ORGANIZATION MEETING April 20, 1976

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 6:00 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin by the County Clerk Dorothy L. Propp.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04B of the Wisconsin Statutes the April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

The Honorable Judge William E. Crane, Circuit Court, Branch I, administered the Oath of Office to the Supervisors.

The newly-elected members of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors were formally introduced.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisor Olson who asked to be excused.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

ELECTION OF BOARD CHAIRMAN

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman of the Board for the term of two years.

Motion made by Supervisor Daggett and seconded that James P. Coughlin be nominiated as chairman. Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to east the unanimous ballot for the chairman. The ballot was so east and James P. Coughlin was elected Chairman of the Winnebago County Board for the term of two years beginning April 20, 1976.

The Chair appointed Supervisors Johnson, M. Utech and Kampo as tellers.

ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Supervisor K. Brandt nominated Herman Brandt.

Supervisor Apell nominated George Singstock.

Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that nominations be closed. Carried by Voice Vote.

The votes were cast and counted. Herman Brandt 27; George

Singstock 16; Abstained 1.

The Chair announced that Supervisor Brandt having received the largest number of vote cast was declared elected as Vice Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

RULES OF THE COUNTY BOARD

Supervisor Greiner, Chairman of the Judiciary & Public Safety Committee, began the discussion of the proposed rules for the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that the meeting of the County Board shall be held in the Board of Supervisors' Room at 9 A.M. Roll Call Vote — Ayes 16 — W. Pawlowski, Becher, Neely, Ales, Kampo, Greiner, Coughlin, Warning, Daggett, Christoph, Loehning, Young, Precour, Planalp, Schneider. Abstain 1 — Jero. Excused 1 — Olson. Nayes 28. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Singstock and seconded that the meeting of the County Board shall be held in the Board of Supervisors' Room at 6 P.M., on the Third Tuesday. Roll Call Vote.—Ayes 34; Excused 1.—Olson. Nayes 11.—Becher, J. C. Pawlowski, Ales, Warning, Jero, Daggett, Christoph, Loehning, Young, M. Utech, Schneider. CARRIED.

Motion made by Supervisor Planalp and seconded to reconsider Time and Place of Meeting, to be at 6 P.M. LOST by Voice Vote. 1.1231 — delete "and then only at the request of the committee chairman"

1.144 — Motion made by Supervisor Planalp to note fiscal impact of resolution.

1.152 — to add "This agenda, along with appropriate attachments, shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to each Supervisor at least five days before the meeting."

1.153 — All matters not appearing on the written Agenda or not delivered with the Agenda shall be out of order and shall not be considered by the Board at the particular meeting.

ADOPTED RULES OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

- 1.10 TIME AND PLACE OF MEETING
- 1.101 The meeting of the County Board shall be held in the Board of Supervisors' Room at 6:00 P.M., on the third Tuesday of the month.
- 1.102 The Board shall be in continuous session from day to day until adjournment to a day certain or sine die.
- 1.103 The annual meeting shall commence on the last Monday in October and continue during consideration of the annual budget.
- 1.1031 The public hearing, as required by law, on the proposed annual budget shall be held at 7:00 P.M. on the date selected.
- 1.11 ORGANIZATION MEETING
- 1.111 At the statutory Organization Meeting in April, it shall be the duty of the County Clerk to call the County Board to order. The Clerk shall call the roll and establish presence of a quorum and proceed with the preliminary ceremonies.
- 1.112 A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman, with no secret ballot being used.
- 1.113 The Chairman shall then present an orientation program, including an explanation of the work of the Board and the manner in which it functions, the projects of various departments, long-range planning, and the status of various projects of the Board. He may ask for the help of the committee chairmen or department heads in making such explanation.
- 1.1131 The County Clerk shall make an explanation of procedure and the manner in which votes are taken.
- 1.1132 There shall be an explanation of the present and proposed rules of the County Board by a person who was a member of the Judiciary and Public Safety Committee prior to the Organization Meeting.
- 1.1133 The Corporation Counsel shall also address the Board on the functions of his office.
- 1.1134 An explanation shall be made by the Chairman as to the appointment of committee membership.
- 1.114 The Chairman will appoint a Committee on Committees to assist in the selection of committee members.
- 1.1141 The Committee on Committees will consist of five Board members, including the Board Chairman, Board Vice-Chairman, and three Board Members appointed by the Board Chairman.
- 1.1142 The Committee on Committees shall advise, by mail, all members of the Board their recommendations for Committee membership.

1.1143 The Board, as the first order of business at the recessed meeting of the Organization Meeting, shall officially appoint all committee members by majority vote.

1.11431 All members of each committee shall then meet for onehalf hour to select committee officials, and then report the results of such elections to the Board as a whole.

1.114311 Any committee may, if the committee membership so decides, postpone election of committee officers for not more than one month.

1.114312Between Organization meetings, should a vacancy occur, or the need arise to adjust a standing committee, then, the Committee on Committees shall fill the vacancy.

1.115 The proposed rules of the Board shall be presented and rules adopted.

1.1151 The proposed rules of the Board shall be made available to the Board membership at the meeting of the Board immediately prior to the Organization Meeting, and also to the newly elected members as soon as possible after the Spring Election.

1.1152 The Rules of the Board shall be adopted at the Organization Meeting of even numbered years by a majority vote.

1.1153 The Rules of the Board shall be amended during the two year period only by a three-quarters vote of those present at a meeting, except at the Annual Organization Meeting, at which time a majority of those present shall rule.

1.1154 The Rules of the Board shall govern the Board until altered or repealed.

1.1155 All prior rules inconsistent to those set out here are hereby, to the extent of such inconsistency, repealed.

1.1156 The Rules of the Board shall include the Rules (No. 1.), the Duties of the County Board (No. 2.), the Duties of Committees (No. 3.), Duties of County Executive (No. 4.) and Standing Committees (No. 5.).

1.116 The County Highway Committee shall be elected by the Board on the first day of the annual Organization Meeting with no secret ballot being used.

L1161 Any member of the County Board may be placed in nomination for election to the Highway Committee.

1.1162 A vacancy in the Highway Committee will be filled by election at the first Board meeting following the creation of such vacancy.

After the adoption of the Rules of the Board and other activities as noted in 1.2. through 1.261, the Board shall recess that Organization Meeting to the following Tuesday.

1.12 POWERS OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN

1.121 The Chairman of the County Board, or in his absence the Vice-Chairman, shall take the Chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, or recessed, or continued, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll by the Clerk.

- 1.1211 In absence of both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, the County Clerk shall preside until a Chairman Pro-Tem is elected.
- 1.122 The Chairman shall be responsible for the preparation of the written agenda of the County Board.
- 1.123 The Chairman shall act as ex officio member of all committees of the County Board.
- 1.1231 The Chairman, as ex officio committee member, shall have the power to vote in such committee only in the absence of one or more committee members.
- 1.124 The Chairman shall receive all requests and communications not specifically addressed to any committee or official of the County and refer such matters to the appropriate committee or official.
- 1.125 The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions before the Board.
- 1.13 ORDER OF BUSINESS
- 1.131 The Order of Business shall be as follows:
 - A. Call to order.
 - B. Roll Call.
 - C. Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
 - D. Prayer.
 - E. Reading and correcting of the minutes of the previous meeting. (On the last day of the Session, the minutes for that day will be read and corrected before adjournment on that day.)
 - F. Communications, Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
 - G. Report of the County Executive (at his option).
 - H. Reports of Committees, Commissions and Boards.
 - I. Special Orders of Business.
 - J. Public Comments.
 - K. Presentation of Resolutions and Ordinances previously tabled or laid over to a day certain, and disposition of same.
 - L. Presentation of new Resolutions and Ordinances and disposition of same.
 - M. Consideration of miscellaneous business.
 - N. Adjournment.
- 1.1311 The Roll Call shall be made by use of the voting machine, or in the event of malfunction, by voice call of the County Clerk.
- 1.1312 Reports of Committees, Commissions and Boards of the County Board shall be made in writing, said reports to be included in the agenda packet mailed, or otherwise delivered, to each Board Member.
- 1.13121 At the appropriate time in the Agenda, the Chairman shall ask for questions by Board Members on each written report in the order in which the Committees, Commissions and Boards appear in the Official County Directory.

- Public Comments will be heard by the Board at the appropriate time in the Agenda, but in any case, no earlier than 15 minutes after the Call to Order and no later than 60 minutes after the Call to Order.
- 1.1321 Public Comments will be heard by the Board only on those Resolutions and Ordinances on the Agenda for that meeting.
- 1.14 HANDLING OF RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES
- L141 Every written resolution shall be prepared in block form and be concise as possible and shall have attached to it the name of the Committee, Commission or Board and/or the names of the Supervisors introducing it.
- 1.142 All items to be acted upon by the Board which have been submitted to the Board at least 12 hours prior to the meeting at which they are to be acted on will be referred to the title and number and need not be read by the Clerk unless requested by a Supervisor.
- 1.143 Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing if requested by a Supervisor.
- 1.144 Every resolution having monetary implications must have a fiscal note attached or included.
- 1.15 WRITTEN AGENDA
- 1.151 The County Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to prepare a written Agenda for each meeting under the direction of the County Board Chairman.
- 1.152 This Agenda, along with appropriate attachments, shall be mailed or otherwise delivered to each Supervisor at least five days before the meeting.
- 1.1521 This Agenda, and attachments, shall be furnished to any person so requesting it from the County Clerk.
- No less than ten copies of the Agenda, with attachments, shall be made available by the County Clerk at the Board Meeting for public inspection and use.
- 1.153 All matters not appearing on the written Agenda or not delivered with the Agenda shall be out of order and shall not be considered by the Board at the particular meeting.
- Any item on the Agenda for consideration by the Board may be withdrawn at any time before action is taken on it, but only by its sponsor.
- 1.1541 In the event of withdrawal of any item as per 1.154, the Chairman will announce the withdrawal and the name of the sponsor withdrawing it.
- 1.155 Special orders of business appearing on the Agenda as authorized by the Board Chairman shall include the name of the Committee, Commission, Board or Supervisor requesting same.
- 1.16 DEFINITIONS
- 1.161 Memorials: Something in a speech, ceremony or written documents that commemorates through recognition of a person, place or occurrence.

