REGULAR APRIL SESSION 1962

Tuesday, April 17, 1962 Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 B of the Wisconsin Statute this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

Meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk.

New members were introduced to the Board.

Roll call showed all present.

The first order of business will be the election of a Chairman for the ensuing year.

Motion was made and seconded that the Clerk cast an unanimous ballot for Supv. Drexler as Chairman of the County Board. Carried.

The next order of business will be the election of a Vice-Chairman. Motion made and seconded that the Clerk cast an unanimous ballot for Supv. Heigl as Vice Chairman. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded that two tellers should be appointed for the following elections. Supv's Redlin and Becker were appointed.

A motion was made and seconded that the nominations be made by balloting and not from the floor, and the first ballot be informal.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Kornder: Informal ballot 46 Kornder, 2 Armstrong. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Kornder elected.

A motion was made and seconded that nominations should be made from the floor before balloting. Carried. Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Gunz: Gunz and Armstrong were nominated. Moved that nominations be closed. Gunz 48, Armstrong 4. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Gunz elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Meigher who is not on the Board. Supv. King was nominated Nominations closed. King 30, Armstrong 21. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. King elected.

Election of a member of Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Hansen: Hansen was nominated. Nominations closed.

Hansen 36, Armstrong 15. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Hansen elected.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Supv. Heigl. Heigl was nominated. Heigl 44, Armstrong 5, O'Reilly 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Heigl elected.

A member of the County School Committee to succeed Supv. Jackson: Jackson was nominated. Moved that nominations be closed. Jackson 50. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Jackson elected for 3 years.

A member of the County School Committee to succeed Mrs. Gertrude Jensen: Mrs. Jensen nominated. Nominations were closed. Mrs. Jensen 43, Armstrong 1, Brandt 2, Russ Carpenter 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Mrs. Jensen elected for 3 years.

Election of a member of the Agricultural and Education Committee to succeed Supv. Jackson: Jackson nominated. Nominations were closed. Jackson 45, Armstrong 3, O'Reilly 1, Brandt 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Jackson elected for 1 year.

Election of a member of the Agriculaural and Education Committee to succeed Supv. Miracle: Miracle nominated. Nominations were closed. Miracle 43, Heaney 1, Heiss 1, Hansen 1, Brandt 4. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Miracle elected for 1 year.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Jankowski: Jankowski and Nordquist nominated. Nominations were closed. Jankowski 28, Nordquist 17, Pitz 1, Pawlowski 1, Redlin 3, Shurbert 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Jankowski elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Sensenbrenner: Sensenbrenner and Nordquist nominated. Nominations were closed. Sensenbrenner 33, Nordquist 12, Redlin 3, Page 1, Shurbert 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Sensenbrenner elected.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Rahr. Rahr and Nordquist nominated. Nominations were closed. Rahr 29, Nordquist 20, Feustel 1, Sensenbrenner 1, R. Carpenter 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Rahr elected.

Prayer leaders were appointed by Chairman Drexler. They will be Supv's Hanson and Daggett.

Moved and seconded to adjourn until 1:30 P.M. Carried.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Meeting called to order by Chairman Joseph F. Drexler. Roll call showed all members present.

Roll call showed all members present. Rules of the Board were read.

A motion was made and seconded to add to Rule No. 3 "No Committee shall have a Majority of its membership from any one municipality." Amended "Except Personnel." Motion to table carried.

A motion was made and seconded that elected members of the board subjected to one Committee. Lost.

Motion made and seconded to refer to the Judiciary Committee for study. Carried.

A motion made and seconded that all resolutions to be acted upon should be posted on the bulletin board for study. Referred to Judiciary Committee.

Moved and seconded that the following be added to rule No. 18, "In order to be considered for payment, all committee account cards for committee work shall be submitted to the County Clerk within thirty days following the date of the particular meeting." Carried.

In Rule No. 2 the question was raised as to what establishes a quorum. Referred to the District Attorney. Carried.

In Rule No. 4, it was moved and seconded that "a vacancy in an elected committee shall be filled at the next regular session." Carried.

It was brought to the attention of the Board that the District Attorney or his assistant should be at all Board meetings, and that the County Chairman can not call a meeting until one is present. Also if no one can be present he should give in writing why he cannot attend the meeting. Motion made and seconded to table. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to accept the rules as amended. Duties of the Board were read.

The names of the Courts under the Judiciary Committee should be changed to County Court Branches I, II and III, and the duties of the Committee will be to assist the Service Officer in his Budget, and also the District Attorney.

In the duties of the Taxation Committee to include assistance to the office of the General Service Office.

Add to Welfare duties, "The duties shall be as set out in the Statutes of the State of Wisconsin together with such other duties as may be imposed upon the Committee by the County Board from time to time." Carried. Motion made and seconded to accept the rules as changed. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded that the Clerk include in the new directory the access roads to the lakes. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 10:00 A.M. Wednesday. Carried.

