4) RULES, REGULATIONS, POLICIES AND PROCEDURES: Provide a new article covering the rights of the Sheriff's Department to promulgate rules, regulations, policies and procedures, providing for distribution of same, and specifying the obligation of employees to review them and follow them.

5) PROMOTION PROCEDURE: Reference within the Agreement an appendix outlining promotional procedures within the Department.

In addition to the above, the new Agreement provides for minor alterations in the articles covering agreement, probation, work week, insurance, vacation compensation plan, pay period, seniority and negotiations.

for 1988 and beyond, that the State provide funding in accord with the community aids distribution ratio of approximately 90% to 91% of the actual cost of care.

REPORT TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD

The following Report No. 228-188 was presented:
The Park Committee is presenting to the County
Board a contract between the County and the Oshkosh
School District regarding lighting of the softball
diamonds at the Community Park. The negotiation
process which has resulted in the document before you,
has been a long and tedious one. The Recreation
Department made initial contact with the Committee in
August of 1986 regarding the lighting project. However,
the Recreation Department has actually been involved
in this project since 1983 when they started setting

aside funds for a ball diamond improvement/lighting program. A \$2.00 additional fee had been included on the registration fee of each softball player. The fee charge has been in effect through the summer of 1987. At the current time there is \$47,500 in this fund for softball diamond improvement/light. During the spring and summer of 1986, the Oshkosh Recreation Department was authorized by the School Board to survey a number of sites that had potential for a lighting program that would utilize the funds that had been building up. The completion of this survey yielded a recommendation by the School Board to pursue the Winnebago County Community Park as the priority site for a lighting program.

After many long months of negotiations, we were finally able to achieve what we feel is a document in the best interest of both parties. The Parks Committee is enthused about this program for the following reasons:

1. It fits in perfectly with one of the ultimate goals of the Community Park Master Plan, to develop a lighted softball complex.

2. It will greatly increase the usage at, and public

exposure of, the Community Park.

3. It may have a spillover effect in increasing usage

at the swimming beach.

4. We have the potential for contracting with a concessionnaire to run the diamonds that would allow us increased revenue and possible tournament exposure on weekends.

5. It is highly unlikely that the County would have been able to develop a lighted softball diamond

complex.

1.2 - Lighting Specifications — The lighting, fixtures, standards, poles, and bulbs to be furnished by the DISTRICT pursuant to this agreement are specified in Exhibit "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- 1.3 Furnishing and Installation The lighting facilities to be provided and installed by the DISTRICT under the provisions of this agreement shall be installed at the expense of the DISTRICT and shall comply with the applicable provisions of state and COUNTY building, electrical and zoning regulations in effect at the time of execution of this agreement.
- 1.4 Ownership During the term of this agreement, the DISTRICT shall retain all ownership of the lighting facilities described in EXHIBIT "B". Ownership of such lighting facilities shall automatically vest in the COUNTY upon the termination of this agreement, unless the COUNTY rejects ownership of such lighting facilities, by providing written notice to the DISTRICT no later than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the expiration of the term of this agreement. Should the COUNTY elect not to assume ownership, the DISTRICT agrees that within one hundred twenty (120) days of termination of the agreement to remove that portion of the lighting facilities placed above ground which is described in Exhibit "A".

ARTICLE 2 - SCHEDULING AND PROGRAMMING

The parties agree that during the term of this agreement, the DISTRICT shall have complete and exclusive authority to schedule and/or program all softball play on the softball diamonds between the hours of 5:00 P.M. CDST and 11:00 P.M. CDST, Mondays through Thursdays, from the 1st Monday in May through the last Thursday in September of each year during the term of this agreement, and/or as otherwise agreed, in writing, between the DISTRICT and the COUNTY.

ARTICLE 3 - REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE

3.1 The DISTRICT shall have full and complete responsibility for all repairs, maintenance, improvements and replacements of the lights, the

fixtures, standards, poles, bulbs, and electrical service thereto installed by the DISTRICT, described in Exhibit "B", or any parts thereof, which become necessary for any reason whatsoever during the term of this Agreement. The DISTRICT also agrees to pay all utility bills for electrical service for the operating of the lighting facilities during the hours set forth in article 2 at the softball diamonds described in Exhibit "A".

