Tuesday, April 15th, 1958 By virtue of Chapter 59.04 (B) of the Wisconsin Statutes this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of Organization and doing any and all regular business which, according to law, may come before the Board.

Meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supv. Moore and Zimmerman.

The meeting was opened by saluting the flag and prayer by Supv. Hansen.

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman. Nominations were in order. Supv. Drexler was nominated, nominations closed. A motion was made and seconded that the clerk cast a unanimous ballot for the election of Supervisor Drexler. Drexler named Chairman.

The next order of business was the election of a vice-chairman. A motion was made and seconded nominating Supv. Heigl. Nominations closed. A motion was made and seconded that the Clerk cast a unanimous ballot for the election of Supervisor Heigl. Heigl named Vice-Chairman.

The new supervisors from the City of Neenah were introduced to the Board.

The next order of business was the election of members to the Welfare Board, Supy.'s Hunter and Pawer were named tellers,

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Heigl. An informal ballot was cast. Heigl 46, Raddatz 1, Jankowski 1. A motion was made and seconded that the Clerk cast a unanimous ballot for Supv. Heigl, Heigl elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succed Supv. Wallace. An informal ballot was cast. Wallace 38, Kelsh 3, Pollnow 2, Thomsen 2, Sensenbrenner 1, John Moore 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Wallace elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Perkins. An informal ballot was cast. Perkins 39, Kelsh 6, Grunska 1, Sensenbrenner 1. A motion was made and seconded that the Informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Perkins elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Metzig. An informal ballot was cast. Metzig 38, Kelsh 3, Pawer 1, Grunska 3, Nolan 1, Sensenbrenner 1, Jankowski 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Metzig elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Jankowski. An informal ballot was cast. Jankowski 39, Kelsh 3, Nolan 1, Heaney 2, Redlin 1, Grunska 1. Metzig 1, Becher 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Jankowski elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Caswell. An informal ballot was cast, Caswell 36, Jacobsen 2, Sensenbrenner 2, King 2, Heaney 6, Kelsh 1. Kornder 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Caswell elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Kornder, an informal ballot was cast. Kornder 35, Sensenbrenner 5, Kelsh 3, King 2, Nolan 1, Wallace 1, Jacobsen 1, Hunter 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Kornder elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Gunz. An informal ballot was cast, Gunz 42, Sensenbrenner 2, King 1, Kelsh 1, Jacobsen 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Gunz elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Meigher, an informal ballot was cast. Meigher 31, Sensenbrenner 8, Jacobsen 1, Dagett 1, Kelsh 1, Heaney 3, King 1, O'Reilly 1, Perkins 1, Raddatz 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Meigher elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Hansen. An informal ballot was cast, Hansen 34, Sensenbrenner 8, Jacobsen 5, Nolan 1, Kelsh 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Hansen elected.

A communication from Supv. Jackson was read, regarding his resignation from the County School Committee. Motion made and seconded that the communication be tabled. Carried.

Election of a member of the County School Committee to succeed Nile Roeder. Roeder 42, Hansen 1, Thomsen 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Roeder elected for 3 years.

Election of a member of the County School Committee to succeed Clarence Fisher. A motion was made and seconded to withhold voting until later. Carried.

Election of a member of the County School Committee to succeed Supv. Carpenter. Carpenter 40, Perkins 2, Heaney 1, O'Reilly 1, Metzig 2, Raddatz 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Carpenter elected for 3 years.

Election of a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee to succeed Supv. Jackson. Jackson 40, Heaney 2, O'Reilly 1, Raddatz 1, Gunz 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Jackson Election of a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee to succeed Supv. Miracle. Miracle 37, Heaney 7, Perkins 2, Raddatz 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Miracle elected.

The election of Clarence Fisher was again before the board. Fisher 16, Carpenter 20, Heaney 1, Shurbert 1, Perkins 5, O'Reilly 1, Miracle 1. Seconded informal ballot, Fisher 11, Carpenter 28, Perkins 4, O'Reilly 2, Miracle 1. Carpenter elected.

