ORGANIZATION MEETING Tuesday, April 15, 1975

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman James P. Coughlin on Tuesday, April 15th, 1975 at 6:00 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

Motion made by Supervisor Olson and seconded that the minutes of the March meeting be approved as printed. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the rules of the Winnebago County be reaffirmed as per Resolution No. 13. Carried by Voice Vote.

#### **ELECTION OF A COUNTY HIGHWAY COMMITTEE**

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the Winnebago County Highway Committee be re-elected for a term of one year beginning April 15, 1975. Carried by Voice Vote.

The County Executive, Orrin H. King, introduced the new airport manager, E. Blair Conrad, to the board members.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

The Chairman announced that at this time the public would be allowed to express their opinion on any resolution or ordinance which appears on the agenda.

Mr. Clyde Huss, 1842 W. Fairview Road, Larsen, opposed the rezoning of the Norman Grunska property in the Town of Clayton. Mr. Huss told the board members that the Town Board of Clayton has voted 2 to 1 to oppose the rezoning.

Mr. Randall Stadtmueller, 1801 Cty Trk BB, Neenah, Wisconsin, a neighbor of Norman Grunska also opposed the rezoning of the

property.

Mr. Byron Birchert, 1731 Hwy. 45, Neenah, a member of the Town Board of Clayton told the board members that the town has opposed the rezoning of this property.

### COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S APPOINTMENT AFFIRMATIVE ACTION COMMISSION

The County Executive announced that his appointment to the Affirmative Action Commission was Yuen Fong (Nancy) Lee, 544 High Avenue, Oshkosh, Wisconsin to fill the unexpired term of Catherine Storch. Carried by Voice Vote.

#### COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S APPOINTMENT TO THE COMMITTEE ON AGING

The County Board Chairman announced that his appointment to the Committee on Aging would be Miss Oranda Bangsberg, Miss Bernice Sibbald and George Dobberke for a term of three years beginning April 15, 1975. Carried by Voice Vote.

### REPORT OF THE EAST CENTRAL WISCONSIN REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE

Mr. James Penfold, staff planner, of the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Committee reported on the proposed study of an areawide drainage water program. Mr. Penfold told the board members that if the 208 Program is adopted that by 1983 the water in the Fox Valley would be of excellent quality for fishing, swimming and human consumption. The commission is concerned with sludge material disposal. The disposal of sludge is very critical in this area. The 208 Program would be a three-fold program: 1) Technical analysis and technical resource. 2) Development of a technical plan. 3) Management aspects for sludge disposal.

INDICATING THE INTEREST TO PARTICIPATE WITH OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTS IN THE FOX RIVER VALLEY IN A JOINT PLANNING PROCESS INITIATED FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEVELOPING A COORDINATED, AREAWIDE WASTE TREATMENT PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.

The following Resolution No. 9 was presented:

WHEREAS, Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 requires that in areas which have substantial water quality control problems, an areawide planning and

management process be undertaken; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Federal Rules and Regulations, the Governor, after consultation with local officials, is to designate the areawide planning district and a single representative agency, which includes local elected officials, capable of developing an effective areawide waste treatment plan; and

WHEREAS, Section 208 authorizes that the waste treatment management plan may be prepared through existing areawide planning agencies; and

WHEREAS, the criteria for designation of planning areas and agencies contained in Federal Rules and Regulations are applicable

to the Fox River Valley; and

WHEREAS, Federal Rules and Regulations require that local governments within a substantial water quality problem area must indicate their intent, through a formally adopted resolution, to participate in the process which results in the development of an areawide waste treatment planning and management system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors hereby indicates its intention to participate in an intergovernmental process which will result in the development of a waste treatment planning and management system

for the Fox River Valley; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors hereby requests the Governor to designate the Fox River Valley as a substantial water quality problem area; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors hereby request the Governor to designate the planning body established through mutual agreement of the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission and the Green Bay—Brown County Planning Commission as the single responsible planning entity to conduct waste treatment management planning in the Fox River Valley under the provisions of Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 and Federal Rules and Regulations which pertain to this section.

