ORGANIZATION MEETING April 19, 1977

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The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 6:00 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin by the Vice Chairman Herman J. Brandt.

Roll call showed full board present.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Goff.

But his memories of those accomplishments have to do most of all with people working together and learning to know and

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respect one another. Although he is leaving the executive office physically, he will retain a keen interest in Winnebago County Government. Winnebago County, he said, has been good to me and I will always cherish the memories of my association with the supervisors. A standing ovation was given to Mr. King.

Supervisor Neely reported to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that Supervisor Ales has completed forty years of public service in Winnebago County.

SPECIAL ORDER OF BUSINESS ARCHITECTURAL REPORT OF THE IOINT SAFETY BUILDING

Mr. Kenton Peters and Mr. Bruce Ream, associates of Orput, Inc., appeared before the board with a report of the Joint Safety Building, which increases the cost of the building with furnishings to \$6,181,950 from the \$5,500,000.

JOINT CITY-COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING: INCREASE PROJECT EXPENDITURE LIMIT

The following Resolution No. 12 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 11, dated October 28, 1976, which was adopted by this County Board, established a total cost for the proposed Public Safety Building in an amount not to exceed \$5,500,000; and

WHEREAS, the total cost in said Resolution included land acquisition, construction, furnishings, architectural services and contingencies; and WHEREAS, the architects have completed the design phase for the project and after careful consideration of all the factors included in the estimated total cost for the building as designed by the architects, it now appears that the total cost for said project will be \$6,181,950, which sum exceeds the project expenditure limit as hereinbefore indicated; and

WHEREAS, your Committee is recommending that the project expenditure limit be increased from \$5,500,000 to \$6,181,950.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the total cost of the proposed Public Safety Building, which cost includes land acquisition, construction, furnishings, architectural services and contingencies, shall be increased from the sum of \$5,500,000 to a sum not to exceed \$6,181,950.

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKS, ACCESS SITES AND RECREATIONAL AREAS OWNED AND OPERATED BY WINNEBAGO COUNTY

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 DEFINITIONS

1.1 Park

The term "park" wherever used in this Ordinance, unless otherwise stated, shall include the grounds, buildings thereon, waters therein, of the parks, river and lake access sites and other

recreational areas which are now or may hereafter be under the control of the Winnebago County Parks and Recreation Committee.

1.2 Nature Area

The term "nature area" wherever used in this Ordinance, unless otherwese stated, shall include all tracts of Winnebago County park land specifically set aside for environmental preservation, nature study and for environmental interpretation purposes.

1.3 Snowmobile Trail

- (a) The term "snowmobile trail" as used herein shall designate any parcel of land owned or obtained by easement by Winnebago County which is used for snowmobiling purposes.
- (b) Oshkosh-Larsen Snowmobile Trail shall refer to the parcel of land formerly a railroad right-of-way approximately 9.8 miles in length commencing immediately west of the City of Oshkosh and ending in the community of Larsen.

1.4 Campground

The term "campground" as used herein shall include those tracts of Winnebago County park land specifically designated for camping purposes.

1.5 Campsite

The term "campsite" as used herein shall refer to a section of a campground which is designated for camping use by a camping unit or camping party.

1.6 Camping Unit

The term "camping unit" as used herein shall refer to any single shelter used for a camp by a camping party, excepting sleeping bags, hammocks and shelters used exclusively for dining purposes.

1.7 Picnic Area

The term "picnic area" as used herein shall referto any tract of land developed and maintained for picnicking, including adjacent playground and playfield areas, containing not less than five (5) picnic tables.

1.8 Bathing Beach

The term "bathing beach" as used herein shall refer to any water area or adjacent land area designated as a swim area by standard regulatory markers or posted notice.

1.9 Person

The term "person" as used herein shall include any individual, firm, partnership, corporation or association of persons, and the singular number shall include the plural.

1.10 Committee

The term "committee" whenever used herein shall mean the Winnebago County Parks and Recreation Committee.

1.11 Superintendent

The term "superintendent" whenever used herein shall mean the Winnebago County Parks Superintendent.

1.12 Head Guard

The term "head guard" as used herein shall mean the lifeguard, or substitute lifeguard when needed, designated by the Superintendent to be head guard and who shall have supervisory control over the balance of the beach staff.

1.13 Vehicle

The term "vehicle" wherever used in this Ordinance shall mean any device by which a person or property may be transported and which is self-propelled.

1.14 County Grounds

The term "county grounds" wherever used in this Ordinance shall refer specifically to all Winnebago County owned land surrounding Park View Health Center and the Sunny View Complex.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Superintendent

The Superintendent shall be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the County parks.

2.2 Violations

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any provision of this Ordinance.

2.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invlaid and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or eircumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby,

24 Title

The Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnebago County Parks Ordinance.

2.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect after its passage and publication.

2.6 Other Ordinances

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in addition to the provisions of the Ordinance Providing for the Regulation and Licensing of Large Assemblies of Persons in Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and, in the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Ordinance and the said Large Assemblies Ordinance, then, the provisions of the latter Ordinance shall prevail.

SECTION 3.0 PARK PROPERTY

3.1 No person in a park shall:

- (a) Willfully mark, deface, disfigure, injure, tamper with, or displace or remover any building, bridges, tables, benches, fireplaces, railings, paving or paving material, waterlines or other public utilities or parts or appurtenances thereof, signs, notices or placards, whether temporary or permanent, monuments, stakes, posts, or other boundary markers, or other structures or equipment, facilities or park property or appurtenances whatsoever, either real or personal.
- (b) Destroy, deface, remove or attempt to remove any natural growth or natural or archeological feature. The picking of edible fruits, nuts or mushrooms is permitted.
- (c) Fail to cooperate in maintaining restrooms and washrooms in a neat and sanitary condition. No person over the age of five years shall use the rest-rooms and washrooms designated for the oppositesex.

SECTION 4.0

D PROPERTY OF OTHERS

4.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to destroy, mutilate, remove, or attempt to remove, property of others.



ADJOURNED APRIL MEETING (MAY)

4.2All persons intending to use metal detectors in any park shall first obtain written permission from the Superintendent.

SECTION REFUSE 5.0 5.1

No person shall throw, discharge, or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters of any fountain, pond, lake, stream, bay or other body of water in or adjacent to any park or any tributary, stream, storm sewer, or drain flowing into such waters, any substance, matter or thing. liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of said waters.

