ORGANIZATION MEETING Tuesday, April 17th, 1979

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Herman J. Brandt on Tuesday, April 17th, 1979 at 6 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisor K. Brandt.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and prayer by Supervisor Daggett.

Motion made by Supervisor J.C. Pawlowski and seconded that the minutes of the meeting held on March 20, 1979 be approved as printed. Motion made by Supervisor Broas and seconded to correct the amendment of Report No. 6 to be included with Resolution No. 6. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

A communication from Chancellor Edward M. Penson of the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh regarding the board's invitation to appear before the Winnebago County Board was read. Placed on file.

A communication from Dean Rue C. Johnson of the Fox Valley Center Campus regarding the board's invitation to appear before the Winnebago County Board was read. Placed on file.

A communication from the law firm of Dempsey, Magnusen, Williamson and Lampe regarding a claim against Winnebago County and Winnebago County Sheriff Marvin R. Peppler and Carol Hartzheim was read. Referred to the Personnel & Finance Committee.

A traffic and engineering investigation having been made on the following described highways, the maximum permissible speed at which vehicles may be operated on said highways, which speed is herewith established as reasonable and safe pursuant to Section 349.11, Wisconsin Statutes, shall be as set forth herein, subject to approval of the Department of Transportation and upon the erection of standard signs giving notices thereof:

No. 1. County Trunk Highway "A", Towns of Neenah, Vinland and Oshkosh, Winnebago County

(a) Forty-five miles per hour for all vehicles from the city limits of the City of Neenah, southerly to a point 0.15 of a mile south of Paynes Point Road.

(b) Forty-five miles per hour for all vehicles from a point 0.1 of a mile north of Sherman Road, southerly to the city limits of the City of Oshkosh.

AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE 1979-1980 LABOR AGREEMENT WITH HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES UNION

The following Resolution was presented:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the County Executive and the County Clerk be, and they are hereby authorized, to execute a two-year Agreement on behalf of Winnebago County with Winnebago County Highway Department Employees Union, Local 1903, AFSCME, for the years 1979 and 1980, effective January 1, 1979, which Agreement will provide the following major changes from the 1978 Labor Agreement:

1. Vacation (Article 12)

Provide two (2) weeks of time off with pay after two (2) years of service.

2. Sick Leave With Pay (Article 13)

Employees who retire upon becoming eligible therefore under the Wisconsin Retirement Fund—Chapter 41 of the Wisconsin Statutes, or retire thereafter, or who die during the period when they are employed by the County and have an accumulation of at least 30 days to their credit, shall receive a sick leave termination benefit of one-half a normal day's pay based on the employee's last hourly rate (excluding longevity pay) for sick leave up to a maximum of 90 days (maximum payout—45 days) straight time pay. Such benefit shall be paid in cash to the retiree upon retirement. This benefit is not available to an employee who is discharged or an employee who leaves employment for any reason other than resignation due to retirement.

3. Insurance (Article 17)

Provide that the County will pay a sum equal to the cost of the single plan plus \$38.00 as its share of the total premium cost of the family plan for 1979.

Provide that the County will pay a sum equal to the cost of the single plan plus \$42.00 as its share of the total premium cost of the family plan for 1980.

. Retirement (Article 21)

Provide that the County agrees to contribute an amount not to exceed \$43.00 per month of the participating employees mandatory contribution to the Wisconsin Retirement Fund (maximum amount of \$21.50 bi-monthly).

- 5. Compensation Plan
- A) Effective January 1, 1979, increase all hourly rates 30¢.
- B) Effective July 1, 1979, increase all hourly rates 15¢.
- C) Effective January 1, 1980, increase all hourly rates 40c.
- D) Effective July 1, 1980, increase all hourly rates 20¢.
- 6. Longevity

Provide 15¢ after 25 years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the necessary funds to cover the costs resulting from the adoption of this Resolution shall be made available from funds budgeted for this purpose.