1.162 Motion: The formal mode in which a member submits a proposed measure or resolve for the consideration and action of the meeting.

1.163 Ordinance: A law set forth by a governmental authority,

a municipal regulation.

Petition: A formal written document embodying a request of action to be taken by Winnebago County or one of its agencies or departments.

1.165 Substitute: To put in the place of another; that which stands in the place of another.

1.17 PRIVILEGE OF SPEAKING

1.171 Every member previous to speaking shall be recognized by the Chair. When two or more members desire to speak, the Chair shall designate the order of speaking.

1.172 No member shall speak more than twice on the same question without leave of the Board, except to answer questions

from the Chair or the Floor.

1.18 VOTING AND ROLL CALL

A vote on every question shall be taken by ayes, nayes, or abstention, and shall be recorded in the records of the proceedings.

A unanimous oral vote shall be considered and recorded as an affirmative unanimous roll call vote.

L183 A tie vote on any question shall indicate that question is lost.

1.184 A roll call vote shall be taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money, and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, members voting the affirmative, negative, and those who abstain, shall be recorded in the minutes.

1.185 A voting error shall be brought to the attention of the Chair before a vote is called on the next item before the Board or no corrective action will be taken.

1.91 MOTIONS

1.191 When a motion is under consideration, no other motion shall be entertained, except:

A. To adjourn.

B. To lay on the table.

C. For the previous question.

D. To postpone to a day certain.

E. To commit to a committee.

F. To amend or to substitute.

G. To postpone indefinitely.

These motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this section.

1.192 A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question shall be decided without debate.

1.193 A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or commit shall not again be entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

- 1.194 A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition.
- 1.1941 If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.
- 1.195 The previous question may be moved by any member and shall require two-thirds affirmative vote of the members present for passage.
- When a motion or question has once been determined, any member with the prevailing side may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted upon at the same or next succeeding meeting and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.
- 1.20 SUSPENSION OF RULES
- 1.201 Any of these Rules may be suspended by two-thirds vote of the members present, except Rule Numbers 1.201, 1.18 1.185, 1.196 and 1.1153 which are not suspendable.
- 1.21 ROBERT'S RULES
- 1.211 The rules of parliamentary practice included in the latest edition of "Robert's Rules of Order" so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.
- 1.22 PUBLICATION OF REPORTS
- 1.221 Reports presented to the Board shall be mentioned in the Board proceedings for reference purposes but not published in their entirety in the official proceedings unless so ordered by the Board by a majority vote.
- 1.23 QUORUM AND VOTE REQUIRED ON BUDGET TRANSFERS Wis. Stats.
- 1.231 Sec. 59.02(3) gives the general rule requiring a majority of supervisors to be present in order to have a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 1.2311 Under the same statute, all questions before the Board are determined by a majority of the supervisors present unless otherwise provided.

 Wis. Stats.
- 1.232 Sec. 65.90(5) has some additional requirements for changes in the budget after it has once been adopted. Changes in the amounts appropriated and changes in the purposes for which amounts are appropriated may not be made after adoption of the budget except by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the Board.
- 1.2321 There is an exception, however, within this Statute, to-wit:
 The County Board may authorize its standing Personnel &
 Finance Committee to transfer funds between items within
 a department or office if these items are separately appropriated, and may further authorize the Personnel and Finance Committee to supplement appropriations for a particular office, department or activity by a transfer from the Contingency Fund.

GENERAL DUTIES OF THE COUNTY BOARD

Delete Paragraphs 2.133 and 2.1331.

Motion made by Supervisor Singstock to include 2.134 but change number to 2.133. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor M. Utech to amend "for any money not previously budgeted." Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to eliminate paragraph 2.135. Carried by Voice Vote.

STANDING COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

Supervisor Greiner, Chairman of Judiciary & Public Safety Committee, began the discussion of committee structure.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that Alternate #2-3.121 be adopted. Motion made by Supervisor Aarons and seconded that "G" Health & Social Services Committee be changed to Health & Social Services Board. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Aarons and seconded that 3.122 of Alternate # 1 be added to Alternate # 2. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor M. Utech and seconded to table Alternate # 2 until discussion of Alternate # 1 & 3. Lost by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to amend as follows: "C" Buildings, Grounds and Finance Committee. "L" Personnel Committee. Roll Call Vote — Ayes 17, Nayes 28, Excused 1 — Olson. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Goff and seconded that the members of the Park View Health Center Committee need not necessarily be members of the 51.42 Unified Board. Roll Call Vote — Ayes 17, Nayes 28, Excused 1 — Olson. LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo to adopt Alternate $\#\ 2$ Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Greiner and seconded to adopt the Duties of Committees (5.10 thru 5.233).

Motion made by Supervisor M. Utech that the duties of Citizen Involved Committee duties be added to Alternate # 2. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Apell and seconded that 5.1121 of Alternate # 1 be added to Alternate # 2. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Loy and seconded that 5.125 of Alternate # 1 be added to Alternate # 2 as follows "It shall, when

Alternate = 1 be added to Alternate = 2 as follows "It shall, when requested to do so by the County Executive, assign two of its members to assist in the preparation and development of the annual County Budget." Carried by Voice Vote.

The motion made by Supervisor Greiner to adopt the Rules of the Committee Carried by Voice Vote.

- 2.1 GENERAL DUTIES OF THE COUNTY BOARD
- 2.10 COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS, BOARDS
- 2.101 The County Board shall be the Board of Jurisdiction for all County Board standing committees.
- 2.102 Any decision of any Standing Committee may be appealed to the Board by any Supervisor at any regular or special Board meeting.
- 2.103 Any County Board Member may attend, without voting privileges, any open or closed meeting of any County Board Committee, Commission or Board.
- 2.104 The public may attend any open meetings of the County Board, and/or its Committees, Commissions, or Boards.
- 2.11 ANNUAL TOUR
- 2.111 The County Board shall make an annual inspection of County owned properties and facilities during the month of May.
- 2.112 The agenda for this tour shall be compiled by the County Board Chairman.
- 2.13 PER DIEM, MILEAGE, EXPENSES
- 2.131 Each Board Member shall be responsible for compiling his own expense sheet for payment by the County of per diem, mileage and other expenses.
- 2.1311 Such expense sheets must be submitted to the Personnel Office no later than the 7th of each month.
- 2.132 Any and all expenses and other items listed on a Supervisor's expense sheet shall be paid by the County, except those which are in excess of sums permitted by County Resolution or Ordinance, or state statute, in which case the legal limit shall be paid.
- 2.133 No Supervisor shall submit for payment any item of expense or per diem which said Supervisor has not actually made or earned.
- 2.14 FREE ACCESS
 - All County Board Members shall have free access to any and all departments or offices of Winnebago County not prohibited by State Statutes or Federal Regulations.
- 3.10 COMMITTEE OF JURISDICTION
- 3.101 Each Committee, Board and Commission shall be the Committee of Jurisdiction for personnel and departments of Winnebago County as listed under specific Committee, Commission and Board duties.

- 3.102 Each Committee of Jurisdiction shall serve as liaison between the personnel and departments for which it is Committee of Jurisdiction and the County Board.
- 3.103 Each Committee of Jurisdiction shall serve as liaison between the personnel and departments for which it is Committee of Jurisdiction and the County Executive's Office.
- 3.11 COMMITTEE MEETINGS
- 3.111 All Committee, Board and Commission meetings shall be held in the County Courthouse or on public property.
- 3.112 Public notice of all meetings shall be given as soon as the members of the Committee, Board or Commission are notified of such meeting and not less than 24 hours before the meeting except as hereinafter provided.
- 3.1121 In emergencies, when a meeting must be held with less than 24 hours notice, the County Clerk shall notify the press as soon as possible.
- 3.113 The County Clerk is to be notified of all meetings prior to the time of the meeting.
- 3.114 Minutes of each meeting, as required by State Statutes, shall be filed with the County Clerk within ten days of the meeting except for executive sessions.
- 3.1141 Minutes of executive sessions shall be kept and will be filed with the County Clerk when no reason exists for such minutes to be kept private.
- 3.115 Minutes of each meeting shall be kept by the secretary of the Committee, Commission or Board meeting, or other person so designated by the Committee, Commission or Board chairman.
- 3.116 Meetings shall be held at the call of the Committee, Commission or Board Chairman, or at the call of a majority of its members.
- 3.117 Committee, Commission, Board meetings shall be held following the rules set up by that group.
- 3.118 Officers shall be elected during the Organization meeting and shall serve a term corresponding to the Supervisors's term except as otherwise provided in these rules.
- 3.1181 Any Committee, by majority vote, may elect new officers after one year or when a vacancy exists for any officer's position in that Committee.
- 3.12 STANDING COMMITTEES

4.1 DUTIES OF COUNTY EXECUTIVE

- 4.10 ADMINISTRATIVE AND MANAGEMENT FUNCTIONS
- 4.101 The County Executive shall coordinate and direct all administrative and management functions of the County Government not otherwise vested by law in Boards or Commissions, or in other elected officers.
- 4.102 The County Executive shall appoint the heads of all departments except those elected by the people and except

where the law provides that the appointment shall be made by a board or commission or by other elected officers, but he shall also appoint all department heads where the law provides that the appointment shall be made by the Board Chairman or the County Board. Such appointments shall require the confirmation of the County Board. (Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.031)

4.1021 The County Executive may file charges for the removal, discharge, or suspension of any persons so appointed, said charges to be filed with the County Board.