5.2 No person shall bring in or shall dump, deposit or leave any bottles, broken glass, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, garbage or refuse, or other trash. No such refuse or trash shall be placed in any waters in or contiguous to any park or left anywhere on the grounds. All refuse and trash shall be placed in receptacles provided for such purpose. Where receptacles are not so provided, all such rubbish or waste shall be carried away from the park by the person responsible for its presence and properly disposed of elsewhere.

SECTION 6.0 **OPERATING POLICY**

(b)

6.1 **Operating Seasons**

> The following operating seasons shall apply to all Winnebago County park lands, excepting the Oshkosh-Larsen Snowmobile Trail (see Sec. 24.1 and 24.2):

> Summer Season — March 16 – Nov. 14. (a)

- (b) Winter Season -- Nov. 15 - March 15. Hours of Operation
- 6.2
 - The following hours of operation shall apply: (a)
 - Boat Landings and Public Access Points, including Boom Bay, Black Wolf, Ush-O-Nee, Eureka and Lake Poygan Boat Landings and the boat launching area at Lake Winneconne Park:

Summer Season -

4:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Winter Season -

6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.

Nature Areas, including Waukau Creek Nature Preserve, Asylum Point Park and the Oshkosh-Larsen Snowmobile Trail during the off-season (see Sec. 24.2(a)):

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Summer Season – 6:00 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Winter Season –

7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

- (c) Campgrounds: See Sec. 20.2 - 20.4
- (d) Park Areas, including Community Park, Grundman Park and the picnic-playground-

shelter areas of Lake Winneconne Park: Summer Season –

7:00 a.m. to 10:30 p.m.

Winter Season -

7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

(weekend openings to be at discretion of Park Superintendent during Winter Season)

- (e) Operating hours shall be visibly posted at all park areas.
- 6.3 Any person found in any park area, nature preserve or public access before the posted opening time or after the posted closing time shall be in violation of this Ordinance and subject to prosecution by Winnebago County.

SECTION 7.0 CLOSED AREAS

7.1 Any section of the park may be declared closed to the public by the Superintendent or Committee at any time and for any interval of time either temporarily or at regular or stated intervals.

SECTION 8.0 PICNIC AREAS

8.1 No person in a park shall:

- (a) Picnic or lunch in a place other than those designated for that purpose.
- (b) Leave a picnic area before a fire in the said picnic area is completely extinguished and before all trash, garbage and other refuse in the said picnic area is placed in the disposal receptacles provided for that purpose.

SECTION 9.0 GROUP ACTIVITY

9.1 Whenever any group, association or organization desires to use said park facilities for a particular purpose such as picnics, parties, theatrical or entertainment performances, a representative of said group, association or organization shall first submit an application to the Superintendent for a permit.

- 9.2 The Superintendent may grant the permit if it appears that the group, association or organization will not interfere with the general use of the park by individual members of the public and if the said group, association or organization meets all other conditions contained in the The application may contain a application. requirement for an indemnity bond to protect the County from any liability of any kind or character and to protect County property from damage, and shall contain such a provision if the swimming lake is to be utilized by said group.
- 9.3 If the group, association or organization is nonprofit, the prohibition against vending and peddling as provided in SECTION 12.0 of this Ordinance may be waived by the Superintendent. Such waiver may include permission to sell beer, provided such non-profit group, association or organization first obtains whatever licenses, if any, are required by the municipality in which the said park is located. Permission for vending or peddling will be limited to vending or peddling within the event or activity being conducted by the non-profit group, association or organization.

SECTION 10.0 FIRES

- 10.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to start, tend, maintain or use any fire except at designated fireplaces in any Winnebago County Park, nature preserve, or public access area.
- 10.2 It shall be unlawful for any person to leave any fire unattended, or to throw away any matches, cigarettes, cigars, or pipe ashes, or any embers, without first extinguishing them.
- 10.3 It shall be unlawful for any person to start, tend, maintain, or use any fire contrary to posted notice.

SECTION 11.0 PETS AND ANIMALS

- 11.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to bring or permit any animal in any County park at any time unless said animal is on a leash of suitable strength not more than eight (8) feet in length.
- 11.2 It shall be unlawful for any person to bring or permit any animal, whether on leash or not, to be in any building or on any designated bathing beach at any time in any Winnebago County park.

ADJOURNED APRIL MEETING (MAY)

- 11.3 Animals must be under control at all times so as not to disturb or prevent the public from enjoying the facilities provided.
- 11.4 Nothing in this section shall prohibit or restrict the use of dogs in posted dog training areas.
- SECTION 12.0 MERCHANDISING, ADVERTISING, SIGNS
 - 12.1 Except as provided in SECTION 9.0, no person is a park shall:
 - (a) Expose or offer for sale any article or thing, or shall he station or place any stand, cart, or vehicle for the transportation, sale or display of any such article or thing, excepting the regularly authorized concessionaire acting by and under the authority and regulation of the Committee.
 - (b) Announce, advertise, or call the public attention in any way to any article or service for sale or hire.
 - (c) Paste, glue, tack or otherwise post any sign, placard, advertisement, or inscription whatever, nor shall any person erect or cause to be erected any sign whatever on any public lands or highways or roads adjacent to a park.
- SECTION 13.0 VEHICULAR TRAFFIC
 - 13.1 Operations of all motor vehicles in Winnebago County parks shall be in accordance with State law.
 - 13.2 The flow of vehicular traffic operating in any Winnebago County park shall be in accordance with signs posted for that purpose.
 - 13.3 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle in any area in said park in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour, except snowmobiles which must, at all times, be operated in accordance with the requirements of the Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance.
 - 13.4 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle in any area other than designated roadways and parking areas; or, in the case of snowmobiles, on marked snowmobile trails.
 - 13.5 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile in any area other than on marked snowmobile trails.
 - 13.6 It shall be unlawful to conduct or engage in snowmobile races on any County park lands, access points or nature preserves.