REQUEST LEGISLATIVE ACTION: NIGHT COURT AND SATURDAY COURT

The following Resolution No. 8 was presented:

WHEREAS, one of the mandatory requirements of the 1978 Court Reorganization Program is that all counties are to conduct a night court and a Saturday court in addition to regular duties; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County Circuit Courts have complied with this legislative action since August 1978 and have had many opportunities to evaluate said program; and

WHEREAS, it has become apparent in this County that the legal community as well as the public community are not as responsive to this new procedure as was anticipated; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 4 was adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on 5/21/74 creating a Winnebago County Committee on Aging, and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Committee on Aging in cooperation with the Board of Social Services has performed in a capable manner in serving the needs of the older people of Winnebago County, and

WHEREAS, the organization and funding of services for the elderly in the State of Wisconsin is to be changed effective January 1, 1980 giving more responsibility to Wisconsin counties and giving a grant of money to each county for services to the elderly, and

WHEREAS, each County Board of Supervisors shall approve a plan of organizing services to the elderly and submit same to the State Department of Health and Social Services by May 31, 1979.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that there is hereby created a Winnebago County Committee on Aging subject to the following terms, conditions and circumstances:

1) Purpose:

The Committee shall act to improve the quality of life for the senior citizens of Winnebago County.

2) Appointing Authority:

The members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Chairman of the County Board, subject to confirmation of the County Board. Members appointed shall have demonstrated an interest in serving the elderly. In making appointments, due consideration shall be given to achieve a balance of urban and rural representation.

3) Membership of Committee:

- a) The Committee shall consist of nine (9) members, at least six (6) of whom shall be senior citizens sixty (60) years of age or over. No more than two (2) members shall be members of the County Board. These two members will be members of the Board of Social Services.
- b) Tenures: The members shall serve for a term of three (3) years with exception of the original appointees whose terms shall be staggered: 1/3 3 years; 1/3 2 years; and 1/3 1 year.
- c) Organization, By-laws: The Committee shall, at its first meeting, proceed to elect a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Secretary. Officers so elected shall serve for a term of one (1) year. The Committee shall be authorized to adopt its own By-laws and procedures, subject to approval by the Board of Social Services.
- d) Representation on Area Agency on Aging: The Committee shall elect one of its members to the Board of Directors of the Area Agency on Aging.

4) Duties, Powers:

The powers and duties of the Committee which shall be exercised and performed in conformity with the laws and ordinances of the County of Winnebago, shall be as follows:

- a) The Committee shall act as the forum through which the voices of the older person can be heard on any and all issues relating to the well-being and enhancing the opportunities of the elderly as contributing members of the community.
- b) The Committee shall serve as the clearing house and facilitate the exchange of information and cooperation for all County (public and private) programs on aging.
- c) The Committee shall review and remain familiar with all existing services for the aging. The Committee shall specify areas that require services and shall encourage the use of existing community programs or recommend new programs that will provide for an efficient and coordinated method of delivering services.
- d) The Committee shall be authorized to establish

subcommittees to encourage community involvement in keeping with the purposes and objectives of the Committee.

- e) The Committee shall on matters concerning budget and personnel report to the Board of Social Services, and shall be called upon at times to make reports to the County Board of Supervisors as required.
- f) The Committee shall gather pertinent information concerning characteristics of the elderly in the County, and shall be informed on legislative developments and needs, and shall make this information available to the Board of Social Services, the County Board and the Area Agency on Aging.
- g) The Committee shall cooperate with the Area Agency on Aging and related public and private agencies in all efforts concerned with planning and program development.
- h) The Committee shall prepare annually, a written plan of services and budget for the elderly and for necessary and reasonable expenditures to be incurred by the Committee in accomplishing its goals and mandates, subject to review and approval of the Board of Social Services and the County Board.
- i) The Committee shall monitor and evaluate the funds included in the annual plan and budget.

5) Administrative Assistance:

The Winnebago County Department of Social Services shall continue to provide staff to assist the Committee on Aging in carrying out its duties.

6) Relationships:

The Committee may call upon all departments and divisions of County government for assistance in fulfilling its purpose as required.

7) Committee Reimbursement:

Members of the Committee shall be reimbursed for per diem effective January 1, 1980, travel and meals required in the performance of their duties in accordance with County Board rules.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Committee reports were filed by the following committees and are on file in the County Clerk's office: Social Services Board, Planning and Zoning Department, Parks Committee, Winnebago County UW-Extension News, Winne-Fond Consortium, and Personnel & Finance Committee.

Supervisor Broas has been appointed to the board of The Eastern Division of Social Services. The Board of Directors are opposed to having citizen members serve on the Board.

Supervisor R. Olson noted that the Wisconsin Taxpayers listed investment reports from the various county treasurers and questioned the legality of such procedure. The Chairman of the Finance Committee reported that the committee will be reviewing the matter.