4.103 Appoint the members of all boards and commissions where the law provides that such appointment shall be made by the County Board or the Chairman of the County Board. All appointments to boards and commissions by the County Executive shall be subject to the confirmation of the County Board.

4.104 The County Executive shall, annually and otherwise as necessary, communicate to the County Board of Supervisors the condition of the County, and recommend such matters to them for their consideration as he deems expedient. Notwithstanding any other provisions of the law, he shall be responsible for the submission of the annual budget to the County Board any may exercise the power to veto any increases or decreases in the budget as provided for in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.032(6).

4.105 The County Executive is charged with the responsibility to examine, settle and allow all general accounts against the County and to cause to have issued County orders therefore, except any account where payment is otherwise specifically provided for by rule or statute.

5.1 DUTIES: STANDING COMMITTEES 5.10 AGRICULTURAL AND EXTENSION EDUCATION COMMITTEE

5.101 The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule 1.114, shall appoint the standing committee. The Agriculture and Education Committee shall consist of five members with duties in the following areas:

- Agriculture and extension education as outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.87.
- 2. County Library.
- 3. Winnebago County Fairgrounds.
- 4. Supervision of Winnebago County Soil Conservation District.
- 5.102 It shall be responsible for county extension service programs, the employment of professional extension service personnel, determination of basic problems and periodic evaluation of extension service in Winnebago County. This

Committee shall function in cooperation with the District Extension Leader, University of Wisconsin, in matters of program planning, public policy and contracting for services of extension agents.

5.103 It is the Committee of jurisdiction in the operation of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds and, as such, is responsible for the auditing and examination of expenditures made by the Winnebago County Fair Association as relates to the operation of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds and especially such appropriations as Winnebago County shall make from time to time for the maintenance and improvements of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds.

5.104 It shall meet regularly to discuss, consider and evaluate soil and water conservation practices established under the technical aid of the Winnebago County Soil Conservationist. It shall give due consideration to wild life conservation in Winnebago County and make appropriate recommendations to the County on such matters.

5.105 Two members of this Committee shall function as Winnebago County Trustees for the University of Wisconsin— Green Bay Fox Valley Campus.

5.11 AVIATION COMMITTEE

5.111 This Committee shall consist of three members.

5.112 This Committee shall have the responsibility for the supervision, maintenance, operation and development of Wittman Field, the Winnebago County owned airport, and all other aviation matters of appropriate concern to the County.

5.1121 While the Buildings and Grounds Committee is the Committee of Jurisdiction for all County buildings, property maintenance and the purchase, lease, sale or rental of all real properties, the Aviation Committee, acting in cooperation with the Buildings and Grounds Committee, shall be directly responsible for the purchase, lease, sale or rental of all real properties and the maintenance of the Airport buildings and property.

5.12 BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE

5.121 The Buildings and Grounds Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees, in accordance with Rule 1.114 shall appoint the standing committee.

5.122 It shall be responsible for the care and upkeep of the Winnebago County buildings and grounds, including the County Jail, Department of Social Services and provisions for the Winnebago County Courthouse parking lot. It shall be responsible for the upkeep and repair of equipment, furniture, and fixtures used in the Courthouse or in any of the aforementioned locations on the Courthouse property.

5.123 It shall be the Committee of jurisdiction for the purchase, sale, lease or rental of all real properties by any depart-

ment of Winnebago County government, except the purchase, sale or lease of land by the Highway Committee and Parks and Recreation Committee pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes.

5.124 It shall also be responsible for the purchase, transfer or sale of office equipment and furniture used in all County owned or leased buildings, structures and offices.

5.125 The duties of this Committee shall include the expenditure of County funds to obtain surveys, options and appraisals relating to property under consideration for purchase, sale or lease by Winnebago County except those lands under the jurisdiction of the Parks Committee and Highway Committee. It shall be designated as the Special Building Committee on all construction projects authorized by the County Board.

5.126 Creation and maintenance of a long range development plan for buildings and office space needed by the County.

5.13 COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE

5.131 The Winnebago County Planning and Zoning Committee shall consist of the following seven (7) members, five (5) of whom shall be County Board Supervisors and two (2) citizen members. Of the five County Board Supervisors, not less than one (1) or more than three (3) shall be from incorporated areas in Winnebago County. The two citizen members shall be from the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County. No two members of the Planning and Zoning Committee may be from the same township. The terms of the members of this committee shall coincide with the terms of the members of the County Board. The five County Board Supervisors shall be selected by the Committee on Committees. The two citizen members of the committee shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman. All appointments shall be subject to confirmation by the County Board.

5.132 The duties and responsibilities of said committee shall be as follows:

Creation and maintenance of the County development plan.

2. Consideration of solid waste disposal, metropolitan sewage disposal and matters relating thereto.

3. Committee of jurisdiction for the Winnebago County Planner.

5.14 GOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

5.141 A Governmental Relations Committee, consisting of the County Board Chairman, the County Board Vice-Chairman, and three County Board Supervisors, to be appointed by the Committee on Committees, in accordance with Rule No. 1.114.

5.142 The duties of this Committee shall be:

- To become aware of legislation proposed in Madison which might affect Winnebago County, if time permits obtain the opinion of the County Board committee of jurisdiction of the subject of such legislation and of the County Board as a whole, to make representations to the Legislature concerning such opinions.
- 2. To consult with the County Boards Association with a view to conveying views of Winnebago County and knowing those of that Association.
- 3. To make a determined effort to improve understandings and cooperative efforts on matters of joint concern between Winnebago County and each or all of its political subdivisions. The County Board Chairman may from time to time ask one or several members of the County Board to serve with the Governmental Relations Committee on a particular matter; but such joining with the committee shall be restricted to the matter concerned, not a general augmenting of the Governmental Relations Committee.
- 4. The Governmental Relations Committee shall report each month to the County Board as does each of the Standing Committees of the Board.

5.15 HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES BOARD

- 5.151 The Health and Social Services Board shall consist of five members, appointed by the County Executive, who shall have responsibility of examining, auditing and recommending to the Personnel and Finance Committee for allowance or disallowance, all claims which have been filed by municipalities against the County for various types of poor relief and such other duties as are contained in Wis. Stats., Sec. 46.22.
- 5.152 It shall supervise the activities of the Department of Social Services and confer with the Director thereof on matters presented to his office.
- 5.153 The Health and Social Services Board shall also function as the County Health Committee and is responsible for those duties relating to the County Public Health Nurses and the County Health Department as are contained in Wis. Stats., Sec. 141.06.
- 5.1531 When the Board is functioning as the County Health Committee, then, a representative of the State Health Department as appointed by the State Health Officer shall participate in decisions and matters pertaining to this subject. The duties of the Health and Social Services Board as relates to health shall be to conduct a generalized public health nursing program in cooperation with the State Board of Health.

5.16 JUDICIARY AND PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

- 5.161 The Judiciary and Public Safety Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board through its Committee on Committees shall appoint the committee in accordance with Rule 1.114.
- 5.162 It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the Circuit Courts, County Courts, Sheriff's Department, District Attorney, Coroner, Corporation Counsel, Family Court Commissioner, Veteran's Service Officer, Register of Deeds, County Clerk and County Law Library.
- 5.163 It shall confer with the Sheriff on matters relating to law enforcement in Winnebago County and handle all matters pertaining to public safety, including provisions for ambulance service, rescue work on waters bordering on or within Winnebago County and snowmobile and boating use in Winnebago County.
- 5.164 It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for Winnebago County's Defense Civil Preparedness Agency (Civil Defense). It shall be responsible for the recommendation and implementation of an effective program of emergency government consistent with the State of Wisconsin plans of emergency government and more particularly as outlined in Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 22.16. The Chairman of the County Board shall function as the head of emergency government services in Winnebago County.
- 5.165 It shall recommend rules of the County Board. Such rules must be submitted at the organization meeting of the County Board and changes in rules may be submitted at other times of the year subject to Rule 1.1153 of the Rules of the County Board.
- 5.166 It shall supervise codification of County Board ordinances and resolutions.
- 5.167 It shall make recommendations of proper apportionment of Supervisory Districts of Winnebago County.
- 5.168 It shall have the duty of arranging for the appropriate publication and printing of the proceedings of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.
- 5.17 PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE
- 5.171 The Parks Committee shall consist of five members. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule 1.114 shall appoint the standing committee.
- 5.172 It shall be responsible for the obtaining, maintenance, operation and development of all Winnebago County Parks and recreation areas, including boat landings, recreational travel areas, associated programs and wild life preservation areas.
- 5.1721 It shall recommend to the County Board from time to time

for its action, the necessary rules and regulations for all Winnebago County owned recreational areas.

