ORGANIZATION MEETING Tuesday, April 16, 1974

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 6 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin by the County Clerk, Dorothy L. Propp.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04B of the Wisconsin Statutes the April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

The Honorable Judge Willaim E. Crane, Circuit Court I, administered the Oath of Office to the newly-elected supervisors.

The new members of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors were formally introduced.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisor Neil Wilson who asked to be excused.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

#### ELECTION OF BOARD CHAIRMAN

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman of the Board for the term of two years.

Motion made by Supervisor Daggett and seconded that the rules be suspended James P. Coughlin be elected as Chairman of the County Board. Motion Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Jacobson and seconded that James P. Coughlin be elected as Chairman by unanimous vote. Carried by Voice Vote.

#### **ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN**

The chair appointed Supervisors Apell, Becher and Johnson as tellers.

Supervisor Precour nominated Alberta Goff as Vice Chairman. Supervisor Kampo nominated George Singstock as Vice Chairman. Supervisor Jacobson nominated Herman J. Brandt as Vice Chairman.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that nomina-

tions be closed. Carried by Voice Vote.

Supervisor Gischia requested a clarification of the voting procedures; namely that the candidate receiving the smallest number of votes be eliminated from the second ballot.

The votes were cast and counted: Herman Brandt 18, George

Singstock 19, Alberta Goff 8.

The second ballot, the votes were cast and counted: Herman

Brandt 24, George Singstock 21.

The Chair announced that Supervisor Brandt having received the largest number of votes cast was declared elected as Vice Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

#### ORIENTATION

Chairman James P. Coughlin addressed the board members outlining the duties of the various departments in the Courthouse, their functions and locations.

The Corporation Counsel welcomed the new members and in-

vited the members to seek his counsel.

Supervisor Neely gave a brief explanation of the functions of

the 51.42 Board.

Mr. Norman Whitford, Director of the Social Service Department explained the various programs of his department and the services which are purchased by the department.

Supervisor Pitz addressed the board regarding the rules and

changes in committee structures.

RULE # 1. Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to amend that the two nights meetings be changed to one day meeting on the third Tuesday, the time of meeting from 9 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. with one and one-half hours for lunch. LOST BY VOICE VOTE.

Motion made by Supervisor Johnson and seconded to amend "to meet once a month with the time 6 P.M., Carried Roll Call Vote Ayes 28; Absent 2, Olson and Wilson. Nayes 16 – Aarons, Ales, Becher, Herman Brandt, Collins, Goff, Greiner, Loy, Miller, Nobbe, Pitz, Planalp, Precour, Franklin Utech, Warning and Coughlin. Carried.

 $RULE~\#\,2.~$  Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to adopt the rule as amended. Carried.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that paragraph #4-Order of business be amended as follows: At least fifteen minutes time will be allowed between 7 P.M. and 8 P.M., at the discretion of the Chairman for public expression of opinion on any resolution or ordinance which appears on the agenda. Carried by Voice Vote.

Unless the rules were amended, Supervisor Pitz requested that

the rules be adopted as a whole at the end of the discussion.

Motion made by Supervisor Greiner and seconded that Rule # 15 - titled "Accounts" be deleted. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Greiner and seconded that the rule on Non-Debatable Motions be the same as last year. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to amend paragraph on Suspension of Rules as follows: Any of these rules may be suspended by 2/3 votes of the members present, except Rule No. 14, 19 and 28 which are not suspendable.

Motion made by Supervisor Loehning and seconded to delete from "and the time of meeting of said committee shall be during the evening hours unless impractical to do so." Carried by Voice Vote.

RULE # 28. Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that the rule on Adoption and Amendment of Rules be as stated in the directory. Carried by Voice Vote.

Supervisor Kampo offered an alternative committee structure which would be as follows: Aviation Committee three members; Zoning Committee two board members with one citizen member and all other committees five members.

Motion made by Supervisor Apell and seconded that the members of the Highway Committee be elected and not combined with the Aviation Committee. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that the Zoning Committee structure be that of two county board supervisors and one citizen member. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Goff and seconded that a Governmental Relations Committee be created was presented. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that his proposal of the Governmental Relations Committee be adopted. Motion made by Supervisor Hansche and seconded to delete the County Executive from the resolution. Carried by Voice Vote. Motion made by Supervisor Hansche and seconded that the Governmental Relations Committee be comprised of the County Board Chairman, Vice Chairman, one member from the following Committees: Personnel & Finance; Unified Board; Social Services Board. Ayes 15—Apell, Arne, Block, Collins, Daggett, Goff, Hansche, Hunter, Kampo, Loy, Miller, Neely, W.C. Pawlowski, Singstock and Coughlin. Excused 4—Englund, Olson, Wilson and Zingsheim. Nayes 27. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that the Committee on Committees make the appointments to the Governmental Relations Committee. Roll Call Vote, Ayes 27 — Apell, Arne, Becher, Block, Collins, Daggett, Goff, Greiner, Hansche, Hunter, Kampo, Loehning, Loy, Miller, Neely, Nielsen, Nobbe, Oberlies, J.C. Pawlowski, W.C. Pawlowski, Precour, Schmidt, Shurbert, Singstock, Michael Utech, Zanowski and Coughlin. Excused 4 — EEngland, Olson, Wilson and Zingsheim. Nayes 15. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Supervisor Loy and seconded that the Social Service Board be renamed The Social Services Committee. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely that the Social Services Committee be substituted for the Health Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Collins and seconded that the Health Committee remain intact. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Grignon and seconded that the following be added to the Buildings and Grounds Committee duties: Creation and maintenance of a long range development plan for buildings and office space needed by the county. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Daggett and seconded that the following be part of the duties of the Agriculture and Education Committee: Two members of this committee shall function as Winnebago County Trustees for the University of Wisconsin—Green Bay Fox Valley Campus. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the rules and duties as amended be adopted. Carried by Voice Vote.

## PROPOSED RULES OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY

#### TIME AND PLACE OF MEETING.

RULE NO. 1: The meeting of the County Board shall be held in the Board of Supervisors' Room at 6:00 P.M. on the third Tuesday of the month. The annual meeting shall commence on the last Monday in October and continue during consideration of the annual budget. The Board shall be in continuous session from day to day until adjournment to a day certain or sine die. The public hearing, as required by law, on the proposed annual budget shall be held at 7:00 P.M. on the date

ORGANIZATION MEETING.

RULE NO. 2:

At the Statutory Organization Meeting, it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to call the County Board to order. The clerk shall call the roll and establish presence of a quorum and proceed with the preliminary ceremonies.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

The Chairman shall then present an orientation program including an explanation of the work of the Board and the manner in which it functions, the projects of various departments, long range planning and the status of the various projects of the Board. He may

ask for the help of committee chairmen or department heads in making such explanation.

The County Clerk shall also make an explanation of procedure and the manner in which votes are taken.

There shall be an explanation of the present and proposed rules by the person who was Chairman of the Judiciary Committee prior to the Organization Meeting. The Corporation Counsel shall also address the Board. An explanation shall be made by the Chairman as to the appointment of committees and that a Committee on Committees will be announced during the day to assist in the selection of committee members. Such committee shall consist of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman and three County Board members appointed by the Chairman. The proposed rules of the Board shall be presented and rules adopted.

The County Highway Committee shall be elected annually by the Board on the first day of the Organization Meeting. A vacancy in the Highway Committee shall be filled at the next regular meeting of the County Board.

After the adoption of rules and committee structure, the Board shall recess that organization meeting to the following Tuesday. The Committee on Committees shall advise, by mail, all members of the Board their recommendations for committee membership and the Board shall as the first order of business at the recessed meeting officially appoint all committees by majority vote. All members of a committee shall then meet one-half hour to select committee officials of each committee and each committee shall then report to the Board who has been selected as such officials.

Between organization meetings, should a vacancy or the need to adjust a standing committee occur, or some committee assignment become urgent, then the Committee on Committees shall include a representative of the standing committee or committees directly concerned.

#### POWERS OF CHAIRMAN.

RULE NO. 3: The Chairman of the County Board shall act as an ex officio member of any committee of

the County Board, but shall have the power to vote on such committee only in the absence of one or more committee members upon request of the presiding officer.

The Chairman of the County Board shall be responsible for the preparation of the written

agenda of the County Board.

The Chairman of the County Board shall receive all requests and communications not specifically addressed to any committee or official of the County and refer such matters to the appropriate committees or officials. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-

RULE NO. 4:

The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the Chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, or recessed, or continued, call the Board to order and direct the calling of roll of members by the Clerk. In absence of both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, the County Clerk shall preside until a Chairman Pro-tem is elected.

#### ORDER OF BUSINESS.

RULE NO. 5:

Upon the establishment of a quorum, after roll call, and preliminary exercises (pledge of allegiance to the flag, prayer) the journal of the preceeding proceedings shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistakes therein shall be corrected by the Board, provided, that upon the last day of the Session, the journal for that day will be read, and before the final adjournment will be corrected.

After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Communications, petitions, memorials, accounts, etc.
- 2. Report of the County Executive.
- 3. Reports of Standing Committees.
- 4. At least fifteen minutes time will be allowed between 7:00 P.M. and 8:00 P.M., at the discretion of the Chairman, for public expression of opinion on any resolution or ordinance which appears on the agenda.
- 5. Presentation of resolutions and ordinances and disposition of same.
- 6. Consideration of miscellaneous business.

RULE NO. 6:

Every subject matter that shall come before the Board shall be referred to the appropriate committee by the Chairman without motion.

RULE NO. 7:

The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

#### HANDLING OF RESOLUTIONS.

RULE NO. 8:

Every written resolution shall be prepared in block form and be concise as possible and shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; when such resolution is referred to a Committee, such Committee shall report their findings with their names endorsed thereon. When a resolution is entered in the publication of official proceedings, such resolution shall bear only the name of the Committee, not names of individual members or date. The membership of each committee shall be published in the County Board proceedings for the session in which the appointments were made.

