Tuesday, April 18th, 1961 Oshkosh, Wisconsin

By virtue of Chapter 59.04B of the Wisconsin Statute this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

Meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supv's Shurbert and Steinhilber.

The meeting was opened by saluting the flag and prayer by Supy, Hanson,

New members were introduced to the Board.

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman. Supv. Drexler was nominated. Motion made and seconded that the Clerk cast a unanimous ballot for Supv. Drexler. Carried. Drexler elected.

The next order of business was the election of a Vice-Chairman. Supv Heigl was nominated. Motion made and seconded that the Clerk cast a unanimous ballot for Supv. Heigl. Carried Supv. Heigl elected

A motion was made and seconded that two tellers should be appointed for the following elections. Supv's Brandt and Ilk were appointed.

A motion was made and seconded that the nominations to be made by balloting and no nominations from the floor.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supy. Kornder. Informal ballot Kornder 47, King 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously. Kornder elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Gunz. Informal ballot Gunz 47, King 1, Page 1. A motion was made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried unanimously, Gunz elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Meigher. Informal ballot Meigher 38, Heiss 1, King 2, Page 3, O'Reilly 1, Struensee 1, Brooks 1, Carpenter 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Meigher elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supy, Hanson, Informal ballot Hanson 46, King 2, It was moved and seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes.

Mr. Therm addressed the board in regard to the roofing project at the County Hospital.

The trustees and Mr. Ward were introduced to the Board.

A motion was made and seconded that the County Board give the trustee's authority to proceed with the repairs to the Hospital roof. Carried.

Mr. Robert Wertsch addressed the Board in regard to the roof at the County Hospital.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 1:30 P.M.

COUNTY HOSPITAL ROOF

A motion was made and seconded that the District Attorney, Trustee's' and the Institution Committee to investigate the possibility of recovering anything for the County on a moral obligation basis, this was carried by a 26 to 20 vote with 5 absent.

Bills were read and referred to proper committees.

A communication from the County Boards Association was read. The Board disapproved the passage of the bills.

A communication from the Department of Resource Development was read Motion made and seconded to place on file. Carried.

\$12,000.00-ROOFING AT COUNTY HOSPITAL

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented.

WHEREAS the roofing of Unit "B", (Apartment and garage) and the Tramways of the Winnebago County Hospital is in need of removal and replacement because of saturation of the insulation; and

TOWN OF MENASHA ZONING ORDINANCE

The following Amendatory Ordinance No. 2 was presented: TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

WHEREAS, it is desirable to amend the Zoning Ordinance of Winnebago County and the zoning map of Winnebago County provided for in said Ordinance in accordance with the request of the Town Board of the Town of Menasha;

NOW, THEREFORE, The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, does ordain that the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance and the zoning map of Winnebago County provided for in Section II of said Ordinance be and the same are hereby amended in the following respects:

1. To create, amend, change and confirm zone district boundaries in respect to the lands hereinafter described into the classification set forth at the heading of each of the following groups, to-wit:

RESIDENTIAL "A"

1. A strip 200 feet in depth along entire West side of U.S. Highway No. 10 in Sections 1-12 and 13 of T20N-R17E except for parcels zoned other than Residential "A" as shown on Official Map and as set forth in this Ordinance.

2. The West $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SE¼ SW¼ and the SW¼ SW¼ except the West 400 feet all in Section 1-T20N-R17E.

3. The Plat of Pleasant Heights except Lots 1 and 2, Block 2 and except the South 100 feet of Lot 1 and all of Lots 2 and 3 of Block 1.

4. All of the Plat of Knorr's Woods except Lot 1 of Block 1.

FIRE PREVENTION ON SOIL BANK LANDS

The following Report No. 1 was read:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Your Agricultural and Education Committee begs leave to report that a member of the State Fire Marshal's Department has met with your Committee and requested that a resolution be brought before the County Board with regard to future soil bank contracts. We have had the matter under consideration and, therefore, wish to present the following resolution:

WHEREAS, many acres of unoccupied farm lands by owners have grown up into tall matured grass and other vegetative growth, presenting a fire hazard during the spring and fall months, and

WHEREAS, many of the rural areas are not too well equipped with fire fighting equipment, and

WHEREAS, human lives, many farm buildings and fire equipment are endangered by fires from grass areas immediately adjacent to these buildings, and

WHEREAS, considerable acreage of wildlife habitat and area, tree planted areas, and forest land are endangered by these potential fire hazards on unoccupied lands;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that

1. A stipulation be included in future soil bank contracts that would require the establishment of fire prevention breaks according to the following specifications:

a. Areas shall be disced at least once between August 15 and September 15 of each year. All land that was comsidered cropland, at the time the farm was put into the Soil Bank, shall be protected by a disced fire break at least 50 feet in width—this fire break being on the outside perimeter of the land in the Soil Bank and on unoccupied farms.

b. A fire break of at least 50 feet in width shall be maintained by discing around all buildings--regardless of whether these buildings are on land in the Soil Bank or on adjoining lands.