5.18 51.42 UNIFIED BOARD and PARK VIEW HEALTH CENTER COMMITTEE (Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.42/51.437(4)(b)

- 5.181 A nine member Board appointed by the Executive, five of whom shall be Winnebago County Board Supervisors, to be known as the 51.42 Unified Board, has the responsibility to provide the program as required by the foregoing statutory sections and appropriate sections in the Wisconsin Administrative Code. A more concise indication of the duties, responsibilities and authorities, as well as other pertinent information relating thereto, can be found in the Ordinance adopted by Winnebago County establishing the 51.42 Unified Board.
- 5.182 The five County Board Supervisors shall function exclusively as the Park View Health Center Committee with jurisdiction over Pleasant Acres.
- 5.19 PERSONNEL AND FINANCE COMMITTEE
- 5.191 The Personnel and Finance Committee shall consist of five members and shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the County Treasurer, the County Auditor, and the County Personnel Director. The County Board, through its Committee on Committees in accordance with Rule No. 1.114, shall appoint the standing committee.
- 5.192 It shall establish the procedure for the preparation of an annual County Budget to be developed by the County Executive and notify department heads, committees and other officials, of the procedure to be followed in the development of the necessary financial data for their segment of said budget.
- 5.1921 It shall, when requested to do so by the County Executive, assign two of its members to assist in the preparation and development of the annual County Budget.
- 5.1922 The Executive Budget shall be referred by the Board to the Personnel and Finance Committee for such review as it deems necessary and for presentation to the Board at the Annual Meeting for its consideration, review and adoption.
- 5.1923 It shall have published the recommended budget in accordance with requirements of Wisconsin Statutes and shall include appropriate notations to show any changes in said budget from the budget proposals initially prepared by the various departments for examination of the County Executive and the Personnel and Finance Committee.
- 5.193 After adoption, it shall have authority to make budgetary alterations as permitted by Wis. Stats., Sec. 65.90(5)(b) where such alterations are either of the following:
 - A transfer of funds between budgeted items of an individual County Department if such budgeted items

have been separately appropriated, and

Supplementation of appropriations for a particular office or department by transfer from the Contingency Fund.

5.1931 The limitation on the dollar amount of such budgetary alteration shall be the amount set aside in the Contingency Fund or the sum of \$3,000.00, whichever is the lesser sum. In addition, the Personnel and Finance Committee may refuse to grant any budgetary alteration in whole or in part or may grant any such request conditionally on such conditions as it deems appropriate.

5.1932 It shall notify the County Board each month of any such budgetary alteration requests and subsequent action thereon.

5.194 It shall review all financial reports submitted to the County Board by the County Executive and by County officials and by auditors retained by the County. (The County Executive is charged with the responsibility to examine, settle and allow all general accounts against the County and to have issued County orders therefore). It shall be empowered to authorize expenditures not to exceed \$1,000.00 for any one item in an emergency request from a Committee between County Board sessions.

5.195 It shall also audit and allow mileage and per diem for County Board and committee meetings and audit, adjust and allow or disallow all dog claims and assessor's claims.

5.196 It shall advise with the County Treasurer and County Executive in the matter of investment of County funds. It shall advise with the County Board from time to time regarding County Finances.

5.197 It shall have the duty to propose equalizing the value of all taxable properties in Winnebago County in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes. It shall have the duty to examine all claims filed against the County for illegal taxes of any kind and shall make a report and recommend to the County Board on all matters pertaining to illegal taxes.

5.198 It shall manage and attend to the sale of all properties taken by Winnebago County on tax deeds.

5.199 It shall negotiate for the insurance of Winnebago County in accordance with the statutes and resolutions adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to establish insurance coverage requirements for all lessees and sublessees of property in which Winnebago County has an insurable interest. It shall make an annual report to the County Board of all such insurance carried by Winnebago County.

5.200 It is the committee of jurisdiction for all claims filed against Winnebago County pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.76 and Sec. 895.43, and shall work in cooperation with the County Clerk and Corporation Counsel to insure that such claims

are properly handled to protect the interest of Winnebago County.

The duties of this Committee shall include the receipt of all personnel requests from all Committees for study and recommendation. It shall supervise negotiations on behalf of Winnebago County with authorized representatives of County employees, and meet from time to time with County employees, or their representatives, with respect to grievances, salaries, classification or reclassification, and other benefits.

It shall recommend to the County Board a salary schedule for elected officers and officials of Winnebago County in accordance with the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes, and a salary schedule for all appointed officials and other employees of Winnebago County, unless otherwise determined by agreement or statute.

5.21 BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

5.211 The Board of Adjustment shall consist of the following: Five (5) members, two (2) of whom shall be County Board Supervisors who are members of the Planning and Zoning Committee, and three (3) citizen members. All members of the Board of Adjustment must be from the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County. No two members of the Board of Adjustment may be from the same township. None of the citizen members of the Board of Adjustment may be a member of the Planning and Zoning Committee. terms of the County Board members of this Board shall coincide with their terms as County Board Supervisors. All citizen members shall have a term of three (3) years except initially the term of one citizen member shall commence with the date of appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the thrid Tuesday in April, 1976; the term of a second citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April, 1977; and the term of the third citizen member shall commence with appointment and confirmation by the County Board and end the third Tuesday in April 1978. Thereafter, all terms shall be three (3) years. All members of the Board of Adjustment shall be appointed by the County Executive subject to confirmation by the County Board.

5.212 The Board shall function as the Board of Adjustments with such duties as are outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.99.

5.22 HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

5.221 The Highway Committee shall consist of five members who shall be elected by the County Board at the organization meeting in accordance with Wis. Stats., Sec. 83.015.

5.222 It shall have those duties as are set out in Wisconsin Statutes, including but not limited to the following:

- Purchase and sale of County road machinery as authorized by the County Board.
- 2. Determine whether each piece of County aid construction shall be let be contract or otherwise.
- Enter into contracts in the name of Winnebago County relating to the construction and maintenance of highways.
- 4. Enter private lands with their employees to remove weeds and brush and to erect or remove fences to keep highways open for travel.
- 5. Direct the expenditure of highway maintenance funds received from the State or provided by County taxes.
- Audit all payrolls, material claims and vouchers resulting from the construction and maintenance of highways.
- 5.23 SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD
- 5.231 This Board shall consist of nine members.
- 5.2311 Five of the members will be County Board Supervisors appointed by the County Executive and confirmed by the County Board.
- 5.2312 All members of the Board shall be selected on a geographical basis as indicated in the Ordinance establishing the Board.
- 5.232 This Board will function pursuant to Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.07(135).
- 5.233 This Board will be responsible for the establishment of a solid waste management system for Winnebago County, which system will develop, provide or cause to be provided, such services as are necessary to the implementation and maintenance of solid waste and sewage sludge collection and disposal.
- 5.32 AFFIRMATIVE ACTION COMMISSION
- 5.321 This Commission shall have five members.
- 5.3211 Not less than two members shall be women; one member shall be an employee of Winnebago County; and not more than three County Board Supervisors shall be members, one of whom shall be a member of the Personnel and Finance Committee.
- 5.322 The underlying principle of the Affirmative Action Program is to improve the equitable treatment and redress of any inequalities that may exist in recruiting, hiring, classifying, referring, assigning, training and retraining, fringe benefits, promotion, transfer, compensation, extending or assigning use of facilities, firing, lay-off, recall, and disciplinary action and any other terms, conditions or privileges of employment for all persons in the employ of Winnebago County.
- 5.3221 Furthermore, the Affirmative Action Program is designed to assure that there will be no discrimination in Winnebago

County employment on the basis of race, color, religion or national origin.

5.323 By Resolution dated April 23, 1974, the County Board did establish a Winnebago County Affirmative Action Program and designated the Director of Personnel as the Affirmative Action Officer.

5.33 WINNEBAGO COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY

5.331 This Commission shall have five citizen members.

5.3311 Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.07(5), permits the creation of County Housing Authorities.

5.3312 Pursuant to such authority, Winnebago County did on April 23, 1974, by Resolution # 2, recognize the need for a Housing Authority to function in Winnebago County. The powers and duties of the Winnebago County Housing Authority can be found in Wis. Stats., Sec. 66.40 to Sec. 66.404.

5.332 The purpose of the County Housing Authority is to make certain determinations concerning the housing conditions

for low income persons within the County.

5.3321 If such determinations indicate a need for improved dwelling accommodations for persons of low income, then, the Housing Authority may authorize the expenditure of public funds made available by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to improve the dwelling accommodations for low income persons in Winnebago County.

5.34 ADVOCAP BOARD

5.341 Six Winnebago County Board Supervisors serve on the Board of Directors of ADVOCAP.

5.342 On May 16, 1972, by Resolution # 2, the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors did designate ADVOCAP, INC., as the community action program to serve Winnebago County.