#### MUST REDUCE TO WRITING.

RULE NO. 9:

Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

#### RIGHT TO VOTE.

RULE NO. 10:

The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes, nays and abstain; when the vote on any question is tie, it shall be deemed to have been lost.

#### FORM OF RESOLUTION.

**RULE NO. 11:** 

All reports, resolutions and petitions must be presented to the County Clerk in typewritten form and be read and preserved by the Clerk.

#### FINANCE RESOLUTIONS.

**RULE NO. 12:** 

Requests from County Board Committees or members which require action of the Personnel & Finance Committees shall be submitted to the County Clerk's office to be assigned to the aforementioned Committee without prior reading to the County Board. A report to reject or adopt must be brought back to the County Board.

#### PRIVILEGE OF SPEAKING.

RULE NO. 13: Every member previous to speaking, shall rise and address the chair, and be recog-

nized by the chair.

When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is to

speak first.

No member shall speak more than twice on the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman, shall take his seat and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

#### VOTING AND ROLL CALL.

**RULE NO. 14:** 

(a) A vote on every question shall be taken by ayes, nays or abstention and shall be recorded in records of proceedings.

A unanimous oral vote shall be considered and recorded as an affirmative unanimous roll call vote.

In the event that there is no mechanical procedure for counting votes, then retain old Rule 16 as follows:

A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays, but members may vote to abstain when polled. A roll call shall be taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money, and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, members voting the affirmative, negative and those who abstain, as well as those absent, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

A unanimous oral vote shall be considered and recorded as an affirmative unanimous roll call vote.

#### PRECEDENCE OF MOTION.

**RULE NO. 15:** When a motion is under consideration, no other motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.

2. To lay on the table.

3. For the previous question.

4. To postpone to a day certain.

5. To commit to a committee.

6. To amend or to substitute.

To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

#### NON-DEBATABLE MOTIONS.

**RULE NO. 16:** A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided. It shall not, however, be in order to move to table a motion or resolution, until after the author of the motion or resolution has been given an opportunity to speak on his motion or resolution.

MOTION TO POSTPONE.

**RULE NO. 17:** 

A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not again be entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

AMENDMENT OR SUBSTITUTE PROPOSAL.

**RULE NO. 18:** 

A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

RECONSIDERATION.

**RULE NO. 19:** 

When a motion or question has once been determined, any member with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

PREVIOUS OUESTION.

RULE NO. 20:

The previous question may be moved by any member and shall require two-thirds affirmative vote on the members present for passage.

SUSPENSION OF RULES.

**RULE NO. 21:** 

Any of these rules may be suspended by twothirds vote of the members present, except Rule No. 14, 19 and 28, which are not suspendable.

ROBERTS RULE.

**RULE NO. 22:** 

The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Roberts Rules of Order" so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

INSPECTION BY COUNTY BOARD.

**RULE NO. 23:** The County Board shall make an annual inspection of county owned properties and facilities during the month of May.

PUBLICATION OF REPORTS.

**RULE NO. 24:** 

Reports presented to the County Board shall be mentioned in the Board proceedings for reference purposes but not published in the official proceedings unless specifically directed by the County Board.

WRITTEN AGENDA.

**RULE NO. 25:** 

The County Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed under the direction of the Chairman of the County Board to prepare a written agenda for each meeting. This agenda, together with relevant proposed ordinances, resolutions, and reports, shall be mailed to each supervisor at least five days before the meeting. Any person requesting this material shall be furnished with same and a sufficient supply, no less than 10 complete sets, of the same shall also be made available at the

meeting for public examination.

All matters not appearing in the agenda shall be out of order and shall not be considered by the Board during the particular meeting. All authors of reports, resolutions, and ordinances shall have said items in the possession of the County Clerk at least seven days prior to the meeting. Should any such material be withdrawn prior to the consideration by the County Board, the reason for the withdrawal and the person requesting the withdrawal shall be clearly indicated to the County Board.

Special orders of business appearing in the agenda as authorized by the County Board Chairman shall include the name of the person or persons requesting them.

#### READING OF AGENDA ITEMS.

**RULE NO. 26:** 

All resolutions, ordinances, and reports to be acted upon by the County Board which have been submitted to the County Board members at least twenty-four hours prior to the County Board meeting at which such resolution, ordinance, or report is to be considered may be referred to by title and number and need not be read unless requested by a supervisor.

#### NOTICE OF COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

**RULE NO. 27:** 

A bulletin board in the lobby of the Courthouse shall display a list of all committees of the County Board and the time and place of committee meetings shall be shown thereon. This shall be the duty of the County Clerk. Public notice of such meetings shall be given as soon as the members of the Committee are notified of such meeting and not less than twenty-four hours before the Committee meeting, except as hereinafter provided. Any Committee meeting announcement made at a County Board meeting shall satisfy the minimum notice requirements. In emergencies, when a Committee meeting must be held with less than twenty-four hours notice, then when notice of such meeting is given to Committee members, the County Clerk shall also give the press and radio or others requesting same or similar notice, such emergency meetings to be

called only as special meetings with notice of each emergency item to be considered. Any adjournment of a committee to a day and time certain shall be noticed in the same manner as a regular committee meeting, including the provisions for an emergency meeting.

All committee meetings shall be held in the

Courthouse or on public property.

Minutes of Committee meetings, except as to Executive sessions, shall be filed with the County Clerk within seven days of the holding of such meeting.

No committee meetings shall be held during any sitting of the Board unless authorized

by a majority vote of the Board.

ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT OF RULES.

**RULE NO. 28:** 

Rules of the County Board shall be adopted at the Organization Meeting of the Board by a majority vote of those present and shall only be amended during the year by a three-fourths vote of those present at a meeting, and such rule shall govern the Board until altered or repealed. All prior rules inconsistent, herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency repealed.

QUORUM AND VOTE REQUIRED ON BUDGET TRANSFERS.

SEC. 59.02 (3)

gives the general rule requiring a majority of supervisors to be present in order to have a quorum for the transaction of business. Under the same statute, all questions before the Board are determined by a majority of the supervisors present unless otherwise pro-

SEC. 65.90 (5)

vided. has some additional requirements for changes in the budget after it has once been adopted. Changes in the amounts appropriated and changes in the purposes for which amounts are appropriated may not be made after adoption of the budget except by a twothirds vote of the membership of the Board. There is an exception, however, within this Statute, to-wit: the County Board may authorize its standing Personnel & Finance Committee to transfer funds between items within a department or office if these items are separately appropriated, and may further authorize the Personnel & Finance Committee to supplement appropriations for a particular office, department or activity by a transfer from the Contingency fund.

#### **ELECTION OF HIGHWAY COMMITTEE**

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that the present members of the County Highway Committee be re-elected. Carried by Voice Vote.

#### GENERAL DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Insofar as possible and feasible, all committee meetings are to be held in the courthouse building, or other County property, and are open to the public with certain exceptions. Accurate minutes are to be kept of all proceedings, indicating as a matter of record discussions made in Committees. The County Board may assign additional responsibilities to committees from time to time.

All elected, appointed and special County Committees and all elected and/or appointed Boards of Directors and Board of Trustees under whose suggested and adopted legislation employees operate, shall have the specific responsibilities for such employees to the Personnel & Finance Committee through the Personnel Director for consideration and reference to the County Board as necessary for adoption.

They shall also have the specific responsibility for being familiar with State Statutes and regulations applicable to their area as well as new statutes or rules being proposed.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES

#### AGRICULTURE AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee. The Agriculture and Education Committee shall consist of five members with duties in the following areas:

1. Agriculture and extension education as outlined in Wis. Statutes, Sec. 59.87.

2. County Library.

3. Winnebago County Fairgrounds.

4. Supervision of Winnebago County Soil Conservation District.

It shall be responsible for county extension service programs, the employment of professional extension service personnel, determination of basic problems and periodic evaluation of extension service in Winnebago County. This Committee shall function in cooperation with the District Extension Leader, University of Wisconsin, in matters of program planning, public policy and contracting for services of extension agents.

It is the Committee of jurisdiction in the operation of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds and, as such, is responsible for the auditing and examination of expenditures made by the Winnebago County Fair Association as relates to the operation of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds and especially such appropriations as Winnebago County shall make from time to time for the maintenance and improvements of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds.

It shall meet regularly to discuss, consider and evaluate soil and water conservation practices established under the technical aid

of the Winnebago County Soil Conservationist. It shall give due consideration to wild life conservation in Winnebago County and make appropriate recommendations to the County on such matters.

Two members of this Committee shall function as Winnebago County Trustees for the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay Fox Valley Campus.

#### **AVIATION COMMITTEE**

The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee. The Aviation Committee shall consist of three members who shall have responsibility for the supervision, maintenance, operation and development of Wittman Field, the Winnebago County owned airport, and all other aviation matters of appropriate concern to Winnebago County.

#### **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE**

The Buildings and Grounds Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees, in accordance to Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee.

It shall be responsible for the care and upkeep of the Winnebago County buildings and grounds, including the County Jail, Department of Social Services and provisions for the Winnebago County Courthouse parking lot. It shall be responsible for the upkeep and repair of equipment, furniture and fixtures used in the Courthouse or in any of the aforementioned locations on the Courthouse property.

It shall be the Committee of jurisdiction for the purchase, sale, lease or rental of all real properties by any department of Winnebago County government, except the purchase, sale or lease of land by the Highway Committee and Park and Recreation Committee

pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes.

It shall also be responsible for the purchase, transfer or sale of office equipment and furniture used in all County owned or leased

building, structures and offices.