That Winnebago County, Wisconsin, does hereby ratify and confirm the Agency Agreement between the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission and Winnebago County, Wisconsin, dated March 15, 1961, in accordance with Section 114.32, Wisconsin Statutes, affecting this project.

SECTION IV. That the Grant Agreement referred to here-inabove shall be as follows:

WHEREAS, the Sponsor has submitted to the F.A.A. a Project Application dated May 19, 1961, for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the Winnebago County Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for such project, which Project Application, as approved by the F.A.A. is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the F.A.A. has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consisting of the following described airport development:

Construct taxiway from intersection with N-S runway to west end of E-W runway; construct intermediate connecting taxiway; construct paved apron extension (approx. 100' x 200') including tie downs; fence; install electrical ducts; grade; drain; turf.

(This development is in addition to the development included in Project Nos. 9-47-017-801, -5702 and -6003.) all as more particularly described in the property map and plans and specifications incorporated in the said Project Application;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act, as amended (49 U.S.C. 1901), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said Project Application, and its acceptance of this Offer as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport as hercin provided, THE FEDERAL AVIATION AGENCY, FOR AND ON BEHALFO OF THE UNITED STATES, HEREBY OFFERS AND AGREES to pay, as the United States' share of the allowable costs incurred in accomplishing the Project, 50 percentum thereof.

This Offer is made on and subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer shall be \$72,000.00.
 - 2. The Sponsor shall:
- (a) Begin accomplishment of the Project within thirty days after acceptance of this Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the F.A.A., with failure to do so constituting just cause for termination of the obligations of the United States hereunder by the F.A.A.;
- (b) Carry out and complete the Project without undue delay and in accordance with the terms hereof, the Federal Airport Act, and Sections 550.7 and 550.8 of the Regulations of the Federal Aviation Agency (14 CFR 550) in effect as of the date of acceptance of this Offer; which Regulations are hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations".
- (c) Carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and property map, incorporated herein, as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the F.A.A.

3. The allowable costs of the project shall not include any costs determined by the F.A.A. to be ineligible for consideration as to

allowability under Section 550.4(a) of the Regulations.

4. Payment of the United States' share of the allowable project costs will be made pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Section 550.9 of the Regulations. Final determination as to the allowability of the costs of the project will be made at the time of the final grant payment pursuant to Section 55.99(d) of the Regulations: Provided, that, in the event a semi-final grant payment is made pursuant to Section 550.9(c) of the Regulations, final determination as to the allowability of those costs to which such semi-final payment relates will be made at the time of such semi-final payment.

5. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the Airport as pro-

vided in the Project Application incorporated herein.

6. The F.A.A. reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.

7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be object to pay any part of the costs of the Project unless this Offer has been acceped by the Sponsor on or before May 15, 1962, or such subsequent date as may be prescribed in writing by the F.A.A.

- 8. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that Paragraph 9 of Part 3 Sponsor Assurances of the Project Application dated May 19, 1961, is hereby deleted in its entirety. It is recognized between the parties hereto that Section 11, Paragraph 5 of the Federal Airport Act as amended provides that the Sponsor "will furnish without cost to the Federal Government for use in connection with any air traffic control activities, or weather reporting activities and communications activities related to air traffic control, such areas of land or water, or estate therein, or rights in buildings of the Sponsor as the Administrator may consider necessary or desirable for construction at Federal expense of space or facility for such purposes." The Federal Aviation Agency has determined that no such areas, estate or rights will be required for the purposes set forth in said Paragraph 5 of Section 11 and therefore, it is further understood and agreed that the Sponsor is under no obligation to furnish any such areas, estate or rights under this Grant Agreement. However, nothing contained herein shall be construed as altering or changing the rights of the United States and or the obligations of the Sponsor under any prior Grant Agreement to furnish rent-free space for the aforementioned activities.
- 9. The F.A.A. in tendering this offer on behalf of the United States recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Winnebago, Wisconsin, and the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission, as agent, created by the Agency Agreement entered into on March 15, 1961. The Sponsor agrees that it will not amend, modify or terminate said agency Agreement without prior approval, in writing, of the F.A.A.
- 10. It is understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make, nor shall it be obligated to make, final grant payment hereunder until the Sponsor has submitted evidence satisfactory to the F.A.A. that the easement rights of the Wisconsin-Michigan Pipe Line Company have been satisfactorily subordinated to the development, operation and maintenance of the Winnebago County Airport.