### LAKE WINNEBAGO AREA-WIDE COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH PLANNING COUNCIL, INC.

WHEREAS, the Lake Winnebago District meets all other criteria for designation of a health service area, including the availability of resources to provide all necessary health services for residents of the area, the presence of at least one center for the provision of highly specialized health services, coordination with the boundaries of a State Administrative District, and the inclusion of an entire standard metropolitan statistical area; and

WHEREAS, the population of the Lake Winnebago District is now estimated at within ten percent of the five hundred thousand minimum, and is projected to reach five hundred thousand by 1981.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors recommends that the Lake Winnebago Area-Wide Comprehensive Health Planning Council, Inc. become the designated Health Systems Agency serving the Health Service area comprised of: Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Marquette,

Outagamie, Waupaca, Waushara, and Winnebago Counties.

or board to a committee of the county board; and

WHEREAS, a recent Attorney General's opinion appears to have created some confusion as to whether a county board of public welfare may be referred to as a county committee of public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Legislature should be requested to clarify this confusion by directly providing for the creation of a county board of public welfare or a county committee of public

welfare, whichever the county may choose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Wisconsin Legislative members elected by the citizens of Winnebago County be requested to introduce appropriate legislation to the 1975 Wisconsin Legislature requesting that Wis. Stats., Sec. 46.22, be amended so as to provide for a County Board of Public Welfare or a County Committee of Public Welfare, the choice to be made by the County Board of Supervisors.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Wisconsin Legislative members elected by the citizens

- (3) That those persons receiving annual wage or salary increases who are presently below the proposed maximum wage law level be limited to an increase equal to the percentage increase the State allows local governments to increase property tax levies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be sent to each Wisconsin Legislative Representative elected by the citizens of Winnebago County.

#### REPORT FROM THE COMMITTEE ON AGING

Miss Oranda C. Bangsberg, Chairperson of the Winnebago County Committee on Aging presented her report to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. The commission was established one year ago on June 5, 1974. There are over 18,000 people over 60 years in Winnebago County. There are eight districts in Wisconsin and Winnebago County is in Area # 3 which comprises eight counties. The greatest need of the commission is to provide transportation for the senior citizens.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD (Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.07 (135))

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

#### SECTION I. ESTABLISHMENT.

Pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.07 (135) there is established a solid waste management system for Winnebago County and a solid waste management board to operate the system.

The solid waste management system hereby created shall identify Winnebago County as a solid waste management district which shall be composed of twenty-one (21) individual service districts. Each governmental unit within the County shall constitute one (1) service district with the right to determine whether or not it shall participate in this County-wide solid waste management system.

#### SECTION II. NAME.

The name of such system shall be the Winnebago County Solid Waste Management System.

#### SECTION III. PURPOSES.

The solid waste management system hereby created shall develop, provide, or cause to be provided such services as are necessary to the implementation and maintenance of solid waste and sewage sludge collection and disposal within said districts. The arrangement of this system shall be such as to encourage the participation of private enterprise as well as to facilitate the use of interjurisdictional resources to the fullest extent through unity of management, fiscal responsibilities and equitable servicing of all designated solid waste management areas within the County-wide district as indicated on Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

#### SECTION IV. SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD.

(1) The Solid Waste Management Board shall be composed of nine (9) members, five (5) of these members being County Board Supervisors. Furthermore, Supervisors shall also be established as the County Board Committee on Solid Waste Management. Members of the Solid Waste Management Board shall be appointed by the County Executive from the areas within Winnebago County as described on a map attached to this Ordinance and identified as Exhibit "A" on the following basis:

2 members - Neenah-Menasha area;

2 members - Oshkosh area;

1 member - North/Central area;

1 member — South/Central area;

1 member - Western area; and

2 members — at large.

All such appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. All members of the Solid Waste Management Board shall be persons of recognized ability and demonstrated interest in the problems of solid waste

management.

(2) Except as hereinafter provided, the term of office of each member of the Solid Waste Management Board appointed pursuant to this Ordinance shall be for three (3) years. The terms of those initially appointed shall be as follows:

> One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1976; One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1977; and One-third shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending the third Tuesday in May, 1978.

