#### **REGULAR APRIL SESSION 1951**

Supervisors' Room, Oshkosh, Wisconsin Tuesday, April 17, 1951.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 (B) of the Wisconsin Statutes this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

The meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supervisors Caswell and Geiger.

The Supervisors took the oath of office which was given by Judge D. E. McDonald.

The first regular order of business was the election of a Chairman for the ensuing year. Nominations were called for, Supv. Harms addressed the board and nominated Supv. Shea. Nominations were closed and the Clerk was instructed to cast a unanimous ballet for Supv. Shea. Ballot was so cast and Supv. Shea was declared Chairman

#### \$579.00 MIMEOGRAPH MACHINE—SUPT. SCHOOLS OFFICE

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN: --

#### Gentlemen:

Your Agricultural & Education Committee beg leave to advise that they have investigated the condition of the mimograph machine in the County Supt. of School's office, and find that, as the same was purchased in the year 1938, it is in a rather worn condition at the present time, and there is need for a new machine in that office. A new machine is listed at \$565.00, less a trade-in value on the old machine of \$50.00, or a cost figure of \$515.00, plus \$64.00 for the stand, or a total of \$579.00.

#### A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY TO AMEND THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE PUBLISHED DECEMBER 23rd, 1944

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN

#### Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, it is desirable to amend the Zoning Ordinance of Winnebago County, which as published December 23rd, 1944, in accordance with the request of certain property owners in the Towns of Algoma, Neenah, and Menasha.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, do ordain that a General Ordinance of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, entitled "Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance," which was passed and approved November 20th, 1944, and was published December 23rd, 1944, be amended to provide that the properties hereinafter described shall be changed from the classification under said Ordinance which they now and heretofore have had, into the District set after the parcel of land in each case, as follows:

T. of Menasha, From Residential to Industrial.

Replat, Airport Heights, Block 6, Lots 15, 16, 17, and 18, and Replat Airport Heights, Block 7, Lots 12 and 13. Town of Neenah, From Residential to Commercial.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a hearing be set on the changes incorporated herein, and that the County Clerk of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, give such notice of same as is perscribed by law, and that the above proposed changes to the Ordinance be submitted to the Town Boards of the towns affected by the changes for approval before adoption by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

#### \$10,000 LIABILITY INSURANCE

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented:

WHEREAS, the Finance Committee in meeting May 18, 1951, did take under advisement the matter of the extent of county liability in the event of a major accident involving excessive liability in compensation insurance, and

WHEREAS, said Committee, in consultation with other members of the County Board, and with qualified representatives of insurance companies, ascertained that it would be expedient and advisable that the county's liability be limited in the event of any major accident and compensation liability resulting therefrom, and

WHEREAS, said Committee, in consideration of the afore-mentioned facts, took out a \$10,000.00 deductible liability policy, with the condition if the County Board did not see fit to approve of this action of the Committee, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of said policy is that any compensation resulting from a major accident will be borne by the county, to the extent of \$10,000.00, and any liability over and above said \$10,000.00 to be assumed by the cognizant insurance carrier, at a yearly premium of \$372.00,

NOW, THEREPORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that the action of the Finance Committee on May 18th, 1951, in contracting with the Employer's Mutual Insurance Company for a policy of liability insurance for excess compensation resulting from any major accident, whereunder the County assumes to pay to the extent of \$10,000.00, the remainder liability thereunder to be borne by said insurance carrier, at a yearly tinue in force and effect for its term, and that proper steps be taken for the payment thereof.

This exception shall not change the 60 foot width requirement."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Section III, as it pertains to side yards, be amended, after the words "7 feet in width," to read as follows: "Except that a garage may be erected no nearer than three feet from the side line, providing the set-back thereof is 70 feet from the highway right-of-way line."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Sections VI and VII of said Zoning Ordinance, with reference to side yards as it pertains to commercial and industrial sections, be amended, after the words "8 feet in width (in one instance), and 10 feet in width (in another instance), to read as follows: "Except in cases of buildings of fire-proof structure, said structures may be erected without any required distance from the lot line, provided owner has made proper provisions for drainage."