Supervisor Precour was concerned that he had not received any comments on his memorandum of June 1979 regarding the pooling of resources to eliminate the one car one person situation.

Supervisor Planalp questioned the Agricultural Committee concerning the alterations at the Fairgrounds. Supervisor Daggett reported that the alterations are proceeding on schedule under the supervision of the Directors. The first three rows of seats have been removed. Supports have been added. Consideration is being given to the facing of the grand stand. The race track has been graded out. Supervisor Planalp requested that the committee investigate the matter to find out if proper permits have been secured for the remodeling.

Supervisor Johnson requested information on the purchse of the Larsen By-Pass.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Chair announced that at this time the public would be allowed to express their opinion on any resolution or ordinance which appears on the agenda.

Mr. Kenneth Humke, 1300 Graham Street, appeared before the board regarding the monumentation program. He contends that Winnebago County is not complying with the state law which requires that at least 5% of the corners should be laid per year. Winnebago County is presently doing only 1%. He strongly opposed the elimination of the County Surveyor's position.

Mr. William Manske, Oshkosh attorney, representing Mr. Sayler also opposed the elimination of this position. He contended that the present surveyor was not properly notified of this resolution and it would be unconstitutional.

Mr. Fintan Flanagan, Oshkosh attorney, told the board members that his client is still interested in the Fairgrounds property. It was his opinion that his client would pay on the increased value of the property.

Mr. George Kleinschmidt, 3873 Utica Road, Pickett told the board members that Winnebago County has the finest fairgrounds in the State of Wisconsin. It was his opinion that the question of the fairground site should be put to a referendum vote.

Esther Walling, Chairman of the Town of Menasha, addressed the board regarding the five zoning changes before the members.

A staff member of the Nutritional Prenatal Care appeared before the board regarding the WIC program.

ADJOURNED APRIL MEETING Tuesday, September 18, 1979

The meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Herman J. Brandt on Tuesday, September 18, 1979 at 6:00 P.M., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed the full board present with the exception of the following excused supervisors: Shipman, Neely, J.C. Pawlowski, and Singstock.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

Motion made by Supervisor Wertsch and seconded that the minutes of the meeting held on August 21, 1979 be approved as printed. Motion made by Supervisor Hunter and seconded to correct the minutes as follows: the zoning ordinance listed for the Town of Utica is erroneous and should be contained in the General Zoning Ordinance for Winnebago County. The minutes approved as corrected by Voice Vote.

A petition was filed by Noel J. Smith, 800 Butte Street, Menasha containing 130 signatures requesting the Winnebago County Highway Department to widen County Highway PP (North Lake Street) to eight feet each side and blacktop the entire road from County Trunk II to the first overhead was read. Referred to the Highway Department. A communication from the Town of Neenah voicing their opposition to county-wide administration of general relief was read. Referred to the Winnebago County Social Services Department.

A communication from the Winnebago County Unified Board supporting the contemplated opening of an additional unit at Park View Health Center in 1980. Referred to Supervisor Neely.

A notice of claim for hospitalization and care furnished to Veronica Delano by Theda Clark Memorial Hospital in the amount of \$1,496.90 was read. Referred to the Personnel & Finance Committee.

A communication from the Clayton-Winchester Fire Department requesting the County Zoning office and the County Parks Department to cease operating on emergency frequencies was read. Referred to the Judiciary & Public Safety Committee.

A petition from the Town Board of the Town of Rushford requesting aid for the replacement of a bridge located on Senn Road was read. Referred to the Highway Committee.

ZONING PETITION HAL—MARK DEVELOPMENT TN MENASHA

PETITION NO. 1. A request from the Hal-Mark Development for a change in zoning on property located in the Town of Menasha from C-B (R-5 and B-3) District to Residential A (R-2) District was read. Referred to the Zoning Committee.

The Corporation Counsel presented Mrs. Jolene Maternowski as the new Winnebago County Assistant Corporation Counsel.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Mr. James P. Coughling, County Executive, presented his report to the County Board. The County Executive received a communication from the Department of Labor commending the CETA office and staff for their outstanding work. Mr. Matt Nebl was commended for his work at a recent meeting of tax listers held in Winnebago County. A saving of 24% on the fuel bills was realized by the Social Services Building due to the insulation. A saving of 14% on fuel bills was realized by the Winnebago County Courthouse due to the storm windows. A study is being made for the allocation of space after the Safety Building is completed. Mr. Coughlin approves the opening of an additional unit at Park View Health Center. At the budget session the County will consider assuming the medical portion of relief and the towns would assume responsibility for the day to day relief portion.

