to expedite abstract work so that more prompt delivery of abstracts can be made. It seems to your Committee it is essential that the tract index be kept up to date through making daily postings of all instruments following recording by the Register of Deeds. Your Committee feels many errors would be eliminated in posting to the tract index if a double check system would be put in effect, and would speed up the work.

The Committee recommends that in view of its findings, immediate steps be taken to relieve the congestion and suggests providing additional help to work with the County Abstractor. We have talked with Mr. Carl Mailahn, Tax Description Supervisor, working under the direction of the County Treasurer and find that with his experience in work of this character he could be of considerable assistance to Miss Gene Sturtevant in bringing the work in the abstract office up to date. In all probability this would require that Mr. Mailahn put in additional hours over and above the hours other employees of the county work, as his work in the County Treasurer's office now takes his full time, and some consideration should be shown Mr. Mailahn for taking on this additional responsibility.

It does not seem to your Committee there is a solution of the problem that will be immediately effective, and it will require further study by the Committee and will require watchfulness of developments, and in all probability there will be further suggestions your Taxation Committee will have to offer at a later date that may improve the situation.

Your Committee recommends the passage of the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that your Taxation Committee be and they hereby are given authority to continue with their investigation work, with the thought in mind of providing a final solution of the problem, and as an immediate step. they be empowered to employ additional help at a cost of not to exceed \$50.00 per month for the next six months, that employee to work at least two hours a day with the County Abstractor in order to bring records and entries up to date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this appropriation be made from the General Fund, and the proper county officials be empowered to make payments to extra help employed upon approval by the Taxation Committee of vouchers submitted.

SETTLEMENT SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT TAXES

The following Report No. 56 was read:
TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:
Gentlemen:

Your Taxation Committee, to whom was referred a communication and a resolution adopted by the Common Council of the City of Oshkosh, respectfully report they have held several meetings with officials of the City of Oshkosh and the County Treasurer and discussed the subject matter referred to in these papers, namely, the claim of the City

of Oshkosh for settlement of proceeds of sale of properties taken by Winnebago County by tax title on which there were delinquent special improvement taxes subsequently charged back to the municipality as provided by Chapter 62.21 Wisconsin Statutes, and recommend the passage of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Winnebago County has through procedure provided by statute, over the last several years past, been taking tax deeds on properties which have become due for tax title by reason of delinquent taxes, either on special improvements assessments or general tax levy, and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Board by annual resolution, has been charging back to the municipality wherein the tax originated, all special improvement taxes which have remained unassigned, unredeemed or otherwise disposed of, as provided by Section 62.21 Wisconsin Statutes, and

WHEREAS, in most instances the property on which tax title was taken has been sold, through channels provided by Wisconsin law and County Board resolution, resulting in Winnebago County receiving, in most instances, the equity it had in the property by reason of delinquent taxes of any nature thus realizing by sale thereof both the amount of special assessment improvement taxes which have been charged back to municipalities and general tax levy, and

WHEREAS, the City of Oshkosh has made claim on Winnebago County for a portion of the special assessments charged back to that municipality on properties sold by Winnebago County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Winnebago County Board in session assembled this 4th day of November, 1946, that this Board acknowledge claim of the City of Oshkosh and claims of other municipalities subsequently filed, for an equitable settlement of special improvement taxes as provided by Section 75.365 Wisconsin Statutes, on all properties taken by tax title by Winnebago County on which there was levied a special improvement tax, which subsequently was charged back to the municipality wherein the tax levy originated, and the County Treasurer be and he hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to make settlement with municipalities on or about October ist each year, the first settlement to be made as and when claims are filed, using the following formula as a basis for settlement.

- 1—On properties sold whereby the County realized by such sale the full amount of taxes assessed by general levy plus the full amount of special assessment taxes, there shall be paid the proper municipality the full amount of special assessment tax which has been charged back with interest to date of sale of property.
- 2—On properties sold for less than the amount of special improvement taxes and general tax levy, the loss incurred shall be pro-rated and settlement made on the percentage basis that the sale price bears to the total delinquent taxes and applied to the equities of the County and Municipality.
- 3—On properties sold for amounts which exceed total of all delinquent taxes plus interest at the statutory rate to date property is sold proceeds shall first be used to satisfy the equities of both the municipality and county and the balance shall be the property of the County.
- 4—The County shall on sale of each and all properties on which a Special Assessment has been charged back receive Five Dollars to cover expenses for advertising, notice fee and other minor expenses or cost, this amount to be deducted from the share due the municipality.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of \$5.664.20 be and it is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the county and disbursed as follows: to City of Omro \$50.80; City of Menasha \$1,244.11; City of Neenah \$640.09 and City of Oshkosh \$3,729.20, these amounts having been determined as being proper and due on sales of tax title property accumulated over all years past.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper County Officials are hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreements as specified in said Statute, with any municipality in Winnebago County eligible to file such claims, such agreements to embody and be limited to the terms and conditions contained in this resolution.

