ORGANIZATION MEETING

Tuesday, April 17, 1973

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Vice Chairman James P. Coughlin, on Tuesday, April 17th at 9:00 A.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of the following excused supervisors: Apell, Holverson, Ilk, Meyer, Schott and King.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and prayer by Supervisor Daggett.

RESIGNATION OF COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN

A communication from County Board Chairman King submitting his resignation as Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors effective as of April 17, 1973 was read. Motion made by Supervisor Fara and seconded to accept the communication and place on file. Carried by Voice Vote.

RESIGNATION OF COUNTY BOARD VICE CHAIRMAN

A communication from Vice Chairman Coughlin submitting his resignation as Vice Chairman of Winnebago County Board of Supervisors for the reason that he will be a candidate for the Chairmanship was read. Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded to accept the communication and place on file. Carried by Voice Vote.

By virture of Chapter 59.04 B. of the Wisconsin Statutes the April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order by the clerk for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the board.

ELECTION OF COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN

The Chair announced that the first order of business would be the election of a Chairman for the term of one year.

Motion made by Supervisor Putzer and seconded that nominations be made from the floor. Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that a majority of the votes are needed to elect.

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Motion made by Supervisor Putzer and seconded that James P. Coughlin be nominated as Chairman of the Board. Motion made by Supervisor Fara and seconded that nominations be closed. Carried by Voice Vote. Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot for James P. Coughlin for Chairman. The ballot was so cast and Supervisor Coughlin was duly elected as Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors for a term of one year beginning April 17, 1973.

ELECTION OF COUNTY BOARD VICE CHAIRMAN

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that nominations be closed and a majority of the votes are needed to elect. Carried by Voice Vote.

The Chair appointed Supervisors Becher and Johnson as tellers.

Motion made by Supervisor Seefeld and seconded to combine the duties of the Aviation and Highway Committees. Motion made by Supervisor Greiner and seconded to table the motion. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Goff and seconded that the duties of the committees be adopted as amended. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Loy that the duties of the County Executive as outlined by Supervisor Neely be placed in the County Directory. Carried by Voice Vote.

Chairman Daggett reported routine business. Trustee Gundlach of the University Extension Center School reported an increase of enrollment. An Appreciation Evening has been scheduled for May 3rd at 7:00 P.M., the board members will receive an invitation to attend. Supervisor Hunter, a member of the Zoning Committee, reported on a meeting in the Town of Clayton regarding the sanitary land fill site.

AVIATION

Vice Chairman Fara reported that the sum of \$70,000.00 has been turned into the General Fund as a result of a payment from the State and Federal Government. The committee is presently negotiating with the FAA on fire protection station. The committee has approved renting additional space at the terminal building.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS

Chairman Becher reported on the progress of the parking lot. Maps had been received from the American Automobile Association. The committee is requesting a revise due to the size of the parking stalls. Bids were received for the re-wiring of the courthouse. The office for the County Executive and Board Chairman will be completed by the first of May.

AGRICULTURAL

Chairman Daggett reported on the status of the Community Gardens. The land at the Sunny View Sanatorium would be unsuitable for present use, due to the fact that it has not been used for such a long period. There are private plots available for rent.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the County Board request the Agricultural Committee to study the feasibility of preparing a plot for community gardens and report back to the

County Board their findings. Carried by Voice Vote.

SOCIAL SERVICES BOARD (HEALTH)

Chairman Putzer reported that the Immunization clinics will be conducted at Tullar School under the direction of the City of Neenah. Application has been made to the state for a grant regarding the Veneral Disease Program.

Chairman Putzer reported that Winnebago County will participate under the Food Stamp Plan about the first of the year. This

program will be state-wide in the very near future.

Supervisor Collins informed the board members that complaint forms will be available for individuals to record their complaints about welfare receipents.

(ADVOCAP)

Supervisor Nolan reported that impounded funds have been released due to a court order. A list of priorities will be established. The Nutrition sub-committee is very active. This program should be self-sustaining in the near future.

(COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH PLANNING)

Supervisor Christoph reported on the meeting held in March relative to nursing homes. About 75 to 80 people attended this meeting. Many of them were potential providers. There is a possibility of an over supply of nursing homes. Before a nursing home can be licensed it must have the approval of the agency. The next meeting of the executive committee will be on April 26th. The Planning Council will meet on May 24th. The Emergency Medical Service will meet on April 24th to study ambulance service.

Motion made by Supervisor Parker and seconded that the Judiciary Committee send a representative to the Emergency Medical Ambulance Service meetings. Motion made by Supervisor Seefeld and seconded to amend the motion "that Supervisor Parker be designated as the representative". Supervisor Seefeld withdrew his motion as it was agreed that a member of the Judiciary Committee should be selected.

INSTITUTIONS

Supervisor Gischia reported on changes pending due to legislation on health services. The census at the County Institution is down slightly while that at Pleasant Acres is filled to capacity. The three facilities will be functioning under one name, but they still will retain their title that they now hold.

IUDICIARY

Supervisor Pitz reported that the bills for indigent legal services is slightly lower than last month. He also discussed the problem of photographing prisoners. Information has been received on a new internship program at the University of Wisconsin - Oshkosh.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported on the tour of the International Harvester plants at Libertyville and Melrose Park, Illinois. The bid of Dahl Motor Truck was accepted for six trucks. The Fox Valley Appraisals, Inc. submitted their rate for appraisals of 9 parcels of land. The committee met with Mr. Ryan, District Engineer to discuss the proposed building permit at the intersection of CTH "BB" and STH "150". The permit would authorize the conversion of a barn to a beverage mart.

LABOR RELATIONS

Chairman Farrell reported that a one year labor agreement has been reached with Winnebago County Sheriff's Professional Police Association. This agreement was reached in mediation session with a mediator. Five new bridgetenders have been hired to fill vancies for the 1973 navigation season. Vacant positions in the courthouse have been filled. Applications are being received for lifeguards and attendant positions at the Community Park. Ten county employees have completed a supervisory training program in coordination with the City of Oshkosh.