A fire break shall also be maintained by discing, of at least 50 feet in width around woodlots and woods, tree planted areas, or wildlife developed areas.

2. The County Agricultural Stablization and Conservation Committee be requested to contact all present owners of Soil Bank land, and ask them to comply with the above fire prevention measures.

3. That copies of this resolution be sent to the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee, the State A.S.C. Office, the U.S. Senators from Wisconsin and the 6th District Representative. Dated June 6, 1961.

WHEREAS, the above mentioned department has experienced difficulty in obtaining adequately trained social workers to handle the existing demand for services and,

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare has consistently attempted to improve its services and keep abreast of advances in the field of social work and.

WHEREAS, the County Merit System has recognized this situation and has made provision for the hiring of a student caseworker for a period not to exceed 90 days and,

WHEREAS, the State Welfare Department provides the regular administrative reimbursement for this student case-worker position.

SECTION V-AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

DELETE subsection numbered eleven (11) therefrom and renumber the remaining subsections in proper sequence.

SECTION VI-B-COMMERCIAL DISTRICT "B"

Following present subsection numbered 13, ADD the following:

14. Automobile Wrecking Yards, subject to the previsions of Section XIII, Appeals, (g).

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors do ORDAIN that Sections III-A, IV, V, VI-A, VI-B and XIV be amended in the following respects:

SECTION III-A RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT "A"

At the end of said Section III, subsection 10 ADD the following paragraph:

"No premises in a Residential District shall be used to harbor more than two dogs. Puppies whelped on any such premises as the result of fortuitous mating may be retained on the premises until they are six months old and shall not be taken account of in determining the number not in excess of two dogs hereinabove permitted on such premises. No premises in a Residential District shall be used for breeding or rearing of dogs for sale or hire or for the boarding of dogs for pay."

SECTION IV RECREATIONAL DISTRICT

At the end of said Section IV, ADD the following paragraph:

"No premises in the Recreational District shall be used for the breeding or rearing of dogs for sale or hire or for the boarding of dogs for pay."

SECTION V AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

At the end of said Section V, ADD the following paragraph:

"No premises in the Agricultural District shall be used for the breeding or rearing of dogs for sale or hire or for the boarding of dogs for pay."

SECTION VI-A COMMERCIAL DISTRICT "A"

To Section VI-A, Subsection 2 at the end thereof following the word "highway" ADD the words:

'and except such uses as are hazardous and uses which are noxious by reason of the emission of smoke, gas, noise or odors."

ALSO

To the use numbered (1) thereunder at the end thereof ADD the words:

"and commercial dog kennels."

SECTION VI-B COMMERCIAL DISTRICT "B"

To Section VI-B, following use numbered 13 ADD the numeral and words:

"14. Establishments engaged in the repair, rebuilding or testing of internal combustion engines or motors other than engines or motors actually used in registered motor vehicles or in implements of husbandry."

ALSO

"15. Operation of engine or motor propelled vehicles which by reason of deficiency of equipment are incapable of being licensed for highway operations when certificate for such use is authorized as hereinafter provided in Section XIV.

SECTION XIV COUNTY ZONING OFFICER; . . . etc.

To Section XIV, Subsection 5, ADD the following paragraph:

"A certificate of occupancy and compliance in respect to use of premises for the operation of engine or motor propelled non-highway vehicles shall be issued only upon application therefor along with proof of payment of the fee hereinafter provided accompanied by a written permit for such use issued by the Town Board wherein the land to be so used is located."

This amendatory ordinance shall take effect forty (40) days from the date hereof, following the transmittal by the County Clerk of copies thereof in duplicate, as provided by law, to the Town Clerk of each of the towns wherein the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance is in effect, or upon such earlier date in such towns in respect of which the County Clerk shall receive and file a certified copy of a town board resolution approving the same.