#### SALARY ADJUSTMENT-COURTHOUSE EMPLYEES

The rollowing Resolution No. 4 was presented: TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen

Your Personnel Committee beg leave to report that they have had

under consideration the matter of a re-survey of classifications and salaries of Winnebago County Courthouse employees employed at the Winnebago County Courthouse, as per instructions by Resolution No. 9. adopted at the April, 1951, meeting of the Winnebago County Board.

Your Committee wishes to report that they have had the services of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel to assist them in making this resurrey

Your Committee further wishes to report that they have met with Mr. Young, of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel, and he recommended that each employee fill out a Questionnaire supplied to them, and state his her specific duties. Your Committee further wishes to report that these Questionnaires were properly filled out by the employees and returned to the Personnel Committee.

The Committee held three meetings with Mr. Young and studied the Questionnaires to determine in what cases re-classification should be made. The Committee had in its files the wage pattern of every County Courthouse in the State, including salaries being paid elected officials, even to the extent of the fees received. They also had, at their disposal, the wage scale of all major industries and offices in Winnebago County.

Your Committee further wishes to report that they felt, as did a good share of the employees in the Courthouse, that the cost of living bonus now being paid was not set up on a fair and just basis to all employees. We are recommending that it be changed to a more sensible method. This met with the approval of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel and the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees' Association

Your Committee further wishes to report that after they had reached an agreement as to what they would recommend to the Winnebago County Board, they met with the Executive Committee of the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees' Association, for the purpose of explaining the recommended plan to them. This proved very effective in promoting good relations between the Personnel Committee and the employees. The Executive Committee of the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees' Association endorses the recommended plan submitted here.

Your Committee further wishes to report that if the Winnebago County Board adopts the following recommendation, the Winnebago County Courthouse wage structure will be in a very favorable position with counties of the same size in the State, as well as with industries and offices throughout Winnebago County.

Your Personnel Committee would recommend the passage of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, it is recognized there is a need for a re-survey of classifications and salaries for Winnebago County Courthouse employees,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebage County Board of Supervisors, that the recommendations of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel, together with the Personnel Committee of the Winnebago County Board, be and the same are hereby adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all classifications listed in the wage structure of the Winnebago County Courthouse be advanced \$20.00 per month in all brackets.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the cost of living bonus now being paid Winnebago County Courthouse employees be discontinued and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a new cost of living bonus be applied and added to the base pay of all Winnebago County Courthouse employees, including elected and appointed officials, excepting the Supervising Teacher and the County Physician. This bonus is to be based on the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer's Price Index. The base to be used in computing the cost of living bonus is to be the Consumers' Price Index of February, 1947, which was 152. One Dollar per month

for every point the Index rises above 152 is to to be added to the base pay of the employees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED t, hat at the organization and annual meetings of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors the Winnebago County Personnel Committee shall review the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumers' Price Index, using the latest Index figure available, and recommend to the Board that any increase or decrease demanded by the rise or fall of the Index figure be applied to the base pay of the employees at the next regular pay period.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a new classification be established for the District Attorney's Secretary, this classification to be listed as "Legal Stenographer," the classification to carry a base salary range of \$200.00 to \$240.000 per month.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the classification of Stenographer No. II in all cases carry a salary range of \$170.00 to \$210.00. This makes it consistent with the Winnebago County Welfare Stenographer No. II.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Beverly Kargus, of the Veterans' Service Office, be advanced from Stenographer No. I to Stenographer No. II.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the new classification be established in the County Clerk's office, to be called "Account Clerk," and that Ursula Cragg be changed to said classification, this classification to carry a base salary range of \$170.000 to \$210.00.

#### COURTHOUSE PARKING ORDINANCE

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented: THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That a General Ordinance of the County of Winnebago, relating to the parking of vehicles on the premises adjacent to the Courthouse, providing for imposition of penalties and forfeitures, the collection and enforcement thereof, is hereby enacted as follows:

#### SECTION I

It shall be unlawful for any person to park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle, attended or unattended, upon the premises adjacent to the Courthouse, between the hours of 12:00 o'clock a. m. and 7:30 o'clock a. m., other than employes or person engaged in official business for Winnebago County on duty at the Courthouse, and further except in compliance with the directions of the officers of the State Highway Patrol, Sheriff, or his Deputies, or any member of the County Traffic Department, during the times specified herein.