SECTION 14.0 BOATS

- 14.1 No boats of any type shall be allowed on the Winnebago County Community Park swimming lake.
- 14.2 No boats with motors, except for model boats less than three (3) feet in length, shall be allowed on the lakes at the Winnebago County Community Park.
- 14.3 Canoes, row boats or sailboats may be operated on the lakes at the Winnebago County Community Park.
- 14.4 It shall be unlawful to operate a boat within a water area marked by buoys or other approved regulatory devices as a bathing beach.
- 14.5 It shall be unlawful to operate a boat in a restricted use area contrary to regulatory notice marked on buoys or other approved regulatory devices.
- 14.6 This SECTION does not apply to patrol or rescue craft required in emergency cases.

SECTION 15.0 FIREARMS, HUNTING, TRAPPING

- 15.1 Except for law enforcement personnel, no person shall carry, fire, or discharge any gun, pistol or firearm, or hunt with bow and arrow within any County grounds, park or snowmobile trail covered by this Ordinance. No person shall carry, fire, or discharge any torpedo, rocket, or other fireworks within any park or snowmobile trail covered by this Ordinance.
- 15.2 No person shall trap or snare, or cause any animal or bird to become trapped or snared, on any County park land, access point or nature preserve.
- 15.3 Nothing in this SECTION shall restrict the County, or duly authorized agents of the County, from disposing of nuisance animals in accordance with regulations established by the Department of Natural Resources.

SECTION 16.0 PARKING

- 16.1 It shall be unlawful for the operator of any vehicle:
 - (a) To park any vehicle or permit any vehicle to remain standing on any highway or roadway within the boundaries of County parks at any time other than during the hours the parks are open as indicated in SECTION 6.2(a) - 6.2(d).
 - (b) To block, obstruct or limit the use of any road.

- (c) To park outside of areas provided for such purpose when it is practical to use such areas.
- (d) To park contrary to posted notices.
- SECTION 17.0 ABANDONED VEHICLES, BOATS
 - 17.1 It shall be unlawful to leave any vehicle unattended for more than forty-eight (48) hours under such circunstances as to cause the vehicle to reasonably appear to have been abandoned without prior permission from the Superintendent. An abandoned vehicle shall constitute a public nuisance.
 - 17.2 It shall be unlawful to leave any boat unattended for more than forty-eight (48) hours at any dock, pier or morring area under such circumstances as to cause the boat to reasonably appear to have been abandoned without prior permission from the Superintendent. An abandoned boat shall constitute a public nuisance.
- SECTION 18.0 UNNECESSARY NOISES
 - 18.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate any sound truck, loudspeaker, generator, or any other device that produces excessive or unusual noises without first obtaining a written permit from the Superintendent.
- SECTION 19.0 PERSONAL CONDUCT
 - 19.1 No person shall, in a public place, engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which such conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance.

SECTION 20.0 CAMPING, OVERNIGHT MOORING

- 20.1 No camping or overnight parking will be permitted in any park except at the Lake Poygan Campground and then only within a duly obtained campsite therein.
- 20.2 The Lake Poygan Campground shall be open for public use from April 15 through October 15.
- 20.3 The Lake Poygan Campground shall be closed to all camping from October 16 through April 14.
- 20.4 No camping units shall be crected between the hours of 10:30 p.m. and 6:30 a.m. from April 15 through October 15.
- 20.5 No person or persons shall remain at the Lake Poygan Campground for more than fourteen (14) days. After fourteen (14) days, the camping unit must be removed from the campground for seven (7) days before being eligible to return.

- 20.6 Overnight morring shall be allowed at the Lake Winneconne Park on the steel and wooden shorewall. No boat shall remain moored longer than forty-eight (48) hours.
- SECTION 21.0 FEES AND CHARGES
 - 21.1 It shall be unlawful for any person to use any facility, land or area for which a fee has been established by the Committee without payment of such fee.
 - 21.2 The following fees shall apply for the reserved use of picnic shelter buildings:
 - (a) Winnebago County Community Park:
 - \$ 7.50 for groups whose expected attendance will be 500 people or less.
 - \$12.50 for groups whose expected attendance will be more than 500 people.
 - (b) Lake Winneconne Park:
 - \$ 7.50 for groups whose expected attendance will be 500 people or less (Shelters No. 1, 2 and 3)
 - \$12.50 for groups whose expected attendance will be more than 500 people.

Hall and Refreshment Hut:

- \$15.00 for groups whose expected attendance will be 500 people or less.
- \$25.00 for groups whose expected attendance will be more than 500 people.
- 21.3 The following fees shall apply for the use of the permitted swimming facilities at the Winnebago County Community Park:

- 21.4 Wisconsin Sales Tax shall be added to all the foregoing fees except those fees in SECTION 21.3(a)-General Admission, which shall include sales tax.
- SECTION 22.0 BEACHES

22.1 No person in a park shall:

- (a) Swim, bathe, or wade in any waters or waterways in or adjacent to any park, except in such waters and at such places as are provided therefor, and in compliance with such regulations as are herein set forth or may be hereafter adopted.
- (b) Dress, or undress, on any beach, toilet or other place, except in such bathing houses or structures as may be provided for that purpose.
- 22.2 Swimming at all park areas shall be strictly at the person's own risk.
- 22.3 Swimming at the Lake Winneconne Park shall be allowed only in the area designated by buoys.
- 22.4 The Head Guard, Superintendent or Committee may close the swimming facilities, or any area within the swimming facilities, in any park during inclement weather, the existence of unsanitary conditions, attendance levels, or any other good cause.
- 22.5 It shall be unlawful for any person to possess or consume any food or beverage, to smoke, use any soap, detergent or shampoo, on any bathing beach or in the water adjacent to any bathing beach on any County park property.
- 22.6 Swimming Winnebago County Community Park Lake

The following regulations shall apply at the Winnebago County Community Park Swimming Lake:

- (a) Persons shall be allowed to swim or wade only in designated lake areas and only when authorized lifeguards are present.
- (b) Lifeguards shall have full authority to enforce any and all beach regulations and parkland regulations where applicable.
- (c) No floating device, inflatable toys, rafts, balls or snorkels are permitted in or upon the water at the Community Park Lake swimming area.

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- (d) The playing of baseball, football, volleyball or the throwing of footballs, airborne discs or any other hard device used in playing catch or any other game is strictly prohibited on the beach or in the water adjoining the beach.
- (e) The beach shall be open for operation to the general public from 11:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. daily except as designated in SECTIONS 7.1, 22.4 and 22.6(f).
- (f) The attendance at any one time on the beach and in the water shall not exceed 900 persons. The Community Park Lake staff shall have the right to refuse entry to persons when the attendance has reached this level. People may be allowed into the Lake when the turnover rate has allowed attendance to reach a safe level.
 (g) Failure to comply with any beach regulation shall result in revocation of daily lake use privilege and possible revocation of season pass privileges.
- (h) No swimming shall be allowed during the rest break from 2:45 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- (i) No roughhousing, pushing, shoving, or other violent games or activities shall be allowed within the lake boundaries.

