Tuesday, April 18, 1967

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 B of the Wisconsin Statutes this April session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the board.

Meeting was called to order by the Chairman Joseph F. Drexier. Roll Call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisors Shurbert and Thomsen. Skalmoski excused.

The meeting was opened by saluting the flag and prayer by Supervisor Hanson.

The first order of business was the election of members for the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Luebke and seconded that nominations be made from the floor and the first ballot be declared informal and the second ballot be made formal. Carried by Acclamation.

The election of a member for the Highway Committee to succeed A. J. Kornder. Motion made by Supervisor Coughlin and seconded that A. J. Kornder be nominated for a member of the Highway Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Sensenbrenner and seconded that nominations be closed. Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for A J. Kornder. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and A. J. Kornder was elected as a member of the Highway Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member for the Highway Committee to succeed Gordon M. Hanson. Motion made by Supervisor Daggett and seconded that Gordon M. Hanson be nominated for a member of the Highway Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Coughlin and seconded that the nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Gordon M. Hanson. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Gordon M. Hanson was elected as a member of the Highway Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member for the Highway Committee to succeed Lyle Raddatz. Motion made by Supervisor Carpenter and seconded that Lyle Raddatz be nominated for a member of the Highway Committee. The ballot was so cast and Arthur E. Struensee elected as a member of the Highway Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Highway Committee to succeed Clarence Loehning. Motion made by Supervisor Pawlowski and seconded that Clarence Loehning be nominated for a member of the Highway Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Clarence Loehning. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Clarence Loehning elected as a member of the Highway Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee to succeed Archie E. Daggett. Motion made by Supervisor Loehning and seconded that Archie E. Daggett be nominated as a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Hanson and seconded that nomination be closed and the clerk instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Archie E. Daggett. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Archie E. Daggett elected as a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee to succeed Max Carpenter. Motion made by Supervisor Kornder and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for George Hunter. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and George Hunter elected as a member of the Agriculture and Education Committee for a term of one year.

Motion made by Supervisor Loehning and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unani-

mous ballot for Frank H. Metzig. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Frank H. Metzig elected as a member of the Welfare Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Welfare Committee to succeed Henry A. Jankowski. Motion made by Supervisor Tappan and seconded that Henry A. Jankowski be nominated as a member of the Welfare Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Luebke and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Henry A. Jankowski. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Henry A. Jankowski elected as a member of the Welfare Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Welfare Committee to succeed R. M. Sensenbrenner. Motion made by Supervisor Pawlowski and seconded that R. M. Sensenbrenner be nominated as a member of the Welfare Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Steinhilber and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for R. M. Sensenbrenner. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and R. M. Sensenbrenner elected as a member of the Welfare Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Welfare Committee ot succeed Carl Rahr. Motion made by Supervisor Daggett and seconded that Carl Rahr be nominated as a member of the Welfare Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Fuller and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Carl Rahr. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Carl Rahr elected as a member of the Welfare Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a member of the Welfare Committee to succeed Ray J. Toner. Motion made by Supervisor Pinckley and seconded that Ray J. Toner be nominated as a member of the Welfare Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Loehning and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Ray J. Toner. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Ray J. Toner elected as a member of the Welfare Committee for a term of one year.

Election of a trustee for the Fox Valley Extension Center to succeed Orrin King. Motion made by Supervisor Sensenbrenner that Orrin King be nominated as a trustee for the Fox Valley Extension Center. Motion made by Supervisor Hanson and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for Orrin King. Carried by Acclamation. The ballot was so cast and Orrin King elected as a trustee for the Fox Valley Extension Center for a term of two years.

The next order of business was the consideration of the rules governing the board.

#### PROPOSED REVISION OF COUNTY BOARD RULES

REPORT NO. 1. Proposed revision of rules for the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County was presented. Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to accept the report, and the clerk to proceed with the reading of the rules.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that Rule No. 7 should be changed from flag salute to pledge of Allegiance. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Fuller and seconded that Rule No. 6 should be changed as follows: "In the absence of both the chair-

man and vice-chairman, the County Clerk shall preside until a chairman pro-tem is elected. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that Rule No. 10 be changed as follows: "Section 22 instead of 23." Carried by Acclamation. Motion made by Supervisor Hanson and seconded that word "abstain" be deleted. Motion made by Supervisor Hanson that his previous motion be withdrawn. Carried.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that Rule No. 16 be amended as follows: "A unanimous oral vote shall be considered and recorded as an affirmative unanimous roll call vote." Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Williams and seconded that in Rule No. 23 the word "removed" by stricken and "moved" inserted. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Putzer and seconded that the Roman numerals be eliminated and the Arabic number be used. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the rules be renumbered as follows: Proposed Rule 38 should be 37; old Rule 37 be changed to 38 and new Rule 39 be inserted.

Motion made by Supervisor Steinhilber and seconded that in Rule No. 1, the time of starting for board meetings be changed from 9:30 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. Ayes 26, Nayes 17, — Altmann, Christoph, Gischia, Hanson, Ilk, Kampo, Luebke, Pawlowski, Pitz, Priem, Ristow, Sensenbrenner, Schultz, Stafteld, Steffin, Tappan and Toner. Excused 2 — Ales and Skalmoski. Absent 2 — Shurbert and Thomsen. Carried.

Motion made by Supervisor Fuller and seconded that in Rule No. 37 the following be inserted after the word "thereon:" A new sentence inserted to read as follows: "This shall be the duty of the County Clerk." Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the rules as amended be adopted. Carried by Acclamation.

Supervisor Jankowski raised the question on the payment of more than one per diem. The Corporation Council informed the Board members that travel time for not more than two meetings could be paid.