#### SECTION II

It shall be unlawful any person to park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle, attended or unattended, at any time on any of the driveways on the premises adjacent to the Courthouse, except that members of the Sheriff and Traffic Departments may park their vehicles on the ramp leading to the driveways, and excepting persons in their regular course of business, in transporting materials to or from said Courthouse Building.

#### SECTION III

It shall be unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to use and drive upon any of the driveways of the Winnebago County Courthouse property for the purpose of using any such driveway as a through roadway in traveling from one public highway to another.

#### SECTION IV

Any person violating the provisions of Sections I, II, and III of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof forfeit to Winnebago County the sum of not to exceed \$10.00, and in default of payment be imprisoned until payment of the forfeiture and costs in the Winnebago County Jail for not more than 5 days.

For the second or each subsequent conviction within one year thereafter, such person shall forfeit to Winnebago County not to exceed \$15.00, and in default of payment of said forfeiture shall be invisioned in the Winnebago County Jail until payment of the forfeiture and costs not exceeding 10 days for each such offense.

#### ZONING CHANGE—SET BACK RESTRICTIONS

The following Report No. 3 was read:

TAKE NOTICE that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors has adopted the following resolution proposing certain changes to the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance:

WHEREAS, it is desirable to amend the Zoning Ordinance of Winnebago County, which was published December 23, 1944.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Section III of said Zoning Ordinance, as it refers to the lot area in residential districts, be amended, after the words "60 feet wide," to read as follows: "Except that in such districts wherein sewerage disposal is provided by a public utility and water is provided, the area shall be no less than 7,200 square feet. This exception shall not change the 60 foot width requirement."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Section III, as it pertains to side yards, be amended, after the words "7 feet in width," to read as follows: "Except that a garage may be erected no nearer than three feet from the side line, providing the set-back thereof is 70 feet from the highway right-of-way line."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Sections VI and VIII of said Zoning Ordinance, with reference to side yards as it pertains to commercial and industrial sections, be amended, after the words "8 feet in width (in one instance), and 10 feet in width (in the other instance), to read as follows: "Except that in cases of buildings of fire-proof structure, said structures may be erected without any required distance from the lot line, provided owner has made proper provisions for drainage." . . . . .

## CITY WATER & SEWERAGE—SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 6

The following Resolution No. 26 was presented;

WHEREAS, School District No. 6 of the Town of Oshksh, Winnebag County, Wisconsin, is constructing a new school building in the Town of Oshkosh immediately adjacent to the North side of the Winnebago County Fair Grounds, and inasmuch as there are water and sewer laterals now situated in the Winnebago County Fair Grounds running across real estate owned by both the Winnebago County Fair Association and the County of Winnebago, which laterals connect with the City of Oshkosh water system and sewerage system of the City of Oshkosh, and

WHEREAS, the City of Oshkosh has granted permission to School District No. 6 to connect with the City water and sewerage systems, and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Fair Association has entered into written agreements with School District No. 6, authorizing the use of said water and sewer laterals under conditions prescribed in said written agreements, all of which, however, are subject to approval by the Winnebago County Board by reason of the fact that the laterals in question are laid in real estate owned both by Winnebago County and the said Fair Association as aforesaid, and

WHEREAS, the utilization of said facilities will effect a substantial saving in money to School District No. 6 and be of substantial public benefit,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that permission is hereby accorded School District No. 6 to use said sewer and water laterals as are situated in the Winnebago County Fairgrounds on land of Winnebago County Wisconsin, all in accordance with agreements heretofore made between School District No. 6 and the Winnebago County Fair Association,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proper county officials are hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreements for and on behalf of Winnebago Courty, Wisconsin.

## COUNTY TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

The following Resolution No. 27 was presented:

A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO TO AMEND, REPEAL AND RECREATE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY, PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOSITION OF PENALTIES AND FORFEITURES, THE COLLECTION AND ENFORCEMENT THEREOF AND TO ADD NEW SECTIONS TO CONFORM WITH CHAP. 85. WIS. STATS. AS AMENDED IN 1951.