SECTION 23.0 PRAIRIE PRESERVES

- 23.1 The following regulations shall apply to the Native Tallgrass Prairie Preserves which were set aside as such by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on September 28, 1976.
 - (a) No person shall uproot, gather, collect, prune or modify any prairie vegetation or the seeds of such vegetation in the prairie preserve unless written permission has been obtained from the Parks Superintendent.
 (b) No adjoining landowners shall allow their cattle or other livestock to graze on the
 - prairie preserve.
 (c) Vehicular traffic of any sort, except for emergency, maintenance and rescue vehicles owned by the County or Townships shall not be allowed on the prairie preserve.
 - (d) No tree or shrub planting shall be allowed on the prairie preserve.

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ADJOURNED APRIL MEETING (MAY)

(e) Organized groups may utilize the prairie preserve for educational purposes providing permission has first been obtained from the Superintendent.

SECTION 24.0 SNOWMOBILE TRAIL REGULATIONS

24.1 The snowmobile trail regulations hereinafter provided are in addition to those regulations contained in the Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance:

(a) Snowmobile Trail Season:

The snowmobile trail season which indicates the times of the calendar year during which the snowmobile trail may be used by snowmobiles shall be from December 1st through March 31st. No snowmobiles shall be operated on the snowmobile trail other than during the snowmobile season hereinbefore provided. No other vehicles may be operated on the snowmobile trail during the snowmobile trail season except police vehicles, emergency and rescue vehicles or County maintenance vehicles.

(b) Off-Season Regulations:

- Oshkosh-Larsen Snowmobile Trail:
- During the period April 1st through November 30th the snowmobile trail may be used for hiking, bicycling or horseback riding.
- (2) No vehicles of any kind shall be operated on the snowmobile trail except police vehicles, emergency and rescue vehicles or County maintenance vehicles. During the offseason, the use of the snowmobile trail shall conform with the rules and regulations relating to Winnebago County Parks.
- (c) Signs:

Signs for use on the snowmobile trail to regulate snowmobile traffic, warn snowmobile drivers or assist the snowmobile driver to reach his destination, in accordance with recommendations established by the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, shall be placed at appropriate locations along the said trail. No person shall operate a snowmobile other than in accordance with such signs.

SECTION 25.0 AREAS OPEN TO SNOWMOBILING

25.1 The following areas are open to snowmobiling: All County owned public access points.

- (a) (b) The Oshkosh-Larsen Snowmobile Trail and all future designated County snowmobile
- trails. 25.2 Snowmobiling is not allowed on any other County owned parkland unless prior permission has been obtained from the Superintendent.

SECTION 26.0 ENFORCEMENT

26.1 Superintendent; Corporation Counsel:

The Superintendent, or duly authorized agents, shall, with the assistance of the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department, enforce the pro-The Corporation visions of this Ordinance. Counsel, upon complaint from the Superintendent or the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department is authorized to institute whatever legal proceedings he may deem necessary to effect compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

26.2 Penalty:

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00), nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not more than thirty (30) days.

SECTION 27.0 EXCEPTIONS

27.1 Nothing in this Ordinance shall hinder or prohibit Winnebago County, its law enforcement personnel, the Parks Superintendent, Corporation Counsel, or other duly authorized agents, from performing their official duties.

SECTION 28.0 REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCE

28.1 The Winnebago County Parks Ordinance regulating parks, access sites, and recreational areas owned and operated by Winnebago County which was adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on October 31, 1974, and all amendments thereto, are hereby repealed and rescinded as of the effective date of this Ordinance.

AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE **1977 PARK VIEW REHABILITATION PAVILION** AND PLEASANT ACRES EMPLOYEES LABOR AGREEMENT

The following Resolution No. 16 was presented:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the County Executive and the County Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute a one year labor agreement on behalf of Winnebago County with the Park View Rehabilitation Pavilion and Pleasant Acres Employees for the year 1977, effective January 1, 1977, which agreement shall provide the following major changes from the 1976 labor agreement: 1.

Conduct of Union Business

The Employer agrees to allow up to four (4) employees designated by the Union to take time off, without pay, not to exceed a total of two (2) working days per employee, per calendar year for attending the annual AFSCME Legislative Conference educational course related to Union functions and AFSCME Council 40 Institutional Conferences, contingent upon staffing needs. The Employer shall notify employees a minimum of seven (7) calendar days before the event, of the approval or disapproval of the requests.

2. **Disciplinary Procedures**

Add to the disciplinary procedure that the Employer shall provide for Union representation from among the representatives on a list provided by the Union. The employee involved and the Union representative present shall be permitted to confer privately for a reasonable period of time before the recorded disciplinary action is taken.

3. Grievance Procedure

> Add to the grievance procedure that, in Nursing Service, grievances will be turned in to the office of the Director of Nursing Service for processing.

> Also add that the Employer shall, if possible, schedule such conference at a time when the Union representative of the grievant's choice (as designated on the grievance form) is available to be present, failing that, the Administrator may summon to the conference, the Chief Steward, or any of the four (4) Union officers as identified on a list supplied by the Union. The Union representative and the aggrieved employce shall be permitted to confer privately for a reasonable period of time, immediately before the conference.

4. Authorized 'Absence

Provide that holidays worked by part-time employees shall be compensated the normal rate of pay for hours worked

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plus an equivalent amount of pay for holiday pay.

Also, clarify that the employee shall be eligible for the birthday holiday benefit when on active pay status on birthday in question.

Also, provide that if an employee in the bargaining unit on a regular scheduled work day is a pallbearer at the funeral of a former Winnebago County Park View Rehabilitation Pavilion and Pleasant Acres employee then, in that event, one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) day funeral leave with pay shall be granted for such purpose.

5. Check-Off of Union Dues

Eliminate article. Article XXVI, Fair Share Agreement, has been in effect for a number of years and makes the checkoff of Union dues unnecessary.