Supv. Hansen was elected to lead the County Board in Prayer. Supv. Hansen addressed the Board.

Supv. Staffeld addressed the Board regarding the opening of the Airport Terminal on May 2 & 3rd.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 1:30 P.M. Carried.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Meeting called to order by Chairman Drexler.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supv's Moore and Zimmerman.

The rules of the Board were read.

Rule No. 3. A motion was made and seconded to add 3 more members to the Personnel Committee, Chairmen from the Institution, Aviation and County Park. Six members instead of five for the Taxation and General Accounts, and five members for the County Health Committee. Carried.

Rule No. 4. A motion was made and seconded that rule No. 4 be corrected to read, A County Highway Committee consisting of five members and all other elective committees are to be elected annually on the first day of the organization meeting of the County Board. All other elective officers are to be elected annually on the first day of the annual board session of the County Board.

Rule No .17. A motion was made and seconded that unless excused by the Chairman every member shall vote either aye or naye. Carried.

Rule No. 31. All report or resolutions should be four copies instead of three.

Rule No. 34 changed to 35.

Rule No. 34. No committee meetings shall be held during any sitting of the board unless authorized by a majority vote of the members present.

Motion made and seconded that the rules be adopted as amended.

The general duties of committees were read.

In the Aviation Committee's duties in the Fifth line the word "municipally" was deleted.

County Fair, Conservation and Park Committee in the second and third lines, 'shall have the duty of supervision of Winnebago County Fair Grounds."

Finance Committee duties, second paragraph "pursuant to Section 59.08(38)" be deleted. Paragraph 4 strike out first part, and starting with the fourth line from the bottom have it read "That the Committee shall be empowered to authorize expenditures not to exceed \$1000.00 for any one item in any emergency arising between board sessions, and be it authorized to transfer funds in accordance with resolution No. 66 dated November 1, 1957." In the 5th paragraph, strike the words "the Highway Committee, trustees of Sunnyview Sanatorium" and insert the words "and other county board committees and the Boards of Trustees." Strike the 6th paragraph entirely and have it read, "The Finance Committee shall negotiate for the insurance of Winnebago County in accordance with the Statutes and resolutions passed by the Winnebago County Board."

General Accounts changed to read 6 members instead of 5.

Personnel Committee changed to read 12 members with the following changes.

The Personnel Committee shall consist of twelve members. who shall be the Chairmen of the following Committees: Public Buildings, Welfare, Sheriff, Finance, General Accounts, Judiciary, Taxation, Highway Aviation, Institutions, and County Fair, Conservation and Park and, in addition, a Supervisor member of the Agriculture and Education Committee. Should a member of the Personnel Committee be unable to attend one of its meetings, his committee shall be represented by its Vice-Chairman, or, in his absence, by another of its members. The Chairman of the County Board shall designate the Chairman of the Personnel Committee. Applications for additional help in any of the offices of Winnebago County shall be referred to said Committee for study and recommendation back to the County Board. In addition the Committee shall have the responsibility, from time to time, of investigating the various departments of the county and on their own initiative recommend whether the case warrants the abolition of unnecessary positions. The Personnel Committee is to meet with the executive committee of the Courthouse Employees' Association a month prior to the Organization and annual meetings of the County Board. It shall be the duty of said Committee to recommend to the County Board, at the Organization meeting in April preceding the election of the county officers, a salary schedule to be paid for the ensuing term to the several officers who are to be elected at such election, and to recommend further to the County Board, at the annual meeting preceding the election of County or Municipal Judge and County Superintendent of Schools, the salaries to be paid to these officials for the ensuing term, and said Committee shall also recommend, from time to time, the salaries to be paid all appointive officers and all employees of Winnebago County, except where covered by Statute.