WHEREAS, the current number of proposed conflicting and duplicating laws in the areas of mental health, alcoholism, and other drug abuse, and developmental disabilities leads to piece-meal legislation and consequent fragmented organization of such human services, and

WHEREAS, the proposed Budget Bill, A 300, while extremely sketchy and vague, seems to involve poorly planned State control which bypasses community planning and citizen participation, and

which bypasses community planning and citizen participation, and WHEREAS, the Budget Bill, A 300, also advocates uniform staffing patterns and standards which demonstrate a naive understanding of modern community mental health methods and would lead to stereotyped approaches to the care of the psychologically impaired, and

WHEREAS, the Budget Bill, A 300, further advocates contractual relationships based on as yet poorly understood and developed costing methods from private systems which do not exist and enables present county owned and operated facilities to be bypassed, and

WHEREAS, the Budget Bill, A 300, does not represent the planning efforts of either the Department of Health and Social Services or the Governor's Health Planning and Policy Task Force,

WHEREAS, the Budget Bill, A 300:

- (1) Provides for a complete reorganization of the State Department of Health and Social Services,
- (2) Provides for the State to take over from counties the administration of Mental Health Services and Social Services,
- (3) Provides for abolishing the State Board of Health and Social Services,
- (4) Authorizes the Governor to appoint the Secretary of Health and Social Services,
- (5) Provides for counties to continue paying about 25% of the total cost,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors goes on record favoring such amendments to A 300 as would create a unified and comprehensive system for the organization, funding and delivery of mental health, mental retardation, alcoholism and other drug abuse services, and favoring any legislative approaches to mental health, mental retardation,

alcoholism and other drug abuse problems which would provide a

unified system of solutions, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors favors the complete reorganization of the State Department of Health and Social Services, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County

Board of Supervisors is opposed to:

(1) The State assuming administration from the counties of mental health services and social services,

(2) The abolition of the State Board of Health and Social

Services,

(3) The appointment by the Governor of the Secretary of the Department of Health and Social Services, and

(4) Counties continuing to pay 25% of the cost unless they continue to have administrative and policy making authority, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be made available to the Governor, representatives in the legislature from Winnebago County, the chairman of every Wisconsin board of supervisors, and other organizations with an interest in these matters.

Chairman Gischia reported that the Institutions is pleased with the results of the elevator agreement. Bids will be opened for an emergency power generator. Pleasant Acre facility is filled. The average age of the patients is about 80 years of age. The County Hospital facility has a list of 273 patients which is slightly over last month. The committee favors bill 51.42 over 51.37.

JUDICIARY

Chairman Pitz reported that the committee will have a report for the board very shortly on a Juvenile Detention Center. The committee received a request from the Friar Ambulance Service for an increase in rates, and discussed with Mr. Friar the use of sirens and flashing lights by his wrecker service. Correspondence was read from the Sheriff on a letter received from the Division of Highway Safety Coordination regarding Winnebago County being cited in the Milwaukee Sentinel for not participating in the Summer Traffic Safety Program because of the lack of equipment.

LABOR RELATIONS

The Emergency Employment Act of 1971 is being phased out with a planned termination of January 1, 1974, or shortly thereafter, The County currently has six positions remaining that are funded under EEA. It is anticipated that the EEA participants will be placed in unsubsidized employment during the phase out period.

A summer youth program for 17 County youths is being set up and will be funded with EEA funds. The youths will be used in basically the same work areas as last year — highway, airport, institutions, parks and courthouse; however, at a reduced number as EEA funding was available for 27 youth last year and is available for only 17 youths this year.

The youths will be paid \$1.60 per hour for 26 hours per week for nine weeks, and will be hired through the Wisconsin State Employment Service.

The hiring of lifeguards and attendants for the swimming facility, groundsmen for the County park at Winneconne, and laborers for the highway department has been completed. Those applications on file not selected for these positions are being forwarded to the Wisconsin State Employment Service to be given consideration for the 17 summer youth program jobs.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported that the committee signed Award of Damages for a parcel of land on the west side of Little Lake Butte des Morts. Tabulations for tires were received and the bid of the Firestone accepted. Tabulation of road oil was also received. The committee elected their officers. A meeting was held on May 15, 1973 to discuss the Little Lake Butte des Morts bridge financing and the opening of bids at Madison.

Supervisor Neely announced that the Finance Committee will be making a study of mileage cost and conference expenditures. The committee will consider any suggestion by the board members.

Supervisor Becher announced that the Buildings, Grounds and Parks Committee had received a complete survey on the insurance carried by Winnebago County on its buildings.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE

Chairman Daggett reported on the seminar attended by members of the committee. Senator Hollander and other legislators were in attendance. Valuable information was given by the lecturers.

Supervisor Daggett informed the board members that the County Agent has suggested that county-owned land in the area of the carp pond could be made suitable for Victory Gardens. The land could be made available for use by next spring. To be considered will be the expense involved in this project.

The committee has investigated several sites for a sanitary land fill. Before the county can participate, it will be necessary for the Corporation Counsel to investigate all the legal steps. The question was presented if it would be feasible to use the land fill to build a ski hill or someother project on this order.

Supervisor Gundlach reported that the enrollment at the Fox Valley Campus for the fall enrollment will show a decided increase. Temporary repair has been made to the roof. The trustees will consult a professional agency to make a survey of the repairs that will be made.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Supervisor Loy reported the committee had received a letter from Representative Flintrop regarding resolutions adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

A communication was received from Wood County in oppo-

sition of state take-over of the Social Services Dept.

The committee went on record of supporting Assembly Bill 391.

Mr. Arlo Paul and James Lynn members of the Solid Waste

Recycling Task Force, will be present at the July 17th meeting.

Representatives of the Legislative Committee will attend meetings of Wisconsin County Boards Association meeting held at Madison, Wisconsin.

The committee also met with the Highway Commissioner regarding pending legislation affecting his department.

AVIATION

Supervisor Schott informed the board members that the restaurant at the airport has been closed due to the failure of Richard Jansen's rent payments.