The duties of this Committee shall include the expenditure of County funds to obtain surveys, options and appraisals relating to property under consideration for purchase, sale or lease by Winnebago County except those lands under the jurisdiction of the Parks Committee and Highway Committee. It shall be designated as the Special Building Committee on all construction projects authorized by the County Board.

Creation and maintenance of a long range Development Plan

for buildings and office space needed by the County.

#### HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

The Highway Committee shall consist of five members who shall be elected by the County Board at the organization meeting in accordance with Wis. Stats. 83.015.

It shall have those duties as are set out in Wisconsin Statutes,

including but not limited to the following:

... Purchase and sale of County Road machinery as authorized by the County Board.

- Determine whether each piece of County aid construction shall be let be contract or otherwise.
- 3. Enter into contracts in the name of Winnebago County relating to the construction and maintenance of highways.

4. Enter private lands with their employees to remove weeds and brush and to erect or remove fences to keep highways open for travel.

5. Direct the expenditure of highway maintenance funds received from the State or provided by

County taxes.

 Audit all payrolls, material claims and vouchers resulting from the construction and maintenance of highways.

#### HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE

The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee. The Health and Social Services Committee shall consist of five members who shall have responsibility of examining, auditing and recommending to the Finance Committee for allowance or disallowance, all claims which have been filed by municipalities against the County for various types of poor relief and such other duties as are contained in Wis. Stats. Sec. 46.22.

It shall supervise the activities of the Department of Social Services and confer with the Director thereof on matters presented to his office.

The Social Services Committee shall also function as the County Health Committee and is responsible for those duties relating to the County Public Health Nurses and the County Health Department as are contained in Wis. Stats., Sec. 141.06.

When the Board is functioning as the County Health Committee, then, a representative of the State Health Department as appointed by the State Health Officer shall participate in decisions and matters pertaining to this subject. The duties of the Committee on Social Services as relates to health shall be to conduct a generalized public health nursing program in cooperation with the State Board of Health.

#### JUDICIARY AND PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

The Judiciary and Public Safety Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board through its Committee on Committees shall appoint the committee in accordance with Rule # 2.

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the Circuit Courts, County Courts, Sheriff's Department, District Attorney, Coroner, Corporation Counsel, Family Court Commissioner, Veteran's Service Officer, Register of Deeds, County Clerk and County Law Library.

It shall confer with the Sheriff on matters relating to law enforcement in Winnebago County and handle all matters pertaining to public safety, including provisions for ambulance service, rescue work on waters bordering on or within Winnebago County and snowmobile and boating use in Winnebago County.

on waters bordering on or within Winnebago County and snow-

mobile and boating use in Winnebago County.

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction of Winnebago County's Defense Civil Preparedness Agency (Civil Defense). It shall be responsible for the recommendation and implementation of an effective program of emergency government consistent with the State of Wisconsin plans of emergency government and more particularly as outlined in Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 22.16. The Chairman of the County Board shall function as the head of emergency government services in Winnebago County.

It shall recommend rules of the County Board. Such rules must be submitted at the organization meeting of the County Board and changes in rules may be submitted at other times of the year

subject to Rule # 28 of the Rules of the County Board.

It shall supervise codification of County Board ordinances and resolutions.

It shall make recommendations of proper apportionment of

Supervisory Districts of Winnebago County.

It shall have the duty of arranging for the appropriate publication and printing of the proceedings of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

#### PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

The Parks Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee.

It shall be responsible for the obtaining, maintenance, operation and development of all Winnebago County Parks and recreation areas, including boat landings, recreational travel areas, associated programs and wild life preservation areas.

It shall recommend to the County Board from time to time for its action, the necessary rules and regulations for all Winnebago

County owned recreational areas.

#### PERSONNEL AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Personnel and Finance Committee shall consist of five members and shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the County Treasurer, the County Auditor and the County Personnel Director. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance to Rule #2, shall appoint the standing committee.

It shall establish the procedure for the preparation of an annual County Budget to be developed by the County Executive and notify department heads, committees and other officials, of the procedure to be followed in the development of the necessary financial

data for their segment of said budget.

The Executive Budget shall be referred, by the Board, to the Personnel & Finance Committee for such review as it deems necessary and for presentation to the Board at the Annual Meeting for its

consideration, review and adoption.

It shall have published the recommended budget in accordance with requirements of Wisconsin Statutes and shall include appropriate notations to show any changes in said budget from the budget proposals initially prepared by the various departments for examination of the County Executive and the Personnel & Finance Committee.

After adoption, it shall have authority to make budgetary alterations as permitted by Wisconsin Statutes Sec. 65.90 (5) (b) where such alterations are either of the following:

 A transfer of funds between budgeted items of an individual County Department if such budgeted items have been separately appropriated,

2. Supplementation of appropriations for a particular office or department by transfer from the Contingency fund.

The limitation on the dollar amount of such budgetary alteration shall be the amount set aside in the Contingency Fund or the sum of \$3,000.00, whichever is the lesser sum. In addition, the Personnel & Finance Committee may refuse to grant any budgetary alteration in whole or in part may grant any such request conditionally on such conditions as it deems appropriate.

It shall notify the County Board each month of any such budgetary alterations requests and subsequent action thereon.

It shall review all financial reports submitted to the County Board by the County Executive and by County officials and by auditors retained by the County. (The County Executive is charged with the responsibility to examine, settle and allow all general accounts against the County and to have issued County orders therefore.)

It shall be empowered to authorize expenditures not to exceed \$1,000.00 for any one item in an emergency request from a committee between County Board sessions.

It shall also audit and allow mileage and per diem for County Board and committee meetings and audit, adjust and allow or disallow all dog claims and assessor's claims.

It shall advise with the County Treasurer and County Executive in the matter of investment of County funds. It shall advise with the County Board from time to time regarding County finances.

It shall have the duty to propose equalizing the value of all taxable properties in Winnebago County in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes. It shall have the duty to examine all claims filed against the County for illegal taxes of any kind and shall make a report and recommend to the County Board on all matters pertaining to illegal taxes.

It shall manage and attend to the sale of all properties taken by

Winnebago County on tax deeds.

It shall negotiate for the insurance of Winnebago County in accordance with the statutes and resolutions adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to establish insurance coverage requirements for all lessees and sub-lessees of property in which Winnebago County has an insurable interest. It shall make an annual report to the County Board of all such insurance carried by Winnebago County.

It is the Committee of jurisdiction for all claims filed against Winnebago County pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 59.76 and Sec. 895.43, and shall work in cooperation with the County Clerk and Corporation Counsel to insure that such claims are properly

handled to protect the interest of Winnebago County.

The duties of this Committee shall include the receipt of all personnel requests from all Committees for study and recommendation. It shall supervise negotiations on behalf of Winnebago County with authorized representatives of County employees, and meet from time to time with County employees, or their representatives, with respect to grievances, salaries, classification or reclassification, and other benefits.

It shall recommend to the County Board a salary schedule for elected officers and officials of Winnebago County, in accordance with the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes, and a salary schedule for all appointed officials and other employees of Winnebago County, unless otherwise determined by agreement or statute.

#### CITIZEN INVOLVED COMMITTEES

### UNIFIED BOARD AND PARK VIEW HEALTH CENTER COMMITTEE

Pursuant to Wis. Statutes, Sec. 51.42 and 51.437 (4) (b), Winnebago County has by Ordinance established a community mental health, development disabilities, alcoholism and drug abuse program.

A nine member Board appointed by the Executive, five of whom shall be Winnebago County Board Supervisors, to be known as the 51.42 Unified Board, has the responsibility to provide the program as required by the foregoing statutory sections and appropriate sections in the Wisconsin Administrative Code. A more concise indication of the duties, responsibilities and authorities, as well as other pertinent information relating thereto, can be found in the Ordinance adopted by Winnebago County establishing the 51.42 Unified Board.

The five County Board Supervisors shall function exclusively as the Park View Health Center Committee, with jurisdiction over Pleasant Acres and the Rehabilitation Pavilion, except in those areas specifically in the field of mental health.

#### ZONING AND ADJUSTMENTS COMMITTEE

The Zoning and Adjustments Committee shall consist of three members. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee, which shall consist of two Winnebago County Board supervisors and one citizen member.

This committee shall have the powers conferred by Wisconsin Statutes Sec. 59.97, including but not limited to the following:

1. Creation and maintenance of the County Development plan.

2. Formation and maintenance of the Zoning

Ordinance.

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the County Zo

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the County Zoning Officer and County Sanitary Inspector.

The Committee shall function as the Board of Adjustments with such duties as are outlined in Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 59.99.

#### GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

A Governmental Relations Committee, consisting of the County Board Chairman, the County Board Vice-Chairman and three County Board supervisors, to be appointed by the Committee on Committees, in accordance with Rule # 2.

The duties of this Committee shall be:

- To become aware of legislation proposed in Madison which might affect Winnebago County, if time permits obtain the opinion of the County Board Committee of jurisdiction of the subject of such legislation and of the County Board as a whole, to make representations to the Legislature concerning such opinion.
- To consult with the County Boards Association with a view to conveying views of Winnebago County and knowing those of that Association.
- 3. To make a determined effort to improve understandings and cooperative efforts on matters of joint concern between Winnebago County and each or all of its political subdivisions. The County Board Chairman may from time to time, ask one or several members of the County Board to serve with the Governmental Relations Committee on a particular matter; but such joining with the committee shall be restricted to the matter concerned, not a general augmenting of the Governmental Relations Committee.
- The Governmental Relations Committee shall report each month to the County Board as does each of the Standing Committees of the Board.

#### WINNEBAGO COUNTY PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Winnebago County Planning Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule # 2, shall appoint the standing committee, whose membership shall be determined as follows:

Two (2) County Board Supervisors from the Zoning and Adjustments Committee; and

Three (3) other County Board Supervisors to be designated by the Committee on Committees, two (2) of whom shall be urban supervisors.