6. Shift and Work Week

Change the article that notice to the Union of any change by the Employer in hours of work or days of work shall be preceded by a fifteen (15) day notice. (Formerly a thirty (30) day notice)

7. Maintenance of Benefits

Eliminate: launder and press three (3) uniforms a week.

8. Fair Share Agreement

Add that should this article be declared invalid for any reason, dues deductions shall be continued by Employer upon request of signed authorization cards from employees and shall be initiated following completion of probationary period.

9. Workmens' Compensation

Change to "Workers' Compensation" and change the waiting period from 11 to 7 days to conform to present state law.

10. Health Insurance

Change the carrier from Wisconsin Physician's Service hospitalization and medical benefit plan to Blue Cross of Wisconsin Surgical Care Blue Shield.

Also, provide that the County will pay the total premium cost of the single plan (\$5.46 per month increase) and a sum equal to the cost of the single plan plus \$25.00 toward the family plan (\$5.00 per month increase).

11. Classification and Compensation Plan

Increase all steps in the compensation plan 21¢ per hour.

Estimated cost of this one-year agreement is \$158,158 which is 6% of the estimated 1976 payroll.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the necessary funds to cover the cost resulting from the adoption of this resolution shall be made available from funds budgeted for this purpose.

WHEREAS, your Personnel and Finance Committee has reviewed Winnebago County's insurance program covering its employees at Park View Health Center; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County, pursuant to Resolution # 8 dated January 20, 1976, is self insured for professional liability in the County Nurses' Department, Mental Health Clinic, Rehabilitation Pavilion and Pleasant Acres Home; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County has purchased general liability insurance for its employees in the aforementioned departments from Employers Insurance Company; and

WHEREAS, the annual cost for the general liability insurance is \$11,828.00 and the balance in the self insured professional liability fund as of January 1, 1977, was in the amount of \$177,419.00; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County may obtain general liability and professional liability insurance coverage through the State of Wisconsin's Health Care Liability Insurance Program at a substantial savings in annual premium cost; and

WHEREAS, your Committee has studied the four basic coverages available through the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Program and recommends that coverage #4 with the following limits of liability be obtained for the Park View Health Center, to-wit:

General Liability	-	\$500,000/\$500,000
Professional Liability		\$200,000/\$600,000

and

WHEREAS, the annual premium for the said insurance coverages will be as follows:

County Nurses	\$ 850.00
Mental Health Clinic	1,745.00
Rehabilitation Pavilion	16,316.00
Pleasant Acres Home	14,686.00

Total \$33,597.00

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that appropriate County officials take the necessary steps to apply for general liability insurance coverage in the amounts of \$500,000/\$500,000 through the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Insurance Program covering the following employees:

> All employees, students and volunteers in the Winnebago County Nurses' Department, Mental Heatlh Clinic, Rehabilitation Pavilion and Pleasant Acres Home while acting within the scope of their duties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that appropriate County officials take the necessary steps to apply for professional liability insurance coverage in the amounts of \$200,000/\$600,000 through the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Insurance Program covering the following employees:

All professional employees, all professional students and all professional volunteers in the Winnebago County Nurses' Department, Mental Health Clinic, Rehabilitation Pavilion and Pleasant Acres Home while acting within the scope of their duties excepting from said coverage all licensed physicians and licensed nurse anesthetists. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$33,597.00 which represents the annual premium for the insurance to be provided by the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Insurance Program be and the same is hereby made available from funds budgeted for Winnebago County's insurance program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution #8 dated January 20, 1976, establishing the self insured insurance program for professional liability be and the same is hereby rescinded as of the effective date of coverage under the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Insurance Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the general liability insurance coverage obtained from Employers Insurance Company be and the same is to be cancelled as of the effective date of coverage under the Wisconsin Health Care Liability Insurance Program.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING

THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.2

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 49.50(5) and 59.07(20), Stats. Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.3 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnebago County Civil Service Commission Ordinance.

1.4 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect October 1, 1977.

2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Membership

- (a) The Civil Service Commission shall be composed of five (5) members, all of whom shall be legal residents of Winnebago County with an appreciation for and knowledge of personnel management and dedication to the concept of equal employment opportunity.
- (b)No person holding any elective or appointed public position or office in Winnebago County government shall be appointed to the Civil Service Commission.
- (c) The Civil Service Commission members shall be appointed by the County Executive, subject to confirmation by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.
- (d)Members of the Civil Service Commission shall not be employed in any capacity by Winnebago County.
- (e) Except as hereinafter provided, the term of office of each member of the Civil Service Commission shall be five (5) years. The terms of office initially appointed shall be as follows:

SECTION 2.0

- One member shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending December 31, 1978.
- One member shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending December 31, 1979.
- One member shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending December 31, 1980.
- One member shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending December 31, 1981.
- One member shall be appointed for a term commencing with the date of appointment and ending December 31, 1982.
- Each member shall hold office until a successor is appointed and confirmed pursuant to this section.

2.2 Jurisdiction

Except as hereinafter provided, the jurisdiction of the Civil Service Commission shall be limited to appeals from Winnebago County employees alleging discrimination or improper separation from County employment. Determinations by the Commission shall be binding upon all parties.

Nothing herein shall limit Winnebago County employees' rights under Sec. 111.70, Stats. If a Winnebago County employee or duly authorized representative pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement elects to appeal a decision alleging discrimination or improper separation from County employment through a grievance procedure contained in said collective bargaining agreement, the Commission shall have no jurisdiction to review that same decision.

2.3 Procedures

The Civil Service Commission shall establish the procedures for filing appeals, hearings and other matters relating to its operation. Copies of the procedures established by the Commission shall be available in the office of the Winnebago County Director of Personnel, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin, 54901.

SECTION VIII

HIGHWAY SETBACK LINES AND GRADES SETBACK LINES ESTABLISHED:

Amend opening paragraph to read as follows: For the purposes of this Ordinance all highways in Winnebago County outside the limits of incorporated cities and villages are divided into Class "A" Highways, Class "B" Highways, Class "C" Highways, and a separate class for County Trunk BB.

Create Paragraph 4. County Trunk BB:

All construction along that portion of County Trunk BB lying West of U. S. 41 along the North County line shall have the following setbacks:

- a. If such construction is served by public sewer, the minimum setback requirement from the road right-of-way shall be 50 feet.
- b. If such construction is served by an onsite septic system, the minimum setback requirement from the road right-of-way shall be 75 feet.