The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION ONE:—Auto registration. No automobile, motor truck, motor delivery wagon, bus, motorcycle or other similar motor vehicle or trailer or semi-trailer used in connection therewith, shall be operated upon any highway in the County of Winnebago unless the same shall have been registered in the office of the Motor Vehicle Department of the State of Wisconsin, and the registration fee paid. Any person who shall operate an automobile or motorcycle, or any person, except as hereinafter provided, who shall operate a motor truck, tractor truck, bus, tractor, trailer or semi-trailer, unless the same shall have been registered, as hereinafore provided, may be arrested by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, city marshall, constable or any other police officer, and brought before the Municipal Court of the City of Oshkosh and County of Winnebago, wisconsin.

SECTION TWO:—In SECTION ONE of this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words and terms shall have the following meanings:

(a) "Automobile" shall mean every motor vehicle not excluded by following paragraph (b) designed for the purpose of transporting not more than seven persons including the operator.

(b) The term "automobile" does not include motor driven cycles, motor vehicles used for the purpose of transporting persons or goods for hire, and motor vehicles owned and operated exclusively in the public service by the state of Wisconsin or by any county or municipality thereof.

(c) The owner of a vehicle shall be deemed to "operate" the same if it is being driven with his consent.

SECTION THREE:—Any person violating Section One of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00, and in default of payment thereof with costs, be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed 90 days, and in addition shall require such person to make application for registration and pay the fee therefor, and \$2.00 in addition thereto.

SECTION FOUR:—Operators must be licensed. No person, except those hereinafter expressly exempted, shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in Winnebago County unless such person has a valid license issued under the provisions of Section 85.08 Wisconsin Statutes. After revocation or cancellation a new period of revocation has terminated.

SECTION FIVE:—Persons exempt from license. The following persons are exempt from licenses hereunder:

(a) Any person while operating a motor vehicle in the service of the army, navy or marine corps of the United States,

(b) Any person while operating any farm tractor or implement of husbandry temporarily operated or moved on a highway.

(c) A nonresident who is at least 16 years of age and who has in his immediate possession a valid license issued to him in his home state or country may operate a motor vehicle in this state.

(d) Any nonresident who is at least 16 years of age whose home state or country does not require the licensing of operators may operate a motor vehicle for a period for not more than 90 days in any calendar year, if the motor vehicle so operated is duly registered in the home state or country of such nonresident. However, such nonresident shall have an official certificate showing the lawful registration of such motor vehicle and may be required at any time or place by any person empowered to enforce the provisions of Chapter 85 of the Wisconsin Statutes to establish his identity prove lawful possession or right to operate such motor vehicle.

SECTION SIX:—Every person convicted of a violation of Section Four of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 and, in default of payment thereof with costs, be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed six months.

SECTION SEVEN:—Section Three of a general ordinance of the County of Winnebago regulating traffic upon the public highways of said county passed and approved October 14, 1947, and published October 21, 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION THREE: LIGHTING EQUIPMENT ON VEHICLES. (1) DEFINITIONS. Words and phrases as used in this Section shall have the meaning as given and adopted in Section \$5.06 (1) Wisconsin Statutes, which Section is hereby incorporated by reference and made a part hereof.

(2) EQUIPMENT REQUIRED. (a) Every vehicle upon a public highway during hours of darkness shall be equipped with the lighting equipment required by this section for vehicles of its class.

(b) In determining the distance from which lighting equipment shall render objects visible or within which such lighting equipment shall be visible during hours of darkness, such distance shall be measured directly ahead upon a straight, level, unlighted highway under normal atmospheric conditions unless a different time, direction or condition is expressly stated.

(3) HEADLAMPS ON MOTOR VEHICLES. Every motor vehicle other than a motorcycle shall be equipped with 2 headlamps, which shall display a white light of sufficient illuminating power to reveal any person, vehicle or substantial object 200 feet ahead of the headlamps.

(4) HEADLAMPS ON MOTORCYCLES. Every motorcycle shall be equipped with at least one and not more than 2 headlamps which shall display a white light of sufficient illuminating power to reveal any person, vehicle or substantial object 200 feet ahead of such headlamp.