The duties and responsibilities of said committee shall be as follows:

1. Creation and maintenance of the County development plan.

 Consideration of solid waste disposal, metropolitan sewage disposal and matters relating thereto. 3. Committee of jurisdiction for the Winnebago County Planner.

#### COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S APPOINTMENT TO 51.42 UNIFIED BOARD

#### 51.42 UNIFIED BOARD REPORT

Supervisor Neely reported on the status of the 51.42 Board calling the board's attention to the impending deficit of \$946,912 because the state has not fully funded mental health programs as presented to State of Wisconsin last December. It is hoped that when legislators reconvene shortly that funds will be appropriated to pick up the full amount of Winnebago's 51.42 program's budget. Assembly Bill No. 90A eliminated county mental hospitals December 31st so that Winnebago County faces a \$1,500,000 project converting the former county hospital into a psychiatric nursing home. On May 23rd the County will be opening bids on converting the hospital. Supervisor Neely has sent a communication to the Governor and interested legislators requesting the state to reverse its decision to go to a current billing program and return to the charge backs system of previous years. Motion made by Supervisor Gischia and seconded that Supervisor Neely be instructed to send the letter.

Two Legal Stenographers

These positions are presently part-time and will be increased to full-time.

Social Worker

Services required for this position will be performed by the Marriage Counselor in the Social Services Department and, therefore, will not require the creation of a new position.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that your Personnel and Finance Committee is authorized to establish the salaries for the foregoing positions in accordance with existing County labor contracts or salary plans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive is authorized to purchase the necessary office equipment and supplies for the newly expanded Family Court Commissioner's Office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the newly expanded Family Court Commissioner's Office be ready to function on or about June 1, 1974.

CREATION OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY COMMITTEE ON AGING

The following Resolution No. 4 was presented: THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the older people of Winnebago County are now and long have been contributing members to this County's social and economic well-being, and

WHEREAS, in order that these members are able to be a vital part of the community and in order to meet their needs, in-

creased planning and services must be provided, and

WHEREAS, with the attention now being given by the national and state governments and in our own community toward senior citizens, it is important that the County also participate in an effective manner toward making a positive impact on the lives of its older citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that there is hereby created a Winnebago County Committee on Aging subject to the following terms,

conditions and circumstances:

(1) Purpose:

The Committee shall act to improve the quality of life for the senior citizens of Winnebago County.

(2) Appointing Authority:

The members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Chairman of the County Board, subject to confirmation of the County Board. Members appointed shall have demonstrated an interest in serving the elderly. In making appointments, due consideration shall be given to achieve a balance of urban and rural representation.

(3) Membership of Committee:

- (a) The Committee shall consist of at least nine (9) but no more than thirteen (13) members and 75% of the members shall be senior citizens sixty (60) years of age or over. At least one (1) member shall be under the age of thirty (30). No more than two (2) members shall be elected County officials.
- (b) Tenures: The members shall serve for a term of three (3) years with exception of the original appointees whose terms shall be staggered: 1/3 3 years; 1/3 2 years; and 1/3 1 year.
- (c) Organization, By-laws: The Committee shall, at its first meeting, proceed to elect a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Secretary. Officials so elected shall serve for a term of one (1) year. The Committee shall be authorized to adopt its own By-laws and procedures, provided they are not inconsistent with the intent and purposes of Public Law 93-29 (The Older American's Act).

(d) Representation on Area Agency on Aging: The Committee shall elect one of its members to the Board of Directors of the Area Agency on Aging.

(e) Responsibility of Delegate to Area Agency on Aging: The County Committee on Aging shall recommend to its member of the Board of Directors of the Area Agency on Aging, its selection of priorities as listed in the State Operating Plan under Public Law 93-29 (The Older American's Act). (4) Duties, Powers:

The powers and duties of the Committee which shall be exercised and performed in conformity with the laws and ordinances of the County of Winnebago, shall be as follows:

The Committee shall act as the forum through (a) which the voices of the older person can be heard on any and all issues relating to the well-being and enhancing the opportunities of the elderly as contributing members of the community.

The Committee should serve as the clearing house **(b)** and facilitate the exchange of information and cooperation for all County (public and private)

programs on aging.

(c) The Committee shall review and become familiar with all existing services for the aging. The Committee shall specify areas that require services and shall encourage the use of existing community programs or recommend new programs that will provide for an efficient and coordinated method of delivering services.

(d) The Committee shall be authorized to establish subcommittees to encourage community involvement in keeping with the purposes and objectives

of the Committee.

(e) The Committee shall report to, and shall coordinate its activities with, the Health and Social Services Committee of the County Board, and shall be called upon at times to make reports to the County Board of Supervisors as required.

**(f)** The Committee shall gather pertinent information concerning characteristics of the elderly in the County, and shall be informed on legislative developments and needs, and shall make this information available to the Health and Social Services Committee, the County Board and the Area Agency on Aging.

The Committee shall cooperate with the Area (g) Agency on Aging and related public and private agencies in all efforts concerned with planning and

program development.
The Committee shall prepare annually, a budget (h) for necessary and reasonable expenditures to be incurred by the Committee in accomplishing its goals and mandates, subject to review and approval of the County Board.

(5) Administrative Assistance:

The Winnebago County Department of Social Services shall provide staff to assist the Committee on Aging in carrying out its duties.

(6) Relationships:

The Committee may call upon all departments and divisions of County government for assistance in fulfilling its purpose as required.

#### (7) Committee Reimbursement:

Members of the Committee shall be reimbursed for travel and meals required in the performance of their duties in accordance with Winnebago County's policy concerning the subject.

# DATA PROCESSING OF TAX ROLLS FOR WINNEBAGO COUNTY MUNICIPALITIES

The following Resolution No. 12 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Winnebago County has been studying the possibility of assisting the various municipalities within its boundaries in the development of assessment rolls, tax rolls, delinquent and post-poned tax bills and the tax sales book; and

WHEREAS, this assistance by Winnebago County would involve the utilization of data processing equipment and procedures presently available to Winnebago County as a unit of government;

and

WHEREAS, the following is a list of some of the benefits available to the various municipalities through the conversion of the present card system to the use of data processing:

Eliminate hand posting of assessed valuations to assess-

ment roll by Town Clerk or Assessor.

2. Eliminate hand transferring of assessed valuations from assessment roll to tax roll.

3. Eliminate hand calculation of taxes due and recording in

4. Eliminate hand recording of taxes due on all tax bills.

5. Eliminate hand typing of delinquent list by County Treasurer's office.

6. Eliminate hand posting of delinquent tax amount to a card for previous year's accumulated delinquent taxes on same parcel of property.

7. By coding each parcel of property as to type of land or zoning, you would have ready access to totals or list of property such as agricultural, residential, industrial, County owned, State owned, Federal owned, etc.

8. Have ability to print a report of delinquencies by municipality. Also, ability to list tax roll by owner in addition

to list by parcel number.

and

WHEREAS, through the funds available to Winnebago County by reason of the Comprehensive Employment & Training Act of 1973, such temporary staff as may be necessary to provide this service to the various municipalities can be funded by this Act; and

WHEREAS, a meeting with officials of interested municipalities, together with certain County officials, was held on May 15, 1974, and it was concluded that a substantial majority of municipalities within Winnebago County would be interested in such a service.

#### SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION -

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.07 (1m), Wis. Stats., (1971).

1.2 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances
All prior Winnebago County Ordinances, or parts
thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this
Ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded effective the effective date of this Ordinance.

1.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance.

1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law and the placement of sufficient signs in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

## SECTION 2.0 DEFINITIONS

Terms used in this Ordinance have the following meanings:

2.1 Vehicle: every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway.

2.2 Area "A" — 1 Hour Visitor Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by persons other than employees of Winnebago County having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of a duration not to exceed one (1) hour between the hours of 7:30 o'clock A. M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight.

2.3 Area "B" — General Courthouse Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by persons other than employees of Winnebago County having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of an unlimited duration between the hours of 7:30 o'clock A. M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight.

2.4 Area "C" — Employee Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by employees of Winnebago County, as hereinafter defined, to park vehicles having an officially designated parking permit issued by the Winnebago County Personnel Department visibly exhibited on said vehicle; said parking to occur during their hours of employment in any of the departments or offices located within the Winnebago County Courthouse.

2.5 Area "D" — Police Vehicle Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used for the purpose of parking official vehicles of a police department located within or outside of Winnebago County.

2.6 Area "E" - Loading Zone: the area at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot reserved for the loading and unloading of materials, supplies and the like at the Winnebago County Courthouse and shall be used only for such time as is necessary to complete the aforementioned loading or unloading.

2.7 No Parking Area: the area of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot where the parking of any vehicles at any time is strictly prohibited.

- 2.8 Employees: persons employed by Winnebago County in any of the departments located in the Winnebago County Courthouse or any other persons whose employment is located within any of the offices or departments in the Winnebago County Courthouse.
- 2.9 Winnebago County Courthouse: buildings known as the Winnebago County Courthouse building and the Winnebago County Social Services building.

## SECTION 3.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

## 3.1 Regulation of Parking

(1) General:

No vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended, in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot except in accordance with the designations placed on signs in the said parking lot and then only in accordance with the regulations governing the use of said areas. Those designations shall be as follows:

(a) Area "A" - 1 Hour Visitor Parking

(b) Area "B" - General Courthouse Parking

(c) Area "C" - Employee Parking

(d) Area "D" - Police Vehicle Parking

(e) Area "E" – Loading Zone
(f) – No Parking Area

(2) Driveways, Ramp:

Except as hereinafter provided, no vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended at any time on any of the driveways or Winnebago County Sheriff's Department ramps of the Courthouse Parking Lot. Police vehicles may be parked on the Sheriff's Department ramps.