Motion made by Supervisor Engler and seconded that the duties of the committees not be read. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to adopt the duties with the specified changes listed. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the Finance Committee be instructed to the study, with views to providing for travel pay for board meetings and not more than two committee meetings the same day. Carried by Acclamation.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the board adjourn until 2 P.M. for the appointment of Committees. Carried by Acclamation.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

2 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Joseph F. Drexler. Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisors Shurbert, Thomsen. Excused Kampo, Priem, and Skalmoski. Chairman Joseph F. Drexler addressed the board stating that after careful consideration of the committees, it has been decided that they will remain the same with the exception of the County Park, Recreation and Conservation Committee. Supervisor Becher will become the new chairman and Supervisor Ristow the Vice-Chairman.

#### NEW WELFARE BUILDING

REPORT NO. 2. The report of the Alterations or Remodeling Committee on the new welfare department building was read. Motion made by Supervisor Steinhilber and seconded that the report be accepted. Mr. Robert Yarbro, architect for the new building, addressed the board members and explained the three plans for the new building with approximate cost and floor plans. The supervisors expressed their views and asked questions of Mr. Yarbro. Report accepted by Acclamation.

## APPROVE PLANS, AUTHORIZE ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS, LET CONTRACTS—NEW WELFARE DEPARTMENT BUILDING

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, your Courthouse Alterations or Remodeling Committee has made its report this date and has recommended the construction of a completed three floor building and a basement to house the Wlefare Department and the local office of the State Probation and Parole Department,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Courthouse Alterations or Remodeling Committee be, and it hereby is, authorized to proceed with the following in regards the construction of a new Welfare Department Building:

- 1. Request the architect to draft specifications for the plans submitted this date providing for a completed three floor building and a basement.
- 2. Advertise and receive bids for the construction of said building in accordance with preliminary plans dated April 7, 1967, and approved by the Courthouse Alterations or Remodeling Committee and the Welfare Board.

WHEREAS, the reorganization of the County Board has reduced its number; and

WHEREAS, the operation of county government and its branches has become increasingly complex; and

WHEREAS, other counties are presently considering reorganization of county government in order to more effectively administer the many county functions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Chairman of the County Board appoint a committee composed of not more than 5 members of the County Board, to the County Board, or his nominee, and the County Corporation Counsel, to inquire into the feasibility of centralizing the administration of county government and particularly to provide continuity and coordination of all functions of county government in Winnebago County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said Committee make a preliminary report of its progress to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors not later than sixty days after the Committee is appointed.

of aquatic weeds is proposed.

SPECIAL BOARD MEETING Tuesday, July 25, 1967

Meeting called to order by the Chairman Joseph F. Drexler.

Pursuant to a written request for a special meeting signed by a majority of the supervisors of the County Board of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and delivered to the County Clerk on July 17, 1967 a special meeting of the County Board of Winnebago County was called to order by the Chairman of the Board at 10:00 A.M., on July 25th, 1967 at the Winnebago County Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, the time and place specified in such request, the primary purpose for this special meeting was to consider and adopt a resolution to increase that portion of the runway at the Winnebago County Airport that was 8 inches in thickness to 10 inches, thereby making the complete runway 10 inches in thickness; to delete the holding apron of the south end of the new North-South taxiway and also delete 90-degree taxiway of the north-end of the runway, replacing it with a high speed turn-off; and any other business that may legally come before the board.

## CHANGE IN CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW NORTH-SOUTH RUNWAY & PARALLEL TAXIWAYS

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

Your Committee begs leave to report that the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission has recommended the following changes in the construction of the new North-South runway and parallel taxiways, to wit:

- 1. Realign access taxiways at the North end of the North-South runway to provide high speed turn-off.
- 2. Delete the holding apron on the South end of the new North-South taxiway.
- 3. Presently the entire taxiway is designed for 10-inch thickness as well as the first 500 feet of each end of the new North-South runway. It is now proposed to increase the thickness of the

remaining 5700 feet of the North-South runway from 8 inches to 10 inches.

The net cost to the county to accomplish item 1 and item 2 will be \$697.00. The total cost of increasing the thickness of the runway as indicated in item 3 will be \$54,233.68 of which amount the Federal Aviation Agency will participate to the extent cf \$12,797.00, leaving a net cost to the county of \$41,436.68. The combined total cost to the county therefore will be \$42,133.68.

WHEREAS, your committee along with the Airport Manager feel that this is a justifiable and necessary expenditure in view of a recent disclosure that an 8 inch concrete has not been standing up under constant use by some of the later model jets; and

WHEREAS, we are informed by the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission that funds already appropriated are very ample to absorb this additional cost,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the recommendations of the Wisconsin State Aeronautics Commission are hereby confirmed and that the Aviation Committee is authorized to proceed immediately.