Supervisor Christoph commended the county clerk for the work on the new County Directory, and requested that it be recorded in the minutes.

Everett Matz, part owner of the house purchased for the Toward Tomorrow Program, urged the board to care for the mentally ill. Mrs. Esther Walling, Chairman of the Town of Menasha, was concerned with three phases of the 1980 Budget. 1) Million dollars for economic development program. 2) Decreasing the emergency government fund by cutting \$26,000 for sirens and warning signals. Mrs. Walling urged that this item be retained in the budget. 3) Also the \$14,000 for transportation for older adults should stay in the budget.

Don Kutchera, a member of the Oshkosh City Council, was concerned over the tax levy for the residents of the City of Oshkosh.

DESIGNATE SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT AS AGENCY TO DISTRIBUTE EMERGENCY FUEL AND UTILITIES ASSISTANCE GRANTS

AMEND CHAPTER 10, FRINGE BENEFITS, SECTION 7 RETIREMENT; WINNEBAGO COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY; MANDATORY RETIREMENT

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented: BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Chapter 10 Fringe Benefits, Section 7 Retirement, of the Winnebago County Personnel Policy, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) Mandatory Retirement.

Except as hereinafter provided, all County employees shall retire at the end of the calendar year in which an employee reached the age of 70 years. All County elected officials are excluded from such mandatory retirement. County employees who are protective occupation participants as defined in sec. 41.02(11)(a), Stats., shall retire at the end of the calendar year in which said employees reach age 55 unless the County Board extends the period of employment of such employees.

Inasmuch as sec. 41.02(11)(a), Stats., indicates the principal duties of a protective occupation participant involves active law enforcement and requires frequent exposure to a high degree of danger or peril and requires a high degree of physical conditioning, no extension of employment for a protective occupation participant shall be granted by the County Board unless and until the said employee obtains satisfactory medical evidence of his or her ability to perform the duties of the protective occupation participant position for which an extension of employment is requested.

The procedure for action on requests for extension of employment is as follows:

1. Forms.

The County agrees to provide the necessary forms for use by the employee requesting an extension of employment. To initiate such a request, the employee must submit a form entitled "Notice; Extension of Employment Request" to the Director of Personnel sometime during the quarter calendar year immediately preceding the quarter calendar year in which the requesting employee's birthday occurs. No such request may be received by the Director of Personnel without the form entitled "Medical Examination" duly completed by a physician licensed to practice medicine in the State of Wisconsin.

(b) Term of Extension; Denial.

The County Board may grant an extension of employment to a protective occupation participant for a term of employment of twelve full months beginning the first day of the month following the end of the quarter calendar year in which the said employee's birthday occurs.

The County Board may refuse the extension of employment of any protective occupation participant employee who is unable to perform the duties of the rotective occupation participant position for which the extension has been requested.

Any protective occupation participant employee whose request for an extension of employment has been denied by the County Board shall retire at the end of the quarter calendar year in which the employee's birthday shall occur.

No extension of employment for a protective occupation participant employee shall be granted beyond the quarter calendar year in which said employee reaches the age of 70 years.

For purposes of this Policy, quarter calendar year means a period of three months beginning January 1, April 1, July 1, or October 1, in any year.

A. PURPOSE

To establish an orderly procedure whereby the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors may take action on petitions for discontinuance and vacation of streets, slips or alleys in a recorded plat not located within any City or Village.

B. PROCEDURE

1. Petition.

The written petition required by sec. 66.296(1), Stats., shall be filed with the County Clerk who shall present the petition to the County Board at the first regularly scheduled meeting following the receipt of the petition. The petition shall be referred by the County Board to the Planning and Zoning Committee.

Upon receipt of the petition by the County Clerk, two photocopies thereof shall be made. One such photocopy shall be referred to the Corporation Counsel to determine whether the statutory requirements concerning the preparation of the petition (sec. 66.296, Stats.) and filing of notice of application (sec. 840.11, Stats.) have been met, and the other photocopy shall be referred to the Planning and Zoning Department for a determination concerning the accuracy of the legal description contained in the petition.