(5) TAIL LAMP. Every motor vehicle, when in use upon, or parked upon or immediately adjacent to, a traveled portion of a highway shall display on the rear a tail lamp so constructed and placed to show a red light from the rear plainly visible from a distance of 500 feet to the rear of such vehicle. But no motor vehicle lawfully parked upon a highway within the limits of an incorporated municipality shall be required to display a lighted tail lamp or lamps when equipped with a red reflex reflector or reflectors in accord-

ance with subsections (26) and (27). No motor vehicle originally equipped at the time of manufacture and sale with 2 tail lamps shall be operated upon any public highway unless both of said lamps

are in good working order.

(6) STOP LAMP. Every motor vehicle in use upon a highway shall be equipped with a stop lamp on the rear, which shall emit a red light and which shall be actuated upon application of the service or foot brake. Such lamp shall be plainly visible and under-standable from a distance of 100 feet to the year both during normal sunlight and at those time when lighted lamps are required on motor vehicles. Such lamp may be incorporated with a tail lamp. No motor vehicle originally equipped at the time of manufacture and sale with 2 stop lamps shall be operated upon a highway unless both of said lamps are in good working order.

(7) SPOTLAMP. (a) Any motor vehicle may be equipped with not to exceed 2 spotlamps which shall not be used in substitution

of headlamps.

(b) Every spotlamp mounted upon a motor vehicle shall be located with the center of such lamp not less than 30 nor more than 72 inches above the level surface upon which the vehicle stands.

- (c) No spotlamp shall be used as an auxiliary driving light on any motor vehicle except when such spotlamp is set or adjusted so that the rays of light shall be projected directly upon the road surface at a distance not exceeding 150 feet directly in front of the vehicle and to the right of the center of the traveled roadway. No spotlight shall project any glaring light into the eyes of an approaching driver.
- (8) ADVERSE WEATHER LAMP. (a) Any motor vehicle may be equipped with not to exceed 2 adverse weather lamps mounted upon the front of said vehicle below the level of the centers of the headlamps.
- (b) Adverse weather lamps shall not be used in lieu of headlamps unless absolutely necessary in case of rain, snow, dust or fog and then only when a vehicle is equipped with 2 adverse weather lamps mounted on opposite sides of the front of the vehicle and when both such adverse weather lamps are lighted.

Whenever any vehicle is equipped with only one adverse weather lamp, both headlamps of such vehicle shall be lighted at

all times whenever such adverse weather lamp is lighted.

(9) BACK-UP LAMPS. (a) Any motor vehicle may be equipped with a back-up lamp, which shall be so directed as to project a white or amber light illuminating the roadway to the rear of such vehicle for a distance not to exceed 75 feet.

(b) No lighted back-up lamp shall be displayed on any vehicle upon a highway except when such vehicle is about to be or is being driven backward. Whenever a back-up lamp is lighted during hours of darkness, the tail lamp or tail lamps on the vehicle displaying such lighted back-up lamp shall also be lighted.

(10) NUMBER OF LIGHTED LAMPS RESTRICTED. No motor vehicle upon a highway shall display lighted at one time more than 4 headlamps, adverse weather lamps or spotlamps or combination

(11) COLOR OF LIGHTS ON FRONT OF VEHICLES. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person shall drive or move any vehicle or equipment upon a highway displaying other than a white or amber light visible from directly in front of said vehicle.

(12) COLOR OF LIGHTS ON REAR OF VEHICLES. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person shall drive or move any vehicle or equipment upon any highway displaying any color of light other than red on the rear of said vehicle.