If a County Board member of the Solid Waste Management Board ceases to be a County Board member for any reason whatsoever, his membership on the Solid Waste Management Board shall terminate as of the effective date of his termination as a County Board Supervisor. Vacancies for unexpired terms shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments. Any Solid Waste Management Board member appointed hereunder may be removed by the appointing authority in accordance with the procedure and authority set forth in the statutes.

(3)Solid Waste Management Board members appointed hereunder shall be compensated for their services and travel expenses at a rate which shall be the same as the per diem and mileage allowance prevailing for the Winnebago County Board of Super-

(4) Subject to the rules and regulations established and amended from time to time by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors and the County Executive in their respective areas of responsibility, the Solid Waste Management Board shall have the powers and duties set forth in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.07 (135), as follows:

(a) Develop plans for a solid waste management

(b) Within such county or joint county, collect, transport, dispose of, destroy or transform wastes, including, without restriction because of enumeration, garbage, ashes, or incinerator residue, municipal, domestic, agricultural, industrial and commercial rubbish, waste or refuse material, including explosives, pathological wastes, chemical wastes, herbicide and pesticide wastes.

(c) Acquire lands by purchase, lease, donation or eminent domain, within the county, for use in the solid waste management system.

(d) Authorize employees or agents to enter upon lands to conduct reasonable and necessary investigations and tests to determine the suitability of sites for solid waste management activities whenever permission is obtained from the property owner.

(e) Acquire by purchase, lease, donation or eminent domain such easements or other limited interests in lands as are desired or needed to assure compatible land uses in the environs of any site that is part of the solid waste

disposal system.

(f) Establish operations and methods of waste management as are deemed appropriate. Waste burial operations shall be in accordance with sanitary landfill methods and the sites shall, insofar as practicable, be restored and made suitable for attractive recreational or productive use upon completion of waste disposal operations.

(g) Acquire necessary equipment, use equipment and facilities of the county highway agency, and construct, equip and operate incinerators or other structures to be used in the solid

waste management system.

(h) Adopt and enforce ordinances necessary for the conduct of the solid waste management system and provide forfeitures for violations.

 (i) Contract with private collectors or transporters or municipalities to receive and dispose of wastes.

(j) Engage in, sponsor or co-sponsor research and demonstration projects intended to improve the techniques of solid waste management or to increase the extent of reuse or recycling of materials and resources included within the wastes.

(k) Accept funds derived from state or federal grant or assistance programs and enter into

necessary contracts or agreements.

(I) Appropriate funds and levy taxes to provide funds for acquisition or lease of sites, easements, necessary facilities and equipment and for all other costs required for the solid waste management system except that no town, city or village which operates its own waste collection and disposal facility, or property therein, shall be subject to any tax levied hereunder to cover the cost of operation of these functions. Such appropriations may be

treated as a revolving capital fund to be reimbursed from proceeds of the system.

Make payments to any municipality in which county disposal sites or facilities are located to cover the reasonable costs of services rendered to such sites or facilities.

(n) Charge or assess reasonable fees, approximately commensurate with the costs of services rendered to persons using the services of the county solid waste management system. Fees may include a reasonable charge for depreciation which shall create a reserve for future capital outlays for waste disposal facilities or equipment. All assessments for liquid waste shall be assessed by volume.

Districts may be created and different types (o) of solid waste collection or disposal services provided within them and different regulations and cost allocations may be applied to each service district. Costs allocated to such service districts may be provided by general tax upon the property of the respective districts or by allocation of charges to the cities, villages or towns whose territory is included within such districts.

(p) Utilize or dispose of by sale or otherwise any and all products or by-products of the solid waste management system.

No recycling or processing plant for solid wastes may be constructed, altered or recon-(q) structed in a recycling region established by the Wisconsin solid waste recycling authority without prior consultation with the authority.'

#### SECTION V. FINANCES.

(1) The Winnebago County Solid Waste Management System shall be financed by such funds as may be available through public and private sources; and the Solid Waste Management Board is authorized to accept private donations and to request and receive state and federal grants-in-aid in addition to county funds.