11. The terms "Administrator of Civil Aeronautics", "Administrator", "Civil Aeronautics Administration", "Department of Com-

merce" or "CAA" wherever they appear in the aforesaid Project Application, plans and specifications or in any other documents constituting a part of this Agreement shall be deemed to mean the Federal Aviation Agency or the Assistant Administrator, Central Region, Federal Aviation Agency, as the case may be; any reference made in the Project Application to Section 303 of the Civil Aeronautics Act of 1938 shall be deemed to mean Section 308 of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidence by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor, as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and Acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, as provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States and the sponsor with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the airport. Such Grant Agreement shall become effective upon the Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and shall remain in full force and effect throughout the useful life of the facilities developed under the Project but in any event not to exceed twenty years from the date of said acceptance.

SECTION V. That Winnebago County, Wisconsin, does hereby ratify and adopt all statements, representations, warranties, covenants, and agreements contained in the Project Application executed May 19, 1961, on behalf of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and does hereby ratify the action of the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission in accepting said Offer on April 17, 1962, and by such acceptance. Winnebago County, Wisconsin, agrees to all the terms and conditions thereof.

Your Special Committee, appointed to study the merits of Resolution No. 29, dated October 31, 1961, concerning the possible creation of the post of "Administrative Executive", beg leave to report as follows:

We have examined the matter, particularly relating to statutory authority, and have also on file an Attorney General's special report presented at the District Attorney's Midwinter Conference at the request of our District Attorney, who submitted our resolution for an informal legal opinion.

It appears from this opinion that statutory authority for a county executive officer is, up to now, limited to Milwaukee County. However, there appears to be a considerable movement for extending such authority to other counties, perhaps to those with populations in excess of 100,000.

There was, in fact, a bill passed by the Assembly but finally tabled in the Senate, which to a large extent covered the features mentioned in Resolution No. 29.

As a committee, we feel the need is great for a county executive with duties similar to those mentioned in Resolution No. 29, to be enumerated by the County Board, and we suggest, therefore, that acceptance of this report be with instructions for your committee to pursue the matter further, with the specific objective of obtaining at least the enabling state legislation to permit the hiring of an administrative executive, should the County Board so desire.

REPORT OF PURCHASE GEER-MURRAY CO. FOR COUNTY OFFICES

The following Report No. 1 was read:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

At the last meeting of the County Board, a resolution was approved which authorized an investigation of possible new quarters for the Welfare Department, to provide for any additional growth in staff. This was referred to the Public Building Committee.

A sub-committee of the Building Committee was appointed to begin by surveying what some of our comparable neighboring counties are doing. This was done in Manitowoc, Brown and Outagamie Counties.

It was learned that Manitowoc County, with 75,000 population, has 16 employees in the Welfare Department, and is presently in need of additional space. Brown County, with 125,000 population employs 23 in the Welfare Department, which is housed in the Court House Annex, the old post office building, across the alley from the Brown County Court House. Upon inquiry, the sub-committee was told that this arrangement was not a handicap but was satisfactory. Outagamie County with a population of 101,000, employs 21 in the Welfare Department. It was indicated that additional space also was a problem with them.

Supervisor Struensee was designated to contact the Geer-Murray Company, located adjacent to the Court House on Algoma Blvd., to determine if they would consider selling their property to the County. Mr. Struensee had several conferences with Mr. Murray and a selling price was determined.

ray, and a selling price was determined.

The property is 931/4 feet wide on Algoma Blvd. and 312 feet deep with a width of about 60 feet in the rear, according to the plat. The building has three floors and a complete basement, used for keeping records. There is a gas hot air furnace. The building has 16 offices in use and two unused, most of which are very large, carpeting and drapes would be included in the sale. The Building Committee has viewed the premises and is of the opinion the building is in very good condition and would require no expense of redecoration for use by the Welfare Department, if purchased, and would satisfy any needs for a few years as is.

Your Committee believes the property should be acquired in order to straighten the property line from east to west and provide for immediate additional space for parking or for future Court House expansion in the future, if necessary.

In addition, if the Welfare Department needs further space in the future, there is room for an addition at a very small cost compared to an addition to the Court House.

WHEREAS, the intent of this resolution shall be that no such expense shall be incurred or allowed unless proper authorization as hereinafter set forth be secured and further that a restriction be placed on the number of delegates in attendance to no more than two (2) or as the County Board or Finance Committee so directs.

DEFINITION

A meeting means a one day session which does not necessitate incurring a lodging claim to the county or any other source.

AUTHORIZATION PROCEDURE

Authorization forms setting forth pertinent information will be available to all County Board Committees for requesting attendance and approval by the Finance Committee.

A. County Board Members

1. A formal request shall be presented to the County Board prior to the attendance, setting forth the members name, location, dates and the approximate cost. In the event an emergency arises between Board meetings, written request shall be made to the Finance Committee; however, the above afore-mentioned procedure will be followed.

B. Elected and Appointed Officials

 A formal request shall be presented by their respective County Board Committee to the Finance Committee, prior to their attendance.