- (13) IDENTIFICATION LAMPS ON TAXICABS AND BUSES. No motor vehicle regularly used for transporting passengers for hire may display any lighting device for identification purposes other than a single illuminated sign or lighted lamp mounted above the top line of the windshield, colored white, amber or green. Such illuminated sign or lamp shall be so constructed as to emit a steady or flashing nonglaring light.
- (14) LAMPS ON AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLES.
  (a) Any authorized emergency vehicle may be equipped with flashing, oscillating or rotating red lights to warn drivers and pedestrians to yield the right of way when making an emergency run on official business.
- (b) The chief of police of any city or, when the owner resides outside of a city, the sheriff of the county, may authorize the owner of a motor truck equipped and used for towing or moving disabled vehicles to mount not to exceed 2 fixed flashing red lamps on the front of such truck. Said red lamps may be lighted only when said truck is being used to move a disabled vehicle along or upon a public highway. Chiefs of police and sheriffs shall keep a record of all such authorization issued by them.
- (15) DIRECTION SIGNAL LAMPS. (a) Any vehicle may be equipped, and when required under this chapter shall be equipped, with direction signal lamps for the purpose of giving a signal of intention to turn right or left. Such lamps shall project a flashing white or amber light visible to the front and a red or amber flashing light visible to the rear. Direction signal lamps shall be plainly visible and understandable from a distance of 100 feet both during normal sunlight and during hours of darkness.
- (b) Vehicle equipped with such lamps shall also be equipped with a visible signal on the instrument panel, dash or steering column to indicate to the driver when either signal lamp is operating.
- (16) (a) Every person operating a motor vehicle equipped with multiple beam headlamps upon a public highway during hours of darkness shall, when at a distance of not less than 500 feet of an oncoming vehicle or of a vehicle proceeding ahead in the same direction, dim, depress or tilt the headlamps of his vehicle and keep them dimmed, depressed or tilted while approaching or following such other vehicle within a distance of 500 feet, so as to distribute the light therefrom so that the glaring rays are not directed into the eyes of the driver of the other vehicle; but at all times during hours of darkness every operator of a motor vehicle upon a highway shall use headlamps which will reveal a person or vehicle at a distance of at least 100 feet ahead.
- (17) CLEARANCE LAMPS. Every motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer having a width at any part in excess of 80 inches shall be equipped with 2 amber clearance lamps mounted on the front of said vehicle so as to be visible from the front and 2 red clearance lamps mounted on the rear of said vehicle so as to be visible from the rear. Such lamps shall be mounted in such a manner as to indicate the extreme width of the vehicle and as near the top thereof as practicable, and when lighted shall be visible from a distance of 500 feet.
- (18) LIGHTING DEVICES FOR STATIONARY VEHICLES. No person shall during hours of darkness permit a truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or bus to stand upon any traveled portion of a highway outside of the corporate limits of any incorprated city or village, unless there is displayed 3 of any one of the following lighting devices: burning fuses, burning pot torches, lighted red lanterns. One shall be placed 10 feet to the left rear side of the vehicle, one placed approximately 125 feet to the front and one

placed approximately 125 feet to the rear of the vehicle to clearly indicate the location of such vehicle on the highway. Such lighting devices shall be so displayed during the entire time such vehicle is left standing. Every truck, tractor or bus operated upon a highway outside of the corporate limits of any incorporated city or village shall carry in a place readily accessible to the driver the lighting device so required. Said lighting devices shall at all times be kept in proper working order, and pot torches or lanterns shall be kept filled.

be kept filled.

(19) LIGHTS ON HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE EQUIPMENT.

(a) No tractor, truck, road grader, road drag or other unit of road machinery used in highway construction or maintenance shall be used upon a highway unless such vehicle or machinery displays during daylight hours a red flag on each side of the front and a red flag on each side of the front and a red flag on each side of the rear. During hours of darkness a red light visible at a distance of 500 feet shall be displayed on each side of the front and each side of the rear to give adequate warning of the presence of such vehicle or machinery and to show safe clearance for passing or overtaking vehicles. Red flags herein

prescribed shall be not less than 12 inches square.

(b) In lieu of such red lamps such vehicles or road machinery may be equipped with 2 amber floodlamps, one mounted on each side of the vehicle, so as to illuminate the sides of the vehicle and the attachments, if any, to show safe clearance for passing or overtaking vehicles. Such floodlamps shall display an amber light of sufficient illuminating power to indicate safe clearance from a distance of 200 feet to the front and the rear of such vehicle. When such vehicles are required to operate on the left hand sid of a highway they shall be equipped with an auxiliary lamp or lamps projecting a blue light visible from a distance of 500 feet from the front and rear. The lenses of such auxiliary lamps shall be not less than 6 inches in diameter, and said lamps shall be mounted approximately midway between the extremities of the width of the vehicle and at the highest practicable point.