(2) The Solid Waste Management Board shall plan its financial operations on a calendar year basis; and each year it shall submit its proposed budget for the next calendar year to the County Executive prior to August 15th or such other date as may be established by the County Executive.

(3) The expenses incurred in the operation of the Winnebago County Solid Waste Management System shall be paid by Winnebago County and charged against the appropriations and other funds credited

to the system.

#### SECTION VI. REPORTS.

The Solid Waste Management Board shall make an annual report to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, and it shall make or cause to be made such other reports as may be required from time to time by the County Executive and the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

SECTION VIL REPEALER.

Any ordinance or resolution previously enacted and relating to any predecessor agency or system, or which conflicts with this Ordinance, is hereby repealed.

SECTION VIII. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage, approval and publication as required by law.

The Superintendent may grant the application if it appears that the group, association or organization will not interfere with the general use of the park by the individual members of the public and if the said group, association or organization meets all other conditions contained in the application. The application may contain a requirement for an indemnity bond to protect the County from any liability of any kind or character and to protect County property from damage, and shall contain such a provision if the swimming lake is to be utilized by said group.

be limited to vending or peddling within the event or activity being conducted by the non-profit group, association or organization.

# REPORT ON SELF-HELP HOUSING PROJECT

Mr. James Michler, Group worker for the self-housing program and Mr. James Schlicht, Coordinator for the self-housing program appeared before the County Board and explained their program which is federally funded. Under the program sixteen houses have been completed in Fond du Lac County and seventeen are under construction. They hope to establish a program in Winnebago County for thirty new homes. Communities under 40,000 are eligible and new regulations require that communities must have sewer and water available. The homes are appraised at \$27,000 to \$30,000. Mr. Michler anticipated to start building in Winnebago County in the summer of 1976.

#### ADVOCAP REPORT

Ms. Rosalie L. Tryon, Executive Director of ADVOCAP, ap-

peared before the County Board at their request to answer questions and explain the various programs, paid personnel's monthly salary and job titles and the work area or program in which the staff serves. The Ordinance Providing For Attendance At Meetings Or Schools and Expense Reimbursement While In Such Attendance is hereby amended to read as follows effective immediately:

#### SECTION IV. GUIDELINES.

Recognizing that attendance at conventions, schools or seminars by Winnebago County officials and employees is a matter of deep concern to the Winnebago County Executive and the members of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors; and

Further recognizing that some flexibility may be required insofar as selection of conventions, schools or seminars to be attended by Winnebago County officials and employees, the following guidelines are hereby established:

- A. Prior to County Board action on the Budget:
  - Department heads, officials and other persons shall be responsible for the preparation of the information required by SECTION III of this Ordinance to be included in any annual budget relating to conventions, schools and seminars to be attended during that year.
  - The County Executive and County Board may take further action regarding the said conventions, schools and seminars budget in any manner permitted by Wisconsin Statutes or by Coun-

ty Board resolution or ordinance.

- 3. The list of conventions, seminars or schools together with the cost information relating thereto included in the County Executive Budget and remaining therein after action, if any, by the County Board shall constitute the department's list of approved conventions, schools or seminars.
- B. After County Board action on the Budget: Except as hereinafter provided,

 Only those conventions, schools or seminars which appear on a department's approved list may be attended by the department head, officials or employees of that department.

- Notwithstanding budgetary approval action by the County Executive and County Board, authorization to attend any and all out-of-State conventions, schools or seminars must be received and approved by the County Executive prior to actual attendance at such conventions, schools or seminars.
- Winnebago County officials and employees may, without further approval action, attend any convention, school or seminar providing the following conditions exist:
  - (a) The convention, school or seminar is on the said department's approved list.
  - (b) It is to be conducted within the State of Wisconsin.
  - (c) Sufficient funds are available in the budget for that department's conventions, schools and seminars.
- 4. A Winnebago County official or employee may be authorized to attend a convention, school or seminar which has not been included on that department's approved list under the following conditions:
  - (a) Sufficient funds exist in the department's budget for the person who wishes to attend the convention, school or seminar.
  - (b) Approval prior to attendance is obtained from the following and in this order:
    - (1) County Executive
    - (2) Committee of Jurisdiction(3) Personnel & Finance Committee
- If attendance at the convention, school or seminar is denied by any of the aforementioned, the Winnebago County official or employee may not attend at County expense.