WHEREAS, Winnebago County, having filed a petition under Sec. 114.33 (2) Wis. Stats. with the Division of Aeronautics to

sponsor an airport development project to be constructed with federal and state aid; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Aeronautics having made a generally favorable finding under Sec. 114.33 (2) Wis. Stats., to the development petitioned for, and said finding having been approved by the Governor on September 18, 1967; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 114.33 (2) further provides that on receipt cf such finding the sponsors shall take action to provide their share of the cost, and shall promptly notify the Division of Aeronautics; and

WHEREAS, the project covered by this resolution is the construction of a new control tower at the Winnebago County Airport at a total cost of \$342,750.00 and the division of costs for the project is as follows:

WHEREAS, the proposed Control Tower project is estimated to be completed in the year 1968, therefore, Winnebago County will be required to provide a sum equal to 10 per cent of the Federal grant, or \$15,837.50, until the project is satisfactorily completed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Winnebago County's share of the cost of construction of a new control tower at the Winnebago County Airport, all in accordance with the finding in the matter of the development of the said airport dated September 18, 1967, shell be provided as follows:

### DESIGNATING THE DIVISION OF AERONAUTICS AS ITS AGENT

The following Resolution No. 3 was presented: Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, the said Winnebago County, being a municipality of the State of Wisconsin, authorized by law (Section 114.11, Wis. Stats.) to acquire, establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain and operate an airport, and being an eligible sponsor of an airport development project with federal aid as provided by Section 2 (a) (7) of the Federal Airport Act, and having initiated a federal and state aid airport development project, namely the Winnebago County Airport project, by petition filed with the Division of Aeronautics: and the hearing in the matter hving been held and a finding generally favorable to the development petitioned for having been rendered by the division, including an approximate estimate of the costs and the amount to be paid by the County of Winnebago: all as provided by Section 114.33, Wis. Stats.: and the County of Winnebago desiring as sponsor to develop the said airport project, and having acted toward providing its share of the estimated cost and notified the division as required by law: and desiring to proceed as provided by the applicable regulations of the federal aviation agency.

AND IT BEING PROVIDED BY LAW (Section 114.32 (5), Wis. Stats.) that no county, city, village or town in this state shall submit to the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Agency of the United States any project application under the provisions of the Federal Airport Act unless the project and the Project Application have been first approved by the Division, and that no county, city, village or town shall directly accept, receive, receipt for or disburse any funds granted by the United States under the Federal Airport Act, but shall designate the Division as its agent and in its behalf to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse such funds, and enter into an agreement with the Division prescribing the terms and conditions of the Division's functions under such agency in accordance with the federal laws, rules and regulations and applicable laws of this state:

And the Division being authorized (Section 114.32 (1), Wis. Stats.) to accept, receive and receipt for federal monies and other monies on behalf of the state or any municipality thereof for the acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance and operation of an airport and other aeronautical facilities upon such 'erms and conditions as are or may be prescribed by the laws of the United States, and to render financial assistance to sponsors in matching federal aid (Section 114.35 (1), Wis. Stats.) and to act as agent of any municipality of the state upon its request, in accepting, receiving and receipting for such monies in its behalf for airports, and in contracting for the acquisition, improvement, maintenance or

operation of airports financed either in whole or in part by federal monies; and the governing body of any municipality being authorized to designate the Division as its agent for such purposes and enter into an agreement with it prescribing the terms and conditions of such agency;

The said grantor further agrees that all costs incurred through the modification of said line to obtain proper depth of land cover and to conform to airport expansion requirements, shall be borne by the Grantor.

The grantor agrees that it will not start construction, repair, excavation, or exercise any of its rights on parcels of land described above, without first notifying airport authorities, except in case of emergency repair, and in such case notice shall be given as soon as possible, and any such work will be accomplished as expeditiously as practicable, with a minimum of interference to the maintenance and operation of the airport.

The grantee agrees that it shall not hereafter use or authorize use of the land described in such manner as to create electrical or electronic interference with radio transmission or reception between any air navigational or aviation communications installation upon or in the vicinity of Winnebago County Airport and aircraft, or as to make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others, or as to otherwise impair pilots visual perception in the vicinity of the airport or as to otherwise endanger the landing, taking off, or maneuvering of aircraft in the vicinity of said airport.

- 2. All of Government Lots 3 and 4 and that part of the East ½ of SE¼ lying North of County Trunk "B" including Poygan Lakeview Plat all in Section 10-T19N-R14E to Residential "A" District.
- 3. All of Government Lots 1 and 2 including the plat of Poygan Beach all in Section 10-T19N-R14E to Residential "A" district.

All that part of Government Lot 1 of Section 16-T19N-R14E lying North of County Trunk "B" except commencing in centerline of Highway "B" 255.75 feet West of East line of said Lot 1, place of beginning, North to point 1032 feet North of South line of Lot 1, West 340 feet, South 72 degrees 45' West 240 feet, South 17 degrees 15' East to centerline of Highway "B," easterly along centerline of County Trunk "B" to beginning, to Residential "A" District.
- 8. All of Government Lots 3 and 4 and that part of the NW¼ SE¼ and NE¼ SE¼ of Section 17-T19N-R14E lying North of County Trunk "B" to Residential "A" District.
- 9. All of Government Lots 1 and 2 and NE¼ SW¼ of Section 17-T19N-R14E to Residential "A" District.

- 15. A strip 200 feet in depth along both sides of County Trunk "DD" and running East from the West line of the East ½ of Section 33 to East line of the Town of Poygan to Residential "A" District.
- 16. A strip 200 feet in depth along the North side of County Trunk "D" and lying within the limits of the SW¼ NW¼ of Section 30-T19N-R14E to Residential "A" District.
- 17. A strip 200 feet in depth along both sides of County Trunk "K" and running the entire length of the North ½ of Section 29-T19N-R14E to Residential "A" District.
- 18. A strip 200 feet in depth along both sides of County Trunk "F" except for areas zoned Commercial to Residential "A" District.
- 19. A strip 200 feet in depth along both sides of all town roads except Haase Road, Lake Poygan Road and that part of old County Trunk "D" lying within Sections 20 and 21 and except for areas zoned Commercial as shown on the official map and as set forth in this ordinance, to Residential "A" District.