C. All Other Employees

A formal request by the Department Head, after an approval from the respective County Board Committee shall be made to the Finance Committee.

D. Out of State

1. County Board approval shall be required before a County Board Member, Elected or Appointed Official, or any other County Employee may attend a conference, convention, school, or meeting other than in Wisconsin.

PAYMENT OF TRAVEL

Upon completion of travel expense form established by the Finance Committee, such form shall be submitted, in the case of

County Board Members, directly to the Finance Committee and and others to their respective committees for approval before being submitted to the Finance Committee.

A. Car Mileage

- 1. The established rate shall be paid for travel by the most direct route with an allowance to be made for reasonable variations due to route conditions. Such mileage shall be paid to the person whose private automobile is used on the trip. Where a number of persons are making the same trip, travel shall be in the least number of cars. Exceptions to the number of cars shall be taken into consideration by the Finance Committee before they approve or disapprove a claim.
 - Mileage shall not be paid to department heads and employees to or from their place of employment for their normal daily work, overtime, attendance at board sessions, committee and commission meetings.
 - 3. If the beginning and ending mileage is not from the locale of the office, the expense voucher should so indicate,

B. Hotels, Motels, Etc.

1. Full reimbursement for single rate lodging with a maximum of \$12.00 will be allowed upon submitting a receipted bill.

C Meals

- 1. An amount of \$8.00 will be allowed for meals and incidentals for each 24 hour period in which a receipted bill from a hotel, motel or any other place of lodging is submitted. The initial 24 hour period will commence as of the hour of departure.
- 2. When "1" above does not apply, the following maximums will be permitted for meals:

Breakfast	\$2.00
Lunch	2.00
Dinner	3.50

These are not flat allowances but maximums which might be paid if actually spent.

- 3. Receipts must be attached to the expense statement for all meals in excess of \$2.00 each.
- 4. Meals will not be reimburseable inside the boundaries of Winnebago County unless they are incurred while attending conferences, schools and conventions. Under certain meeting arragements where our county is a host or otherwise directly interested, meals may be allowed.
 - 5. The hour of departure and the hour of return shall be shown on all expense vouchers when receipts for hotel bills are submitted or when meals of 3 per day are claimed.

D. Public Transportation

1. When traveling by plane, train, or bus and costs are paid directly to the carrier by our Board Members and County Employees, tax exemption certifications should be secured from the County Clerk's Office before starting the trip and a signed copy of this certificate submitted with your travel voucher.

E. Additional Rules

- 1. Registration or Conference Fees Full reimbursement.
- 2. Banquet Tickets One (1) per conference or convention, full reimbursement. The flat \$8.00 allowance shall not apply during the 24 hour period in which the banquet falls and the other maximum meal allowances of \$2.00 or \$4.00 shall apply.

The Finance Committee reserves the right to determine the rea-

sonableness of exceptions to the above schedule.

DUTIES OF CHIEF DEPUTY

- 1. Act for Sheriff in his absence.
- 2. Be the head administrative and personnel officer within the department.
- 3. Direct investigations, internal operations and Civil process
- 4. Assign and review work of officers and employes within the department.
- 5. Prepare and make recommendations to the Sheriff and the Sheriff, Coroner & Safety Committee.
 - 6. Keep records and make reports as directed by the Committee.

7. Make complaints to the Sheriff and the Committee for disciplinary purposes against any officer he believes has acted in a manner to merit suspension, demotion or dismissal.

The intent of the above enumeration of duties is to provide, within the existing limitations of the law and the constitution, a continuity in law enforcement as it relates to the County Police organization; also to relieve the Sheriff of many details in connection with the responsibilities of that office. It is understood that all general policy and top direction will still ultimately come from the Sheriff, but that the Chief Deputy, within the authority herein, is to furnish the necessary leadership and administration on a continuing basis, to provide a more efficient operation of the department.

RANK OF CHIEF DEPUTY

The Chief Deputy shall outrank all other officers and deputies, sergeants, lieutenants or captains, but otherwise the personnel and chain of command will remain as designated in Rules and Regulations adopted January 17, 1961.

SALARY AND VACATION

The Salary of the Chief Deputy shall be determined by the County Board. A condition of the office is that no leave of absence will be granted to run for public office. The position will be considered vacant in such event.

ORDINANCE FOR CIVIL DEFENSE WELFARE SERVICES

The following Ordinance No. 1 was presented:

An Ordinance to provide authorization for the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare to participate in a civil defense program under Section 22.01(4)J, Wis. Stats.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago,

Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Any prior ordinance delegating duties to the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare to perform welfare services in relation to civilian defense is hereby repealed.

2. (a) That the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare is hereby designated to participate in the civil defense plan as organized by the county civil defense director in accordance with policies, procedures and standards of the State Department of Public Welfare and shall for such purpose have the authority to participate in any civil defense activity, whether it be a case of enemy attack, national disaster, federal alert or practice or test runs.