Two parties are interested in securing the restaurant lease. The head tax was eliminated by federal law signed by the President on June 18, 1973. The new law provides for an increase of 50 to 75% on many airport projects. A new CAB ruling permits airports to negiotate with airlines for a charge of twenty-five cents each ticket sold. This cost would be applied to the expense of the security guards.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS

Supervisor Becher reported on the forth-coming auction at the Sunny View Sanatorium. The census of attendance at the Community Park was given. Swimming lessons are being conducted at the lake for both adults and teenagers. Workers are presently tuck pointing the Courthouse. Work has been started on the sewer line for Phase II at the Community Park.

FINANCE

Supervisor Neely reported that a minimum of transfers were made during the month. The report of the Contingency was also given. A request was made that each supervisor make sure that his expense voucher is received by the pay roll department before the seventh of each month.

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

Supervisor Putzer reported that State Senator Steinhilber and Representative Flintrop had attended a meeting of the Social Services Board. The result of their attendance was very encouraging to both parties. Mr. James Dyk of the Day Care Board has submitted his resignation.

Supervisor Christoph reported on the Comprehensive Health meeting. Meetings are held once every six or eight weeks. Subcommittees have been formed and are beginning to make reports. Meetings will be held in various counties. The Comprehensive Health agency has received \$19,000.00. The 1973 budget will have very little if any increase over the 1972. The budget is based on the assessed valuation of the counties. The next meeting of the Comprehensive Health Committee will be on September 12th.

Supervisor Brandt reported on ADVOCAP. The board is uncertain as to their status. If the corporation is forced dissolve, they will try to continue in business. The biggest concern of ADVOCAP is furnishing the elderly with meals and activities.

Supervisor Becher announced to the board members that a chart showing the arrangement of parking stalls on the courthouse parking lot was on the bulletin board in the Supervisors' Room. The Public Service is presently making a survey and plans to illuminate the lot.

PROVIDING FOR ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS OR SCHOOLS AND EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT WHILE IN SUCH ATTENDANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION L PURPOSE

The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish an orderly procedure for the authorization of travel or attendance at meetings or schools on behalf of Winnebago County and for reimbursement for expenses incurred as a result of such attendance.

SECTION II. INTENT

The intent of this Ordinance is that no expense reimbursement shall be made to anyone hereunder by Winnebago County unless proper authorization as hereinafter set forth shall be secured.

SECTION III.

PROCEDURE A. Meetings:

Meetings must be budgeted for prior to the beginning of the fiscal year. The budget must be detailed, insofar as possible, with the names of the persons planning to attend, the location of the meeting, the date or dates of the meeting, and approximate costs. If information as to place and date cannot be specifically identified, there must be at least a close approximation.

B. Schools:

Schools must be budgeted for prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, including a list of persons planning to attend schools, along with their length of employment, current salary status, amount of tuition to be paid, workdays involved, if any, and credits to be earned. Also, there should be included a reference to the statute or regulation requiring the participation at County's expense.

SECTION IV. APPROVAL PROCEDURE

A. The County Board, after consideration of the proposed budget for these purposes, will determine the amount of money to be used by each department making such a request.

B. It will then be the responsibility of the operating manager of the departments to administer the expenditures of monies budgeted for these purposes with the approval of the Committee to which they are responsible.

which they are responsible. SECTION V. EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

A. Automobile Mileage Expense:

1. The rate of twelve cents (12¢) per mile shall be paid for travel by the most direct route

with an allowance to be made for reasonable variations due to route conditions. Such mileage shall be paid to the person whose private automobile is used. Where a number of persons are making the same trip, travel should be in the least number of cars.

2. Mileage shall not be paid to department heads and employees to or from their place of employment for their normal work.

B. Hotel Expense

1. A maximum of Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) including tax per day for single rate lodging will be allowed with a receipted bill required. This rate subject to change as deemed necessary by the Finance Committee.

C. Meal Expense (including tips)

Breakfast - \$2.00 - \$3.50 Lunch - \$6.50 Dinner

Maximum daily allowance - \$12.00 (which includes tips)

These rates are subject to change as deemed necessary by the Finance Committee.

D. General Items of Expense

1. Public Transportation

Travel by plane or train shall be at coach rates.

2. Advances

The Finance Committee may, at its discretion, grant an advance for travel expenses. Requests for an advance should be made to the County Auditor.

3. Registration or Conference Fees

Registration or conference fees are reimbursable by Winnebago County upon proof of payment.

SECTION VL

ENFORCEMENT

The Finance Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors shall be the Committee responsible for the enforcement of and compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION VIL

This Ordinance shall be effective July 1, 1973, after its adoption and publication by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. None of the provisions herein shall apply to any conference dates or expenses incurred thereat prior to the effective date of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or resolutions on the subject matter contained herein dated prior to the effective date of this Ordinance to the extent such ordinances or resolutions apply to conferences dated after the effective date of this Ordinance are hereby rescinded and repealed.

The census at the Pleasant Acres facility is 218 with a waiting list of eleven. The hospital census dropped to 270 with a vacancy of 56. The reason for the decrease is the discharge from Family Care Program into society.

A request has been made for rate increase at Pleasant Acres. There has been an increase in the referrals to the Guidance Center Clinic. An organizational chart will be available in the future.

JUDICIARY

Supervisor Pitz reported that two bids have been received for the furnishing of gasoline to the Sheriff's Dept., but at the present time they are unable to furnish gasoline.

A discussion will be held with Judge Crane and the other

judges in the near future.

Discussion was held concerning Mr. Friar's request to use the private line for his towing calls in addition to ambulance calls at the north end of the County.

A meeting on Juvenile Detention facility will be held on June 27th, 1973.

LABOR RELATIONS

The Labor Relations Committee has interviewed several management consultant firms during the past few weeks in connection with a compensation study of certain supervisory and managerial

positions within Winnebago County employment.

A UW - Oshkosh senior accounting student working under a federally subsidized work-study program has undertaken the project of taking a physical inventory of Park View Health Center. When completed, the inventory will be incorporated into the computerized

data processing system.

On May 31 a meeting was held at Park View between Park View trustees, management and labor advisors, and AFSCME Local 1280 hospital employees' bargaining unit officials and their Union representatives regarding Union grievances and employer/employee problems. Many grievances and problems were aired and since the meeting Institutions management and Union officials have been able to resolve many of the problems.