5.343 The U. S. Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 authorizes the establishment and funding of community action agencies and programs to stimulate a better focusing of all available local, State, private and Federal resources upon the goal of enabling low-income families, and low-income individuals of all ages, in rural and urban areas, to attain the skills, knowledge and motivations and secure the opportunities needed for them to become self-sufficient.

5.35 WINNE-FOND COMPREHENSIVE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING CONSORTIUM

5.351 Three Winnebago County Board Supervisors serve on the Policy Board of the Winne-Fond Comprehensive Employment and Training Consortium.

5.352 On February 19, 1974, by Resolution # 15, the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors authorized the filing of an application by Winnebago County to participate as a prime

sponsor in a manpower revenue sharing program pursuant to the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973.

- 5.3521 Winnebago County's application was accepted and a consortium agreement was executed by appropriate representatives of Winnebago County and Fond du Lac County giving rise to the Winne-Fond Comprehensive Employment and Training Consortium. The agreement between the two counties indicates the various powers, functions and responsibilities of the Policy Board and other related activities.
- 5.353 The purpose of the Winne-Fond Comprehensive Employment and Training Consortium is to provide job training and employment opportunities for economically disadvantaged, unemployed and underemployed persons, and to assure that training and other services lead to maximum employment opportunities and enhance self-sufficiency.
- 5.36 COMMITTEE ON AGING
- 5.361 This Committee shall have not less than nine and not more than thirteen members.
- 5.3611 At least 75% of the members shall be senior citizens sixty years of age or over, and at least one member shall be under the age of thirty.
- 5.3612 No more than two members shall be County Board Supervisors.
- 5.362 Winnebago County Board of Supervisors did on May 21, 1974, by Resolution # 4, create the Winnebago County Committee on Aging.
- 5.3621 The purpose of this Committee is to improve the quality of life for the senior citizens of Winnebago County.
- 5.3622 The powers and duties of this Committee can be found in the aforementioned Resolution.

Motion made by Supervisor Hunter that Donald Arne be nominated to the Highway Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot. The ballot was so cast and Donald Arne was elected to the Highway Committee for a term of one year beginning April 20, 1976.

Motion made by Supervisor Goff to nominate Supervisor Jero. Motion made by Supervisor Ales to nominate Supervisor Johnson.

Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that the nominations be closed. Carried.

The votes were cast and counted. Jero 10; Johnson 35. The Chair announced that Supervisor Johnson having received the largest number of votes be declared elected to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Arne that Clarence Loehning be nominated to the Highway Committee. Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski that the nominations be closed and the clerk be instructed to cast the unanimous ballot. The ballot was so cast and Clarence Loehning elected to the Highway Committee for a term of one year beginning April 20, 1976.

Motion made by Supervisor Singstock to nominate J. C. Pawlowski to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Daggett to nominate Alfred Bech-

er to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that nomina-

tions be closed. Carried by Voice Vote.

The votes were cast and counted. J. C. Pawlowski 32; Alfred Becher 12. The Chair announced that Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski having received the largest number of votes be declared elected to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor M. Utech to nominate Lillian Jero to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Greiner to nominate Alfred Becher

to the Highway Committee.

Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded that nominations be closed. Carried.

The votes were cast and counted. Jero 26; Becher 19.

The Chair announced that Supervisor Jero having received the largest number of votes be declared elected to the Highway Committee.

The Chair announced that his appointment of the Committee on Committees as follows: H. Brandt, Singstock, Greiner and Goff.

Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski and seconded that the board adjourn until Tuesday, April 27th at 6 P.M., Carried by Voice Vote.

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman James P. Coughlin on Tuesday, April 27th, 1976 at 6 P.M.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of the following excused supervisors: Arne and Collins.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Goff.

Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski and seconded that the minutes be approved as printed. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Greiner and seconded that the committee appointments made by the Committee on Committees be approved. Supervisor Precour asked permission to address the board regarding the appointments of the Committee. Permission was granted. The appointments were approved by Voice Vote.

A communication from the Twin City Rod & Gun Club signed by 126 petitioners who are interested in a boat landing on the Wolf River East side near Riverview Resort was read. Referred to the Parks and Recreation Committee.

A petition from the Small Property Owners League of Winnebago County requesting participation in the re-drafting of the Winnebago Town-Country Zoning Code was read. Referred to the Planning & Zoning Committee.

- (c) "Non-conforming use" means any structure, tree or use of land which does not conform to a regulation prescribed in this Ordinance or an amendment thereto, as of the effective date of such regulation.
- (d)"Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or other similar representative thereof.
- (e) "Structure" means any object constructed or installed by man.
- (f) "Tree" means any object of natural growth, except farm crops which are cut at least once a year, and except shrubs, bushes or plants which do not grow to a height of more than five feet.
- (g) "Runway" means a level portion of an airport having a surface specially developed and maintained for the landing and take-off of aircraft.

SECTION IL ZONES

There are hereby established airport approach and navigation zones within a three mile distance from the boundaries of the Wittman Field Airport as shown on official Zoning Map "A" and official Zoning Map "B", Wittman Field Airport, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, dated October, 1963, with revisions to Map "A" dated September, 1970, which are attached hereto and adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION III. HEIGHT ZONES. EXCEPTIONS

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, no structure shall be constructed, altered or located which has a height in excess of the height limit indicated within the zones on the map referred to in SECTION II hereof, and no trees shall be permitted to grow in excess of the height limit indicated within the zones on the map referred to in SECTION II hereof.
- (b) The restrictions contained in SECTION III(a) shall not apply to legal fences or to farm crops which are cut at least once each year.

SECTION IV. USE RESTRICTIONS. ACTÍVITES

Notwithstanding the provisions of SECTION III of this Ordinance, no use may be made of land in any zone in such manner as to create electrical interference with radio communication between the airport and aircraft, or make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others, or result in glare in the eyes of the pilots using the airport, or impair visibility, in the vicinity of the airport or otherwise endanger the landing, taking off or maneuvering of aircraft.

SECTION V. NON-CONFORMING USES

(a) Not Retroactive:

The regulations prescribed in SECTIONS II and III of this Ordinance shall not be construed to require the removal, lowering or other change or alteration of any non-conforming use, or otherwise interfere with the continuance of any non-conforming use, except as otherwise provided by SECTION VII (b), however, non-conforming objects existing at the time of adoption of this Ordinance which violated the Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinance adopted March 12, 1946, and subsequent amendments thereto, and which were not exempt from the requirements of said prior Ordinance, shall be subject to the requirements of this Ordinance.

(b)Changes:

Nothing herein contained shall require any changes in the construction or alteration of intended use of any structure if the construction or alteration of such was begun prior to the effective date of this Ordinance and if such is diligently prosecuted.

(c) Removal:

This section shall not interfere with the removal of non-conforming uses by purchase or the use of eminent domain.

SECTION VL ADMINISTRATION

It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator to administer and enforce the regulations prescribed herein. Applications for permits and variances shall be made to the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator or his designated agent upon a form furnished by him. Applications which are by this Ordinance to be decided by the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator shall be promptly considered and granted or denied by him. Applications for action by the Winnebago County Board of Adjustments shall be forthwith transmitted by the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator to the Board for hearing and decision.

SECTION VIL PERMITS

(a) Height Permit Required:

Except as otherwise provided under Sec. VII(b), no structure shall hereafter be constructed, erected or installed, or be permitted to remain in any zone created by SECTION II of this Ordinance until the owner or his agent shall have applied in writing for a permit therefor and obtained such permit from the Winnebago County Zoning Administra-

tor or his designated agent.

Also, except as otherwise provided under Sec. VII(b), no tree may be planted without a permit, and any tree planted without a permit or permitted to grow without planting may be ordered removed at any time by the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator or his designated agent upon his finding that such tree violates or is about to violate the height restriction for the zone.

(b) Height Permit not Required:

Structures to be located beyond the half mile limit or half mile limit extended (Map 'A') and which will be at, or below, seventy-five feet (75') maximum height above ground at the building site shall not require a height permit.

The following trees shall not require a height permit when located beyond the half mile limit or half mile limit extended (Map 'A') according to attached supplement.

(c) Application:

Application for a height permit shall indicate the use for which the permit is desired, and shall describe and locate the use with sufficient particularity to permit the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator to determine whether such use would conform to the regulations herein prescribed. If such determination is in the affirmative, the Winnebago County Zoning Administrator shall issue the permit applied for.

(d)Fee:

\$5.00 when not in conjunction with County Building Permit.

(e) Existing Uses:

Before any non-conforming structure may be altered, repaired, or rebuilt, a permit shall be applied for and secured in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) authorizing such change or repair, except that a non-conforming use other than utility poles destroyed, to the extent of fifty (50) per cent or more of its assessed valuation, according to the assessment for the fiscal year in which such destruction occurs, shall, from and after the date of such destruction, conform to the regulation of this Ordinance. No such permit shall be granted that would allow the structure to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was on the effective date of this Ordinance, or than it is when the application for the permit is made. No tree shall be allowed to grow so as to become a greater

hazard to air navigation than it was at the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION VIII.HAZARD MARKING AND LIGHTING

Any variance granted under SECTIONS IX and X may, if such action is deemed advisable by the Winnebago County Board of Adjustments to effectuate the purpose of this Ordinance and if such is reasonable in the circumstances, be so conditioned as to require the owner of the structure or trees in question to permit the owner of the airport, at its own expense, to install, operate and maintain thereon such marker and lights as may be necessary to indicate to the flyers the presence of an airport hazard.