3.2 During the term of this agreement, the DISTRICT also agrees to use the following materials and to provide the following maintenance for the softball diamonds:

3.2.1 provide all bases, pitching rubbers and lime for the marking of the playing areas;

3.2.2 Provide infield mix beginning with the 1989 season, on an as-needed, basis.

3.2.3 Drag the infields, as needed, unless a concessionaire secured by the COUNTY agrees to provide game day maintenance.

3.2.4 Mark all foul lines, base lines and other lines as needed, unless a concessionaire secured by the COUNTY agrees to provide game day maintenance.

ARTICLE 4 - COMPLIANCE WITH ZONING AND PARK REGULATIONS

4.1 The DISTRICT recognizes that the Winnebago County Community Park is zoned P-1 and the DISTRICT agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of the COUNTY Zoning Code in effect at the time of the execution of the Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "E" regarding the permitted uses of the park and lighting facilities referred to in this Agreement and further clarified by the Winnebago County Zoning Department per Exhibit "F" attached hereto.

4.2 The DISTRICT agrees to comply with the applicable provisions or Chapter 19 of the General Code of Winnebago County in effect at the time of execution of this Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "G", concerning parks and recreation as it relates to scheduling events and programs except as to sec. 19.07 (2) (d) 1. Summer Season Hours at the Community

park shall be amended to 7 A.M. to 11 P.M. CDST. The DISTRICT agrees to encourage persons attending its events to comply with the provisions of Chapter 19 of the Winnebago County Code.

ARTICLE 5 - COUNTY OBLIGATIONS

5.1 The COUNTY agrees that the DISTRICT shall have the exclusive right to use the softball diamonds described in Exhibit "A" under the conditions set forth in this agreement.

5.2 The COUNTY agrees to provide for the grass seed and to re-seed outfield areas on an as-needed basis

as mutually determined by the parties hereto.

- 5.3 The COUNTY agrees to maintain and repair COUNTY-owned fences, backstops, bleachers, as well as to empty all trash receptables and pay all utility bills for electrical service for the operating of the lighting facilities at the softball diamonds described in Exhibit "A".
- **5.4** The COUNTY shall provide maintenance of the warning track at the softball diamonds described in Exhibit "A".

5.5 The COUNTY shall be responsible for all other maintenance and repairs not specifically designated the responsibility of the DISTRICT.

5.6 The COUNTY shall provide and maintain adequate and sufficient parking and restroom facilities at the Winnebago County Community Park during the term of this agreement. For purpose of this agreement, the present parking and restroom facilities at the Winnebago County Community Park are deemed adequate and sufficient by the DISTRICT.

ARTICLE 6-INSURANCE

6.1 During the term of this Agreement, the DISTRICT agrees to provide and maintain the following types and amounts of insurance coverages stated in minimum limits of liability:

General Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurrence for bodily injury of \$1,000,000 and a minimum limit of \$250,000 for

property damage.

- a. Premises Operations
- b. Products and Completed Operations
- c. Broad Form Property Damage
- d. Broad Form Blanket Contractual
- e. Personal Injury

DISTRICT agrees to name Winnebago County as an additional insured on each of the said insurance policies.

Additionally, the District agrees to have the insurer provide a current certificate of insurance indicating compliance with this Article and to be identified as Exhibit "C". The District agrees that such insurance policies shall include a provisions for thirty (30) days advance written notice to the COUNTY prior to cancellation. The DISTRICT reserves the right to change carriers or method of insurance provided the types and amounts of insurance are not less than hereinbefore stated.

6.2 During the term of this agreement, the COUNTY agrees to provide and maintain the following types and amounts of insurance coverages stated in minimum limits of liability:

General Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of liability per occurence for bodily injury of \$1,000,000 and a minimum limit of \$250,000 for property damage.

- a. Premises Operations
- b. Products and Completed Operations
- c. Broad Form Property Damage
- d. Broad Form Blanket Contractual
- e. Personal Injury

COUNTY agrees to name the Oshkosh School District as an additional insured on each of the said insurance policies.

Additionally, the COUNTY agrees to have the insurer provide a current certificate of insurance indicating compliance with this Article and to be identified as Exhibit "D". The COUNTY agrees that such insurance policies shall include a provision for thirty (30) days advance written notice to the DISTRICT prior to cancellation. The COUNTY reserves the right to change carriers or method of

insurance provided the types and amounts of insurance are not less than hereinbefore stated.