DETENTION HOME REPORT

The following Report No. 2 was read:

WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Juvenile Detention is the temporary care of children who are removed from their own homes pending investigation and action by the Juvenile Court. Only the following groups of children need to be so

1. Children so beyond control that parents or guardians may not be able to prevent a repetition of behavior which is menacing to themselves or the community.

2. Children who are in physical or moral danger in their own

nomes and for whom no other emergency placement is possible.

3. Children whose presence in court, return to another community, longer time placement or uninfluenced testimony can only be assured by detention.

Detention should be as short as is consistent with effective dispo-

sition as possible.

Detention should be more than custody; it's responsibilities are:

1. Physical care and custody under safe and healthful conditions including a sound medical program. For those few who require maximum security it must be without use of jails or jail-like measures.

2. Meeting non-physical needs, which should not be suspended even the program of the

for a short period, requires orientation and follow-up interview to insure acceptance of detention; supervision based on sound methods of dealing with disturbed children; and a program of physical activity and mental and social exchange planned for the child's entire day. This program should take into account age and development level and it should also consider religious expressions. it should also consider religious expression in the various faiths.

3. Information to the court based on observation and clinical study

of the child's capacities and needs as revealed during detention.

The ideal home should be such as to make possible the assumption of these responsibilities. But the most important factor in detention care is the staff, its quality and number. Competent professional service is very desirable if not processional service is very desirable if not processional services.

care is the stail, its quanty and number. Competent professional scree is very desirable if not necessary.

As a result of the study of 68 institutions in 22 states the National Probation Association found that detention care which came closest to meeting these standards cost \$3.50 per day per child.

Now in considering these conditions and needs, your committee

made trips to Wisconsin Rapids and Madison and has contacted many groups and individuals. Under present conditions and times we are not now ready to recommend that Winnebago County build a suitable institution.

We are aware that if the law allowed it, this Board would consider the use of the facilities upstairs as the answer to our problem, but as we do not anticipate this answer now, we do recommend that the study of these needs be continued and that for the present an attempt be made to find a suitable home and that this home be subsidized at an agreed price per month and that it also be paid a per diem price for each child placed therein. In the past such homes have been secured at from \$25.00 to \$30.00 per month and a per diem charge of \$2.00. Present economic conditions may make these prices too low, so we are willing to recommend even \$50.00 per month if necessary and up to \$3.00 per day per child.

The following is a report of our activities since the last Board meeting

At the close of the Fall session, we were fortunate to meet with a company representative who was willing to talk to us about private plane hangars that would pass the State Industrial Board Code, Because of a number of complications, it was not until the latter part of January, this year, that we were satisfied to contract for a battery of ten "T" type private plane hangars, at a cost of \$12,979.00, F. O. B., Oshkosh. As soon as they arrive, and weather permits, bids will be asked for on the erection of the same in the new building area.

As directed by the Board, we have maintained contact with the "Bell" interests relative to construction of a building to "house" them, as a second operator on the field. Your Committee, with the help of our consulting engineer, has extended itself to expedite this program, and until now has not been in a position to recommend anything. The most of the difficulty was building material. Tentative plans are in the making and recommendations will be made to you for your consideration.

No doubt all of you noted by way of the paper that Winnebago County was allotted \$20,000.00 as Federal Aid toward field lighting. This

was not by request of your Committee. It was set up as a project by C. A. A. officials, who feel that lighting is the next most needed project. The Committee has had other projects in mind, which they thought were of greater importance, such as sewer and water, and the building of the committee of the committee

of taxi-ways in the new building area.

To clarify our position as to what we can do about getting aid on what we had planned, your Committee met with Mr. S. J. Zimmerman, C. A. A. District Engineer, and talked the matter over. He admitted that we need Utility service, but also put the need of lighting at the head of the list. At his request, rough plans on water, sewer and lighting are being prepared, and estimates are to be made, and, as Mr. Zimmerman put it, "maybe we can stretch the allotment to cover the several projects." eral projects."

2. The construction of an operator's building, at a cost of not to exceed \$25,000.00

 The installation of a lighting system, appropriate for said Air-port, at a cost of not to exceed \$25,000.00 of the funds of Winnebago County, the same to be matched by an equal amount of Federal funds.
