REGULAR APRIL SESSION 1954

Supervisors' Room, Oshkosh, Wis., Tuesday, April 20th, 1954.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 (B) of the Wisconsin Statutes this April session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for purpose of Organization and doing any and all regular business which, according to law, may come before the Board.

The meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supervisors Braun, Ellinger, Yule.

The meeting was opened with prayer given by Supervisor Hansen.

The first order of business was the election of a chairman. A motion was made and seconded nominating Supervisor Drexler. A motion was made and seconded that the clerk cast a unanimous ballot for the election of Supervisor Drexler. Drexler named Chairman.

The next order of business was the election of a vice-Chairman. A motion was made and seconded nominating Supervisor Geiger. A motion was made and seconded that the clerk cast a unanimous ballot for the election of Supervisor Geiger. Geiger elected Vice-Chairman.

Supervisors Geiger, Evenson, Reimer, newly elected to the board, were sworn into office by the County Clerk.

The next order of business was the election of members to the Welfare Board. Supervisors Novotny and O'Reilly were named tellers.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supervisor Heigl. An informal ballot was cast. Heigl 32, Wallace 4, Carpenter 1, Doule 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Heigl elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supervisor Wallace. An informal ballot was cast. Wallace 28, Harms 1, Evenson 1, Tank 1, Doule 1, Raddatz 1, Carpenter 2, Hunter 2, Nolan 1, Redlin 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Wallace elected.

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Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supervisor Kelsh. An informal ballot was cast Kelsh 17, Perkins 16, Doule 1, Carpenter 3, Evenson 1, Redlin 1. Formal ballot was cast. Perkins 25, Kelsh 14, Redlin 2, Perkins elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supervisor Metzig. Informal ballot was cast Metzig 34, King 1, Heiss 1, Kelsh 2, Doule 3. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Metzig elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supervisor Yule. An informal ballot was cast. Yule 35, Heiss 1, Kelsh 2, Nolan 1, Evenson 1, O'Connor 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal. ballot be made tormal Carried unanimously. Yule elected.

Mr. Warner Geiger addressed the board. Mr. Geiger is a teacher at the State Teachers College and was accompanied by several students.

The rules of the board were read. In Rule No. 3 the name "Safety Committee" was added to the Sheriff and Coroner's Committee. A new Rule No 33 was added: "All requests for an appropriation for equipment, salary increase or extra help shall appear in each departmental budget, but shall be specifically enumerated and shall be covered by separate resolution."

Rule No. 8--Flag salute and prayer shall be first order of business.

Rule now known as No. 33 will now be rule No. 34.

Motion made and seconded to adopt the rules as read and corrected. Carried.

Duties of Committee were read. A motion was made and seconded that part of line three be omitted. Motion lost. A motion was made and seconded that the word "may" be added instead of the word "are" in the line three.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 2 p. m. Carried.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Meeting called to order by Chairman Drexler.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supervisors Braun, Doule, Ellinger, Ginnow, Heigl, Heiss Hunter, Yule.

The name of the Welfare Committee be changed to "Welfare Board."

Motion made and seconded to adopt the duties as amended. Carried.

Bills were read and referred to proper Committees.

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A communication from Elizabeth Henning regarding an infirmary was read. Motion made and seconded to accept and place on file. Carried.

A communication for Kimberly-Clark activities was read. Motion made and seconded to accept and place on file. Carried.

A communication from District Engineer regarding the closing of Eureka Locks was read. Motion made and seconded to accept and place on file. Carried.

A communication from Albina Isling was read and referred to the Institution Committee.

A communication from the Staub Abstract Company was read and referred to the Taxation Committee.

A communication from E. C. Arnemann was read and referred to the Institution Committee.

A communication from the State Historical Society was read. Motion made and seconded to accept and place on file. Carried.

A communication from the State Highway Commission was read and referred to Highway Committee.

AVIATION REPORT

The following Report No. 3 was read:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Your Aviation Committee has the following to report: In the early fall of last year Mr. Wittman, our Airport Manager, informed us that he was no longer interested in the managership of the Winnebago County Airport, under the present plan of pay. This became known generally, and we received a number of applications for the managership. Along with that, people from groups and otherwise prevailed on the Committee to keep the present manager, Mr. Wittman. After a number of meetings with the applicants Mr. Wittman was appointed by the Committee to take over the managership on a new plan of salary which was \$4,000 per year, payable monthly.

The same plan of leasing the ten T hangars and the 20th street hangar to him was followed, to-wit, \$1,200.00 per year on the ten T hangars and \$1200 per year on the 20th street hangar.

This new salary plan increased the maintenance cost of the Airport by the amount of his salary or \$4,000.00 per year.

Also, during the month of December of last year, we were to set up a new Airline contract. Because the officials of the Air Line were not available, the new contract was not complted uneil February of ehis year, whe nehe following contract was set up, retroactive as of January 1, 1954: North Central Air Line to pay Winnebago County \$60.00 per month, or \$720.00 per year, for the office space, plus \$50.00 for the first flight \$25.00 for the second, \$15.00for the third, and \$10.00 each for the remainder, or a possible amount of \$130.00 per year. Further, they have relieved us of electrical service charges, averaging \$13.45 per month, or \$161.40per year. The previous contract paid the same amount for office rent, and 2 per cent on the generated business. The gain by the new contract is a difference between the savings by their taking over the electrical service charges, plus \$2,160.00 for office rental and flight fees, or \$2,321.40, or a gain of \$421.40. While this is not a big gain, it does represent a gain, rather than a loss. We would like to further report that less than three weeks ago we received a communication from Kimberly-Clark Corporation, informing us that they were buying another large plane which they would like to keep in a building with their present DC 3. We advised them that a meeting could best afford an answer to their inquiry, which was duly held and they were advised that their request would be presented to the County Board for action. Accordingly, you will hear at a later time during this session a reading of a resolution to this effect.