Whenever a county has paid for legal representation of an indigent defendant and the county board so requires the clerk of the court wherein representation for the indigent was appointed shall prepare, sign and file in the office of the register of deeds, in a record book there to be kept for the purpose, a certificate stating the name and residence of the indigent beneficiary, the amount paid by the county for his legal representation, the date when paid, the court and county in which his case was heard and such other information as the county board directs. When a claim is so filed within 6 months after payment is made by the county it may, any time within 10 years after such filing, commence an action to recover from the indigent defendant, or his estate if the action is commenced within the time set for filing claims by creditors, the amount paid by the county for his legal representation. In any such action the 10 year statute of limitations and s. 313.08, so far as applicable, may be pleaded in defense. Such claim shall not take precedence over the allowances in s. 313.15. It is the duty of the district attorney to commence and prosecute all actions and proceedings necessary under this section to make such recovery when it appears that the indigent defendant or his estate is able to pay the claim."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the Clerk of Court for Winnebago County be and he hereby is required to prepare, sign and file in accordance with 957.263 hereinabove referred to the necessary certificate stating the name and residence of the indigent beneficiary, the amount paid by the County for his legal representation, the date when paid, the court and county in which the case was heard and such other incidental information he may deem helpful for use in the recovery of the funds paid and that all such claim certificates shall be filed with the Register of Deeds within six months after payment is made by the County.

#### COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

Mr. Graf explained the financial statement of the department, showing funds available, revenues and expenditures from January 1, 1967, to December 31st, 1967. Supervisor Hanson commended Mr. Graf on his efficient work as Highway Commissioner and asked that the report be accepted and placed on file. Carried by Acclamation.

Mr. Morris stressed the importance of the adoption of the Floodplain and Shoreland Zoning Ordinance and stated that the dead-line for this ordinance as May 31st, 1968.

#### CREATION OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the County Board has appointed a Reorganization Committee which Committee has made a study of County government and has reported its findings and recommendations to this Board; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with its recommendations the said Reorganization Committee was directed to prepare a resolution creating an Executive Committee in the manner described in the report of such Reorganization Committee

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, as follows:

#### 1. CREATION OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There shall be created a Committee consisting of eleven (11) members who shall be the Chairman and Vice Chairman of the County Board, together with nine (9) Supervisors selected in the manner hereinafter provided.

#### 2. DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall have the following duties:

#### A. Finance

- (i) Recommend and tabulate the County Budget for publication and presentation at the annual session of the County Board.
- (ii) Unless otherwise provided by the statutes of Wisconsin, to examine accounts regularly and settle and allow current accounts and claims not in excess of \$2,500.00 on any one such account, and to authorize issuance of County orders therefor.
- (iii) Audit and allow mileage and per diem for Board and Committee meetings.
- (iv) Advise the County Treasurer and County Board Committees, Trustees and Agencies regarding investment of County funds and other matters relating to County finances.
- (v) Authorize expenditures not to exceed \$1,000 00 for any one item in any emergency arising between Board sessions.
- (vi)) Determine the insurance requirements of County interests in accordance with the statutes and resolutions of the County Board and report annually to the County Board.
- (vii) Review and recommend to the County Board a schedule of fees and charges for County services.

#### B. Personnel

- (i) Receive all personnel requests from other Committees for study and recommendation to the County Board.
- (ii) Negotiate on behalf of Winnebago County with authorized representatives of County employees, and meet from time to time with County employees, or their representatives, with respect to grievances, salaries and other benefits.
- (iii) Recommend to the County Board a salary schedule for elected officers and officials of Winnebago County, in acocordance with the requirements of the Wisconsin Statutes; recommend a salary schedule for all appointed officials and other employees of Winnebago County unless otherwise determined by agreement or statute.
- (iv) Appoint a sub-committee on labor relations and prescribe the duties of such sub-committee.

#### C. County Board

- (i) Report to County Board all action taken by Committee since previous report including a reference to the vote of the committee on such action.
  - (ii) Prepare Agenda for County Board meetings.
- (iii) Perform all additional functions and duties specifically delegated by the County Board.

#### D. Additional Duties

- (i) Receive all requests and communications not specifically addressed to any Committee or official of the County and refer such matters to the appropriate Committees of officials, and, where applicable, include its recommendations with such referral.
- (ii) Receive copies of all minutes of other Committees and Boards; determine that the action of such Committees and Boards has been implemented.
- (iii) Apprise the County Board of all legislative matters affecting County government.
- (iv) Supervise codification of Couunty Board ordinances and resolutions.
- (v) Act as planning commission to study long-range problems of County and recommend solutions to the Board.
- (vi) Prepare rules for its own operation which shall be presented to the County Board for its approval; any amendments thereto shall be subject to County Board approval.

### 3. SELECTION OF COMMITTEE MEMBERS IN ADDITION TO COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN

#### A. Members

One member from each of the following committees, to be designated by each respective committee not later than the 15th day of May following the organization meeting of the county board:

- (i) Aviation
- (ii) Parks. Recreation and Conservation
- (iii) Institutions
- (iv) Judiciary
- (v) Public Building
- (vi) Sheriff, Coroner and Safety
- (vii) Social Services Board
- (viii) Agriculture and Education
- (ix) Highway

#### B. Alternates

Each committee may designate an alternate member to attend the Executive Committee meeting or meetings in the absence of the regularly designated member and who shall have the same voting rights as the regularly designated member.

#### C. Vacancies

Vacancies on the Executive Committee shall be filled by the respective committee at the earliest opportunity.

### 4. ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There is hereby created the regular full-time position of Administrative Assistant to the Executive Committee who shall be subject to the Executive Committee and shall have no appointive or policy making authority.