(c) Motor vehicles and road machinery used for and engaged in maintaining highways, when equipped with and designated by lighted amber floodlamps and blue auxiliary lamps as provided in paragraph (b) are exempt from the provisions of paragraph (a).

(20) LAMPS ON SELF-PROPELLED FARM EQUIPMENT. No farm tractor, as defined in section 85.10, Wis. Stats., or self-propelled farm equipment shall be operated or parked upon a highway during hours of darkness unless such tractor or equipment carries the lighted lighting equipment required of motor vehicles under this section. No such tractor or equipment when so operated or parked

shall show any light to the rear other than red in color,

(21) LAMPS ON POWER-DRIVEN CYCLES AND MOTOR BICYCLES. Power-driven cycles and motor bicycles shall be equipped with an electric headlamp, red tail and current source. Such headlamp shall display a white light of sufficient illuminating power to reveal any person, vehicle or substantial object at a distance of 100 feet ahead, and shall be so adjusted or operated that the glaring light rays therefrom are not directed into the eyes of the driver of any oncoming vehicle. The tail light, when illuminated, must be visible on a dark clear night for a minimum of 500 feet from the rear. The electric current source shall be derived from either a wet battery and electric generator; or from a generator connected to the motor direct or by gears, friction wheel, chain or belt; or by means of a current generating coil incorporated into the magneto.

(22) LAMPS ON BICYCLES. Every bicycle operated upon a highway shall be equipped with a lamp on the front emitting a white light visible from a distance of at least 500 feet to the front

and with a lamp on the rear emitting a red light visible from a distance of 300 feet to the rear. But in lieu of the red lamp a bicycle may be equipped with a red reflex reflector so mounted and maintained as to be readily visible from all distances from 50 feet to 300 feet from the rear of said bicycle.

- (23) LAMPS ON CABIN TRAILERS. Cabin trailers operated on a highway shall be equipped with a combination tail lamp and stop lamp, controlled and operated from the driver's seat of the propelling vehicle.
- (24) LAMPS ON NON-MOTOR VEHICLES. No vehicle or piece of equipment or machinery not otherwise referred to in this section shall be driven upon or occupy any highway during hours of darkness unless such vehicle, equipment or machinery is equipped with at least one lighted lamp or lantern exhibiting a white light visible from a distance of 500 feet ahead and a lighted lamp or lantern exhibiting a red light visible at a distance of 300 feet to the rear, except that in lieu of a red lamp or lantern 2 red reflex reflectors may be displayed on the rear of such vehicle, equipment or machinery.
- (25) REFLEX REFLECTORS ON VEHICLES. No vehicle having a width at any part in excess of 80 inches shall be operated or parked upon a highway during hours of darkness unless such vehicle is equipped with 2 amber reflex reflectors mounted on the front, and 2 red reflext reflectors mounted on the rear in such a manner as to indicate as nearly as possible the extreme width of said vehicle.
- (26) INSTALLATION OF REFLEX REFLECTORS. Whenever this section requires any reflex reflectors to be displayed by a vehicle upon a highway, each such reflector shall be mounted on such equipment not less than 16 inches nor more than 60 inches above the ground on which the equipment stands. Such reflectorshall be of such size and characteristics and so maintained as to be readily visible from all distances within 500 feet to 50 feet from such vehicle when directly in front of lawful upper headlamp beams during hours of darkness. A lawful red reflex reflector may be incorporated as a part of a tail lamp.
- (27) All reflex reflectors required under this section shall reflect an amber color, except that any reflex reflector mounted on the rear or on either side nearest to the rear of a vehicle or other equipment shall reflect a red color. Red reflex reflector warning devices shall comply with the minimum visibility requirements set forth in subsection (26).
- (28) LAMPS AND REFLECTORS TO BE KEPT CLEAN. The operator of every vehicle on a highway required to display lighted lamps or reflex reflectors under this section shall keep such lamps and reflectors reasonably clean and in proper working condition at all times.
- (29) ENFORCEMENT. It shall be the duty of sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, traffic officers, policemen and village marshals to enforce the provisions of this section.
- SECTION EIGHT. SECTION NINE (5) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC
  UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY PASSED AND
  APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21,
  1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION
  NINE (5). PASSING ON CURVES AND GRADES RESTRICTED. It
  shall be unlawful for the operator of a vehicle to operate on the left,
  side of the highway upon any part of a grade or upon a curve in the
  highway where the operator's view along said highway is obstructed
  for such a distance as to create a hazard in the event another vehicle
  might approach from the opposit direction.