. Sheriff, Coroners and Safety Committee to read as follows:

The Sheriff, Coroner's and Safety Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall be the duty of said Committee to examine, audit, and recommend for allowance or disallowance all claims of the Sheriff, Coroner, Justices of the Peace, and Constables and all officers; it is to have charge of the Police Radio System of the County; said Committee shall have the responsibility of the hiring, disciplining, and discharging of all departmental personnel, including Radio Operators and Traffic Policemen, which said Traffic Policemen shall possess all the powers and authority that can be vested by Winnebago County in any police officer; said Committee shall also advise with the Sheriff on matters affecting law enforcement in Winnebago County; it shall handle all matters pertaining to public safety, and shall have charge of all ambulance service and also of rescue work on waters bordering on or within Winnebago County; the Committee shall likewise perform such duties as shall be imposed upon it from time to time by the County Board.

Taxation Committee changed to read 6 members.

Motion made and seconded to adopt the duties of committee as read. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 1:30 P.M. Wednesday, April 16, 1958. Carried

#### **RULES — COUNTY INSURANCE POLICIES**

The following Resolution No. 6 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County insurance program has been operating under rules adopted by resolution of the County Board dated March 19, 1935; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary to revise and clarify the said rules relating to county insurance with a view to placing responsibility for the letting and renewing of said county insurance;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that all prior resolutions and reports pertaining to County insurance excepting those resolutions pertaining to workmen's compensations are hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all County insurance, with the exception of County trucks and cars and Highway machinery and equipment, shall hereafter be governed as follows:

1. The Finance Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors shall have general supervision of all County insurance, pursuant to Chapter 59.07 (2) (a) (b). They shall advise with the County Treasurer concerning his duties, as provided under Section 59.20 (6) Wisconsin Statutes, relating to the insuring of county property.

 The Finance Committee shall also consult with County Board committees and Board of the County concerning insurance coverage within their respective jurisdictions.

3. All County insurance policies shall be in the custody of the County Treasurer.

4. The Finance Committee shall periodically review all existing insurance and, with the advice of the County Treasurer, shall have the authority to make adjustments in insurable values, subject to confirmation by the County Board at its next succeeding meeting.

5. The County Treasurer shall have the authority to sign all statements of value necessary to obtain current rates from the Fire Insurance Rating Bureau, pending confirmation by the Finance Committee.

6. The Finance Committee may meet for the purpose of purchasing new insurance and renewing insurance already in force on county property.

7. It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to increase or decrease the amount of insurance in accordance with any additions, improvements, exposures or changes to insurable property belonging to Winnebago County, subject to confirmation by the Board at its next succeeding session.

8. When necessary to protect the interests of the County, the County Treasurer shall have the authority to purchase insurance on new County property and exposures, pending approval of the Finance Committee and the County Board.

9. All County Committees and Boards of Trustees who have county property under their jurisdiction shall file an annual inventory within 30 days after end of fiscal year with the County Treasurer and inform him in writing of all changes in insurable values when such values approximate \$1,000.00 or more.

10. All County insurance and renewals thereof, with the exception of Workmen's Compensation, shall be placed with commercial insurance companies.

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#### COST OF LIVING INCREASE-COURTHOUSE EMPLOYES

WHEREAS, on June 12th, 1951, the County Board of Supervisors passed Resolution No. 4, relative to the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees' Salary Schedule, and

WHEREAS, such resolution contained provisions for the cost of living bonus to conform to the changes in the Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumers' Price Index, based on the 1935-39 facts, and

WHEREAS. the latest Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumers' Price Index, available, applicable to the month of February, 1958, received on April 2nd, 1958, is stated as 204.8, and

There are no Federal funds available that can be used for such a building. There are no State funds available that can be used for such a building. The County or Counties can legally raise money for the erection of such a building. The Counties lease the school to the State for \$1.00 per year. The State furnishes all equipment, the teaching staff and one-

The State furnishes all equipment, the teaching staff and onehalf the cost of janitor service. The Counties furnish the heat, light, water, repairs, insurance and one-half the cost of janitor service.