(3) Operators of motor vehicles making use of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot shall observe and comply with the regulatory and directional traffic signs for entry upon and departure from said Parking Lot.

(4) No vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended, in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot in such manner as to cause a hazard or in any way be an obstruction to vehicular or other traffic.

(5) No vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended, in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot between the hours of 12:00 o'clock A. M. and 7:30 o'clock A. M. other than employees of Winnebago County or persons engaged in official business at the Winnebago County Courthouse or the Winnebago County Social Services Department.

3.3 Policing and Enforcement:

It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department to issue citations for parking violations at the Winnebago County Court-

house Parking Lot.

It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County Personnel Department to distribute and account for employee parking stickers to designate the vehicles to be parked in Area "C" in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot.

3.4 Authorization to Move Vehicles:

Any vehicle parked in violation of this Ordinance may be removed or caused to be removed by the Winnebago County Sheriff from the present location of the vehicle to another area of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot or such other location as the Sheriff shall designate. Any vehicle so moved shall be released to the owner or operator thereof upon proper identification by that person and payment of the cost of removing said vehicle. Winnebago County shall not be liable for any damages to the removed vehicle which might result from the act of removal unless such damages can be shown to have resulted from the negligence of Winnebago County in such removal.

SECTION 4.0 PENALTIES

4.1 Stipulation for Parking Violation Procedure:

Persons to whom a citation has been issued to appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, for violating any of the provisions of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance may, within forty-eight (48) hours after 6:00 o'clock P. M. on the day of the violation, appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's office and enter into a stipulation with Winnebago County. The violator may stipulate as follows:

(a) that the facts of the violation are true, (b) that he pleads to the violation by enter-

ing a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, (c) that the plea which he makes is reduced

to writing on the stipulation.

The violator shall then sign the stipulation, print his name, post office address, his operator's license number and date of birth on the stipulation. The violator shall then and there pay to the Winnebago County Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) and shall further stipulate that the sum paid to the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, shall be forfeited to Winnebago County upon expiration of forty-eight (48) hours after 6:00 o'clock P. M. of the date of the violation. After the expiration of such time, the forfeited money shall be remitted by the Sheriff to the Winnebago County Treasurer. Such violator need not appear in Court and no witness fees or additional costs shall be taxed.

4.2 Penalties Where No Stipulation:

Persons to whom a citation has been issued to appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, for violating any of the provisions of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance, and who do not timely enter into a stipulation as provided in Section 4.1 of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction of violating the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance, forfeit to Winnebago County, a sum of not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each violation as the Court, in its discretion, shall determine, together with the costs of the action to collect such forfeiture, and upon default of the payment may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail for a period not to exceed (5) days. # PROHIBITING REĆEIPT OF GIFTS OR GRATUITIES

A. Except as hereinafter provided, it shall be unlawful for any Winnebago County Employee or Official to receive or offer to receive, either directly or indirectly, any gift, gratuity, or thing of value which he is not authorized to receive from any person, if such person:

(1) has or is seeking to obtain contractual or other business or financial relationships with Winnebago County or any of its departments:

(2) conducts operations or activities which are regulated by Winnebago County or

any of its departments; or

(3) has interests which may be substantially affected by Winnebago County or any of its departments.

B. The receipt of any gift, gratuity, or thing of value as denoted above is contrary to the pub-

lic policy of Winnebago County.

C. Nothing herein shall prevent or shall it be deemed unlawful hereunder for any Winnebago County Employee or Official, as a candidate seeking public office, to accept money, property or other thing of value as a campaign contribution pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 12, Wisconsin Statutes.

SECTION 3. REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES

All prior Winnebago County Ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded effective with the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Hospital, Sanatoria and Nursing Home;

WHEREAS, the 1970 amendment to Section III-B of the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance necessitates that all multiple-family construction follow the provisions in a "special use permit" issued for said construction; and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Board has charged the Winnebago County Planning Committee and its planning staff with the authority to design and maintain a County Development Plan; to undertake special studies pertinent to county development; and to assume responsibility for all planning duties which are within county jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the designated legal tool for implementing this planning function; for maintaining and improving upon the chosen life-styles of existing residents; and for insuring that the life-styles advertised for future residents will be congruent with the realities encountered by these future populations is through the authority of the

zoning process; and

WHEREAS, efficient, quality workmanship is always facilitated by tools which are both designed for a specific use and honed to a

keen edge; and

WHEREAS, the existing County Zoning Ordinance was designed for use at a time when open land, a small population, single-family homes, uninterrupted drainage and distant neighbors were the mode; and

FURTHERMORE, because this mode of living required only that the zoning process accommodate the "Health", "Safety" and "Morals" of the individual land user rather than to promote these standards on a coordinated, community-wide basis as needed today; and

WHEREAS, the mode of living in the county today is characterized by a large portion of the population which is settling into an "urbanized" life-style with diverse residential needs, i. e. single-family, multiple-family, cluster housing, condominium ownership, etc., which requires close scrutiny of development practices; and

FURTHERMORE, these diverse residential types intensify the need to preserve unobstructed surface drainage and to insure that sewage treatment and solid waste disposal are effectively controlled so that environmental quality can be maintained or restored where necessary; and

WHEREAS, it has now become necessary to protect farming methods from the intrusions that accompany urban sprawl; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to preserve prime agricultural areas for large-scale food production and to protect those small-scale farms where agriculture is chosen as an alternative occupational life-style to that of "city work"; and

ADJOURNED APRIL SESSION Tuesday, August 20, 1974

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman James P. Coughlin on Tuesday, August 20th, 1974 at 6 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of the following excused supervisors: Apell, England and Singstock.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

Motion made by Supervisor Precour and seconded that the minutes of the July 16th meeting be approved as printed. Carried by Voice Vote.

A communication from the City of Oshkosh that the subject matter of a contract between the City of Oshkosh and Winnebago County is hereby authorized to attach to the city sewer and water utilities provided that they pay the appropriate charges for such utilities was read. Referred to the Aviation Committee.

A communication from Attorney James T. Bayorgeon representing Mr. William T. Heling, who suffered personal injuries as a result of a collision between his automobile and a Winnebago County grade was presented. Referred to the Highway Committee and Corporation Counsel.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

The following committee reports were submitted in written form and are on file in the County Clerk's office: Aviation; Agricultural & Extension Education; Buildings & Grounds; Health & Social Services; Parks & Recreation; Personnel & Finance.

Supervisor Pitz questioned the Agricultural & Extension Com-

mittee regarding the use of sludge.

Supervisor Christoph questioned the Agricultural & Extension Committee regarding the control of Dutch Elm disease.

Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded that the subject be referred to the Agricultural Committee with their recommendation to be submitted in four months. Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded to amend that the report should be submitted in one month. Carried by Voice Vote.

Supervisor Greiner, Chariman of the Judiciary & Public Safety, reported that his committee is concerned over the salary paid to the

Family Court Commissioner.

### PUBLIC HEARING ON PETITION OF RICHARD WAND

Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski and seconded that the board go into a committee of a whole for the purpose of a public hearing on the property owned by Richard and Sharon Wand in the Town of Neenah for the purpose of discontinuing and vacating a road. Upon rising the board could act as a committee. Mr. Richard W. Wand, owner and his attorney Mr. F. Joseph Sensenbrenner appeared before the board with their request. A representative from the Town Board of Neenah reported that the board had no objections or recommendations on this subject. There were no persons present who objected to the vacation of the road.

Motion made by Supervisor Loy and seconded that the hearing be closed and the board go into regular session. Carried by rising.

Dean Rue C. Johnson, of the University Center — Fox Valley School, appeared before the board showing slides of the campus and statistics related to the school. Dean Johnson also showed slides of the various campus which were comparable to Winnebago County. At the end of the presentation, Dean Johnson, told the board that they might anticipate a request in the near future for expansion and up-dating of this facility. Supervisor Daggett introduced the trustees from Outagamie County, Mr. Al Lewandoski and Mr. Nick Karras.

The County Executive, Orrin H. King, received a study from the National Council on Crime and Delinquency which was authorized by the Winnebago County Board. The study covered juvenile detention, both secure and nonsecure or shelter care; the feasibility of a safety building for the City of Oshkosh and Winnebago; and also Justice planning in Winnebago County. Mr. King, in his summary reported to the board, his conclusion of the study 1) There is not a need for Winnebago County to build a juvenile detention facility. 2) Availability of receiving home rooms should be expanded so that there are places that the Court can use for those in need of being kept in some place other than their home. 3) Juvenile Court policies and procedures should be studied and perhaps updated. 4) The study of a cooperative venture, the joint City-County safety building, should proceed diligently. 5) Justice Planning in Winnebago County needs updating. A study needs to be implemented. A criminal and juvenile justice planner position should be created to serve our county as well as its municipalities.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

The Chairman announced that at this time the public would be allowed to express their opinion on any resolution or ordinance which appears on the agenda.

Mr. Donel H. Wyman, representing the Buildings & Trades Union, appeared before the board of supervisors in opposition to the resolution requesting the highway employees to demolish a countyowned building.

Mr. Fred Gehrke, an employee of the Winnebago County Highway Department, appeared before the bord asking favorable support

of the resolution.

### WINNEBAGO COUNTY PARKS ORDINANCE

The following Ordinance No. 4 was presented:

### AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKS, ACCESS SITES AND RECREATIONAL AREAS OWNED AND OPERATED BY WINNEBAGO COUNTY

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

### SECTION 1.0 DEFINITIONS

### 1.1 Park

The term "park" wherever used in this Ordinance, unless otherwise stated, shall include the grounds, buildings thereon, waters therein, of the parks, river and lake access sites and other recreational areas which are now or may hereafter be under the control of the Winnebago County Parks and Recreation Committee.