Negotiations for 1974 labor agreements with County employee bargaining units have begun with the first negotiating session with the Highway employees bargaining unit last night. Negotiations with Social Services will begin July 5. Institutions is currently in the first year of a two-year agreement covering 1973 and 1974. The Courthouse Association and Sheriff's Department bargaining unit em-

ployees have not filed a request to negotiate at this time.

HIGHWAY

Supervisor Loehning reported on the activities of the Highway Committee. The committee signed an authority for modification of sanitary facility for Wayside # 8 to modify the building to accommodate physically handicapped. A contract was signed with the Wisconsin Power & Light Co. for lowering as mains on reconstruction on CTH "E". The Park View Health Center Committee for changing of signs on county roads for direction to the New Park View Health Center. The policy is to designate hospitals with picture signs but this would not do for Park View Health Center because it is not an emergency hospital. A report was given on the Summer Road School at Hurley, Wisconsin.

Work is needed on the parking lot at the campus, which has been discussed with the Highway Commissioner.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS

Supervisor Becher reported on the activities of his committee. A census report was given on the attendance at the Community Park. A report was made on the lighting of the courthouse parking lot. It is anticipated that four lights will be needed. The Heritage Entertainers will present a muscial at the park on August 12. A reimbursement from the insurance company will be made on the tractor used at the park.

FINANCE

The report of the Finance Committee was given by Supervisor Neely. A report of the Contingent Fund was projected by Supervisor Neely, enumerating the various transfers for the months of June and July. Budget worksheets have been distributed to the various departments and committees. A request has been made to have the worksheets completed by July 24, 1973.

APPOINTMENT TO WINNEBAGO COUNTY DAY SERVICE BOARD

Mr. Orrin H. King, Winnebago County Executive announced his appointment of George Keith, 2018 Oregon Street, Oshkosh, to the Winnebago County Day Service Board for the term of July 18, 1973 through December 31, 1974 which fills the unexpired term of Mr. James Dyk. Motion made by Supervisor Nolan and seconded that the appointment of George Keith by the County Executive be approved. Carried by Voice Vote.

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

The report of the Health & Social Services Committee was given by Supervisor Christoph. There is a possibility that within the next few months a Adult Group Home will be opened in Oshkosh. The committee discussed the Food Stamp Plan. A meeting was held with fourteen agencies on Family Planning. The next meeting date of ADVOCAP will be July 21st, 1973.

IUDICIARY & PUBLIC SAFETY

The report of the Judiciary & Public Safety Committee was given by Supervisor Greiner. At the committee meeting, the members discussed the future of the buildings at the Sunny View Sanatorium. The County Executive has informed the committee that the Standard Oil Company will furnish gasoline to the Sheriff's Department for their squad cars.

LABOR RELATIONS

The Labor Relations Committee has held initial negotiating meetings with the Courthouse employees, Social Services Employees and the Highway employees bargaining committees. Future meetings have been scheduled with these committees in early August. The Sheriff's Department bargaining unit has filed a request to negotiate for a 1974 labor agreement but has not submitted their proposals as requested. Institution employees are in the first year of a two-year labor agreement.

The Neighborhood Youth Corps Program has just begun its 1973 summer program. This is a 100% Federally funded program in which youth from low income or unemployed families work for non-profit organizations with the hope that the money derived will assist in

ways that will prevent the youth from dropping out of school. The youths are paid \$1.60 per hour and will work 36 hours per week for 6 weeks. Winnebago County will provide work for approximately 10 of these youths. They will work at the Airport, Highway Department, Institutions, Parks and the Courthouse.

PARK VIEW HEALTH CENTER

The report of the Park View Health Center was given by Supervisor Goff. The committee has been working on the transferring of the Guidance Center Clinic to the Health Center. Pleasant Acres has a waiting list of twenty applicants, but due to lack of homes for patients who do not need skilled nursing care they cannot be transferred which creates a problem for those patients that need the special care. The sub-committee of the Park View Health is working in the mental health area. The sub-committee is planning a puppet show and also radio or television programs. A brochure will be available describing their activities. Supervisor Greiner questioned the committee concerning the mimeographed bulletin received by the supervisors each month as to the cost, who is responsible for the bulletin, and where it is reproduced. The Chairman of the committee has been instructed to bring this information to the board at the next meeting.

HIGHWAY

The report of the Highway Committee was given by Supervisor Loehning. The committee discussed the gasoline situation, but the County Executive has informed them that Standard Oil Company will also furnish them with gasoline. The committee signed an authorization for AFE for CTH "E". A quit claim deed was signed for property on USH "41". Due to the fact that the Dahl Motor Co. was unable to meet the delivery of four trucks as per bid, the committee decided to enforce the penalty on one truck. The County Executive reported on the fire inspection and gave his recommendation. There will be a change in location of a wayside on the south end of the county which will be eliminated due to proposed access roads. The Highway Commissioner and the sheriff's department discussed the proposed "No Parking" on CTH "GG" from A.

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE # 24 RECYCLING OF SOLID WASTE

Mr. Arloe W. Paul, Vice Chairman of the Governor's Task Force # 24 on Recycling of solid waste material appeared before the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. Mr. Paul projected his presentation with colored slides. It is the recommendation of the Governor's Task Force Committee that a shredder-type equipment is the best method of recycling.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mr. Clifford Sebora, Oshkosh grocer, addressed the board urging the supervisors to adopt the Food Stamp program.

Mrs. Gilbert Pitz, 4244 Shady Lane, Oshkosh, asked that a comprehensive plan of all three institutions should be presented before the Guidance Center is moved to the hospital or other offices moved to the nurses home at Sunny View.

Mr. Jeffrey Schneider, attorney from the City of Neenah, works very closely with juveniles, urged to the board to have a test load of the buildings at Sunny View Sanatorium and consider it for a

detention facility.

Donald Mand of the Oshkosh Police Department told the supervisors that the County Jail has no adequate facility to house juveniles. Members of the Neenah-Menasha Police Department were also in favor of the test load and urged the board to re-consider demolition of the buildings at Sunny View Sanatorium.