The present school is too small to have any laboratories. Present enrollment is 165. Estimated enrollment as soon as laboratories are available would be about 350. Estimated attendance by 1965 would be about 700.

Estimated savings to pupils by being able to stay at home, \$500.00 per pupil or \$175,000 by 1961. A large number would be able to work and go to school also.

Estimated cost of building without grounds would be \$400,000.

We have not been able to meet with the Outagamie County Committee or with the Chamber of Commerce Committee from Menasha. Therefore cannot report on intentions or requests by those municipalities.

2. South-bound traffic only from a point 650 feet Northeast of its intersection with the cross-road at the unincorporated place known as Winnebago, which leads to the State Hospital at said place. Southerly to said intersection.

#### C. County Trunk Highway "T", Larsen, Town of Clayton, Winnebago County

Twenty-five miles per hour on County Trunk "T" from a point 0.25 of a mile southeast of County Trunk Highway "MM", northerly to a point 0.15 of a mile north of said highway, located at Larsen, Town of Clavton. Winnebago County.

D. County Trunk Highway "K", Town of Algoma, Winnebago County

Forty miles per hour at the following locations and for specified traffic movements, all in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County:

### AIRPORT REGULATIONS GOVERNING AUTOMOBILE AND TRUCK RENTALS

(a) pursuant to the terms of a written contract entered into with Winnebago County;

(b) where an airline passenger or other person arriving at Winnebago County Airport has placed an order for the rental of an automobile or truck with a person, firm or corporation not having a contract with Winnebago County, such customer may be met at the Winnebago County Airport by such person, firm or corporation, or a representative thereof, and the automobile or truck delivered to the customer, but only in areas designated by the airport manager for the purpose of meeting the customer and for the purpose of delivering the automobile or truck.

2. The airport manager shall have the right to cause to be ejected from the airport premises any person guilty of violating any of the provisions contained in this section.

#### Penalty

Any person violating this ordinance, shall upon conviction of such violation, forfeit to the county a sum not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$200.00 for every such violation, with the costs of the action to collect such forfeiture, and upon default of the payment thereof shall be imprisoned in the county jail of Winnebago County for a period not to exceed 90 days.

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WINNEBAGO COUNTY:

We have been charged with a duty to investigate the advisability of continuing the operation of the County Fair—to look over the value of the fair grounds and location with the thought in mind of discontinuing the operation or changing the location.

We have concluded that at the present time we should go along with the County Fair Association and give them moral support to see if this present slump in county fair interest is or is not temporary. In line with this they have declared that they intend to exercise their contract with the county which has some 20 years to run.

We have studied the possibility of changing the location but feel that that has little merit. The present site offers some good assets such as ample room, good location, transportation to and from the fair grounds by automobile is not too difficult, and also this piece of property may be extremely valuable at some future date for unforseen county utility.

Although for many years fairs have contributed much in the field of education and culture, this committeee feels that this form of edification and entertainment has been dimmed or possibly superceded by present teaching and learning through college extension, T.V., radio, periodicals, etc., but in spite of this we don't think that this is the time to terminate the fair project.

We have a criticism or two that has to do with the general appearance of the fair grounds—we think that some buildings should be torn down because they are not in keeping with what we think they should be. The housekeeping, that it building care, painting, landscaping, is far from satisfactory, but we don't think that it's the part of the county to supply money for capital improvements or upkeep at this time. We should carefully observe the trend within the next year or two and then set our course as to future develoments.

May we recommend that the rental on various buildings, stables, etc., be revised to make them equitable and up to date and at the same time, we think that the insurance covering these buildings could be looked over to see if it covers against loss when the buildings are used for storing vehicles that have gasoline in their fuel tanks.

In conclusion the above can be summed up in these few words: Stay in this location; inspire the Fair Association to be better housekcepers; and carefully observe the program and worth of the fair during the next couple of years.