#### 1.2 Person

The term "person" as used herein shall include any individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association of persons, and the singular number shall include the plural.

#### 1.3 Committee

The term "committee" whenever used herein shall mean the Winnebago County Parks and Recreation Committee.

### 1.4 Superintendent

The term "superintendent" whenever used herein shall mean the Winnebago County Parks Superintendent.

#### 1.5 Vehicle

The term "vehicle" wherever used in this Ordinance shall mean any device by which a person or property may be transported and which is self-propelled.

1.6 Snowmobile Trail

The term "snowmobile trail" as used herein shall designate the parcel of land formerly a railroad right-of-way approximately 9.9 miles in length commencing immediately west of the City of Oshkosh and ending in the vicinity of the Community of Larsen.

### SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Superintendent

The Superintendent shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the County parks.

2.2 Violations

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision of this Ordinance.

2.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

2.4 Title

The Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnel ago County Parks Ordinance.

2.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect after its passage and publication.

2.6 Other Ordinances

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in addition to the provisions of the Ordinance Providing for the Regulation and Licensing of Large Assemblies of Persons in Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and, in the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Ordinance and the said Large Assemblies Ordinance, then, the provisions of the latter Ordinance shall prevail.

### SECTION 3.0 REGULATIONS

3.1 Park Property

No person in a park shall:

(a) Disfiguration and removal: wilfully mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with, or displace or remove, any buildings, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, railings, paving or paving material, waterlines or other public utilities or parts or appurtenances thereof, signs, notices or placards, whether temporary or permanent, monuments,

stakes, posts, or other boundary markers, or other structures or equipment, facilities or park property or appurtenances whatsoever, either real or personal.

(b) Rest rooms and washrooms: fail to cooperate in maintaining restrooms and washrooms in a neat and sanitary condition. No person over the age of five years shall use the rest rooms and wash-

rooms designated for the opposite sex.

- Sanitation: throw, discharge, or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters of any fountain, pond, lake, stream, bay or ony body of water in or adjacent to any park or any tributary, stream, storm sewer, or drain flowing into such waters, any substance, matter or thing, liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of said waters. Have brought in or shall dump, deposit or leave any bottles, broken glass, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, garbage or refuse, or other trash. No such refuse or trash shall be placed in any waters in or contiguous to any park, or left anywhere on the grounds thereof, but shall be placed in the proper receptacles where these are provided; where receptacles are not so provided, all such rubbish or waste shall be carried away from the park by the persons responsible for its presence, and properly disposed of elsewhere.
- (d) Disorderly Conduct: no person shall in a public place engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance.

3.2 Operating Policy

(a) Hours: The park and activities therein shall be opened or operating during the hours of 5:30 A.M. until 10:30 P.M. daily and signs to this effect shall be posted at the various entrances to

the park.

(b) Closing of Park or parts thereof: Any section, or part of the park, may be declared closed by the Superintendent or Committee at any time and for any interval of time either temporarily or at regular or stated intervals. The Superintendent or Committee may close the swimming facilities in any park during inclement weather, the existence of unsanitary water conditions, or for other good cause.

3.3 Picnic Areas

No person in a park shall:

(a) Picnic or lunch in a place other than those designated for that purpose.

(b) Leave a picnic area before a fire in the said picnic area is completely extinguished and before all trash, garbage and other refuse in the said picnic area is placed in the disposal receptacles provided for that purpose.

3.4 Group Activity

Whenever any group, association or organization desires to use said park facilities for a particular purpose, (such as picnics, parties or theatrical or entertainment performances) a representative of said group, association or organization shall first obtain a permit from the Superintendent for such

purposes.

The Superintendent may grant the application if it appears that the group, association or organization will not interfere with the general use of the park by the individual members of the public and if the said group, association or organization meets all other conditions contained in the application. The application may contain a requirement for an indemnity bond to protect the County from any liability of any kind or character and to protect County property from damage, and shall contain such a provision if the swimming lake is to be utilized by said group.

If the group, association or organization is nonprofit, the prohibition against vending and peddling as provided in SECTION 3.10 of this Ordinance may be waived by the Superintendent. Such waiver may include permission to sell beer, provided such non-profit group, association or organization first obtains whatever licenses, if any, are required by the municipality in which the said park is located. Permission for vending or peddling will be limited to vending or peddling within the non-profit group, association or organization con-

ducting the event at the park.

Bathing and Swimming No person in a park shall:

(a) Designated areas: swim, bathe, or wade in any waters or waterways in or adjacent to any park, except in such waters and at such places as are provided therefor, and in compliance with such regulations as are herein set forth or may be hereafter adopted.

(b) Bathhouses: dress or undress on any beach, toilet or other place, except in such bathing houses or structures as may be provided for that

purpose.

3.5

3.6 Speed of Vehicles

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle in any area in said park in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour, except snowmobiles which

must, at all times, be operated in accordance with the requirements of the Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance.

3.7 Smoking, Food or Beverages

It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke inside the pool area or to handle, possess or consume food or beverages therein.

3.8 Animals

No animals, except on leashes of suitable strength not more than six (6) feet in length, shall be allowed in the park.

3.9 Making Fires

No person shall make or kindle a fire for any purpose except in places provided therefor, and then, subject to such regulations as may be prescribed.

3.10 Merchandising, Advertising and Signs

Except as provided in SECTION 3.4 of this Or-

dinance, no person in a park shall:

- (a) Vending and peddling: expose or offer for sale any article or thing, or shall he station or place any stand, cart, or vehicle for the transportation, sale or display of any such article or thing, excepting the regularly authorized concessionaire acting by and under the authority and regulation of the Committee.
- (b) Advertising: announce, advertise, or call the public attention in any way to any article or service for sale or hire.
- (c) Signs: paste, glue, tack or otherwise post any sign, placard, advertisement, or inscription whatever, nor shall any person erect or cause to be erected any sign whatever on any public lands or highways or roads adjacent to a park.

3.11 Firearms; Hunting

Except for law enforcement personnel, no person shall carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol or firearm, or hunt with bow and arrow within any park or snowmobile trail covered by this Ordinance. No person shall carry, fire or discharge any torpedo, rocket or other fireworks within any park or snowmobile trail covered by this Ordinance.

3.12 Parking

Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall park any vehicle or permit any vehicle to remain standing on any highway or roadway within the boundaries of county parks other than during the hours the park is open as indicated in SECTION 3.2 (a) of this Ordinance. Police vehicles, emergency rescue or fire vehicles, or County maintenance vehicles are excepted from this provision.

3.13 Camping

No camping or overnight parking will be permitted in any park except at the Lake Poygan Campsite and then only within a duly obtained campsite thereon. 143

#### SECTION 5.0 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL REGULATIONS

The snowmobile trail regulations hereinafter provided are in addition to those regulations contained in the Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance.

5.1 Snowmobile Trail Season

The snowmobile trail season which indicates the times of the calendar year during which the snowmobile trail may be used by snowmobiles shall be from December 1st through March 31st. No snowmobiles shall be operated on the snowmobile trail other than during the snowmobile season hereinbefore provided. No other vehicles may be operated on the snowmobile trail during the snowmobile trail season except police vehicles, emergency and rescue vehicles or County maintenance vehicles.

5.2 Off Season Regulations
During the period April 1st through November
30th the snowmobile trail may be used for hiking

or bicycling.

No vehicles of any kind shall be operated on the snowmobile trail except police vehicles, emergency and rescue vehicles or County maintenance vehicles. During the off season, the use of the snowmobile trail shall conform with the rules and regulations relating to Winnebago County Parks.

5.3 Signs

Signs for use on the snowmobile trail to regulate snowmobile traffic, warn snowmobile drivers, or assist the snowmobile driver to reach his destination, in accordance with recommendations established by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, shall be placed at appropriate locations along the said trail. No person shall operate a snowmobile other than in accordance with such signs.

### SECTION 6.0 ENFORCEMENT

6.1 Superintendent; Corporation Counsel

The Superintendent shall, with the assistance of the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, enforce the provisions of this Ordinance. The Corporation Counsel, upon complaint from the Superintendent, or the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, is authorized to institute whatever legal proceedings he may deem necessary to effect compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

6.2 Penalty

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not more than \$200.00, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not more than thirty (30) days.

SECTION 7.0 REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCE

The Winnebago County Parks Ordinance regulating parks, access sites, and recreational areas owned and operated by Winnebago County which was adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on June 15, 1971, and all amendments thereto, are hereby repealed and rescended as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Board has charged the Winnebago County Planning Committee and its planning staff with the authority to design and maintain a County Development Plan; to undertake special studies pertinent to county development; and to assume responsibility for all planning duties which are within county jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the designated legal tool for implementing this planning function; for maintaining and improving upon the chosen life-styles of existing residents; and for insuring taht the life-styles advertised for future residents will be congruent with the realities encountered by these future populations is through the authority of the zoning process; and

WHEREAS, efficient, quality workmanship is always facilitated by tools which are both designed for a specific use and honed

to a keen edge; and

WHEREAS, the existing County Zoning Ordinance was designed for use at a time when open land, a small population, single-family homes, uninterrupted drainage and distant neighbors were the mode: and.