SECTION IX. JURISDICTION

The Winnebago County Board of Adjustments shall have jurisdiction over all appeals and review under this Ordinance.

SECTION X. APPEALS AND REVIEW

(a) Variances:

Upon appeal in special cases, the Winnebago County Board of Adjustments may, after investigaton and public hearing, grant such variance from the terms of this Ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of this Ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship, and such relief will do substantial justice and be in accord with the spirit of this Ordinance, and does not create a hazard to the safe, normal operation of aircraft.

(b) Aggrieved Person:

Any person aggrieved or affected by any decision or action of the Winnebago County Zoning Officer made in his administration of this Ordinance may appeal such decision or action to the Board of Adjustments.

(c) Procedure:

Any appeal taken pursuant to this section shall be in conformity with the procedure established by Section 59.99 of the Statutes.

SECTION XL PENALTIES

Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00), or more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for such offense, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the County Jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty (30) days for

each violation. Each day that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION XIL SEVERABILITY

If any of the provisions of this Ordinance of the Application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION XIII REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES

All prior Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinances, including amendments thereto, are hereby repealed.

SECTION XIV. EFFECT

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and publication.

SECTION XV. FILING

This Ordinance shall be filed in the Office of the County Clerk, but shall not be recorded by the Register of Deeds. The Clerk shall notify the Register of Deeds of such filing and such notice shall be recorded.

HUBER LAW PRISONERS: RECOVERY OF PER CAPITA JAIL COSTS

The following Ordinance No. 1 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.

Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 56.08(4), enables counties to charge Huber Law prisoners for actual expenses in addition to meals and board.

SECTION 2. INTRODUCTION.

a. Winnebago County now operates its jail utilizing the Huber Law provisions and does have a number of Huber Law prisoners incarcerated from time to time. b. The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors recognizes that prisoners who are gainfully employed under the provisions of the Huber Law should have the opportunity to pay their own way as much as possible while incarcerated in the Winnebago County Jail.

SECTION 3. PER CAPITA DAILY COST.

A per capita daily cost, plus Wisconsin Sales Tax where applicable to any portion thereof, is hereby established for Huber Law prisoners.

SECTION 4. METHOD OF DETERMINING PER CAPITA COST.

The method of charging Huber Law prisoners for their fair share of the per capita cost shall be as follows:

- a. All gainfully employed prisoners working under the Huber Law provisions in the Winnebago County Jail shall be required to pay a per capita charge for room and board in the amount of \$11.73 per day, or 50% of his or her weekly take-home pay, whichever is less, computed on a seven day week basis
- b. The per capita daily cost as hereinbefore provided shall be reviewed annually by the County Executive and a new daily per capita rate shall be established using the following formula:

The total annual operating costs of the Winnebago County Jail shall be divided by 365 (the number of days in a year) and that sum divided by 60 (the maximum number of prisoners in the Jail) equals the daily per capita cost.

Any daily per capita rate established pursuant to the foregoing formula shall be subject to the approval of the Judiciary and Public Safety Committee.

c. The daily per capita rate is to be collected by or paid to the proper officials of the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department who shall, in turn, remit the monies collected on a regular basis to the County Treasurer, and they shall also furnish a comprehensive monthly report of said charges collected to Judiciary and Public Safety Committee.

SECTION 5. REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES.

All prior Winnebago County Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as required by law.

Mr. W. E. Schneider, 2958 Oakwood Lane, Oshkosh urged the Winnebago County Board not to delay the passage of the federated library system.

Mr. Carl Snyder, 540 Riverway, Menasha, President of the Menasha Library Board opposed the adoption of the federated library resolution.

Mr. Ralph Roselius, 1219 Nebraska Street, Oshkosh, urged the board members to adopt Resolution No. 10 for ambulance service in Winnebago County.

Ms. Nancy Rottier, an Oshkosh attorney representing the Oshkosh Ambulance Service, requested favorable consideration of the resolution for ambulance service in Winnebago County.

Mr. Donald Sherman, Supervisor of Assessments from the Department of Revenue, Fond du Lac presented the 1976 Winnebago County Equalization figures for all property. Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded to accept the report. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

WHEREAS, this prairie vegetation is a part of the natural history of Winnebago County and has educational, historical and ecological value to the community; and

WHEREAS, a special Architectural Selection Committee, approved by the Winnebago County Board and the City Council of the City of Oshkosh, has conducted interviews with a number of architectural firms and recommends that the firm of Orput Associates, Inc., of Wauwatosa, Wisconsin, be selected as the architects for this project; and

WHEREAS, funds have been allocated in the 1977 Budget to

cover the preliminary stages of this project.

AMENDATORY ORDINANCE: HUBER LAW PRISONERS' CHARGES WITH PROVISIONS FOR WISCONSIN SALES TAX ADDED (ADOPTED 11/12/71)

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY.

Wisconsin Statutes, Sec. 56.08(4), enables counties to charge Huber Law prisoners for actual expenses in addition to meals and board.

SECTION 2. INTRODUCTION.

- a. Winnebago County now operates its jail utilizing the Huber Law provisions and does have a number of Huber Law prisoners incarcerated from time to time.
- Winnebago County, as all other counties in the State of Wisconsin, is presently experiencing extreme financial problems.

c. The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors recognizes that prisoners who are gainfully employed under the provisions of the Huber Law should have the opportunity to pay their own way as much as possible while incarcerated in the Winnebago County Jail.

SECTION 3. PER CAPITA DAILY COST.

A per capita daily cost of \$11.73 plus Wisconsin Sales Tax where applicable to any portion thereof is hereby established for Huber Law prisoners.

SECTION 4. METHOD OF DETERMINING PER CAPITA COST. The Method of charging Huber Law prisoners for their

fair share of the per capita cost shall be as follows:

- a. All gainfully employed prisoners working under the Huber Law provisions in the Winnebago County Jail be required to pay to Winnebago County a total of fifty percent (50%) of their weekly take-home pay for room and board, also known as per capita cost, but said charge not to exceed \$11.73 per day, seven days a week, and said charge not to be less than the cost of meals plus Wisconsin Sales Tax, if any.
- b. The per capita daily cost as hereinbefore provided shall be reviewed annually by the County Executive and a new daily per capita rate shall be established using the following formula:

The total annual operating costs of the Winnebago County Jail divided by 365 (the number of days in a year) and that sum divided by 60 (the maximum number of prisoners in the Jail) equals the daily per capita cost.

Any daily per capita rate established pursuant to the foregoing formula shall be subject to the approval of the Judiciary and Public Safety Commit-

c. This charge is to be collected by or paid to the proper officials of the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department who shall, in turn, remit the monies collected on a regular basis to the County Treasurer, and they shall also furnish a comprehensive monthly report of said charges collected to the Judiciary and Public Safety Committee.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective as of 12:01 A.M. January 1, 1972.

ORDINANCE: COUNTY SURVEYOR

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. ELECTION OF OFFICE

Pursuant to provisions of Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.12, the office of surveyor for Winnebago County shall be elected at the general election held in each even numbered year.

SECTION 2. QUALIFICATION

The surveyor shall be a registered land surveyor.

SECTION 3. DUTIES

The County Surveyor shall:

(a) Execute, by himself or a deputy, any and all surveys required by the County or by any Court.

- (b) Surveys for individuals or corporations may be executed at the County Surveyor's discretion. It is expressly understood, however, that surveys for individuals or corporations may be performed by any land surveyor who is employed by the parties requiring his services, providing that within sixty (60) days after completing any survey he files a true and correct copy of the survey in the office of the County Surveyor.
- (c) Make by himself or a deputy, a record in books or on drawings and plats kept therefor, of all corners set and the manner of fixing the same and of all bearings and the distances of all courses run, of each survey made by him, his deputies, or other land surveyors and so arrange or index the same as to be easy of reference and file and preserve in his office the original field notes and calculations thereof; and within sixty (60) days after completing any survey, make a true and correct copy of the foregoing record, in record books or on reproducible papers to be furnished by the County and kept in file in the office of the County Surveyor to be provided by the County.
- (d) Furnish a copy of any record, plat or paper in his office to any person on demand and payment to the County of the legal fees therefor.
- (e) Administer to every survey assistant engaged in any survey, before commencing their duties as such, an oath or affirmation faithfully and impartially to discharge the duties of survey assistant, and the surveyor and his deputies are impowered to administer the same.
- (f) Perform such other duties as are required by law.

SECTION 4. COMPENSATION

The County Surveyor shall receive compensation and reimbursement of expenses as follows:

- (a) The County Surveyor shall receive an hourly rate as established by the County Board through its Personnel and Finance Committee for all professional services performed as County Surveyor. The hourly charges shall be billed monthly on an appropriate County voucher subject to audit and review by the Audit Department. Administrative expenses of the County Surveyor shall be included in the hourly rate and shall be paid by the County Surveyor.
- (b) Reimbursable expenses: the County Surveyor shall be reimbursed for expenses as may be determined by the County Board through its Personnel and Finance Committee in accordance with County policy.