The general duties of said employee shall be as follows:

- A. Carry out assigned orders of the County Board and Executive Committee.
  - B. Prepare Agenda for Executive Committee.
- C. Schedule appearances of any individual, group or organization before the Executive Committee or the County Board as required.
  - D. Act as secretary to the Executive Committee.
- E. Perform such other duties as may be delegated by the Executive Committee.
  - F. Be available to the various committees and officials.
  - G. Evaluate and study insurance coverage.

Submitted by, REORGANIZATION COMMITTEE

Supervisor Engler asked permission of the board to read the resolution paragraph by paragraph and if the board members so desire they might ask questions and discuss the duties of the proposed Executive Committee. Permission was so granted. Motion made by Supervisor Williams and seconded by King that the resolution be adopted. Motion made by Supervisor Putzer and seconded that the County Health Committee be represented on the Executive Committee. Ayes 23. Nayes 23. Excused 1. Motion LOST. General discussion by the board members concerning the resolution. It was the opinion of the members that the duties of the Executive Committee are being carried out by various committees at present and no advantages would be realized by the creating of the Executive Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Hanson and seconded that the board adjourn until 1:30 p.m. Ayes 21. Nayes 25. Excused 1. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Williams and seconded by Steinhilber that the resolution be re-considered at 3:30 p.m. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded by Loehning to take a vote on the resolution CARRIED.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the board adjourn until 1:30 p.m. Carried by Acclamation.

Supervisor Wertsch complimented the Re-organization Committee on their work and expressed the opinion that if the rules were more closely adhered to and reports made by the committee this would make for better working relations.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

1:30 p.m.

Meeting called to order by the Chairman Joseph F. Drexler.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisors Heaney and Steffin. Both supervisors asked to be excused.

A special order of business for 1:30 p.m. was the presentation of a Sanitary Ordinance, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

#### SANITARY ORDINANCE

The following Ordinance No. 4 was presented: SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 Authority

These regulations are adopted under the authority granted by Section 59.07(51) of Wisconsin Statutes. Therefore, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County do ordain as follows:

#### 1.2 Purpose

The purpose of this Ordinance is to promote the health, safety, prosperity, aesthetics, and general welfare of the people and communities within Winnebago County.

#### 1.3 Intent

The general intent of this Ordinance is to regulate the location, construction, installation, alteration design and use of all private water supply and sewage disposal systems so as to protect the health of residents and transients; to secure safety from disease and pestilence; to further the appropriate use and conservation of land and water resources; and to preserve and promote the beauty of Winnebago County and its communities. It is further intended to provide for the administration and enforcement of this Ordinance and to provide penalties for its violation.

#### 1.4 Abrogation and Greater Restrictions

It is not intended by this Ordinance to repeal, abrogate, annul, impair, or interfere with any existing easements, covenants, deed restrictions, agreements, ordinances, rules, regulations, or permits previously adopted or issued pursuant to law. However, wherever this Ordinance imposes greater restrictions, the provisions of this Ordinance shall govern.

#### 1.5 Interpretation

In their interpretation and application, the provisions of

this Ordinance shall be held to be minimum requirements and shall be liberally construed in favor of Winnebago County and shall not be deemed a limitation or repeal of any other power granted by the Wisconsin Statutes.

#### 1.6 Severability

If any section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

#### 1.7 Repeal

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances of Winnebago County inconsistent or conflicting with this Ordinance, to the extent of the inconsistency only, are hereby repealed.

#### 1.8 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as the "Sanitary Ordinance, Winnebago County, Wisconsin."

#### 1.9 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be effective after a public hearing, adoption by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, and publication or posting as provided by law.

#### SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### 2.1 Jurisdiction

The jurisdiction of this Ordinance shall apply throughout the unincorporated area of Winnebago County.

#### 2.2 Compliance

- (1) Except as hereinafter provided, no private water supply or private sewage disposal system, or part thereof, shall hereafter be located, installed, moved, reconstructed, extended, enlarged, converted, structurally altered, or shall the use thereof be changed prior to obtaining a Sanitary Permit issued by Winnebago County and without full compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance and all other applicable local, county and state regulations.
- (2) No Sanitary Permit shall be required to make minor repairs to faucets, valves, pipes, appliances, the removal of stoppages, or the replacement of existing plumbing fixtures.
- (3) No Sanitary Permit shall be issued for any structure or facility open to the public which requires a private sewage or any water system until the plans for such systems have been approved by the Division of Health or other state agency authorized by law to make such an approval.

#### 2.3 Incorporation of Provisions by Reference

This Ordinance incorporates by reference the applicable rules, regulations and laws as set forth in the Wisconsin Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code. These rules, regulations and laws shall apply until amended and then shall apply as amended. The provisions of this Ordinance shall control where more restrictive.

#### 2.4 Variances

The Winnebago County Board of Adjustment may grant variances from the provisions of this Ordinance in the manner provided in Section XIII of the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance where, owing to special conditions a literal enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance will result in unnecessary hardship and so that the spirit of this Ordinance shall be observed and substantial justice done. No variance shall be permitted which does not meet minimum Division of Health or other state requirements or which will threaten health or safety or cause nuisances.

#### 2.5 Violations

It shall be unlawful to construct or use any private water supply or sewage disposal system in violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance. In case of any violation, the Winnebago County Zoning Committee, the Zoning Administrator, the Sanitary Inspector, or any property owner who would be specifically damaged by such violation may institute appropriate action or proceeding to enjoin a violation of this Ordinance.