(b) Shall establish an approved plan for a line of succession to key agency positions for preservation and protection of essential documents and records and the protection of duplicate records; personal services and other costs related to the continuity of operations of the Public Assistance programs in an emergency, including disaster preparedness training and the development and establishment of offices essential for the resumption of operations after the emergency.

(c) That these duties shall include without limitation by reason

of enumeration:

"Feeding; clothing; housing or lodging in private and congregate facilities; registration; locating and reuniting families; care of unaccompanied children, the aged, the handicapped, and other groups needing specialized care or service; necessary financial or other assistance; counseling and referral services to families and individuals; aid to welfare institutions under national emergency or post-attack conditions; and all other feasible welfare aid and services to people in need during a civil defense emergency. Such measures include organization, direction and provision of services to be instituted before attack, in the event of strategic or tactical evacuation, and after attack in the event of evacuation or of refuge in shelters.

(d) Such other welfare services as may be delegated by the State Department of Public Welfare.

3. (a) The agency in performance of civil activities may employ additional administrative staff, either full time or part time. Such staff shall be employed under the merit system classification and salary range, pursuant to Sec. 49.50(2) to (5), and Rule PW-PA 10.

(b) The County Agency in the performance of civil defense activities may also make use of voluntary workers who shall receive no salary, but who may be paid necessary and usual out-of-pocket

expense incurred in performing this work; such payment to be made from the administration account of said agency.

There is created a fact finding commission for Winnebago County, hereinafter called "Commission," to consist of three (3) members who are not affiliated with any county or municipal employer units, or with any labor union, or organization of municipal employes, or municipal employes to be appointed by the Chairman of the County Board, subject to confirmation by said Board, for a term of three (3) years and until a successor is appointed and confirmed, provided that of the members initially appointed one shall be appointed for one (1) year, one for two (2) years, and one for three (3) years. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the remainder of the vacant term. The members of the Commission shall annually elect a chairman and secretary from their number. The County Board shall provide quarters and necessary office supplies, procedure forms, and postage for use of said Commission when in session and shall also provide stenographic service competent to report Com-mission hearings. Where such services are furnished by other than permanent county employe personnel, they shall be paid by the county upon voucher approved by the chairman of the Commission. Costs incurred for mailing and reporting Commission hearings, paid by parties to proceedings before the Commission, shall be paid over by the Commission to the county treasurer. Any member of the Commission may issue subpoenas for witnesses to appear in a hearing before it.

Section 3. COMPENSATION OF COMMISSIONERS; PETTY CASH FUND.

(1) Compensation of Commissioners. Each fact finding Commissioner shall be compensated at the rate of \$15.00 per diem for each day of six (6) hours actually and necessarily spent by him in the conduct of Commission business and pro rata for part time upon monthly voucher sworn to by him. Such compensation shall be paid by the county.

(2) Petty Cash Fund. The County Board shall annually provide a petty cash fund for the use of the Commission in the necessary transaction of its business with such provision for replenishment and accounting as the County Board shall determine. The Commission may use such fund for subpoenas issued on its own behalf and for other emergency expenses.

Section 4. FACT FINDER PANEL; QUALIFICATIONS; SELEC-TION

The Commission shall promptly after its organization select a panel of persons resident in Winnebago County, who are not affiliated with any municipal employer unit or with any labor union or organization of municipal employes, or municipal employes; to serve as fact finders when so designated. The Commission shall certify the names of such persons to the County Clerk of said county, who shall keep a record thereof. Said Commission shall formulate rules and regulations as are consistent with general personnels fiscal and budget practices of the county that are not contrary to Sec. 111.70, Stats. Such rules and regulations shall be filed with the County Clerk.

Section 5. PETITION FOR FACT FINDING.

(1) Who may file: where to file: form; number of copies; service on other party.

A petition for fact finding may be filed by a labor organization, which either has been certified by the Wisconsin Employment Rela-tions Board as the representative of the employes of Winnebago County in a collective bargaining unit, or which has been recognized by such county as the representative of its employes in a collective bargaining unit; or which has been recognized by Winnebago County as the representative of a majority of the members of a department of Winnebago County who may be required by the Commission to post a bond pursuant to Sec. 111.70 (4), (8) Stats. or by Winnebago post a bond pursuant to Sec. 111.70 (4), (8) Stats. or by Winnebago County acting by a person lawfully authorized to act in its behalf. The petition shall be prepared on a form to be furnished by the Commission of Winnebago County, the original being signed and sworn to before any person authorized to administer oaths or acknowledgments. Five (5) additional copies thereof, together with the original, shall be filed with the County Clerk of said county who shall promptly transmit same to the Chairman of the County Fact Finding Commission. The party filing the petition, shall, at the same time, cause a copy of said petition to be served on the other party or its representative by registered or certified mail. party or its representative by registered or certified mail.