WHEREAS, the case load of the Municipal Court for the City of Oshkosh, Winnebago County, and the Winnebago County Court has steadily expanded due to the increase in population and the shift from a rural to an urban economy and the increased use of automobiles in the county; and

WHEREAS, the Court Re-organization Program adopted by the Wisconsin Legislature and which is scheduled to go into effect January 1, 1962, will result in a large increase in the number of cases to be handled by two branches of the County Court one of which replaces the present Municipal Court: and

Court, one of which replaces the present Municipal Court; and WHEREAS, the cities of Neenah-Menasha constitute an urban area of population in excess of 32,000 people, but has no court of record sitting within said urban area; and

WHEREAS, these many problems could be resolved and while REAS, these many problems could be resolved and the citizens of Winnebago County could be better served if a third branch of the Winnebago County Court were created so as to provide additional court facilities to the citizens of the county, and privide a sitting court for the consideration of ordinance violations and small claims in the City of Menasha and in the City of Neenah; and WHEREAS, the adequate and convenient administration of

ZONING ORDINANCE-MOBILE UNITS

The following General Ordinance No. 5 was presented:

An ordinance amending the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance in respect to districts and regulatory provisions thereof.

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors do ordain that the County Zoning Ordinance be amended in the following respects:

SECTION I DEFINITIONS

To Section I, add the following definitions in appropriate alphabetical sequence:

Mobile Home: A unit which is, or was as originally constructed, designed to be transported by any motor vehicle upon a highway and designed, equipped and used primarily for sleeping, eating and living quarters, or is intended to be so used and included any additions, attachments, annexes, foundations and appurtenances.

Mobile Home Park: Any plot or plots of ground upon which two or more mobile home units occupied for dwelling or sleeping purposes are located, regardless of whether or not a charge is made for such accommodation.

SECTION II. DISTRICTS

In respect to Section II, all references as to the number of zoned districts appearing therein shall be amended to read in words and numerals "eight" (8).

Further, add in appropriate alphabetical sequence the words "Residential District C."

SECTION III A. RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT "A"

To Section III A, Item 1, add the following words after the word Residences, "but excluding tents, trailers, house cars and mobile homes, except that one mobile home may be temporarily used as a residence on a lot owned by the occupant while the dwelling is being constructed thereon pursuant to a temporary building permit issued therefor, but such use and occupancy shall not be continued for more than six months."

SECTION III C. RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT "C"

In the Residential District "C" no building or premises shall be used and no building shall hereafter be moved upon, erected or structurally altered except for one or more of the following specified uses:

1. All uses permitted in Residential Districts "A" and "B." 2. Mobile homes occupied by a single family.

HEIGHT AND AREA

Each lot, site or parcel of land upon which a mobile home is located for occupancy shall conform in all respects with the lot, area, height, side and rear yard, and set-back provisions as are provided for in Residential District "A." SECTION IV. RECREATIONAL DISTRICT

To Section IV, Item 4, add the following words after the word "Camps": "excluding mobile home parks."

SECTION V. AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT

To Section V, add Item 12 which read as follows: "Not more than one mobile home occupied by a single family related to or employed by the farm operator and permitted to use the sanitary facilities of the farmhouse, after a building permit has been issued."

SECTION VI. A. COMMERCIAL DISTRICT "A"

To Section VI A add Item 35 which reads as follows: "Not more than one mobile home occupied by a single family conforming with the height and area, and building permit requirements as specified in Residential District "C."

SECTION VI. B. COMMERCIAL "B"

To Section VI B, Item 6, after the words "Tourists camps" add the following words: "and mobile parks." After the word "tent" delete the word "or" and after the word "house car," add the words "or mobile home."

Not more than one mobile home occupied by a single family conforming with the height and area, and building permit requirement as specified in Residential District "C".

SECTION XIV. BUILDING PERMITS

To Section XIV add new Item 8 to read as follows: "Building permits shall be issued in respect to mobile homes in residential or commercial district only upon showing that adequate water supply and sanitary facilities for the disposal of wastes arc available upon the lot or premises to be occupied by such mobile home, and further that suitable plumbing, pipes and couplings are in place thereon for attachment to said mobile home."

The foregoing amendatory ordinance shall take effect forty (40) days from the date of adoption, following transmittal by the county clerk of copies thereof in duplicate as provided by law to the town clerk of each of the towns wherein the county zoning ordinance is in effect or upon such earlier date in such towns in respect of which the County Clerk shall receive and file a certified copy of a town board resolution approving the foregoing.