WHEREAS, any use of these alternate systems is under the jurisdiction of the Division of Health of the State of Wisconsin, and the Division has approved for use three alternate systems; and

WHEREAS, in implementing the use of these alternate systems, the Division of Health has imposed certain requirements upon any county which desires to permit such use; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County desires to permit the use of these alternate systems on a controlled basis initially; and

WHEREAS, a maximum of seven (7) such systems could be properly supervised and evaluated on an "experimental" basis during 1976.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Winnebago County ageres to:

- 1. Authorize a maximum of seven (7) such alternate systems during 1976.
- Authorize, require and pay the cost of the County Sanitary Inspector attending an educational program developed to train him in the techniques to be sued in the construction and monitoring of alternate systems
- Require the County Sanitary Inspector to inspect each alternate system during construction in the manner and at the times specified at the training program and to complete an inspection checklist provided by the Division.
- 4. Require that the County Sanitary Inspector sign a statement certifying that he inspected the construc-

- tion of the alternate system and further require that he mail this statement to the Division within ten (10) days after his final inspection of the system.
- 5. Supply sufficient funding to permit the County Sanitary Inspector to monitor each alternate system installed in the County for a period of one year after the system is put into use and to require him to so monitor the systems and to send a report stating the operating status of each system to the Division at the end of the one year period.
- 6. Not to permit the installation or construction of any alternate system unless the Division has approved the construction of that system and the County Planning and Zoning Committee has properly reviewed and recommended approval of the system.

WHEREAS, your Solid Waste Management Board has submitted its Report earlier this date containing various recommendations concerning a county-wide solid waste management system for Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, included in said Report are the following specific recommendations which your Solid Waste Management Board is requesting be approved by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors:

(1) That Winnebago County purchase the present Town of Oshkosh Sanitary Landfill Site located in Sections 2 and 3, Township 18 North, Range 16 East, in the Town of Oshkosh, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

- (2) That Winnebago County authorize the purchase of property located adjacent to the Town of Oshkosh Landfill Site and which is presently under option to the Town of Oshkosh.

- (4) That the Winnebago County Solid Waste Management Board shall have the rent-free use of the aforementioned lands during such time as said lands are used as a sanitary landfill site.

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Resolution # 5 dated August 19, 1975, established the following daily private pay rates, which rates reflected the actual daily cost for such care:

Rehabilitation Pavilion — \$36.38 Pleasant Acres Home — \$32.57;

and

WHEREAS, the then existing public assistance patients daily rates for the two institutions were \$27.45 at the Rehabilitation Pavilion and \$26.43 at Pleasant Acres Home; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County has appealed to the State Division of Family Services for an increase in the then existing public assistance patients daily rates for the two institutions; and

WHEREAS, a daily rate increase of \$2.50 has been granted on the public assistance patients daily rate at Pleasant Acres Home; and

WHEREAS, the appeal relating to the rates at the Rehabilitation Pavilion has not yet been resolved; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an amendment to Resolution # 5, the private pay rate must be lowered to the rate established for public assistance patients within sixty days after the action by the State Board of Appeals; and

WHEREAS, to do so will jeopardize Winnebago County'e eligibility for further rate adjustments because under no circumstances can a public assistance patient's rate exceed that of the private pay patient or the actual cost for such services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the amendment to Resolution #5 dated August 19, 1975, which amendment bears the same date, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the private pay rates as established by Resolution # 5 dated August 19, 1975, be and they hereby are continued in the amount of \$36.38 per day at the Rehabilitation Pavilion and \$32.57 per day at the Pleasant Acres Home.

## ESTABLISHING ADMISSION RULES FOR PARK VIEW HEALTH CENTER (PLEASANT ACRES HOME AND REHABILITATION PAVILION)

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

#### SECTION 1. PURPOSE

The purposes of the Ordinance are:

(a) To establish the admission requirements for res-

idency at Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion).

(b) To authorize a Board to act on admission applications to Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion).