(2) Contents. The petition shall include the following:

(a) The name, address and affiliation of the labor organization involved and its principal representative or, where appropriate, the name, address and principal representative of a majority of the members of the department involved.

(b) A statement that Winnebago County is the employer and that the Chairman of the County Board of said county, is the princi-

pal representative of said county.

(c) A description of the certified or recognized collective bargaining unit involved, as well as the approximate number of em-

ployes in such unit.

(d) A statement setting forth the basis of the petition, either that after a reasonable period of negotiation (the duration of which shall be stated) the parties are deadlocked, or that the party other than the petitioner has failed or refused to meet and negotiate in good faith at the state of the stat good faith at reasonable times in a bona fide effort to arrive at a settlement.

- (e) A statement to the effect, that within the knowledge of the petitioner, said deadlock or failure or refusal to meet and negotiate in good faith at reasonable times in a bona fide effort to arrive at a settlement, does not involve discipline or discharge cases under civil service provisions of a state statute or ordinance of Winnebago County.
- (f) A clear and concise statement of facts constituting said alleged deadlock or said failure or refusal to meet and negotiate in good faith.

(g) Any other relevant facts.

(3) Withdrawal of petition. A petition may be withdrawn only with the consent of the Fact Finding Commission of Winnebago County under conditions similar to those established by Wisconsin Employment Relations pursuant to its Rule ERB 14.03.

Section 6. COMMISSION INVESTIGATION.

(1) Scope. After a petition has been filed the Commission shall make an investigation to determine whether or not:

(a) The parties are deadlocked after a reasonable period of

negotiation; or

(b) Either party has failed or refused to meet and negotiate at reasonable times in a bona fide effort to arrive at a settlement.

(2) Nature. Who shall conduct. The investigation shall be in the form of a formal hearing conducted by the Commission unless the parties stipulate the material facts and waive the formal hearing. To assist the Commission in its conduct of the hearing the Commission may assign a Board agent to conduct an informal investigation prior to the hearing.

(3) Informal investigation. It shall be the duty of the Commission agent conducting the informal investigation to ascertain facts essential to the investigation by interviewing the parties, their representatives, or other parties or persons having knowledge of the matter and by the examination of any documents, correspondence, or any other like material pertaining to the matter. The Commission agent shall not retain in his possession the original of any documents correspondence, or any other like material, which might be presented as evidence in a formal Commission hearing. Upon completion of his investigation the Commission agent shall report his findings to the Commission either orally or in writing, as the Commission may direct.

(4) Consolidation of Proceedings. Whenever the Commission deems it necessary in order to effectuate the purposes of s. 111.70 Stats., or to avoid unnecessary costs, delay, multiplicity of proceedings, the Commission may consolidate fact finding proceedings.

(5) Notice of Formal Hearing by Commission on Petition.

- (a) When issued; contents. If the formal hearing is not waived by the parties, after the receipt and consideration of the Commission agent's investigation report, the Commission shall issue and serve, upon each of the parties, a notice of hearing at a place feasible in the jurisdiction of the municipal employer involved, on a date and at such time as therein fixed.
- (b) Amendment or withdrawal. Any such notice of hearing may be amended or withdrawn at any time before the close of the hearing by the Commission or the Commission agent conducting the hearing.

Section 7. HEARINGS BEFORE COMMISSION.

(1) Scope and nature. The Commission hearing in fact finding cases shall be limited to pertinent matters necessary to establish

the facts to determine whether, after a reasonable period of negotiation, the parties are deadlocked; or, whether the municipal employes or labor organization has failed or refused to meet and negotiate in good faith at reasonable times in a bona fide effort to arrive at a settlement. Such hearing shall be public.

(2) Who shall conduct. The hearing may be conducted by the full Commission or any member or members thereof, all acting on behalf of the Commission. At any time a hearing officer may be substituted for the hearing officer previously presiding. A record shall be kept of all evidence introduced at such hearing.

(3) Certification of Results of Investigation on Petition for Fact

Finding.

(a) When Issued. After consideration of the record adduced in the hearing, or the stipulation of facts where hearing has been waived by the parties the Commission shall issue a certification of its determination with respect to the question as to whether or not a fact finding should be initiated.

(b) Contents of Certification. Said certification shall contain findings of fact and conclusions with regard to the investigation, either initiating fact finding or dismissing the petition, or either action, consistent with the purpose of the Act (s. 111.70) (4) as the Commission may deem appropriate.

(c) Appointment of Fact Finder. If the certification requires that fact finding should be initiated, the Commission shall appoint from the panel provided for in Section 5 of this ordinance, a fact finder

and such appointment shall appear in said certification.