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, Kimberly-Clark Corporation, of Neenah, Wisconsin has requested the Winnebago County Aviation Committee to consider the construction of an addition to its present hangar at the Winnebago County Airport, at an approximate cost of \$60,000.00, and

WHEREAS, negotiations are presently under way for a contract, under the terms of which Kimberly-Clark will repay Winnebago County the cost of said construction, plus 15 per cent, within eleven years from the date of its completion, and provide in said agreement for a renewal thereof, at the expiration of eleven years, under the same terms and conditions which now exist in a contract with Marathon Corporation,

NOW, THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Aviation Committee be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to complete the negotiations for such a contract with Kimberly-Clark and upon completion thereof to erect such an addition to the present Kimberly-Clark hangar at the Airport at a cost not to exceed \$66,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$60,000.00 be and the same is hereby transferred from the General Fund to the Aviation Committee Fund, for the purpose of paying for the construction of said addition.

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Our report of July 20th noted that we had awarded the contract for the Kimberly-Clark hangar addition, that we were working on a plan to amend the Airport Zoning Ordinance, and trying to find a satisfactory replacement for the Kiekhaefer hangar doors; also mentioning that individuals were telling us of the need for a new Air Line office.

At this time it appears that another fifteen or eighteen days will complete the addition, to the Kimberly-Clark hangar, as all that remains to be done is to finish the wiring, heating, and plumbing. Changes and extras on the job will run to between \$1,500.00 and \$2,000.00 Engineering fees will run to about \$1,700.00, making a total of \$40,332.00 as the cost of the addition.

Work on the amending of the Airport Zoning Ordinance is about complete. The Engineer has finished his maps, etc., and a hearing has been held, about which you will hear more when the resolution, recommending the change of Zoning Ordinance, is brought before you tomorrow

The replacement of the Kiekhaefer doors is well under way. The contract for replacement was awarded to the Deyo Door Sales of Appleton. Weather permitting, it is expected replacement will be made in a couple of weeks.

Of late we had a delegation of Oshkosh Chamber of Commerce men call on us, who presented reasons for building a new building for the Air Line office. Your Committee welcomed the thoughts and advice presented, and then went on to explain why it did not appear encouraging for a year or two. To sum it up in a nut-shell, the need for the office building is over-shadowed by the heavy demands for expenditures on other phases of county interest.

Building, estimated cost of \$1,000.00; repairs to the north wall of the 20th street hangar, \$556.00 to \$1,100.00, depending on what method is used for repair; painting of the Air Line office building, \$310.00 (aluminum); painting of beacon tower, \$126.00; Airport signs on the hangar roof, \$75 00, and on the north wall of the 20th street hangar, \$147.00; seal coating roof of the 20th street hangar, \$200.00; seal coating and patching the north-south and the east-west runways. about \$7,800. These estimates and unforeseen maintenance costs will about use up our present balance.

AND REPEALING PRIOR TRAFFIC **ORDINANCES PASSED AND APPROVED OCTOBER 14TH. 1947.** AND PUBLISHED OCTOBER 21ST, 1947.

WHEREAS, an investigation and a survey has been made by the State Highway Commission relative to a speed restriction on County Trunk "K" in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County Wisconsin, and

SECTION TWO

Any person violating the provisions of Section 34 (1) of the Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit to Winnebago County the sum of not to exceed Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars for the first offense, and for the second or each subsequent conviction within one year thereafter, shall forfeit not to exceed One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and in default, shall be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, not to exceed thirty days.

Gentlemen:

Your County Health Committee begs leave to report that as a result of the resignation of Miss Katherine Weinman, the matter of the existence of the Winnebago County Health Committee, its duties, tenure of office, and method of appointment was discussed. It was learned that very little was known about the creation of this committee, the filling of the membership thereon, and other matters pertaining thereto. It is felt that this matter should be sudied and a proper resolution brought in at the organization meeting so that the method of appointment and duties of this committee should be made certain.

As it presently stands, we are operating under the provisions of Section 141.06 of the Wisconsin Statute and yet employing a part of the provision of Section 140.09. As it presently stands, the Health Committee is made up of Chairman of the County Board, Juvenile Judge, Superintendent of Schools, a dentist, the former county physician, and a lay-woman.

The statute provides that this committee may be made up of the Chairman of the County Board, the County Superintendent of Schools, a woman appointed by the County Board, the Judge of the Juvenile Court, and the District Health Officer, or may, in the alternative, be made up of the District Health Officer and no less than five (5) members of the County Board appointed by the chairman thereof.

It is the feeling of your committee that the present personnel on this committee has in the past worked very satisfactoriy, but that since we do not now have a county physician and we do not feel that the District Health Officer, a member of the State staff, should be on the committee that we should substitute, herefore, a denist and a physician, leaving the committee personnel to be made up of the same persons who hold the office as Chairman of the County Board, Superintendent of Schools, and Juvenile Judge. This would then leave the selection to be made by the County Board or its chairman, of a physician, a dentist. or a lay-woman. Your committee, therefore feels that study should be given as to whether or not these three persons should be appointed by the Chairman of the County Board, or the County Board, and secondly, for how long a period of time their appointment should run.

Your committee, therefore, requests that this matter be referred to some committee of the County Board for an appropriate resolution to be adopted at the organization meeting.