ACTIVITY CENTER BUILDING

The following Report No. 27 was read:

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors' Special Committee on Study of Activity Center Building herewith files its report of a study on the feasibility of a civic center building for Winnebago County.

Your committee embarked on its activities pursuant to resolution duly adopted at the Annual Meeting of the County Board one year ago. The members of the committee decided that they were not in an appropriate position to make determinations on this project of their own accord. The committee felt that it had insufficient knowledge of the desirability of this project or the public's desire in this area.

Accordingly, a survey was prepared and distributed to all known activities in our community which might have some interest in such a project. A copy of the results of this survey has been distributed to each member of this Board and is attached to this report.

Reference to the survey results demonstrate that of 683 questionnaires distributed, 246 replies were received. Of the replies received, 67 stated that they would favor a civic center building and would use it if it were built. The attached report thereafter shows a variety of answers demonstrating lesser interest.

It is the consensus of this committee that there has not been demonstrated sufficient need or desire on the part of the citizens of this county to expend tax monies for this purpose. It recognizes that a tax savings could accrue to the citizens of this county by the construction of a multipurpose facility in the place of a number of isolated, highly specialized public structures.

Because of an apparent lack of general public interest or enthusiasm in the construction of a civic center for Winnebago County at this time, it is the feeling of this committee that consideration of such a structure is premature at this time.

It is therefore the wish of this committee, the Special Committee on Study of Activity Center Building be disbanded upon the acceptance of this report and that further consideration of this proposition be held in abeyance until such time as public interest may require further study.

CENTRAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT

REPORT NO. 27:

The following Report was read:

TO THE HONORABLE, THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Your Taxation Committee and Personnel Subcommittee desires to report the results of a study in the matter of promoting efficiency and achieving economy in county operations.

After investigation and discussion, your committee has decided that certain routine tasks now being performed in the several offices of the courthouse could be more efficiently and economically performed in a central service department.

Our study has shown that in visiting the following counties they were operating as follows:

1. Brown County has a separate department which consists of the Tax Listing equipment, Multilith Offset Printing equipment, Microfilm equipment and a photostat machine which is operated for the Register of Deeds. Brown County indicated a savings of at least 50% on printing costs, and that the other duties performed by this department are more efficient. They have three men and a woman employed in this department to handle these operations.

The following were visited by the Personnel Subcommittee:

2. Outagamie County was in the process of setting up a central service department when we were there.

3. Shawano County has a department housing the Tax Listing equipment. Offset Printing equipment, Microfilm equipment and a mimeograph machine. There are two men to operate this department. 4. Wood County, at the time we visited them, was in the process of combining their Offset Printing equipment with the Tax Listing and Microfilming equipment under one department for more efficient and economical performance.

5. Waukesha County has a separate department for offset printing, but does not combine any of the other functions of the county in this department. The three employees here do all the printing for the courthouse departments. They indicate a substantial savings on printing because of the volume of work.

6. Dane County has a central service department which includes two offset printing presses and microfilming equipment. They estimated a 40 to 50% savings on their printing costs. The estimated savings are based on labor costs, depreciation on equipment, plus all service and repairs to equipment.

Further, certain related matters affecting the taxation, transfer and use of land are now being handled in widely separated offices and, we believe, that centralizing these functions would be beneficial.

Based upon these findings, your committee believes the county should establish a general services department.

Wherefore, your committee recommends adoption of the accompanying resolution.

CENTRAL SERVICE DEPARTMENT ORDINANCE

The following Ordinance No. 1 was presented:

An ordinance creating a General Services Department for the purpose of promoting administrative efficiency and effecting economies in county operations.

The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section I.

That, pursuant to Section 59.07(5) of the Wisconsin Statutes, there is hereby created a General Services Department which shall provide centralized administrative services in connection with the business and concerns of the county.

Section II.

The General Services Department shall perform functions hereinafter enumerated, as follows:

1. To provide such secretarial and stenographic services to boards and committees of the county board, and to county departments and officials, as may be requested; to design and layout, furnish in quantity, replace and revise, the routine paper forms and inclosures used in county affairs; to furnish single or multiple true copies of documents, papers and records; to copy and preserve, in full or reduced size, the permanet records of the county.

2. To take charge of and maintain the maps, equipment and records of the property tax listing department and to perform the duties heretofore carried out by that department.

3. To take charge of and maintain the county zoning map and records and perform administrative duties for the county zoning officer.

4. To take charge of and maintain the county tract index and perform administrative duties in keeping the same up to date.