(d) Service of Certification; Record. A copy of the Commission's certification shall be immediately served upon the parties, and, if a fact finder is designated, upon the fact finder selected. The Commission shall also therewith transmit to the fact finder a copy of any written informal investigation report, and a copy of the record before the Commission in the matter.

Section 8. HEARINGS BEFORE FACT FINDER.

(1) Notice of Hearing. Following the receipt of notification of his appointment as fact finder, the fact finder shall issue and serve upon each of the parties, a notice of hearing at a place feasible in the jurisdiction of the municipality involved at a date and at such time as therein fixed.

(2) Amendment or Withdrawal. Any such notice of hearing may be amended or withdrawn at any time before the close of the hearing

by the fact finder.

(3) Scope and nature of hearing. The hearing shall be public, shall concern pertinent matters necessary for the fact finder to determine the facts in the dispute and which, in the opinion of the fact finder, assists him in reaching his recommendation for the solution of the dispute.

(4) Rescheduling Hearing. Upon his own motion, or upon proper cause shown by any of the parties, the fact finder may prior to the opening of the hearing reschedule the date of such hearing.

(5) Transcripts. Hearings shall be stenographically reported and transcripts. Hearings snan be stenographically reported and transcribed unless waived by both parties and consented to by the fact finder. Such transcripts shall be the sole official transcript. Costs involved for the original of such transcript shall be borne equally by the parties. Copies of the transcript shall be available to the parties and the sall be a rate of the Sec. 282 90 Wisconsin the parties and the public at rates as set by Sec. 252.20 Wisconsin Statutes

Section 9. FACT FINDING REPORT.

(1) Issuance. After the close of the hearing the fact finder shall prepare and make a fact finding report.

(2) Contents, Such report shall contain:

(a) A statement of findings of fact and conclusions on all material issues presented on the record:

(b) Recommendations for the solution of the dispute;

- (c) A memorandum stating the reasons for such findings, conclusions and recommended solutions.
- (3) Service. Upon the completion of this report the fact finder shall file the original with the Commission and shall cause copies of the same to be served on the parties.

Section 10. COMPENSATION OF FACT FINDER.

The fact finder designated by the Commission to conduct the fact finding proceeding shall be entitled to a per diem compensation for days spent in hearing of \$50 per day, and for days spent in preparing and issuing his report of \$50 per day. He shall also be compensated for ordinary expenses incurred for travel, meals, room allowance, and other necessary expenses incurred in the proceeding. One-half of such compensation shall be paid by the municipal employer and one-half by the union.

Section 11.

This ordinance shall take effect on passage and publication. As soon as the county fact finding commissioners have been appointed and confirmed and after said Commission has certified the panel of fact finders as provided in this ordinance, a certified copy of this ordinance and of the fact of such appointments shall be transmitted by the County Clerk to Wisconsin Employment Relations Board, Madison, Wisconsin.

Section 12. SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this ordinance are severable.

If any provision of the ordinance is invalid, or if the application to any person or circumstance is invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.

The following Resolution No. 55 was presented: TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

WHEREAS, the purpose of this resolution is to establish an orderly procedure for the authorization of travel or attendance at conventions, conferences, schools, and meetings on behalf of the county and for re-imbursements to County Board members, elected and appointed officials, and all other employees for expenses incurred as a result of such travel or attendance; and

WHEREAS, the intent of this resolution shall be that no such expense shall be allowed unless proper authorization as hereinafter set forth be secured, and further, that a restriction be placed on the number of delegates to any event, other than regular meetings, to no more than two (2) persons or as the County Board may direct or otherwise order. (Definition of "Meeting" — A "meeting" means a one-day session which does not necessitate incurring a lodging claim to the county or any other source).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the following Rules & Regulations covering authorization for conferences and conventions be enacted.

I. GENERAL CONDITIONS

A. County Board Members

Prior to any event at which it would be advantageous for the county to be represented, a written request shall be made to the County Board by the interested committee setting forth all facts and estimates of probable expense. Emergency situations are to be handled as set forth under County Board Rule III, requiring County Board Chairman approval.

B. Elected and Appointed Officials

A written request shall be presented to the County Board by their respective County Board Committee prior to their attendance. Emergency requests between County Board meetings must be approved by the Board Chairman or the Finance Committee.

C. All Other Employees

Written requests to be made by department head, and approved by the committee to which the department is attached.

D. Out of State

County Board approval shall be required before a County Board member, elected or appointed official, or any other county employee may attend a conference, convention, school outside the state of Wisconsin, except again in emergency as set forth in County Board Rule III, requiring County Board Chairman approval.

E. Authorization Procedure

Authorization forms setting forth pertinent information will be available to all County Board Committees concerning events to be attended. Where County Board approval has been given, no other approval is necessary.