#### 2.6 Penalties

Any person, firm or corporation who fails to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, forfeit not less than Ten and no-100 Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Two Hundred and no-100 Dollars (\$200.00) and costs of prosecution for each violation and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs shall be imprisoned in the County Jail until payment thereof, but not exceeding thirty (30) days. Each day a violation exists or continues shall constitute a separate offense.

#### SECTION 3.0 WATER SUPPLY

#### 3.1 Public Water Supply

All plumbing fixtures shall be served by a public water supply system were available. Where such public water system is not available, a private water supply system may be used.

#### 3.2 Private Water Supply

(1) Except as hereinafter provided, well construction including, without limitation because of enumeration, location, materials, samples and reports, and abandonment, shall be in accordance with the provisions of Chapter RD-12 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.

#### (2) Location

(a) Wells having watertight construction less than fifty (50) feet deep shall be located not less than seventy-five (75) feet from any soil absorption system or privy.

- (b) Wells having watertight construction at least fifty (50) feet deep shall be located not less than fifty (50) feet from any soil absorption system or privy.
- (c) Wells shall not be located closer than ten (10) feet to any property line.

#### SECTION 40 WASTE DISPOSAL

No person shall permit the discharge of liquid wastes into any surface waters which would constitute a nuisance or be in violation of the Wisconsin Statutes or this Ordinance.

#### 4.1 Industrial Waste Treatment

Industrial waste treatment disposal systems shall be subject to approval by the Division of Resource Development prior to construction pursuant to Section 144.555, Wisconsin Statutes, and Section RD-8.03(1), Wisconsin Administrative Code.

#### 4.2 Rubbish in Navigable Waters

It shall be unlawful to throw, discard, or discharge into any navigable water any can, bottle, or rubbish.

#### 4.3 Solid Waste Disposal

Solid waste disposal sites are prohibited unless the Division of Resource Development authorizes a permit pursuant to Section 144.46 Wisconsin Statutes for such sites and facilities.

#### SECTION 5.0 SEWAGE DISPOSAL

All premises intended for human occupation or occupancy shall be provided with an adequate functioning public sewer, privy, septic tank and soil absorption system, or other approved method of sewage disposal.

#### 5.1 Public Sewer

All plumbing fixtures shall be connected to a public sanitary sewer system where available. Where such a public sewer system is not available, a private sewage disposal system may be used. Private sewage disposal systems shall be discontinued and replaced with water-flush toilets within one (1) year after a public sewer system becomes available.

- 5.2 Private Sewage Disposal
  - (1) Privies
- (a) Privies shall be constructed and maintained in the manner described in Wisconsin Division of Health specifications for a sanitary privy.
- (b) Privies shall be located at the minimum horizontal distance of:
  - (i) Twenty (20) feet from a lot line.
  - (ii) Twenty-five (25) feet from dwellings.
- (iii) Twenty-five (25) feet from a slope twelve per cent (12 per cent) or greater at the edge of a watercourse.

(iv) Fifty (50) feet from any well.

(v) Fifty (50) feet from the normal high water elevation of a watercourse.

The bottom of open pits shall be three (3) feet above creviced bedrock and the high groundwater level. All privies in areas subject to periodic flooding shall be floodproofed.

#### (2) Septic Tanks

#### (a) General

No septic tank shall be purchased or installed until a Septic Tank Permit required by Section 144.03, Wisconsin Statutes, has been issued.

#### (b) Type

Only septic tanks, as described in Section H62.20(1)(d), Wisconsin Administrative Code, may be installed or constructed.

#### (c) Size

Septic tank size shall be based upon the number of persons using the building and upon the nature of use and type of waste. The minimum septic tank capacity before the outlet shall be 750 gallons. An additional capacity beyond 750 gallons shall be added as provided in Section H62.20(1), Wisconsin Administration Code.

#### (d) Location

No septic tank shall be located within the following distances measured horizontally:

- (i) Ten (10) feet of any building used for human occupancy.
- (ii) Ten (10) feet of a lot line.
- (iii) Ten (10) feet from any cistern or basement.
- (iv) Twenty-five (25) feet from the normal high water elevation of any watercourse.

(v) Twenty-five (25) feet from any well or other source

of water supply used for domestic purposes.

Where feasible, septic tanks shall be located downslope from wells and shall be floodproofed in any area subject to periodic flooding.

#### (e) Slope

The slope of the sewer for the ten (10) feet preceding the septic tank shall not exceed one-quarter (14) inch per foot.

#### (f) Inlet and Outlet Pipes

The inlet and outlet pipes between the septic tank to stable ground shall be cast iron with lead and oakum joints, or other pipes and joints approved for this purpose by the Division of Health or other state agency designated by law to make such an approval.

#### (g) Maintenance

Septic tanks shall be cleaned whenever the sludge and

scum occupies one-third (1-3) of the volume of the tank.

- (3) Soil Absorption Fields
- (a) General Requirements
- (i) No site for a private sewage system shall be approved:
- a. Where there is less than three (3) feet of soil between the bottom of the proposed tile field or seepage pit and high groundwater or bedrock.
- b. Where the percolation rate in any test hole is slower than one (1) inch in ninety (90) minutes.
  - (ii) Cesspools for disposal or untreated sewage are prohibited.
- (iii) No storm water, roof drains, footing drains or clear water drains, shall discharge into a private sewage disposal system.
- (b) Soil conditions necessary for Construction of Soil Absorption Systems

#### (i) Percolation Characteristics

Soil absorption systems shall not be constructed until percolation tests are performed in accordance with Chapter H65 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and shall consist of at least three (3) test holes sufficiently spaced and adequate in number to represent the soils in the area of the proposed absorption field. The percolation tests shall be conducted on the site and at the depth at which the system will be installed and the results verified by a Sanitary Technician. The results of these tests will determine the tile field size according to the specifications of Chapter H62, Wisconsin Administrative Code contained in the following table:

#### (ii) Slopes

Soil absorption systems shall not be constructed where land slopes are twelve per cent (12 per cent) or more or where there are slopes of more than twelve per cent (12 per cent) downgrade from the proposed system within twenty (20) feet of the proposed system. The Sanitary Technician shall determine and certify whether slopes of such magnitude exist.