SECTION 5. OFFICIAL OATH AND BONDING

The County Surveyor shall execute and file, in accordance with Sec. 59.13, Wis. Stats., an official bond in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) and will take and file the official oath of office within twenty (20) days after receiving official notice of his election.

SECTION 6. OFFICE

The County Surveyor shall keep his office in the County Planning and Zoning Office located in the Courthouse where the books and records of the County Surveyor shall be located. The County Zoning Inspector shall be deputized by the County Surveyor and act as custodian of all survey records.

SECTION 7. COUNTY BOARD COMMITTEE

The Planning and Zoning Committee shall be the Committee of jurisdiction for the County Surveyor's office.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

Administration of County Budget

A. PURPOSE

To establish an orderly procedure whereby the budget adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors is to be administered.

B. PROCEDURE

General.

The Winnebago County budget shall include details on

each item relating to a department's operation with a separate listing, where applicable, under the following four broad categories:

- Salaries Benefits
- Operating Expenses
- Capital Outlay

- Equipment and Furnishings Outlay

Only the totals of the several "line" items in each department's individual budget are to be adopted. The complete listing of each recommended item in the last two columns of the budget shall be considered as substantiating detail used to arrive at a total. No transfers may be made between the four above named categories except in accordance with rules established by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. In the absence of such rules, no transfer may be made without County Board approval.

2. Salaries and Benefits.

Salaries listed in the budget shall be those salaires as are in effect on July 1 of the year in which the budget is being considered. If salaries have been determined, for example, by a negotiated labor agreement, then the salaries for the budget year shall be included in the proposed budget. Other salaries are subject to revision during succeeding periods of time. The cost of salary adjustments for the Highway Department, Unified Board, Winnebago Mental Health Clinic, Social Services Board, and Manpower Planning, shall be included in their budgets. Funds necessary to cover adjustments in salaries for all other budgets shall be included in the General Salary Fund budget.

General Salary Fund monies may be used for all costs pertaining to the employment of personnel where such costs exceed the amount authorized in each department's budget. These costs cover expenditures such as salary increases, new personnel, fringe benefit cost increases, professional services, including salary studies, advertising related to personnel recruitment, and moving expenses, where necessary.

New positions shall be filled in the following manner:

- (a) Submit requests to Committee of Jurisdiction for consideration.
- (b) Committee of Jurisdiction will make its recommendation known to the Personnel and Finance Committee.
- (c) Personnel and Finance Committee will review request and recommendations.

- (d) Request, if approved, will be submitted to the County Board by the Personnel and Finance Committee. If the request is denied by the Personnel and Finance Committee, the Committee of Jurisdiction, at its discretion, may submit the request to the County Baord.
- (e) County Board makes decision.

(f) County Executive makes decision.

Vacant positions in the Table of Organization must have the approval of the County Executive prior to being filled.

Fringe benefits are a separate item in the budget. This item reflects the monetary outlay for various fringe benefits applicable to employees in each department. The actual figures and the estimated figures for the budget year shall be included in this item.

3. Operating Expenses.

Operating expenses consist of various items in the budget required to operate each of the departments in Winnebago County government.

Convention and conference attendance, which is budgeted under 'Operating Expenses', must be limited to the total dollar amount approved by the budget for each department and must comply with the rules governing such attendance as established by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

Alterations within a department's operating budget may be authorized by the County Executive except in cases of conventions and conferences and other changes requiring County Board approval.

4. Capital Outlay.

5.

Capital outlay, if the expenditure of funds is expected to exceed the sum of \$5000.00, shall be subject to the Statement of Policy No. 74-1 as adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on March 19, 1974. Equipment and Furnishings Outlay.

Equipment and furnishings outlay expenses to be made during the budget year are subject to the following:

- (a) The approval of this budget does not grant authority for the purchase of the requested individual items. It is only an indication of various departmental requests. Each request will be reviewed during the year.
- (b) All requests for equipment purchases shall be made to the County Executive. If purchase is approved, County Executive will determine the method of purchase and the purchaser (Purchasing Agent or Department Head).

- (c) Specifications shall be prepared and bids taken for all items in excess of \$5000.00. Informal bids shall be taken on items under \$5000.00, but more than \$500.00. This rule may be waived by the County Executive in unusual circumstances.
- (d) Alterations within the Outlay budget may be made by the County Executive.

C. EFFECTIVE DATE

This policy shall be effective January 1, 1977.

- 4. Require that the County Sanitary Inspector sign a statement certifiying that he inspected the construction of the alternate system and further require that he mail this statement to the Division within ten (10) days after his final inspection of the system.
- 5. Supply sufficient funding to permit the County Sanitary Inspector to monitor each alternate system installed in the County for a period of one year after the system is put into use and to require him to so monitor the systems and to send a report stating the operating status of each system to the Division at the end of the one year period.
- Not to permit the installation or construction of any alternate system unless the division has approved the construction of that system and the County Planning Office has properly reviewed and recommended approval of the system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Forty-five Dollars (\$45.00) is hereby established as the permit fee for the alternate septic system hereinbefore provided effective January 1, 1977.

STATEMENT OF POLICY

76-2 Number: Dated:

11/9/76

Re:

Administration of County Budget

A. PURPOSE

To establish an orderly procedure whereby the budget adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors is to be administered.

B. PROCEDURE

General

The Winnebago County budget shall include details on each item relating to a department's operation with a separate listing, where applicable, under the following four broad categories:

- Salaries Benefits
- Operating Expenses
- Capital Outlay
- Equipment and Furnishings Outlay

Only the totals of the several "line" items in each department's individual budget are to be adopted. The complete listing of each recommended item in the last two columns of the budget shall be considered as substantiating detail used to arrive at a total. No transfers may be made between the four above named categories except in accordance with rules established by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. In the absence of such rules, no transfer may be made without County Board approval.

2 Salaries and Benefits

Salaries listed in the budget shall be those salaries as are in effect on July 1 of the year in which the budget is being considered. If salaries have been determined. for example, by a negotiated labor agreement, then the salaries for the budget year shall be included in the proposed budget. Other salaries are subject to revision during succeeding periods of time. The cost of salary adjustments for the Highway Department, Unified Board,

Winnebago Mental Health Clinic, Social Services Board, and Manpower Planning, shall be included in their budgets. Funds necessary to cover adjustments in salaries for all other budgets shall be included in the General Salary Fund budget.

General Salary Fund monies may be used for all costs pertaining to the employment of personnel where such costs exceed the amount authorized in each department's budget. These costs cover expenditures such as salary increases, new personnel, fringe benefit cost increases, professional services, including salary studies, advertising related to personnel recruitment, and moving expenses, where necessary.

New positions shall be filled in the following manner:

- (a) Submit requests to Committee of Jurisdiction for consideration.
- (b) Committee of Jurisdiction will make its recommendation known to the Personnel and Finance Committee.
- (c) Personnel and Finance Committee will review request and recommendations.
- (d) Request, if approved, will be submitted to the County Board by the Personnel and Finance Committee. If the request is denied by the Personnel and Finance Committee, the Committee of Jurisdiction, at its discretion, may submit the request to the County Board.
- (e) County Board makes decision.
- (f) County Executive makes decision.

Vacant positions in the Table of Organization must have the approval of the County Executive prior to being filled.

Fringe benefits are a separate item in the budget. This item reflects the monetary outlay for various fringe benefits applicable to employees in each department. The actual figures and the estimated figures for the budget year shall be included in this item.

3. Operating Expenses.

Operating expenses consist of various items in the budget required to operate each of the departments in Winnebago County government.

Convention and conference attendance, which is budgeted under 'Operating Expenses', must be limited to the total dollar amount approved by the budget for each department and must comply with the rules governing such attendance as established by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

Alterations within a department's operating budget may be authorized by the County Executive except in cases of conventions and conferences and other changes requiring County Board approval.

4. Capital Outlay.

Capital outlay, if the expenditure of funds is expected to exceed the sum of \$5000.00, shall be subject to the Statement of Policy No. 74-1 as adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on March 19, 1974. Equipment and Furnishings Outlay.

5. Equipment and Furnishings Outlay.

Equipment and furnishings outlay expenses to be

made during the budget year are subject to the following:

(a) The approval of this budget does not grant authority for the purchase of the requested individual items. It is only an indication of various departmental requests.

(b) All requests for equipment purchases shall be made to the County Executive. If purchase is approved, County Executive will determine the method of purchase and the purchaser (Pur-

chasing Agent or Department Head).

(c) Specifications shall be prepared and bids taken for all items in excess of \$5000.00. Informal bids shall be taken on items under \$5000.00, but more than \$500.00. This rule may be waived by the County Executive in unusual circumstances.

(d) Alterations within the Outlay budget may be made by the County Executive.

C. EFFECTIVE DATE

This policy shall be effective January 1, 1977.

(b) Submit to final offer (either/or) arbitration by an arbitrator to be selected by alternate striking initiated by the Association from a list of five from the WERC, the following issue: "Shall matron rates in the 1977 agreement and effective January 1, 1977 be equal to jailer or shall they be 6.35 percent over the matrons 1976 pay levels?"

5. Layoff

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO ISSUANCE OF CITATIONS FOR VIOLATIONS OF ORDINANCES AND PROVIDING A SCHEDULE OF CASH DEPOSITS

The following Ordinance was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION L STATUTORY AUTHORITY

Pursuant to Section 66.119, Wis. Stats., the County of Winnebago hereby elects to use the citation method of enforcement of ordinances other than those for which a statutory counterpart exists.