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority
This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Secs. 59.07 (1) (b) and 59.07 (5), Wis. Stats. (1971).

1.2 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.3 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Solicitation and Selling Ordinance.

1.4 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.2

2.1 Regulation of Sales and Solicitations for Sale
Except as hereinafter provided for in this Ordinance, no person shall sell, keep or offer for sale
any tangible or intangible articles, merchandise or
things; or solicit for any trade, occupation, business,
profession or alms, within or upon County owned
properties.

Exemptions
This Ordinance shall not apply to or interfere with
Winnebago County's continuation of its established
practice of granting leases, contracts for concessions, inviting representatives and bidders to any
of its departments, or any other contacts, sales or
solicitation for sales conducted by persons, departments or any of the Courts for County business
purposes.

2.3 Posting of Signs

The Winnebago County Buildings, Grounds and Parks Committee is hereby directed to post signs in prominent places on County owned property, which signs shall inform the public of the existence of this Ordinance and where a copy of this Ordinance may be obtained.

2.4 Enforcement Powers

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be enforced by the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department.

2.5 Penalty

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$10.00 or more than \$200.00 together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

(3) That the sum of \$6000.00 in cash be placed in the 1974 Executive Budget and the value of in kind services be developed so as to provide the total of \$12,006.00 as Winnebago County's share of the cost of this program.

AN ORDINANCE EST ABLISHING THE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE SERVICES BOARD

(Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.42 Unified Board)

The following ordinance No. 1 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION L ESTABLISHMENT.

Pursuant to Wis. Stats., Secs. 51.42 and 51.437(4) (b), there is established a community mental health, developmental disabilities, alcoholism and drug abuse program for Winnebago County and the board of directors of such program is hereby designated as the community developmental disabilities board.

SECTION II. NAME.

The name of such program shall be the Winnebago County Community Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Services Program.

SECTION III. PURPOSES.

The program hereby created shall identify, develop, provide, or cause to be provided such services as are necessary to the prevention or amelioration of mental disabilities, including but not limited to mental illness, mental retardation, alcoholism and drug abuse. It shall facilitate the use of community resources to the fullest extent through unity of management, control and fiscal responsibility.

SECTION IV. BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

- (1) The Board of Directors shall be composed of nine (9) members, five (5) of whom shall be Winnebago County Board Supervisors. Members of the Board of Directors shall be appointed by the County Executive. All such appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. There shall be representation of the interests of the developmentally disabled, mentally ill, alcoholic and drug abusers by persons of recognized ability and demonstrated interest in these conditions.
- (2) Except as hereinafter provided, the term of office of each member of the Board of Directors appointed pursuant to this Ordinance shall be for three years. The terms of those initially appointed shall be as follows:

One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1974; One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1975; and

One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1976.

If a County Board member of the Board of Directors ceases to be a County Board member for any reason whatsoever, then, his membership on the Board of Directors shall terminate as of the effective date of his termination as a County Board Supervisor. Vacancies for unexpired terms shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments. Any director appointed hereunder may be removed by the appointing authority in accordance with the procedure and authority set forth in the statutes.

(3) Directors appointed hereunder shall be compensated for their services and travel expenses at a rate which shall be the same as the per diem and mileage allowance prevailing for the Winnebago County Board of

Supervisors.

(4) Subject to the rules and regulations established and amended from time to time by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors and the County Executive in their respective areas of responsibility, the Board of Directors shall have the powers and duties set forth in Wis. Stats., Secs. 51.42 and 51.437, and PW-MH 60.20 and PW-MH 60.50 Wis. Adm. Code, and shall specifically:

assume the responsibility of any Board (a) of Trustees functioning in or for this County in the government of a hospital established under Wis. Stats.,

Sec. 46.18:

(b) assume the responsibility of any Board of Directors functioning in or for this County in the government of a clinic established under Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.36;

assume the responsibility of any Board (c) of Directors functioning in or for this County in the government of a day service program for the mentally handicapped established under Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.38;

 (d) adopt as its own the plans and budgets of the aforementioned activities for the initial year which have been approved or accepted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors;

(e) be authorized to receive and disburse

funds:

(f) negotiate and recommend for execution by the County Executive such contracts for the provision or securing of resources as may be necessary to the development or maintenance of services;

(g) be authorized to seek approval of its plan and budget by the Wisconsin Department of Health & Social Services so as to maximize state financial participation in defraying the costs of

services provided hereunder;

(h) be directed to develop a plan for the provision of services in accordance with the requirements of Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.42 (7), within twelve (12) months of initial approval, and the board shall avail itself of the services and capabilities of the Areawide Health Planning Council in developing the plan.

SECTION V. FINANCES.

(1) The program shall be financed by such funds as may be available through public and private sources; and the board is authorized to accept private donations and to request and receive state and federal grants-in-aid in addition to county funds.

(2) The Board of Directors shall plan its financial operations on calendar year basis; and each year it shall submit its proposed budget for the next calendar year to the County Executive prior to August 15th or such other date as may be required by the County Executive.

(3) The expenses incurred in the operation of the program shall be paid by the County and charged against the appropriations and other funds credited to the program. All funds received shall be deposited and credited to the separate account of said program.

SECTION VL. REPORTS.

The Board of Directors shall make an annual report to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, and it shall make or cause to be made such other reports as may be required from time to time

by the County Executive and the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

SECTION VIL REPEALER.

Any ordinance or resolution previously enacted and relating to any predecessor agency or program, or which conflicts with this Ordinance, is hereby repealed.

SECTION VIIL EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage, approval and publication as required by law.

State Representative Gordon Bradley reported that there is a bill introduced which would provide for 100 per cent reimbursement to counties for purchase of land for snowmobile trails from the

state snowmobile fund.

Lewis C. Magnusen, an Oshkosh attorney, representing a number of farmers and landowners along the Oshkosh to Larsen right-of-way.

Robert Marinack, 3585 Allenville Road, who lives near the

tracks.

G. Philip Grundy, Town of Oshkosh Chairman, told the board that the Grundy farms owns two miles of the land along the tracks.