II. PAYMENT OF TRAVEL

Forms shall be provided for properly presenting expense accounts which are to be OK'd by proper committee action before submission to the Finance Committee, for approval.

III. RATE GUIDE

A. Car Mileage

- 1. Rates established by statute or county ordinance shall be paid for travel by the most direct route with an allowance to be made for reasonable variations due to route conditions. Such mileage shall be paid to the person whose private automobile is used. Where a number of persons are making the same trip, travel shall be in the least number of cars.
- 2. Mileage shall not be paid to department heads and employees to or from their place of employment for their normal daily work, overtime, attendance at board sessions, committee and commission meetings.
- 3. If the beginning and ending mileage is other than from the locale of the county office, the expense voucher should so indicate.
 - B. Hotels, Motels, etc.

Full reimbursement for single rate lodging with a maximum of \$12.00 will be allowed upon submitting a receipted bill.

C. Meals

1. An amount up to \$8.00 will be allowed for meals and incidentals for each 24-hour period for which a receipted bill from a hotel, motel or any other place of lodging is submitted. The initial 24-hour period will commence as of the hour of departure.

2. When "1" above does not apply, the following maximums

will be permitted for meals:

2.00 Breakfast 2.00 Lunch 3.50 Dinner

These are not flat allowances but maximums which will be allowed if actually spent.

3. Receipts must be attached to the expense statement for

all meals in excess of \$2.00 each. 4. Meals taken inside the boundaries of Winnebago County will not be reimburseable unless they are incurred while attending conferences, schools and conventions. Under some conditions. where our county is host or where situations develop in which the county is so obligated, meals may be allowed.

5. The hour of departure and the hour of return shall be shown on all expense vouchers when receipts for hotel bills are

submitted or when meals of 3 per day are claimed.

D. Public Transportation

- 1. When traveling by plane, train, or bus, and costs are paid directly to the carrier by our Board members and county employees, tax exemption certifications should be secured from the County Clerk's office before starting the trip and a signed copy of this certificate submitted with your travel voucher.
 - E. Additional Rules
 - 1. Registration or conference fees full reimbursement.
- 2. Banquets full reimbursement. The flat \$8.00 daily allowance shall not apply.
- 3. Wherever there may be conflict between these rules and state statutes, such statutes, of course, shall apply. Also, necessary trips of any official shall be at his own discretion.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this policy becomes effective January 1, 1963, and that all prior resolutions pertaining to this policy be rescinded.

GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY RELATING TO PROPERTY ACQUIRED IN THE ENFORCEMENT OF DELINQUENT TAX LIENS, AND REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES RELATING TO THE CARE AND RENTAL OF PROPERTY TAKEN OVER BY TAX DEED BY THE COUNTY

The following General Ordinance was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.

All prior ordinances relating to the care and rental of property taken over by tax deed by the county and amendments thereto are hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

SECTION II.

Sale of Tax Deeded Lands Other Than By Preference to Former Owner, Pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 75.35 (2) (a), 1961:

- (a) The appraisal price of tax deeded lands shall be determined by an appraisal committee consisting of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and the supervisor of the ward, town or village in which said property is located and approved by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.
- (b) The sale price of all tax deeded lands except the sale of tax deeded lands to former owner by preference pursuant to Wis. Stats., Scc. 75.35 (3), 1961, shall be approved by the Taxation Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.
 - (c) The County Treasurer of Winnebago County shall have the power to convey tax deeded land by land contract or by quit claim deed pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 75.35 (2) (a), 1961, after the requirements of subsections (a) and (b) have been completed.

SECTION III.

Preference to Former Owner to Repurchase, Pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 75.35 (3):

- (a) The County Treasurer of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, shall have the power to give preference in the right to purchase any parcel of tax deeded lands, except those lands included in subsection (d), to the former owner who lost his title through delinquent tax collection enforcement procedure, or his heirs, with the approval of the supervisor of the ward, town or village in which the property is situated and the County Clerk.
- (b) The selling price of any such parcel sold under this section shall not be less than the total taxes paid by the county in taking the tax deed plus interest to the date of the tax deed and any

other taxes, special assessmens or charges for which the county may be liable by having taken the tax deed.

(c) The sale of such lands shall be exempt from all provisions of Wis. Stats.. Sec. 75.69, 1961.

(d) This section of the ordinance shall not apply to tax deeded lands which have been improved for or dedicated to a public use by Winnebago County subsequent to the acquisition thereof.

SECTION IV.

General:

(a) The purchase price of any lands sold under this ordinance shall be subject to the current rate of interest charged by recognized lending institutions.

(b) The purpose of this ordinance is to grant certain optional powers to the County Treasurer of Winnebago County as are provided in Wis. Stats., Sec. 75.35, 1961, and is not intended to enumerate all the requirements for the enforcement of de inquent tax liens.

(c) This ordinance shall take effect upon passage by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.