This Amendatory Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

A communication from the Common Council of the City of Menasha to complete necessary environmental impact study for the Tri-County Expressway was read. Placed on file.

A communication from the Town Board of the Town of Clayton as opposing the Tri-County Expressway was read. Placed on file.



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A communication from the Town Board of the Town of Menasha approving a resolution to dissolve the Tri-County Expressway was read. Placed on file.

A petition signed by one hundred interested citizens approving the support of Winnebago County for a financial committment for the acquisition of the Tri-County Recreation Association was read. Placed on file.

PUBLIC HEARING

The following Substitute Resolution No. 1 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Winnebago County is presently funding portions of a study concerning the proposed Tri-County Expressway Freeway; and WHEREAS, the proposed Tri-County Expressway

WHEREAS, the proposed Tri-County Expressway <u>Freeway</u> will consume large amounts of land and money if constructed; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Tri-County Expressway-Freeway will be a traffic artery providing east-west travel and the majority of the present and future traffic travel is north-south; and

WHEREAS, the planned benefits to Winnebago County compared to the cost to Winnebago County are extremely minor; and

WHEREAS, very little definite need for the Expressway Freeway has been shown; and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, by passage of this Resolution, is of the collective opinion that the proposed Tri-County Expressway Freeway should not be constructed, and an alternative should be developed. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the

- 1. All financial involvement by Winnebago County in the present engineering study of the proposed Tri-County <u>Expressway Freeway</u> is to be terminated no later than November 30, 1977.
- 2. The Winnebago County Executive, the Winnebago County Corporation Counsel and the Winnebago County Clerk are hereby instructed to take the appropriate actions to terminate the financial involvement of Winnebago County in the engineering study for the proposed Expressway Freeway.
- 3. All funds budgeted for this study not obligated by November 30, 1977, are hereby returned to the Winnebago County <u>Ceneral appropriate</u> fund.
- 4. The remainder of the monies raised through the Bond Issue of June 23, 1970, for purchasing land for the proposed Tri-County Expressway is to be invested in an interest bearing account. The interest carned on this account plus the principal amount are to be used only for retirement of the bond issue. (This may be changed by a majority vote of the Winnebage County Board.) Freeway shall not be expended until the receipt of the report as provided in paragraph 6 of this Resolution.
- 5. The Winnebago County Highway Department and Committee are hereby instructed to make a survey and a study of the land purchased to this date by the County for expressway freeway purposes and report back to the County Boardnolater than the Feb. 1978 meeting of the County Board This report will indicate which parcels of land may be disposed of by the County and which parcels of land should be retained for future highway improvements by the County <u>and shall</u> be submitted in conjunction with the report as provided in paragraph 6 of this Resolution.
- 6. The Winnebago County Highway Department Highway Committee, making use of the expertise of East Central Regional Planning Commission, are hereby instructed to start planning the upgrading of existing streets and highways in the area affected by the proposed Tri-County Expressway Freeway, and other alternates to the proposed Freeway, with a report to be made to this County Board no less than annually later than June 1, 1978.
- 7. The Chairman of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors is hereby instructed to appoint an Advisory Committee to work with the Winnebago County Highway Department and Highway Committee and East Central Regional Planning Commission in the preparation of the report as provided in paragraph 6 of

this Resolution. The Advisory Committee shall consist of eight (8) members as follows: the Mayor of Neenah, the Mayor of Menasha, the Chairman of the Town of Menasha and five (5) citizen members.

PROVIDE \$75,000 FOR ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES: FOX VALLEY CENTER

The following Resolution No. 5 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, in a contract with Outagamie and Winnebago Counties, the University of Wisconsin System

has agreed to provide a freshman-sophomore university educational program for the citizens of the Fox Cities area; and

WHEREAS, by the same contract, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties have agreed to provide the facilities to accommodate such a program; and

WHEREAS, those facilities, constructed 17 years ago, no longer adequately house either the number of students enrolled or the types of programs sought; and

WHEREAS, alternate sites for housing parts of the programs, such as the Menasha Public Schools and the Appleton YMCA, will shortly no longer be available for University use; and

WHEREAS, the University of Wisconsin Center-Fox Valley provides access to higher education to over 1,000 students, many of whom would be unable to matriculate elsewhere because of economic limitations, family responsibilities and employment schedules; and

WHEREAS, between 15,000 and 20,000 citizens make use of the campus each year to attend short courses, cultural events and various other educational programs; and

WHEREAS, the presence of the University of Wisconsin Center - Fox Valley constitutes a significant economic benefit to the Fox Cities; and

WHEREAS, by legislation, the educational mission of the University of Wisconsin Center - Fox Valley is different and distinct from that offered by the local district of the State's Vocational, Technical and Adult Education System; and

WHEREAS, projections indicate that the population of the Fox Cities will continue to increase throughout the remainder of this century; and

WHEREAS, the University of Wisconsin Center Fox Valley has fewer square feet of facility per student than any other campus in the University of Wisconsin System; and

WHEREAS, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties together have resources greater than those of any other, save one, of the thirteen counties providing facilities for two year campuses; and

WHEREAS, Outagamie and Winnebago Counties have purchased 13.87 acres of additional land which provides adequate space for new construction; and

WHEREAS, a Facilities Planning Committee, appointed by the Trustees of the Campus and representing the communities, student body and faculty, have recommended a comprehensive building and remodeling program to complete the Campus.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the sum of \$75,000.00 be placed in the 1978 Budget to match a similar amount to be contributed by Outagamie County to cover the cost of architectural services to design and plan the construction and remodeling to complete the Campus at the University of Wisconsin Center - Fox Valley.

WHEREAS, it was contemplated that the development described in the subject Grant Agreement

would not be completed during Fiscal Year 1977 and accordingly, multi-year funding of the United States'share of allowable project costs was anticipated, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined necessary to adjust project funding by increasing the maximum obligation of the United States under the Airport Development Aid Program from \$310,851.00 to \$631,851.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH, that in consideration of the benefits to accrue to the parties hereto, the FAA, on the one part, and the Sponsor, on the other part, do hereby mutually agree that the said Grant Agreement be and hereby is amended as follows:

REPORT OF THE AGRICULTURAL, EXTENSION AND EDUCATION COMMITTEE ON THE RELOCATION OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

Based upon study by this Committee over the past 10 months, the attached resolution recommending the relocation of the County Fairgrounds is being submitted to your Board for Action. While the Committee has discussed the potential of various county properties as sites for a relocated fair and likely administrative structures for them, these more specific details must logically follow a decision by you on whether or not to relocate the fair. Consequently, approval of this resolution would mean that an orderly process of selecting a new site and establishing an administrative structure for it must be initiated.