SECTION IL. THE CITATION

The citation shall contain the following:

- A. The name and address of the alleged violator.
- Factual allegations describing the alleged violation.
- C. The time and place of the offense.
- D. The section of the ordinance violated.
- E. A designation of the offense in such manner as can readily be understood by a person making a reasonable effort to do so.
- F. The time at which the alleged violator may appear in court.
- G. A statement which in essence informs the alleged violator:
 - That a cash deposit based on the schedule established by this ordinance may be made which shall be delivered or mailed to the Clerk of County Court Branch III prior to the time of the scheduled court appearance.
 - That if a deposit is made, no appearance in court is necessary unless he is subsequently summoned.
 - 3. That if a cash deposit is made and the alleged violator does not appear in court, he will be deemed to have entered a plea of no contest, or, if the court does not accept the plea of no contest, a summons will be issued commanding him to appear in court to answer the complaint.

4.	That if no cash deposit is made and the al-
•	leged violator does not appear in court at
	the time specified, an action may be com-
	menced to collect the forfeiture.

H. A direction that if the alleged violator elects to make a cash deposit, the statement which accompanies the citation shall be signed to indicate that the statement required under "G" above has been read. Such statement shall be sent or brought with the cash deposit.

I. Such other information as the County deems

necessary.

The form of the citation to be used by the County is attached hereto and is made a part of this ordinance by reference.

Adoption of this ordinance does not preclude the County Board from adopting any other ordinance or providing for the enforcement of any other law or ordinance relating to the same or other matter.

B. Other Remedies.

The issuance of a citation hereunder shall not preclude the County or any authorized officer from proceeding under any other ordinance or law or by any other enforcement method to enforce any ordinance, regulation or order.

SECTION VIL SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this ordinance is invalid or unconstitutional, or if the application of this ordinance to any person or circumstances is invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the provisions or applications of this ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or application.

SECTION VIIL EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

GOVERNING THE PARKING OF VEHICLES ON THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY COURTHOUSE PARKING LOT

The following Ordinance was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.07(lm), Wis. Stats., (1975).

1.2 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances
All prior Winnebago County Ordinances, or parts
thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this
Ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded effective the effective date of this Ordinance.

1.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof, to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance.

1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law and the placement of sufficient signs in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2.0 DEFINITIONS

Terms used in this Ordinance have the following meanings:

2.1 Vehicle: every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported or

drawn upon a highway.

2.2 Area "A" — 1 Hour Visitor Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by persons other than employees of Winnebago County having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of a duration not to exceed one (1) hour between the hours of 7:30 o:clock A.M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight.

2.3 Area "B" — 2 Hour Visitor Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by persons other than employees of Winnebago County having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of a duration not to exceed two (2) hours between the hours of 7:30 o'clock A.M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight.

2.4 Area "C" — General Courthouse Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used by employees and other persons having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of an unlimited duration between the hours of 7:30 o'clock A.M. and 12:00

o'clock midnight.

- 2.5 Area "D" Police Vehicle Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot which is to be used for the purpose of parking official vehicles of a police department located within or outside of Winnebago County.
- 2.6 Area "E" Loading Zone: the area at the Winne-bago County Courthouse Parking Lot reserved for the loading and unloading of materials, supplies, and the like at the Winnebago County Courthouse and shall be used only for such time as is necessary to complete the aforementioned loading or unloading.
- 2.7 Area "F" Handicapped Parking: the area of parking at the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot reserved for parking of vehicles for handicapped persons having official business in the Winnebago County Courthouse of an unlimited duration between the hours of 7:30 o'clock A.M. and 12:00 o'clock midnight.
- 2.8 No Parking Area: the area of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot where the parking of any vehicles at any time is strictly prohibited.
- 2.9 Employees: persons employed by Winnebago County in any of the departments located in the Winnebago County Courthouse or any other persons whose employment is located within any of the offices or departments in the Winnebago County Courthouse.
- 2.10 Winnebago County Courthouse: buildings known as the Winnebago County Courthouse building and the Winnebago County Social Services building.
 3.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 3.0

- 3.1 Regulation of Parking
 - (1) General:

No vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended, in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot except in accordance with the designations placed on signs in the said parking lot and then only in accordance with the regulations governing the use of said areas. Those designations shall be as follows:

- (a) Area "A" 1 Hour Visitor Parking
- (b) Area "B" 2 Hour Visitor Parking
- (c) Area "C" General Courthouse Parking
- (d) Area "D" Police Vehicle Parking
- (e) Area "E" Loading Zone
- (f) Area "F" Handicapped Parking
 - g) No Parking Area

- (2) Driveways, Ramp:
 Except as hereinafter provided, no vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended at any time on any of the driveways or Winnebago County Sheriff's Department ramps of the Courthouse Parking Lot. Police vehicles may be parked on the Sheriff's Department ramps.
- (3) Operators of motor vehicles making use of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot shall observe and comply with the regulatory and directional traffic signs for entry upon and departure from said Parking Lot.
- (4) All vehicles shall be parked, attended or unattended, within the designated lines in the Winnebago County Courthouse parking areas and in such manner so as not to cause a hazard or be an obstruction to vehicular or other traffic.
- (5) No vehicle shall be parked, attended or unattended, in the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot between the hours of 12:00 o'clock midnight and 7:30 o'clock A.M., other than employees of Winnebago County or persons engaged in official business at the Winnebago County Courthouse or the Winnebago County Social Services Department.
- 3.2 Policing and Enforcement:
 It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County
 Sheriff's Department to issue citations for parking
 violations at the Winnebago County Courthouse
 Parking Lot.
- 3.3 Authorization to Move Vehicles: Any vehicle parked in violation of this Ordinance may be moved or caused to be removed by the Winnebago County Sheriff from the present location of the vehicle to another area of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot or such other location as the Sheriff shall designate. Any vehicle so moved shall be released to the owner or operator thereof upon proper identification by that person and payment of the cost of removing said vehicle. Winnebago County shall not be liable for any damages to the removed vehicle which might result from the act of removal unless such damages can be shown to have resulted from the negligence of Winnebago County in such removal.

SECTION 4.0 PENALTIES

4.1 Stipulation for Parking Violation; Procedure:

Persons to whom a citation has been issued to appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, for violating any of the provisions of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance may, within forty-eight (48) hours after 6:00 o'clock P.M. on the day of the violation, appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's office and enter into a stipulation with Winnebago County. The violator may stipulate as follows:

(a) that the facts of the violation are true;

 that he pleads to the violation by entering a plea of guilty or nolo contendere;

(c) that the plea which he makes is reduced to writing on the stipulation.

The violator shall then sign the stipulation, print his name, post office address, his operator's license number and date of birth on the stipulation. The violator shall then and there pay to the Winnebago County Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, the sum of Two Dollars (\$2.00) and shall further stipulate that the sum paid to the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, shall be forfeited to Winnebago County upon expiration of forty-eight (48) hours after 6:00 o'clock P.M. of the date of the violation. After the expiration of such time, the forfeited money shall be remitted by the Sheriff to the Winnebago County Treasurer. Such violator need not appear in Court and no witness fees or additional costs shall be taxed.

4.2 Penalties Where No Stipulation:

Persons to whom a citation has been issued to appear at the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, for violating any of the provisions of the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance, and who do not timely ... enter into a stipulation as provided in Section 4.1 of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction of violating the Winnebago County Courthouse Parking Lot Ordinance, forfeit to Winnebago County, a sum of not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each violation as the Court, in its discretion, shall determine, together with the costs of the action to collect such forfeiture, and upon default of the payment, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail for a period not to exceed five (5) days.

WHEREAS, the Panama Canal has been built with funds provided by the American people and by treaty given control in perpetuity to America; and

WHEREAS, seventy percent of the ships using the Canal are American and, as such, the Canal is of vital importance to our national interests; and

WHEREAS, Panama is noted for frequent changes of government and is now ruled by a tin-plate dictator who illegally seized power; and

WHEREAS, it is doubtful that Panama would have the expertise to operate the Canal and would require foreign technicians to come in and, as it now appears, such technicians would be from Cuba.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that this County Board does hereby go on record as opposing any change in the operation of the Panama Canal through amendment of the treaty between Panama and the United States of America.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk send a copy of this Resolution to President Jimmy Carter and to all Wisconsin members of Congress.

The Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION VIII HIGHWAY SETBACK LINES and GRADES

SETBACK LINES ESTABLISHED:

Amend opening paragraph to read as follows:

For the purposes of this Ordinance all highways in Winnebago County outside the limits of incorporated cities and villages are divided into Class "A" Highways, Class "B" Highways, Class "C" Highways, and a separate class for County Trunk BB.

Create Paragraph 4. County Trunk BB:

All construction along that portion of County Trunk BB lying between U. S. Highway 45 and

- U. S. Highway 41 shall have the following setbacks:
- a. If such construction is served by public sewer, the minimum setback requirement from the road right-of-way shall be 50 feet.
- b. If such construction is served by an onsite septic system, the minimum sethack requirement from the road right-of-way shall be 75 feet.

This Amendatory Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.