John R. Allen, farmer, whose home and buildings are close to the tracks showed slides to illustrate his objections.

Francis Zeller, 2381 W. Gillingham Road, Oshkosh, Larsen area farmer and member of the board of directors of the Larsen Co-op.

Minor Harris, Route # 3, Ripon, Wisconsin, whose land is near

the Milwaukee Road tracks near Rush Lake.

David Wiesner, rural Winneconne farmer, whose land joins the Milwaukee Road tracks.

Ward Tews, Rush Lake area dairy farmer.

Walter Raehl, whose farm is on the east side of the Northwestern tracks.

A petition signed by 1,411 signers was received petitioning the County Board to acquire and develop the Milwaukee Road right-of-way from Winneconne through Omro to Rush Lake, as a hiking, bicycling and snowmobile trail.

A petition signed by 988 signers was received petitioning the County Board to acquire and develop the Chicago Northwestern right-of-way from Larsen to Oshkosh as a hiking, bicycling and snowmobile trail.

A petition signed by 495 signers was received petitioning the County Board to acquire and develop the Milwaukee Road right-of-way from Winneconne through Omro to Rush Lake, as a hiking, bicycling and snowmobile trail.

A petition signed by approximately 100 signers was received objecting to the proposition that Winnebago County purchase such railroad lands was received.

A communication from the Town of Winneconne was received that the Town Board of Winneconne does not favor the condemnation or purchase of the railroad right-of-way for recreational purposes but rather that the land revert back to each adjoining farm and a leasing agreement made with each farmer for snow-mobile trails was received.

ALTERNATE PROPOSAL - JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITY NEAR COURTHOUSE

The following Resolution No. 13 was presented:

WHEREAS, on August 21, 1973, the Winnebago County Board accepted a report indicating the need for a separate facility to detain juveniles involved with the law, that is to say to "Get the Kids Out of

WHEREAS, on August 21, 1973, twenty-nine members of the Winnebago County Board voted to rpovide money for planning a juvenile detention facility and only thirteen voted against the proposition, thus indicating a preponderance of opinion in favor of the proposition, but the proposal failing, through the technicality of needing thirty votes in favor, thirty votes being two-thirds of the then membership of the County Board; and

WHEREAS, a private source has made available sufficient money

to have plans for a juvenile detention center developed; and

WHEREAS, such plans for a juvenile detention facility are here-

with submitted for your consideration; and

WHEREAS, it is suggested that when the Agricultural Department personnel are moved, the need for parking spaces on the courthouse parking lot will be reduced, and yet the razing of the house in which the Agricultural personnel are now housed will make available yet more space, that the County might very well not need to buy more land for the proposed juvenile detention facility, as it could be located on the courthouse parking lot.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the amount of \$250,000 be placed in the 1974 Budget for the purpose of building and furnishing a juvenile detention facility near the Winnebago County Courthouse in accordance with preliminary sketches submitted and

explained to the members of the County Board this day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Buildings, Grounds and Parks Committee of the Winnebago County Board is hereby directed to select a site near the courthouse for such a juvenile detention facility, arrange with an architect for definitive plans for such a juvenile facility, and to advertise for bids in accordance with plans and specifications for such a juvenile detention facility as are developed by the architect.

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE SOLICITING AND SELLING ON COUNTY OWNED PROPERTY

The following Ordinance No. 1 was presented: The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Secs. 59.07 (1)(b) and 59.07 (5), Wis. Stats. (1971).

1.2 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.3 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Solicitation and Selling Ordinance.

1.4 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.2

2.1 Regulation of Sales and Solicitations for Sale
Except as hereinafter provided for in this Ordinance, no person shall sell, keep or offer for sale any tangible or intangible articles, merchandise or things; or solicit for any trade, occupation, business, profession or alms, within or upon County owned properties.

Exemptions
This Ordinance shall not apply to or interfere with
Winnebago County's continuation of its established
practice of granting leases, contracts for concessions,
inviting representatives and bidders to any of its
departments, or any other contacts, sales or solicitation for sales conducted by persons, depart-

ments or any of the Courts for County business purposes.

2.3 Posting of Signs

The Winnebago County Buildings, Grounds and Parks Committee is hereby directed to post signs in prominent places on County owned property, which signs shall inform the public of the existence of this Ordinance and where a copy of this Ordinance may be obtained.

2.4 Enforcement Powers

The provisions of this Ordinacne shall be enforced by the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department.

2.5 Penalty

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$10.00 or more than \$200.00 together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days. WHEREAS, the Sheriff is required to maintain the Winnebago County Jail which includes furnishing daily meals to the prisoners therein; and

WHEREAS, the present rate of reimbursement to the Sheriff for meals furnished to prisoners is 80¢ per meal, which rate was established by County Board Resolution # 20, dated November 12, 1971 and effective January 1, 1972; and

WHEREAS, the cost of food has been increasing each year and the present reimbursement rate of 80¢ per meal should be increased

to \$1.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that commencing November 1, 1973, the amount to be paid to the Sheriff for meals served to the regular prisoners shall be at the rate of \$1.00 per meal.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that commencing November 1, 1973, the amount payable to the Sheriff for meals served to Huber Act prisoners shall be at the rate of \$1.00 per meal plus an additional \$1.00 per day.

WHEREAS, individuals showing positive results from the screening procedures will be referred to medical care providers of their choosing; and

WHEREAS, the screening program is intended to uncover and correct early childhood defects which could lead to later adult health problems; and

WHEREAS, the screening is expected to be done by nonphysicians in order to reserve physician manpower for diagnosis and treatment services.

Supervisor Holverson reported that the committee is working on the new county brochure map. It will be in color and noncommercial. It is anticipated that a sample map will be available at the next meeting.

The committee is investigating the possibility advertising for bids on the audit for the County. A meeting will be held the first of the year to speed-up data processing work.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported that the committee purchased several pieces of machinery. The county will be using hot asphalt mix for repairing roads in the near future. The three municipalities involved in the Little Lake Butte des Morts Bridge project is interested in a name for this bridge. All suggestions should be mailed to the Winnebago County Highway Department.