#### (iii) Bedrock and groundwater

Soil absorption systems shall not be constructed where bedrock or high groundwater is within six (6) feet of the

ground surface. The Sanitary Technician shall determine and certify whether such problems exist and conduct borings, if necessary.

(iv) Fills in Wet Areas or Areas Subject to Periodic Flooding Where fill materials are placed or other improvements made in wet areas in an attempt to remedy high groundwater conditions, percolation tests and soil borings shall be delayed when nscessary until actual observations can be made of maximum groundwater conditions after completion of the improvements.

#### (v) Sanitary Technicians

The Sanitary Inspector shall prepare and keep updated a list of Sanitary Technicians who are certified to perform these tests. The Sanitary Inspector shall request periodic review of the list by the Division of Health or Division of Resource Development.

(c) Location of Soil Absorption Systems

All portions of a soil absorption system shall be located at the minimum horizontal distance of:

- (i) Ten (10) feet from any lot line.
- (ii) Twenty-five (25) feet from a slope twelve per cent (12 per cent) or greater at the edge of a watercourse.
  - (iii) Twenty-five (25) feet from any cistern or dwelling.
  - (iv) Twenty-five (25) feet from a wetland.
- (v Fifty (50) feet from the normal highwater elevation of any watercourse.
- (vi) Fifty (50) feet from any water supply well having watertight construction.

Soil Absorption fields which receive the effluent of two (2) or more dwelling units shall be setback at least one hundred (100) feet from the high water mark of any lake or watercourse.

- (d) Specifications for Seepage Trenches, Seepage Pits, and Seepage Beds
  - (i) Seepage Trenches

Seepage trenches shall not exceed one hundred (100) feet in length and shall be from two (2) to three (3) feet in width.

- (ii) Seepage Pits
- a. Seepage pits shall be used only when deeper soil formations are more porous than the upper soil and shall be installed only where the lower soil percolation rate is less than thirty (30) minutes for a drop of one (1) inch in water level.
- b. Seepage pits shall not be installed in areas where wells less than twenty (20) feet deep are used for potable water supplies or in areas subject to periodic flooding.
  - (iii) Seepage Beds

A seepage bed is similar to a seepage trench except that

the excavation is more than three (3) feet wide and has more than one (1) line of distribution tile. The bottom of the seepage bed shall be level and the distribution piping laid at a grade of two (2) to four (4) inches per one hundred (100) feet. Distribution lines in a seepage bed shall be spaced not greater than three (3) feet from the sidewall. In all other respects seepage beds shall comply with Sections 5.2(2), 5.2(3), 5.2(4)(a), and 5.2(4)(b) of this Ordinance. Seepage beds may not be installed in soils in which the percolation rate is more than ten (10) minutes for a drop of water level of one (1) inch or in areas subject to periodic flooding.

- (4) Servicing all Sewage Disposal Facilities
- (a) General

Septic tanks, seepage pits, grease traps, privies and other disposal facilities shall be serviced in accordance with Chapter RD13 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and relevant provisions of the Wisconsin Statutes.

#### (b) Sludge Disposal

Sludge, scum, and effluent from septic tanks and any other material removed from sewage disposal units, all hereafter referred to as sludge, shall be disposed of in such manner as not to create a nuisance or menace to public health. Unless otherwise authorized by the Division of Health or the Division of Resource Development, the sludge shall be disposed of as follows:

- (i) Discharge into a public sewage system when practical. The point and method of discharge into the system shall be subject to the requirements of the operator.
- (ii) Discharge for such purpose at a disposal site designated by a city, village, or town, or Zoning Administrator.
- (iii) In the absence of a public sewage system or designated disposal site, by burial on the premises where produced, at least one hundred (100) feet from a well or watercourse; or on other premises at least five hundred (500) feet from a well, watercourse or place of habitation. There shall be not less than eighteen (18) inches of earth over such buried sludge and an additional eighteen (18) between the sludge and groundwater or limestone bedrock.
- (iv) The sludge may also be spread on land not used for pasture or vegetable growing, and in such case, shall not be disposed of within one thousand (1,000) feet of a place of habitation.
- (v) No sludge shall be disposed of by discharge into a lake, watercourse, ditch or dry run, or in any area subject to periodic flooding, or on land within three hundred (300) feet of any navigable water except on the premises where produced.

#### SECTION 6.0 ADMINISTRATION

#### 6.1 Sanitary Inspector

There is hereby created the office of Sanitary Inspector who may exercise the following duties and powers:

- (1) Advise applicants as to the provisions of this Ordinance and assist them in preparing permit applications.
- (2) Issue permits and inspect properties for compliance with this Ordinance.
- (3) Keep records of all permits issued, inspections made, work approved, and other official actions.
- (4) Prohibit the use of new private water supply or private sewage disposal systems not in compliance with the requirements of this Ordinance until he has inspected and approved such system.
- (5) Inspect all private water supply systems and private sewage disposal systems periodically and require that all work thereon for which a Permit is required under this Ordinance shall be given a final inspection before it is closed.
- (6) Have access to any structure or premises between 8:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M., for the purpose of performing his duties.
- (7) Report violations of this Ordinance and other applicable regulations to the Zoning Committee and Corporation Counsel.
  - 6.2 Application for Sanitary Permit
- (1) An application for a Sanitary Permit shall be made in duplicate to the Sanitary Inspector on forms furnished by the Sanitary Inspector and shall include the following information, where applicable, as determined by the Sanitary Inspector:
  - (a) Name and address of the applicant and property owner.
  - (b) Legal description of the property.
  - (c) Type of proposed installation.
- (d) Name of person in charge of installation and any state license held by him.
- (e) Type of occupancy, number of occupants or patrons and estimated water consumption.
  - (f) Size and location of the proposed sewage disposal system.
  - (g) A sketch showing:
- (i) Location of wells, streams, lakes, buildings, privies, and septic tank systems within one hundred (100) feet of the proposed sewage disposal site.
- (ii) The location of all percolation test holes and report of each test and soil boring as run by a Sanitary Technician.
  - (iii) Depth to bedrock if less than six (6) feet.
  - (iv) Depth to high groundwater if less than six (6) feet.
- (v) Slope in feet per one hundred (100) or contour lines at two (2) foot intervals in the area of the proposed absorption field and well.

- (h) Additional information as may be required by the Sanitary Inspector.
- (2) Applications for a Sanitary Permit shall be received by the Sanitary Inspector prior to the issuance of a Building Permit, if required by the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance, or prior to the issuance of a Septic Tank Permit, if required by Wisconsin Statutes.
- (3) The Sanitary Permit shall be granted or denied by the Sanitary Inspector within thirty (30) days after receipt of the application for the Permit. The Permit shall expire six (6) months after date of issuance unless substantial work has commenced. Any Permit issued in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall be null and yoid.

#### 6.3 Fees

(1) The applicant, upon filing of his application, shall pay a fee to the Sanitary Inspector in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Well Construction	\$5.00
(b) Septic Tank Installation or Replacement	\$5.00
(c) Seepage Trench Installation or Addition	\$5.00
(d) Seepage Pit Installation or Addition	\$5.00
(e) Seepage Bed Installation or Addition	\$5.00
(f) Privy Installation or Replacement	\$5.00

#### 6.4 Appeals

Appeals from the decision of the Sanitary Inspector concerning the enforcement of this Ordinance may be made by any person aggrieved or by any officer, department, board or bureau of Winnebago County. Such appeal shall be made to the Winnebago County Board of Adjustment in accordance with provisions of Section XIII of the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance.

#### SECTION 7.0 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this Ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted as follows: Words used in the present tense include the future; Words in the singular number include the plural number, and; Words in the plural number include the singular number. The word "shall" is mandatory, not permissive. All distances, unless otherwise specified, shall be measured horizontally.

Except as hereinafter provided, definitions in applicable sections of Wisconsin Statutes and Chapters of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are hereby incorporated by reference and shall apply until amended and then shall apply as amended.

#### (1) Floodproofing — Floodproofed

Any treatment of land or buildings and their attendant water supply and sanitary sewage disposal facilities that reduces the flood damage and water contamination hazard. This includes sealing, anchoring, elevating and filling.

#### (2) High Water Mark

A continuous mark of reference where the land and the water meet at normal high water elevation.

#### (3) Industrial Wastes

Include liquid or other wastes resulting from any process of industry, manufacture, trade or business or the development of any natural resource.

#### (4) Navigable Water

Any body of water navigable in fact pursuant to Sections 144.26(2)(d) and 30.10, Wisconsin Statutes, and shown as navigable on United States Geological Survey Maps or the official Winnebago County Shoreland Zoning Maps.

#### (5) Normal High Water Elevation

The normal high water elevation for lakes, ponds, flowages and natural or artificial channels shall be defined as the average of the high water elevations for the period of record or the highest water elevation as determined by a control structure or dam.

#### (6) Nuisance

Any source of filth or cause of sickness.

#### (7) Private Sewage Disposal System

All sewers and sewage treatment facilities used in connection therewith other than those maintained and operated by a municipality, sanitary district or public utility.

#### (8) Private Water Supply System

A system whereby one or more sources of groundwater, including facilities for conveyance thereof, such as wells, springs and pumps, on one property other than those serving a municipality or a group of ten or more premises of mixed ownership.

#### (9) Privy

An outhouse or structure used for deposition of human excrement.

#### (10) Sanitary Technician

A person trained or experienced in performing those tests necessary to determine the feasibility of the safe disposal of sanitary wastes on proposed building sites and so certified by the Sanitary Inspector.

#### (11) Septic Tank

A reservoir or tank which receives crude sewage and by facterial action and sedimentation effects a process of clarification and decomposition of solids.

#### (12) Unincorporated Area in Winnebago County

All areas in Winnebago County other than the areas located in villages and cities.

#### (13) Watercourse

Any depression serving to give direction to a current of water at least six months of the year, having a bed and well-defined banks; provided, however, that it shall upon the order of the Department of Natural Resource, also include any particular depression which would not otherwise be within the definition of watercourse.

#### (14) Watertight Construction

Implies cased and grouted construction through firm formations like clay or rock. Through granulated material like sand or gravel, it implies that the casing pipe is of approved quality and assembled watertight.

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Wisconsin Statutes Section 349.085, the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors does hereby deem it necessary for the public safety to install official stop signs of the size and type prescribed in Wisconsin Statutes Section 349.08 at the following public traveled railroad grade crossings, to-wit:

County Trunk "G" and tracks of the Soo Line Railroad Company and Chicago and North Western Railway Company in the Town of Neenah, east of U.S. Highway 41, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin.