FURTHERMORE, because this mode of living required only that the zoning process accommodate the "Health", "Safety" and "Morals" of the individual land user rather than to promote these standards on a coordinated, community-wide basis as needed today; and

WHEREAS, the mode of living in the county today is characterized by a large portion of the population which is settling into an "urbanized" life-style with diverse residential needs, i.e. Single-family, multiple-family, cluster housing, condominium ownership, etc., which requires close scrutiny of development practices; and

FURTHERMORE, these diverse residential types intensify the need to preserve unobstructed surface drainage and to insure that sewage treatment and solid waste disposal are effectively controlled so that environmental quality can be maintained or restored where necessary; and

WHEREAS, it has now become necessary to protect farming methods from the intrusions that accompany urban sprawl; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to preserve prime agricultural areas for large-scale food production and to protect those small-scale farms where agriculture is chosen as an alternative occupational life-style to that of "city work"; and

WHEREAS, the standards and procedures of the present County Zoning Ordinance are inadequate for both the urbanizing and the

rural needs of the people of Winnebago County today; and

FURTHERMORE, that the present zoning ordinance is incapable of organizing the future population distribution and growth rate in a manner which will be compatible with the social, economic, physical and environmental needs and goals which represent the lifestyle atmosphere as projected by each respective township; and

WHEREAS, the comprehensive revision of the existing zoning

ordinance is a lengthy process which will involve:

- The preparation of a preliminary revised draft by the planning staff under the supervision of the County Planning Committee;
- The holding of work sessions among town representatives, the County Planning Committee, Zoning Committee, and County Planner;

4. Submittal of an agreed upon ordinance to the County

Board for its approval;

 Submission of the ordinance and the revised zoning maps to each respective township for public hearings and town action;

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Goff.

Motion made by Supervisor Precour and seconded that the minutes of the meeting held on November 11, 1974 be approved as printed. Carried by Voice Vote.

A communication from Mr. Darryl Enli, Mayor of the City of Omro, supporting the resolution to establish a County Library Planning Committee was read. Placed on file.

A communication from Mr. Wesley E. Schneider, 2958 Oakwood Lane, Oshkosh, supporting the resolution to establish a County Library Planning Committee was read. Placed on file.

A communication from the Town Board of Menasha advising the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that a resolution was adopted by the Town of Menasha in opposition to the proposed establishment of a County Library Planning Committee. Placed on file.

A communication from the City of Menasha opposing the use of a Study Committee for a County Library Planning Committee was read. Placed on file.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Judiciary & Public Safety Committee reported to the board members that beginning January 1975 there will be a change in prisoners' board. A catering firm will be contracted to furnish the meals for a six months period.

Supervisor. Christoph questioned the Agricultural Committee on the preventing and destroying of trees affected by the Dutch Elm Disease. General discussion by the board members. Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that Winnebago County be instructed to pursue the prevention of Dutch Elm Disease. Roll Call Vote, Ayes 22; Nayes 19 — W. Excused 3 — Oberlies, Gischia and Apell. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

### 51.42 BOARD REPORT

Supervisor Neely, Chairman of the 51.42 Board reported that the Park View Health Center is a skilled nursing home requiring skilled nursing care. The State gives the standards under which they operate. They are committed to the aiding and preventing of mental illness. When the rehabilitation pavillion is converted, 200 beds will be equipped to handle acute or chronic psychiatric cases or skilled nursing care patients or combination thereof. It is anticipated that the operation of the pavillion will be with eight 25-bed units or a total of 20 patients by January 1, 1976. Supervisor Neely reported on the financial status and the need for additional personnel.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

The Chairman announced that at this time the public would be allowed to express their opinion on any resolution or ordinance

which appears on the agenda.

Mrs. Paul J. Glaister, 603 E. Wisconsin Avenue, Neenah, a member of the Neenah Library Board, appeared before the board members stating that the City of Neenah would not benefit from a County Library Planning Committee, and it is possible that the taxpayers of Winnebago County would be saddled with the expense if the state decided to withdraw their support.

Mr. Carl Snyder, 540 Riverway, Menasha, President of the Menasha Library Board, stated that the City of Menasha would not benefit from a County Library Planning Committee. The boards would lose control and an increase in taxes would result from the formation of such a committee.

Mr. Donald Rothenbach, 1542 Repp Avenue, Oshkosh, President of the Oshkosh Public Library Board supported Resolution No. 3 urging its passage which would result in a more sophisticated service for the city.

Mrs. Mark Hoegh, 1750A W. Oshkosh Avenue, Oshkosh, a member of the Oshkosh Public Library staff asked that the board adopt the resolution to enable a study committee to investigate the potentials of County Library Committee.

Mr. Milton Mitchell, 1625 Elmwood Avenue, Oshkosh, a member of the Oshkosh Public Library staff told the board members that a County Library Committee would provide high-quality type of service throughout the county.

Mr. Paul J. Glaister, 603 E. Wisconsin Avenue, Neenah, appearing as a taxpayer, opposed spending taxpayers' money for the formation of a County Library Committee.

Mr. Eugene Lind, Route # 1, Omro, asked that the board consider a new building for Agriculture Center which would cost the county approximately Fourteen to Fifteen dollars per square foot. Mr. Lind asked that the board members take action to enact statute prohibiting any employee or purported employee of the federal government to enforce or induce compliance with regulations promulgated by the EPA shall be a felony punishable by imprisonment and fine.

# ESTABLISH A COUNTY LIBRARY PLANNING COMMITTEE

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there is hereby created a single and separate Board of Adjustment with duties and respon-

sibilities as outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.99.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the membership of the Planning and Zoning Committee shall consist of the following: seven (7) members, five (5) of whom shall be County Board Supervisors and two (2) citizen members. Of the five County Board Supervisors, not less than one (1) or more than three (3) shall be from incorporated areas in Winnebago County. The two citizen members shall be from the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County. No two members of the Planning and Zoning Committee may be from the same township. The terms of the members of this committee shall coincide with the terms of the members of the County Board. The five County Board Supervisors shall be selected by the Committee on Committees. The two citizen members of the committee shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman. All appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the County Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the membership of the Board of Adjustment shall consist of the following: five (5) members, two (2) of whom shall be County Board Supervisors who are members of the Planning and Zoning Committee, and three (3) citizen members. All members of the Board of Adjustment must be from the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County. No two members of the Board of Adjustment may be from the same township. None of the citizen members of the Board of Adjustment may be a member of the Planning and Zoning Committee. The terms of the County Board members of this Board shall coincide with their terms as County Board Supervisors. All citizen members shall have a term of three (3) years except initially the term of one citizen member shall commence with the date of appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1976; the term of a second citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1977; and the term of the third citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1978. Thereafter, all terms shall be three (3) years. All members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the County Executive subject to confirmation by the County Board.

and reimbursements in accordance with County policy.

- Good Friday will be a fully paid holiday. (Employees received holiday pay for Good Friday afternoon previously.)

#### 4. Vacations:

Employees will receive vacation pay based on a 40 hour week. (Previously they received vacation pay based on a 45 hour week.)

5. Sick Leave With Pay:

Unused sick leave with pay shall accumulate to a maximum of 120 work days (previously 90 work days.)

6. Insurance:

Provide Health Maintenance Program option to Health Insurance program.

7. Overtime: Added new language:

In emergencies such as snow removal, ice control and flood control, the employer may vary an employee's regular basic work schedule up to three (3) hours. Said shifts shall be a minimum of eight (8) consecutive hours exclusive of lunch period.

8. Hours of Work: Added new language:

The regular basic work week shall consist of eight (8) hours per day and forty (40) hours per week. The regular basic work day will be from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with a one-half (1/2) hour unpaid lunch period to be taken during the middle of the work day.

9. Fair Share Agreement:

The County will deduct \$8.00 per month as monthly Union dues (previously \$6.50).

#### 10. Duration:

All appropriate dates to reflect a one year agreement effective January 1, 1975 through December 31, 1975.

## JOINT ACTION EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE FOR WINNEBAGO COUNTY

The following Ordinance No. 19, dated October 31, 1974 was

presented:

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT ORGANIZATION AND FOR PROTECTION AND PROMOTION OF PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH, AND WELFARE IN THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO DURING EMERGENCIES AND TO CREATE AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT IN THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO, ENTITLED "JOINT ACTION EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE FOR WINNEBAGO COUNTY."

The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County do ordain as follows:

- 2. An Ordinance entitled "Joint Action Emergency Government Ordinance for Winnebago County" is created to read:

#### SECTION 1. POLICY AND PURPOSE

- (1) To ensure that the County of Winnebago will be prepared to cope with emergencies resulting from enemy action and with emergencies resulting from natural disasters, an Emergency Government Organization is created to carry out the purposes set forth in Chapter 22 of Wisconsin Statutes.
- (2) Definitions. As used in this ordinance:

(a) The term "enemy action" means any hostile action taken by a foreign power which threatens the

security of the State of Wisconsin.

(b) The term "Civil defense" means all those activities and measures designed or undertaken: 1. to minimize the effects upon the civilian population caused or which would be caused by enemy action, 2. to deal with the immediate emergency conditions which could be created by such enemy action, and 3. to effectuate emergency repairs to, or the emergency restoration of vital public utilities and facilities destroyed or damaged by such enemy action.

(c) The term "Natural disaster" includes all other extraordinary misfortunes affecting the county, natural or man-made, not included in the term

"enemy action."

SECTION 2. COUNTY EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE

(1) How constituted. In accordance with 22.16 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the County Board shall designate a committee of the Board as a County Emergency Government Committee whose chairman shall be the Chairman of the County Board.

(2) Duties of County Emergency Government Committee. The County Emergency Government Committee shall be the policy and rule-making body in the establishment and development of county emergency government plans and programs.

### SECTION 3. COUNTY MUNICIPAL EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT DIRECTOR

- (1) Joint Director. For the purpose of administering a county-wide program and to insure compatible emergency preparedness planning between the county and municipalities lying therein, there is hereby created the Office of County Municipal Emergency Government Director, hereinafter called Director. The Director shall also perform similar duties and responsibilities in such municipalities of Winnebago County as may hereafter enact an ordinance parallel to this ordinance, as is permitted by Wisconsin Statutes, Section 22.16 (8) and Section 66.30.
- (2) Tenure, Term, Appointment and Statutory Provision.
   (a) Tenure. The Director shall be a part-time position. The salary of the Director and members of his staff shall be established by the County Board.