AMENDATORY ORDINANCE AIRPORT ZONING

The following Amendatory Ordinance No. 7 was presented:

REGULATING THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES AND TREES AND THE USE OF PROPERTY IN THE VICINITY OF WITTMAN FIELD WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN

SECTION L DEFINITIONS

As used in this Ordinance, unless the context

otherwise requires:

(a) "Airport" means the Wittman Field Airport located in Sections 34 and 35, Town 18N, Range 16E, also Sections 2 and 11, Town 17N, Range 16E, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

(b) "Airport hazard" means any structure, object of natural growth, or use of land which obstructs the air space required for the flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an airport or is otherwise hazardous to such landing or taking off.

(c) "Non-conforming use" means any structure, tree or use of land which does not conform to a regulation prescribed in this Ordinance or an amendment thereto, as of the effective

date of such regulation.

(d) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or other similar representative thereof.

(e) "Structure" means any object constructed or

installed by man.

(f) "Tree" means any object of natural growth, except farm crops which are cut at least once a year, and except shrubs, bushes or plants which do not grow to a height of more than five feet.

(g) "Runway" means a level portion of an airport having a surface specially developed and maintained for the landing and take-off of aircraft.

SECTION II. ZONES

There are hereby established airport approach and navigation zones within a three mile disatnce from the boundaries of the Wittman Field Airport as shown on official Zoning Map 'A' and official Zoning Map 'B', Wittman Field Airport, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, dated October 1963, with revisions to Map 'A' dated September 1970, which are attached hereto and adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION III. HEIGHT ZONES. EXCEPTIONS

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, no structure shall be constructed, altered

or located which has a height in excess of the height limit indicated within the zones on the maps referred to in SECTION II hereof, and no trees shall be permitted to grow in excess of the height limit indicated within the zones on the maps referred to in SECTION II hereof.

(b) The restrictions contained in SECTION III (a) shall not apply to legal fences or to farm crops which are cut at least once each year.

SECTION IV. USE RESTRICTIONS. ACTIVITIES

Notwithstanding the provisions of SECTION III of this Ordinance, no use may be made of land in any zone in such manner as to create electrical interference with radio communication between the airport and aircraft, or make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others, or result in glare in the eyes of the pilots using the airport, or impair visibility, in the vicinity of the airport or otherwise endanger the landing, taking off or maneuvering of aircraft. NON-CONFORMING USES

SECTION V.

(a) Not Retroactive:

The regulations prescribed in SECTIONS II and III of this Ordinance shall not be construed to require the removal, lowering or other change or alteration of any nonconforming use, or otherwise interfere with the continuance of any non-conforming use, except as otherwise provided by SECTION VII (b), however, non-conforming objects existing at the time of adoption of this Ordinance which violated the preceding Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinance adopted March 12, 1946, and subsequent amendments to date and were not exempt from the requirements of said preceding Ordinance shall be subject to the requirements of this Ordinance.

(b) Changes:

Nothing herein contained shall require any changes in the construction, alteration or intended use of any structure if the construction or alteration of such was begun prior to the effective date of this Ordinance and if such is diligently prosecuted.

(c) Removal:

This section shall not interfere with the removal of non-conforming uses by purchase or the use of eminent domain.

SECTION VI. ADMINISTRATION

It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County Zoning Officer to administer and enforce the regulations prescribed herein. Applications for permits and variances shall be made to the Winnebago County Zoning Officer or his designated agent upon a form furnished by him. Applications which are by this Ordinance to be decided by the Winnebago County Zoning Officer shall be promptly considered and granted or denied by him. Applications for action by the Board of Adjustments shall be forthwith transmitted by the Winnebago County Zoning Officer to the Board for hearing and decision.

SECTION VII. PERMITS

(a) Future Uses:

No structure shall hereafter be constructed, erected or installed, or be permitted to remain in any zone created by SECTION II of this Ordinance until the owner or his agent shall have applied in writing for a permit therefor and obtained such permit from the Winnebago County Zoning Officer or his designated agent, except structures more than one-half mile from the nearest airport boundary and less than fifty feet maximum height above ground level at building site. permit shall be posted in a prominent place on the premises prior to and during the period of construction, erection, installation or establishment. No tree may be planted within the tree planting permit zone created *by SECTION II of this Ordinance and shown on official Zoning Map 'A', without a permit, and any tree planted without a permit or permitted to grow without planting may be ordered removed at any time by the Winnebago County Zoning Officer or his designated agent upon his finding that such tree violates or is about to violate the height restriction for the zone. Application for such permit shall indicate the use for which the permit is desired, and shall describe and locate the use with sufficient particularity to permit the Winnebago County Zoning Officer to determine whether such use would conform to the regulations herein prescribed. If such determination is in the affirmative, the Winnebago County Zoning Officer shall issue the permit applied for.

(b) Existing Uses:

Before any non-conforming structure may be altered, repaired, or rebuilt, a permit shall be applied for and secured in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) authorizing such change or repair, except that a non-

conforming use other than utility poles destroyed, to the extent of seventy-five (75) per cent or more of its assessed valuation, according to the assessment for the fiscal year in which such destruction occurs, shall, from and after the date of such destruction, conform to the regulation of this Ordinance. No such permit shall be granted that would allow the structure to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was on the effective date of this Ordinance, or than it is when the application for permit is made. No tree shall be allowed to grow so as to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was at the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION VIII.

HAZARD MARKING AND LIGHTING

Any variance granted under SECTIONS IX and X may, if such action is deemed advisable by the Winnebago County Board of Adjustments to effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance and if such is reasonable in the circumstances, be so conditioned as to require the owner of the structure or trees in question to permit the owner of the airport, at its own expense, to install, operate and maintain thereon such marker and lights as may be necessary to indicate to the flyers the presence of an airport hazard.

SECTION IX.

JURISDICTION

The Winnebago County Board of Adjustments shall have jurisdiction over all appeals and review under this Ordinance.

SECTION X.

APPEALS AND REVIEW

(a) Variances:

Upon appeal in special cases, the Winnebago County Board of Adjustments may, after investigation and public hearing, grant such variance from the terms of this Ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of this Ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship, and such relief will do substantial justice and be in accord with the spirit of this Ordinance, and does not create a hazard to the safe, normal operation of aircraft.