## SECTION 2. INITIAL REQUIREMENTS

No person less than eighteen (18) years of age shall be admitted.

#### **SECTION 3. APPLICATION FORM**

- (a) Application must be made on the forms provided by Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion).
- (b) The application forms include the basic Information Form and Voluntary Application, Financial Responsibility Form, Physical Examination by the applicant's own physician, Personal Data Check List, and Agreement by Voluntary Applicant.
- (e) The completed application kit is to be sent to the Admissions Coordinator, Park View Health Center, Winnebago, Wiconsin, 54985.

#### SECTION 4. ADMISSIONS

- (a) Admission to Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion) can be denied if the physical or mental condition of the applicant is such that the applying person could not be adequately cared for due to physical limitations, personnel limitations, or other reasons existing at Park View Health Center.
- (b) A person shall be admitted when an application is processed, approved, classified and filed. Preference will be given according to date of application.
- (c) The medical director, administrator, director of nursing and the admissions coordinator are hereby designated as those persons who are to conduct the admission procedures at Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion).

# SECTION 5. DUTIES OF THE PARK VIEW HEALTH CENTER COMMITTEE

(a) The Park View Health Center Committee shall prepare a written report monthly for County Board information. This report shall include a current census at Park View Health Center, including the number of residents, the number of vacant beds, and the changes that occurred since the preceding report. (b) The Park View Health Center Committee may cause the discharge or release of any resident who, after thorough investigation, has been found in violation of any ordinance, rule, or condition of residency, regulation or policy, as established by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, the Park View Health Center Committee, or any other rules or procedures pertaining to operations of the Park View Health Center (Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion).

#### SECTION 6. RATES

- (a) PRIVATE RATES Resident rates at Pleasnat Acres Home and Rehabilitation Pavilion shall be established by the Park View Health Center Committee consistent with the cost of care and operation of Pleasant Acres Home and Rehabilitation Pavilion. These rates may be adjusted periodically by the Committee if conditions warrant.
- (b) TITLE XIX RATES Rates established by the State of Wisconsin for Title XIX reimbursement shall be utilized. These rates will be appealed if not consistent with costs.
- (c) One (1) month payment of the established rate for the resident's care at Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion shall be payable in advance upon approval of the applicant's admission to Park View Health Center. All subsequent payments shall be made one (1) month in advance and are payable by the 10th of the current month.
- (d) No refund or charges will be made for the first seven (7) days of residence at Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion or any portion thereof. Refunds will be made only on the basis of time in residence at Pleasant Acres Home or Rehabilitation Pavilion after seven (7) days.

#### SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors and all prior Ordinances on this subject shall cease to have any prospective force and effect as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

# WINNEBAGO COUNTY PEACE AND ORDER ORDINANCE

The following Ordinance No. 4 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

### **SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION**

#### 1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.02 and Sec. 59.07 (64), Wis. Stats. (1973).

# 1.2 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

#### 1.3 Repeal of Prior Ordinance

The prior Winnebago County Ordinance entitled "Winnebago County Peace and Order Ordinance" adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on March 16, 1971, and published March 30, 1971, is repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

#### 1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnebago County Peace And Order Ordinance.

## 1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect after its passage and publication.

#### **SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS**

#### 2.1 Jurisdiction

The Winnebago County Peace And Order Ordinance shall apply to disorderly conduct as hereinafter provided which occurs in private or public places located anywhere within the unincorporated area of Winnebago County.

## 2.2 Prohibited Conduct

(1) No person shall, in a public or private place,

engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbence.

(2) No person shall make or cause to be made any loud, disturbing or unnecessary sounds or noises such as may tend to annoy or disturb another in or about any public street, parking lot, alley, park or any private residence.

(3) No person shall, with the intent to annoy another, make a telephone call whether or not conversation ensues.

#### 2.3 Penalty

Any person violating any section of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisioned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed ninety (90) days.

#### 2.4 Bonds

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to limit the right of the proper authorities to accept bail bonds, deposits or certificates or money deposits or to release a violator on his own bond as provided in any sections of the Wisconsin Statutes.