(b) Term. The term of the Director shall be at the pleasure of the County Executive and the Executive heads of Municipal Government having

adopted the Ordinance.

(c) Appointment. The Director shall be appointed by the County Executive and the Executive heads of Municipal Government having adopted the Ordinance subject to County Board concurrence and in accordance with standard employment procedures as used by Winnebago County.

(d) Statutory Provision. The provisions of Section 22.16 (9) of the Wisconsin Statutes, relating to Personnel, shall apply to the Director and office

staff.

(4)

(3) Status. The Director shall be considered to be an employee of Winnebago County.

Municipal Deputy Emergency Government Director.
 (a) Each municipality passing a Joint Action Ordinance with the county shall appoint a Deputy Emergency Government Director, hereinafter called Deputy.

(b) The Deputy shall operate under the administrative

direction of the Director.

(c) Remuneration, if any, for the Deputy will be determined and paid by the governing body of that municipality.

#### SECTION 4. SHARING OF COSTS

- (1) Office and staff. The Winnebago County Board shall provide offices, office furniture, stenographic help and such office supplies as may be necessary to carry out the functions of the Director and the cost thereof shall be defrayed by Winnebago County and any available Federal or State funds.
- (2) Major Equipment and Services. Costs of equipment and Services, as well as other costs relating to the development of emergency preparedness programs not attributed to the administration of the program per se, shall be borne 100 percent by the municipal government requiring such procurement and services, provided, however, that any available Federal or State funds to offset such costs will be obtained by the Director whenever possible. Federal or State reimbursements shall be turned over to the treasurer of the procuring municipality.
- SECTION 5. JOINT ACTION MEETINGS. Whenever it is deemed necessary by either the County Emergency Government Committee or the Emergency Government Committee of a Municipality participating in joint action, there shall be a joint meeting of the committees to decide such matters as may arise. At such times as joint meetings are called, the meeting shall be chaired by the Chairman of the County Board.

## SECTION 6. DUTIES OF THE COUNTY MUNICIPAL EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT DIRECTOR

(1) County-Wide Duties. The Director, in his capacity as County Director, subject to the control and direction of the County Executive and the County Emergency Government Committee and under the general supervision of the County Board shall:

(a) Develop and promulgate emergency plans for the county, including planning for joint action municipalities, consistent with the State Emergency

Operations Plan:

(b) Coordinate and assist in the development of nonjoint action municipal emergency government plans within the county, and integrate such plans with the county plan;

(c) Direct the county and joint action municipality

emergency government programs;

(d) Direct county-wide emergency government training

programs and exercises;

(e) Advise the State Administrator of all emergency government planning for the county and render such reports as may be required by the State Administrator;

(f) In case of a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor, direct the county and joint action municipalities' emergency government activities, under the County Executive and municipal heads of government, and coordinate the non-joint action municipal emergency government activities within the county, subject to the coordinating authority of the State Administrator; and

(g) Perform such other duties relating to emergency government as may be required by the County Board.

(2)Municipal Duties. The Director in his capacity as director for a municipality participating in joint action, shall:

(a) Direct the municipal emergency government or-

(b) Develop, promulgate, and integrate into the county plan, emergency government plans for the operating

services of the municipality;

Direct participation of the municipality in such (c) emergency government training programs and exercises as may be required on the county level or by the State Administrators;

(d) Direct the municipal emergency government

training programs and exercises;

(e) Perform all administrative duties necessary for the rendering of reports and procurement of matching Federal funds for each municipality requesting Federal Matching Funds;

(f) In case of a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor, direct the activities of the municipal emergency government organization under the municipal executive head of government and through the utilization of the municipality's duly appointed Deputy Director;

(g) Perform such other duties, relating to emergency government, as may be required by the municipal

governing body.

#### SECTION 7. UTILIZATION OF EXISTING SERVICES AND FACILITIES

- (1) In preparing and executing the Emergency Government Program, the services, equipment, supplies and facilities of the existing departments and agencies of the county shall be utilized to the maximum extent practicable and the officer and personnel of all such departments and agencies are directed to cooperate with and extend such services and facilities as may be required from time to time.
- **(2)** Responsibility. In order to assure that in the event of an emergency all the facilities of the existing county government are expanded to the fullest to meet such emergency, the following specific responsibilities are assigned to the following department heads named as Directors of the indicated Emergency Government Services. The Director will assist in organizing and planning for the expansion of the various departments hereinafter indicated prior to and during an emergency and for recruiting

necessary Emergency Government Volunteers to supplement regular department employees:

County Sheriff. . . . . . . Director of Police Services

County Highway

Commissioner . . . Director of Engineering Services

Purchasing Agent . . . . . Director of Supply Services

Director of

Public Welfare . . . . . Director of Emergency

Welfare Services

County Coroner . . . . . Director of Mortuary Services

District Attorney . . . . . Director of Intelligence

Other department heads not specifically named will fulfill emergency and non-emergency duties as assigned under the State Emergency Operations Plan. Nothing in this section shall be construed so as to limit the County Municipal Emergency Government Director from immediately commencing organizational and planning programs as required by the State Emergency Operations Plan adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

(3) Joint Action. Municipalities entering into joint action with Winnebago County will provide for utilization of existing services of municipal government by enactment of an ordinance parallel to this section of the county ordinance.

#### SECTION & OTHER EMERGENCIES

(1) Joint Action Municipalities. In the event the Governor determines that an emergency exists growing out of natural or man-made disasters, the Director will activate and direct emergency government services at the appropriate level of government affected by the emergency under the executive head of such level of government and through the duly appointed Deputy of such municipality.

(2) Non-Joint Action Municipalities. In the event of a natural or man-made disaster, the Director will coordinate the municipalities affected and render such assistance as is required and available from county resources.

(3) Penalties. It shall be unlawful for any person willfully to obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the emergency government organization in the enforcement of any order, rule, regulation or plan issued pursuant to this ordinance, or to do any act forbidden by any order, rule, regulation or plan issued pursuant to the authority in this ordinance. A violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance may result in a forfeiture of not less than \$100.00 or more than \$500.00, and in default of payment thereof, may result in imprisonment in the county jail for a period not exceeding 90 days.

(4) Repeal of Prior Resolution. Any resolutions hereinbefore adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors inconsistent with the provisions of this or-

dinance are hereby repealed.

(5) Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and publication.

The terms of the members of this committee shall coincide with the terms of the members of the County Board. The five County Board Supervisors shall be selected by the Committee on Committees. The two citizen members of the committee shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman. All appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the County Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the membership of the Board of Adjustment shall consist of the following: five (5) members, two (2) of whom shall be County Board Supervisors who are members of the Planning and Zoning Committee, and three (3) citizen members. All members of the Board of Adjustment must be from the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County. No two members of the Board of Adjustment may be from the same township. None of the citizen members of the Board of Adjustment may be a member of the Planning and Zoning Committee. The terms of the County Board members of this Board shall coincide with their terms as County Board Supervisors. All citizen members shall have a term of three (3) years except initially the term of one citizen member shall commence with the date of appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1976; the term of a second citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1977; and the term of the third citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1978. Thereafter, all terms shall be three (3) years. All members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the County Executive subject to confirmation by the County Board.

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: WHEREAS, the engineers of the Wisconsin Division of High-

ways have developed plans for a four-lane highway from Oshkosh to Omro; and

WHEREAS, the need for such a four-lane highway is predicated on the probable 80% increase in traffic by 1998, and an unusually high accident rate on the present Highway 21, both of

which predications are subject to serious doubt; and

## OPPOSE GOVERNOR'S 1975-77 BUDGET BILL RELATING TO CLOSING OF WINNEBAGO MENTAL HEALTH INSTITUTE

The following Resolution No. 16 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin has included in his 1975-77 Budget Bill a provision to close the Winnebago Mental Health Institute; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's proposal favors the continued

operation of the Mendota State Hospital; and

WHEREAS, the continued operation of Winnebago Mental Health Institute will result in the continuation of better care for a greater number of Wisconsin citizens by virtue of the following:

1. Winnebago serves an area consisting of 32 counties in which 58.5% of the State of Wisconsin population resides.

2. The daily per capita cost at Winnebago is \$79.57, and the

daily per capita cost at Mendota is \$106.90.

3. The net expenditures for the operation of Winnebago as compared with that of Mendota indicate that it costs less to operate Winnebago. This is in spite of the fact that Winnebago has a larger inpatient population than Mendota, and further in spite of the fact that the programs for these Winnebago inpatients are of a highly specialized nature.

4. The total number of patients served by Winnebago is approximately 1800 annually. These are cases for which a file has been prepared and actual services rendered. The direction at Winnebago is a decrease in the number of inpatients and an increase in the number of outpatients.

5. Programs at Winnebago are not transferable. Mendota does not have specialized programs presently in existence at Winnebago. The transfer of these programs to Mendota cannot be accomplished by merely moving the employees and the patients. The relationships which Winnebago has established with local agencies within the 32 counties served by Winnebago cannot be transferred.

6. Over one thousand persons attend seminars and training programs annually at Winnebago. Of this total approximately 450 are nurses receiving psychiatric training in a six to nine week — year round — program. In addition, special education teachers, graduate students, occupational therapist trainees from universities, colleges and other schools participate in the seminars and training programs. There is a psychiatric residency program at Winnebago drawing participants from around the country who, during their time of residency, provide valuable services at Winnebago.

WHEREAS, the termination of the programs at Winnebago and

the closing of the institute will be a grave error.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT KESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, does hereby oppose the Governor's 1975-77 Budget Bill relating to the closing of the Winnebago Mental Health Institute.