(b) Aggrieved Person:

Any person aggrieved or affected by any decision or action of the Winnebago County Zoning Officer made in his administration of this Ordinance may appeal such decision or action to the Board of Adjustments.

(c) Procedure:

Any appeal taken pursuant to this section shall be in conformity with the procedure established by Section 59.99 of the Statutes.

SECTION XL

PENALTIES
Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00), nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for such offense, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the County Jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty (30) days for each violation. Each day that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION XIL

SEVERABILITY
If any of the provisions of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION XIIL REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES

All prior Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinances, including amendments thereto, are hereby repealed.

SECTION XIV.

EFFECT
This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and publication.

SECTION XV.

FILING
This Ordinance shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk, but shall not be recorded by the Register of Deeds. The Clerk shall notify the Register of Deeds of such filing and such notice shall be recorded.

A communication from the law offices of Nolan, Engler, Yakes & Curtis requesting an opportunity to appear before the Board or its appropriate committee to present plans and proposals for real property tax exemptions was read. Referred to the Finance Committee.

A communication from State Representative Gordon R. Bradley acknowledging receipt of resolution relating to the 51.42 Board's plans to have an educational board was read. Placed on file.

A communication from the City of Oshkosh asking that the City Administration is hereby directed to investigate the acquisition of the Beech Building and also a joint venture with Winnebago County for the purpose of establishing a building that could be used by both the city and the county for a safety building was read. Placed on file.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

SOCIAL SERVICE REPORT

A report of the Social Service Board was given by the Chairman Christoph. Discussed was staff positions that should be filled. The Board has approved the opening of a fourth meal site for the elderly at Court Towers Housing Project. Applications for the Food Stamp Program are continuing to come in at a rapid rate. The Board is negotiating for the use of one additional room in the Neenah office due to the Food Stamp Program. The Board is looking into state proposals for contracts between the state and county for the social

service program in 1975. The Board is studying the proposals for the formation of a Family Court and is in agreement that improvements need to be made in this area.

JUVENILE DETENTION FACILITY REPORT

Mr. Orrin H. King, Winnebago County Executive, reported to the Winnebago County Board on the juvenile detention facility. His advice to the board members is that no further efforts be made toward the construction of a new facility until several determinations have been made. Miss Susan Luker, 158 E. Ripple Road, Oshkosh, a member of the Junior 4-H Club, appeared before the board and told of the advantages of this location for the members of the Junior 4-H Clubs.

Philip Grundy, 1556 W. Sunnyview Road, Oshkosh, a member of the Farm Bureau'and Holstein Breeders Association, recommended the renovation of the nurses' home.

Henry Malchow, 1295 W. Winneconne, Neenah, Manager of the ASCS recommended the remodeling of the nurses' home at Sunnyview. He would like to see a central ag. center within the county. Mr. Malchow told the board members that his department would be willing to rent offices.

- b. After flood insurance is made available, furnishing representatives of appropriate Federal or State agencies or the National Flood insurance Association information as requested concerning new or substantially improved structures within the area of special flood hazard. This information will include floor elevations and, if there is a basement, the distance between the first floor and the bottom of the lowest opening where water flowing on the ground will enter.
- c. Cooperating with Federal, State and local agencies which undertake to study, survey, map and identify flood-prone areas as well as cooperation with neighboring jurisdictions with respect to adjoining flood plains in order to prevent aggravation of the flooding problem.

The following Resolution No. 14 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.02, Wis. Stats. (1971) and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1971).

1.2 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances
All prior Winnebago County Ordinances,
or parts thereof, in conflict with the pro-

visions of this Ordinance insofar as they regulate traffic on highways in Winnebago County, except those Ordinances adopted pursuant to authority granted in Sec. 349.11, Wis. Stats. (1971), are repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

1.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnebago County Vehicle Ordinance.

1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Iurisdiction

The Winnebago County Vehicle Ordinance shall regulate traffic on any highway in Winnebago County except those highways exclusively within the jurisdiction of towns, cities and villages which are regulated by similar traffic ordinances.

2.2 Wisconsin Vehicle Code Adopted

Pursuant to the authority granted to local authorities in Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1971), Winnebago County does hereby adopt the provisions of Chapters 341 to 348, Wis. Stats. (1971), inclusive, until amended, and then, as amended, and the same are by reference made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein with the following exceptions, to-wit:

Those provisions which are excepted in Sec. 349.03 and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1971).

Those provisions in Chapters 341 to 348, Wis. Stats. (1971), which are included in the definition of crimes in Sec. 939.12, Wis. Stats. (1971).

Each chapter and section thereof of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.3 Words and Phrases Defined

The provisions of Sec. 340.01, Wis. Stats. (1971), are hereby adopted and by reference are made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein. This section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.4 Penalties

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit a dollar amount not to exceed the maximum dollar amount of the forfeiture provided in the section of Wisconsin Statutes which coincides with the section of this Ordinance which is violated, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

2.5 Stipulation of Guilt or No Contest; Deposits

Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made by persons arrested for violations of this Ordinance whenever the provisions of Sec. 345.27, Wis. Stats., (1971) are inapplicable to such violations. Stipulations shall conform to the form contained on the uniform traffic citation and complaint and may be accepted within the number of days from the date of the alleged violation as appears on the uniform traffic citation and complaint issued to the alleged traffic offender.

Any person stipulating guilt or no contest as hereinbefore provided must make the deposit required under Sec. 345.26, Wis. Stats. (1971), which deposit has been fixed by the State Board of County Judges. The State of Wisconsin Uniform

State Traffic Deposit and Bond Schedule as adopted by the State Board of County Judges and which is currently in effect is made a part hereof.

PROHIBITING RECEIPT OF GIFTS OR GRATUITIES

- (b) conducts operations or activities which are regulated by Winnebago County or any of its departments; or
- (c) has interests which may be substantially affected by Winnebago County or any of its departments.

SECTION IL

The receipt of any gift, gratuity, or anything of value as denoted above is contrary to the public policy of Winnebago County.