To this end, we have some recommendations which came from our work. It has been our conclusion that both the selection of a site and administrative system must be structured within the framework of developing the new fairgrounds as a "multipurpose" facility. To successfully achieve the goals of a true multipurpose fairgrounds, its location and operation must evolve from integrating the needs of the new County Fair's programs and facilities with those other programs, facilities, activities and functions which will share the site.

Because the scope of decisions is wide and details for facilities construction are many, it is anticipated that a minimum of three (3) years must be allowed to complete the fairgrounds' relocation. For efficient and effective use of these three years, two actions must be taken early in 1978. These are:

- 1. An additional one year lease agreement must be negotiated between the Fair Association and the county (by this Committee) to assure continuity of the fair's operation at the present site through the 1979 fair. The renegotiated lease should then be suited to a yearly renewal as required to facilitate a well planned relocation.
- A special committee must be established to be 2. responsible for the selection of: a site; programs; design; and administrative structure for the new fair operations. This special committee would be comprised of the following members: 3 members of the Agricultural, Extension and Education Committee; 2 members of the Building and Grounds Committee; and 2 members of the Parks and **Recreation Committee. Members on this committee** should be appointed by their respective chairmen to serve as a full committee during this move.

Should your County Board reject our recommendation to relocate the fairgrounds, the length of the new lease and the purpose of the special committee would be somewhat altered.

- 1. The lease should then be renegotiated for a five year
- period. The special committee would replace its responsi-2. bility for site selection with that of establishing a renovation program at the present fairgrounds.

AUTHORIZE EXEUCTION OF AGREEMENT WITH CHICAGO AND NORTHWESTERN RAILROAD COMPANY TO PURCHASE LAND, ETC., FOR RECREATIONAL TRAIL (LARSEN TO HORTONVILLE)

The following Resolution No. 8 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, your Parks and Recreation Committee has negotiated with the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Company for the purchase of certain abandoned railroad right-of-way located between Larsen (in Winnebago County) and Hortonville (in Outagamie County) for use as a Recreational Trail; and 202 Adjourned Board Meeting (Tuesday: February 21, 1978)

WHEREAS, said Recreational Trail will provide an approximate ten mile extension to the present Recreational Trail located between Oshkosh and Larsen; and

WHEREAS, the total acreage involved is 133.12 acres, of which 49.86 acres is located in Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, an appraisal of the portion located in Winnebago County indicated a fair market value of \$44,000.00, which appraisal has been accepted by the State Department of Natural Resources; and

WHEREAS, your Committee has made application for state and federal funding on this project and has received initial approval for 50% funding and a further indication that the trail may be eligible for 90% state and federal funding; and

WHEREAS, a final decision concerning the funding has not been made by the State Department of Natural Resources as of this date; and

WHEREAS, your Committee and the Railroad Company have reached a tentative agreement for the purchase of the portion of the right-of-way located in Winnebago County at a purchase price of \$44,000.00 which is the appraised value of the property; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County's budget for 1977, at Page 71(A), indicates the sum of \$20,000.00 was placed in the budget for acquisition of this trail with anticipated state aids in the amount of \$10,000.00, which funding has been carried forward to 1978; and

WHEREAS, some provision should be made at this time for the funds necessary to acquire Winnebago County's portion of the trail with the understanding that all acquisition funds received on this project from state and federal sources would be returned to the General Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the County Executive and the County Clerk be and they hereby are authorized to execute the offer to purchase the approximate 49.86 acre portion of abandoned right-of-way from the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad Company between Larsen and Hortonville and which lies wholly within Winnebago County for the sum of \$44,000.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that funds sufficient to cover the cost of the purchase of this right-of-way be made available as follows: \$20,000.00—from funds previously budgeted in 1977 \$24,000.00—from General Fund

WHEREAS, Chapter 29, Laws of 1977, provides for total decentralization of Central State Hospital patients to Winnebago Mental Health Institute and to Mendota; and

WHEREAS, no corresponding monies are allocated in the State budget to cover the cost of *transferring* patients from Central State Hospital to Winnebago Mental Health Institute; and

WHEREAS, there is reason to believe that Winnebago Mental Health Institute does not have sufficient funds to *remodel* its physical plant to provide a maximum care facility comparable to that in existence at Central State Hospital; and

WHEREAS, there is no assurance that adequate funding is forthcoming for sufficient *staffing* to safely carry out maximum security functions; and

WHEREAS, the accommodation of maximum security care patients at Winnebago Mental Health Institute could *pose a hazard* to surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, there could be a considerable savings in tax dollars by continuing care for maximum security patients at Central State Hospital and transferring only the



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minimum and moderate security care patients to Winnebago Mental Health Institute.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Winnebago County go on record as being opposed to total decentralization at Central State Hospital, a facility specifically built and staffed for that purpose.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk send copies of this Resolution to all Wisconsin Legislative members elected by the citizens of Winnebago County and to the State Department of Health and Social Services.

1. Grievance Procedure

Step 4 of the grievance procedure is changed to provide that the grievance will be heard by an arbitrator selected from a list of seven professional arbitrators provided by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission. (Previously the grievance was heard by an arbitration board composed of an employer member, a union member, and an arbitrator selected from a list of five professional arbitrators provided by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission.)

2. Authorized Absence

Separated Article XI, Authorized Absence, into seven articles: Holidays, Sick Leave, Vacation, Military Leave, Pregnancy Leave, Funeral Leave, and Leave of Absence Without Pay.

3. Vacation

(a) Provide two weeks of vacation with pay after two years of service (formerly two weeks after three years).

(b) Provide that part-time employees who have worked 1040 hours or more during the earning year will be given credit for vacation, prorated on amount of hours worked (formerly prorating was based on one full week per year for full-time employment and there was no qualifying hours worked limit on part-time employees.)