2. Publication/Resolution.

Upon receipt of the petition referred by the County Board, the Planning and Zoning Committee shall determine when a resolution will be acted upon by the County Board, taking into consideration the notice requirement of sec. 66.296(5), Stats., Class 3 Notice, such requirement being three insertions, once in each week, for three consecutive weeks, the last of which shall be at least one (1) week before the week in which the resolution will be acted upon by the County Board. After the aforementioned date has been selected, the said Committee shall authorize the preparation of the notice to be published and the preparation of a resolution for presentation to the County Board. The resolution prepared hereunder shall contain a full and accurate description of the land affected by the petition and shall be accompanied with a map showing the location thereof. The Planning and Zoning Committee shall include its recommendation concerning the petition in the said resolution.

3. Payment of Publication Fees.

The petitioner shall be responsible for payment of publication fees required by sec. 66.296(5), Stats., and recording fees required by sec. 840.11, Stats. The payment of publication fees by petitioner must be made prior to action by the County Board on the resolution provided in Paragraph 2 hereof. A receipt from the Planning and Zoning Office evidencing payment of such fees shall be satisfactory proof of payment.

4. Certified Copy of County Board Resolution.

The County Clerk shall prepare a certified copy of the County Board resolution and attachments adopted pursuant to Paragraph 2 hereof which shall be suitable for recording by the Register of Deeds. The petitioner shall be notified when the certified copy is available.

C. EFFECTIVE DATE

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Approximately forty proposals have been received for operators of the line, and this has been reduced to four proposals. The EAA will build a museum at Oshkosh expending ten million dollars and this will entail moving sixty families into this area. The ventilation system at Park View Health Center will cost \$30,000. The Sheriff's Department and the City Police Department will move into the new Safety Building on March 28th and the District Attorney will move April 1st. A rate increase has been approved at the Park View Health Center and the Pleasant Acres Pavilion.

County of Winnebago, does ordain as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE CHAPTER 14 of the CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES ESTABLISHING A BUILDING CODE FOR NEW ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS.

- 14.01 **PURPOSES.** (1) The purpose of this Chapter of the Code shall be as follows:
 - (a) To exercise jurisdiction over the construction and inspection of new one- and two-family dwellings.
 - (b) To provide plan review and on-site inspections performed by persons or agencies certified by DILHR.
 - (c) To establish and collect fees to defray costs.
 - (d) To provide remedies and penalties for violations.
- (2) JURISDICTION. The jurisdiction of this Chapter of the Code shall apply in any city, village or town in Winnebago County which has not enacted an ordinance pursuant to §101.65, Stats. This Code shall be enforced within any such city, village or town upon execution of an agreement pursuant to §66.30 and §101.65(1)(b), Stats.,

between such city, village or town and Winnebago County

which has been authorized by the County Board.

14.02 WISCONSIN UNIFORM DWELLING CODE ADOPTED. The provisions of the following Chapters of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this Chapter as if fully set forth herein:

IND 20 ADMINISTRATION & ENFORCEMENT

IND 21 CONSTRUCTION STANDARDS

The County Zoning and Sanitary Inspectors who are persons certified by the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations to engage in the administration and enforcement of this Chapter of the Code shall be designated Certified Inspectors hereunder.

14.05 WISCONSIN UNIFORM BUILDING PERMIT. A Wisconsin Uniform Building Permit shall be obtained from the Winnebago County Building Code Department before any on-site construction within the scope of this Chapter of the Code is commenced, except where a permit to start construction has been issued in accordance with Section IND 20.09(5)(b)2, Wisconsin Administrative Code. Application for a Uniform Building Permit shall be on forms obtained from the Winnebago County Building Code Department. No application shall be accepted that does not contain all the information requested on the form.

14.06 FEES. Winnebago County shall, by ordinance, determine fees to cover expenses for plan examination, inspections, and the issuance of the Wisconsin Uniform Building Permit. Such fees shall be submitted to Winnebago County at the time the Wisconsin Uniform Building Permit application is filed. In addition, Winnebago County shall collect and send to the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations, the

fee for the Wisconsin Uniform Building Permit established in accordance with Section IND 69.21, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

14.07 **PENALTIES.** Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter of the Code, upon conviction of such violation, shall be subject to a penalty as provided in section 25.04 of this Code.

14.08 EFFECTIVE DATE. The effective date of this Chapter of the Code shall be upon passage by the County Board and publication in booklet form as provided in §66.035, Stats.