SECTION NINE SECTION TWELVE (4) (e) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGWAYS OF SAID COUNTY

PASSED and APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, and published OCTOBER 21, 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION TWELVE (4) (e). Within 4 feet of the entrance to a private highway or alley.

SECTION TEN. SECTION TWENTY-FIVE (2) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY, PASSED AND APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21, 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION TWENTY-FIVE (2). DISTANCE BETWEEN SLOW MOVING VEHICLES. The operator of any slow moving vehicle, other than a truck following another truck, when operating upon a highway outside of a business or residence district shall not follow another slow moving vehicle within 300 feet, but this provision does not prevent one slow moving vehicle overtaking and passing another nor does it apply to funeral processions. The operator of any truck operating upon a highway outside of a business or residence district shall not follow another truck within 500 feet except when passing as provided in this subjection.

SECTION ELEVEN. SECTION THIRTY-FOUR (1) (g) AND (h) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY PASSED AND APPROVED JULY 19, 1949, AND PUBLISHED JULY 21, 1949, AMENDING A GENERAL ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC PASSED AND APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21, 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION THIRTY-FOUR. SPEED RESTRICTIONS (1) (g) 55 miles per hour during nighttime except as provided in (1) (h) 65 miles per hour except as provided in (1). (1) 45 miles per hour for any commercial vehicle or combination of commercial vehicle or except busses, having a gross weight of more than 10,000 pounds. (1) Any person violating the provisions of Section Thirty-Four, (1) (g) or (h) of the ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit to Winnebago County the sum of not to exceed \$25,00 for the first offense, and for the second or each subsequent conviction within one year thereafter, shall forfeit not to exceed \$100.00, and in default of payment thereof shall be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, not to exceed 30 days.

SECTION TWELVE. SECTION THIRTY-SEVEN (2) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY PASSED AND APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21, 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION THIRTY-SEVEN (2). HORNS AND WARNING DEVICES Every motor vehicle, when operated upon a highway, shall be equipped with a horn in good working order, capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions for a distance of not less than 200 feet and it shall be unlawful, except as otherwise provided in this section, for any vehicle to be equipped with, or for any person to use upon a vehicle, any siren or compression spark pug whistle, or for any person at any time to use a horn otherwise than as a reasonable warning or to make any unnecessary or unreasonably loud or harsh sound by means of a horn or other warming device. When authorized by the common council of any city or the board of any town or village, it shall be lawful for full-time, part-time, and volunteer members of fire departments to equip their privately owned motor vehicles with a siren or red warning lights, provided such full-time, part-time and volunteer firemen shall use only such siren or red warning lights while traveling to the scene of a fire or while on any other emergency call.

SECTION THIRTEEN. SECTION THIRTY-SEVEN (6) OF A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY PASSED AND APPROVED OCTOBER 14, 1947, AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21. 1947, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows: SECTION THIRTY-SEVEN (6) CABIN TRAILER HITCHES. Whenever a cabin trailer is used in connection with a motor vehicle upon the highway it shall be attached by a coupling so that the trailer will follow in a direct line with a propelling vehicle without sideswing or wobble and in addition shall be coupled with stay

chains or cables to the vehicle by which it is drawn which chains shall be of sufficient size and strength to prevent parting from the drawing vehicle should the regular coupling break or become otherwise disengaged. The couplings shall conform to the regulations of the motor vehicle department.

SECTION FOURTEEN. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and publication. Penalties applicable to repealed sections shall apply to the new sections created unless a specific penalty is herein provided therefor.