4. Health Insurance

Provide that the County will pay the total premium cost of the single plan and a sum equal to the cost of the single plan plus \$27.00 toward the family plan effective January 1, 1978 (\$2.00 per month increase), and \$32.00 toward the family plan effective January 1, 1979 (\$5.00 per month increase).

5. Shifts and Work Week

Provide an employee a meal or food from the vending machine through the employee's supervisor if the employee is not scheduled for overtime before the start of the employee's work shift but employee works twelve or more consecutive hours.

6. Classification and Compensation Plan

Existing classifications were studied by management and classifications and ranking were changed where necessary to provide fairness and equity in pay within the County and to provide competitive pay within the job market area. The compensation plan also was adjusted to provide proper pay for work performed.

Effective January 1, 1978, employee classifications and compensation will be changed to the new Classification and Compensation Plan. Employees in pay grades 1, 2 and 3 are guaranteed 24¢ per hour increase. Employees in pay grades 4, 5, 6 and 7 are guaranteed 21¢ per hour increase.

Effective January 1, 1979, all employee rates and all steps in the compensation plan will be increased 30¢ per hour. Adjourned Board Meeting (Tuesday, February 21, 1978) 209

Estimated cost of the two-year agreement for 1978 is \$243,833.61, which is 7% of the 1977 payroll and in 1979 \$260,901.96, which is 7% of the 1978 payroll.

WHEREAS, Winnebago County is presently funding portions of a study concerning the proposed Tri-County Expressway; and

agencies affected by the conditions contained in this County Board Resolution.

RELATING TO REVENUE BOND FINANCING BY WINNEBAGO COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY

The following Resolution No. 8 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Housing Authority (the "Authority") is a public body corporate and politic, created and existing under and pursuant to Sections 59.075 and 66.40 through 66.404, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and is authorized under and pursuant to said Sections 66.40 through 67.404, Wisconsin Statutes (the "Housing Authorities Act"), to engage or assist in the development and operation of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations for persons of low income; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has been considering acquiring two housing projects for elderly persons of low income (the "Housing Projects") located in the Cities of Omro and Winneconne, both located within Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that the Housing Projects should be financed from the proceeds of revenue bonds issued by the authority under and pursuant to the Housing Authorities Act; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Projects will be the subject of housing assistance payments under Section 8 of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (the "Section 8 Program"); and

WHEREAS, the County has been advised by the Authority that county assistance and support of the Housing Projects would be beneficial, resulting in lower interest costs on the Authority's revenue bonds and permitting less restrictive terms and conditions for said bonds; and

WHEREAS, county assistance and support is authorized under and pursuant to Sections 59.075 and 66.40 through 66.404, Wisconsin Statutes, and would consist of an agreement between the Authority and the County, pursuant to which the Authority would agree to acquire and operate the Housing Projects and the County would agree, subject to performance by the Authority, to provide grants in support of the Housing Projects upon and subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, this County Board has determined that it is in the public interest of the County to assist the Authority in providing safe and sanitary accommodations for persons and families of low income, to thereby alleviate the shortage of safe and sanitary accommodations available within the County at rents that persons of low income can afford, and to contribute to a reduction in the expenditure of public funds for the public health, safety and welfare, which expenditures are necessitated by such shortage; and

WHEREAS, it is the finding and determination of this County Board that the County would derive direct? 224

public benefits from the Housing Projects including, but not limited to, the alleviation of crowded housing conditions for persons of low income, the provision of safe and sanitary housing for such persons, and a decrease in the expenditure of public funds as a result of the provision for such housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of the County of Winnebago does hereby resolve as follows:

1. Subject to the conditions set forth in paragraph 2, the County hereby approves a Plan of Financing having the following elements:

a. The Authority shall issue its revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 (the "Bonds"), provided that the actual amount issued shall not exceed the principal amount approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") pursuant to its Section 8 Program and further pursuant to Section 11(b) of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder.

b. The Bonds shall constitute general obligations of the Authority, payable out of revenues derived from the Housing Projects including, but not limited to, tenant rentals and housing assistance payments by HUD under the Section 8 Program.

c. The Bonds shall not constitute an indebtedness of the County within the meaning of any state constitutional provision or statutory limitation.

d. The Bonds shall not be issued by the Authority until it has received final approval of the Housing Projects from HUD under the Section 8 Program.

e. The Authority will, from the proceeds of the Bonds, purchase the Housing Projects after the same have been completed and have been accepted by HUD and the Authority.

f. The County will provide assistance for the Housing Projects under and pursuant to a Contribution and Cooperation Agreement containing terms and conditions mutually satisfactory to the County and the Authority.

g. The Bonds shall have such maturities, interest rates, and redemption features as the Authority shall propose, provided that such terms shall be substantially similar to the terms of similar bonds for similar housing projects by other housing authorities. Sine Die Meeting (Tuesday, March 21, 1978)

2. This Resolution shall not be construed as binding upon, or creating an obligation of, the County, and the County will authorize assistance by it of the Housing Projects and the execution and delivery of a Contribution and Cooperation Agreement, and will approve issuance of the Bonds by the Authority only upon satisfaction of the following conditions:

a. The Bonds shall not constitute an indebtedness of the County within the meaning of any state constitutional provision or statutory limitation.

b. The Authority shall be responsible for finding a purchaser or purchasers for all of the Bonds.

c. The out-of-pocket costs in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds shall be the responsibility of the Authority and shall be paid from either the proceeds of the Bonds or other funds of the Authority.

d. Prior to the authorization by the Authority of the issuance of the Bonds, the chairman of the Finance Committee of the County and the County Corporation Counsel shall review and approve the terms and conditions of the Contribution and Cooperation Agreement by and between the County and the Authority.

e. The Bonds shall not be issued and delivered until this County Board shall by resolution approve the issuance of the Bonds pursuant to the Housing Authorities Act.

f. the Bonds shall be issued pursuant to the Housing Authorities Act, and the delivery of the Bonds shall be accompanied with the unqualified approving legal opinion of Messrs. Foley & Lardner, bond counsel, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, or such other nationally recognized firm of bond attorneys as shall be acceptable to the Authority and the County.

3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage and approval. Unless the Bonds shall have been issued prior thereto, the authorities and authorizations given by this Resolution shall expire on March 31, 1979, or on such later date as this County Board may specify by resolution adopted either before or after such date.