5. To maintain such internal records and accounts as may be necessary or convenient for the allocation of costs of services provided hereunder.

6. To perform such other and further functions as may be directed by the county board of supervisors, from time to time.

Section III.

This ordinance establishes the policy of examination of requests for additional personnel or equipment which may be received in the future from the several county departments so as to determine whether the need therefor would be better fulfilled by the General Service Department.

Section IV.

The costs of services rendered by the General Services Department shall be charged back, on an equitable basis, against the budget appropriation of the board, committee, department, or official of the county receiving the same. Such chargebacks shall include labor, materials and capital costs so as to carry out the intent that this department be self-supporting.

Section V.

The position of head of the General Services Department is hereby established. Such department head shall be appointed bi-annually by the county board of supervisors who shall prescribe his qualifications and fix his compensation. It shall be his duty to supervise the operations of the department and to carry out the objectives of this ordinance, subject to the immediate directions of the Taxation Committee and the plenary control of the county board of supervisors.

Section VI.

It is not intended by this ordinance to interfere with, abrogate or annul any existing power or duty established by statute to be performed by any county officials or officer nor is intended hereby to abrogate, annual or in any way impair or interfere with any existing provision of law.

Section VII.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any other portion of this ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

This ordinance shall take effect at the beginning of Courthouse business hours on January 2, 1962.

JUVENILE DETENTION HOME

The following Resolution No. 26 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

At the County Board meeting of August 8, 1961, the undersigned committees, Welfare Board and Sheriff, Corner and Safety Committee, were delegated to meet jointly with the Winnebago County Juvenile Detention Study Committee. A number of meetings were held with members of the citizens' committee, and your committees wish to present the following report and resolution for your consideration. The citizens' committee has made available copies of their "Digested Report" and a copy of this report has been supplied to each member of the County Board.

We recognize the need for a family-type shelter home, for cases requiring temporary quarters, with bed facilities for up to 8 juveniles. It is anticipated that such a home could be maintained on a stand-by basis for a nominal fee, with a per diem to be paid to the owners and operators for those occasions when children are placed under their care. Your committees feel that such a shelter home could be provided at a rate of about \$150.00 per month, with a per diem charge of not more than \$3.00 per day per child.

With an annual expenditure of \$1800.00—regular fees, and \$5475.00—per diem charges, assuming 365 days at \$15.00 per day for an average daily number of 5 children, the item could be budgeted at \$5455.00 assuming a 25% state reimbursement.

II.

Secondly, we recommend an Intake Worker as an essential part of the new program, said new County employee to be attached to the Welfare Department for administrative purposes, but whose duties are to be specified by policy of the Juvenile Court, as defined by the Judge of the Juvenile Court in cooperation with the Welfare Department, and shall include the following functions:

1. Screening and referral of juvenile cases.

2. Controlling of detention under policies set down by the Juvenile Judge.

3. Supervising the processing of petitions, summonses, notices, appearances and scheduling of hearings.

We believe also, that while a master's degree in social work is recommended for an Intake Worker, this should not be a requirement for the position.

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With reference to Phase III of the citizen's committee recommendations your committees believe that more study is indicated. It is our further belief that the implementation of the first two phases of the recommendations as outlined above will alter the future needs for secure detention of Juveniles.

Additional recommendations contained in the citizen's committee report can for the most part be handled in regular course by the departments involved.

WHEREAS, there is a sufficient amount set up in the budget of the Welfare Department to (1) establish a familytype shelter care program, and (2) employ a Caseworker III to serve the Juvenile Court as Intake Worker, your committees, therefore, recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that (1) a family-type shelter home be established by the Welfare Department as recommended in the above report, and (2) a Caseworker III shall be employed by the Welfare Department to serve as Intake Worker for the Juvenile Court.

2. Churches, schools, hospitals, sanitoria and other public and quasi-public buildings may be erected to a height not exceeding 60 feet nor 5 stories, provided the front, side and rear yards required in the district in which such building is to be located are each increased at least 1 foot for each foot of additional building height above the height limit otherwise established for the district in which such building is to be located.

3. Chimneys, cooling towers, elevator bulkheads, fire towers, monuments, pent-houses, stacks, tanks, water towers, spires, wireless, television or broadcasting towers, masts or aerial antenna, telephone, telegraph and power transmission poles and lines, micro-wave relay structures and necessary mechanical appurtenances are hereby excepted from the height regulations of this ordinance and may be erected in accordance with other regulations and ordinances of Winnebago County.