ARTICLE 7 - CONCESSIONS

7.1 The DISTRICT and COUNTY agree that during the term of this Agreement the COUNTY shall have exclusive rights to any and all concessions of any nature whatsoever arising out of or in relation to any events scheduled, programmed or conducted by the DISTRICT, or any of its agents or representatives, at either or both of the softball diamonds included in this

Agreement.

7.2 Except as hereinafter provided, the DISTRICT agrees for itself, its agents and assigns that no gate admission fee or other considerations for attendance at any of the events it has scheduled, programmed or conducted at either or both of the said softball diamonds will be established or charged. The District may establish a gate admission fee or other considerations for attendance at any of the events it schedules, programs or conducts at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit A provided the District either negotiates with the County and executes a mutually satisfactory agreement concerning the distribution of any such fee or consideration or the COUNTY submits a written waiver of its right to negotiate for any such distribution agreement.

7.3 Nothing herein shall limit the COUNTY'S exclusive right to establish its own gate admission fee or other considerations for attendance at any of the events other than those the DISTRICT schedules, programs or conducts at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit A or to establish any other fees or considerations it deems appropriate, at its sole discretion, as owner and operator of the Winnebago County Community Park. No admission fee, consideration or any other fee will be charged for any softball play the District schedules, programs or conducts at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit A.

In the event the COUNTY establishes a gate admissions fee or other consideration for

attendance at any events other than those the DISTRICT schedules, programs or conducts at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit "A", the COUNTY agrees to provide the DISTRICT with prior notification.

The COUNTY agrees to meet and negotiate with the DISTRICT concerning any plans the COUNTY may have to establish a gate admission fee for any events scheduled, programmed or to be conducted by the DISTRICT at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit A.

Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to sub-section 7.3 of this Agreement shall be settled by arbitration in accordance with the rules of the American Arbitration Association, and judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrators(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

Expenses of arbitration, including, without limitation of generality, costs of notices and service thereof, fees of arbitrators and of witnesses (but not of counsel) and the cost of taking and transcribing testimony shall be shared equally by the parties.

7.4 Nothing in this Article or agreement shall prohibit the DISTRICT from unilaterally charging, collecting or otherwise receiving user costs including but not limited to player fees, team entry fees, diamond improvement fund fees or similar fees.

provided however, that in no event shall any such user costs charged, collected or otherwise received by the DISTRICT prevent the COUNTY from establishing and collecting a gate admission fee or other considerations for attendance at any of the events the DISTRICT schedules, programs or conducts at either or both of the softball diamonds described in Exhibit A.

ARTICLE 9 - MISCELLANEOUS

8.1 Indeminity - The DISTRICT and the COUNTY mutually agree to protect, indemnify, and hold harmless, each other, its officers, employees, agents or assigns from and against all liabilities, damages, claims, demands, judgments, losses, costs expensee, suits, or actions and reasonable attorneys'

fees, and shall defend the "indemnified parties" in any suit, including appeals, for personal injury or death to any person or persons, or loss or damage to property arising out of the performance or nonperformance of either party's obligations under this agreement.

8.2 Registration - The DISTRICT and the COUNTY mutually agree that registration for the Oshkosh Recreation Department Softball program shall be open to all residents of Winnebago County for the term of this

Agreement.

- (4) Lessee shall annually submit to Lessor's designated committee of jurisdiction a plan for the promotion and use of the County Fairgrounds during the ensuing year.
- (5) SALE OF INTOXICATING BEVERAGES Lessor and Lessee agree that beer may be sold or permitted on the leased premises.

(6) EMPLOYEES (Lessee)

Lessor shall not be held responsible for any salaries or expenses for any employee or employees of the Lessee in the fulfillment of this agreement. Lessor shall not be responsible for damages or injuries resulting from any accident to any employee or employees of Lessee, except to extent that any such damages or injuries may be the result of the negligence of Lessor or any of its employees or officials while acting in the course of their employment or in the performance of official duties.

(7) INSURANCE

A. Coverage:

Except as hereinafter provided, Lessor and Lessee shall maintain insurance coverages as named insureds in not less than the following stated amounts and types: COMPREHENSIVE GENERAL LIABILITY \$500,000/\$3,000,000 - Bodily Injury 100,000 - Property Damage

Ms. Cheryl Pucci, R.N., a member of the County Nurses' Office, who works with the Hmong population in Winnebago County. There are two reasons why the immigrants leave their home country. 1). A desire to move to another country. 2) They are forced to leave because of persecution. It has been predicted that within the next few years another 1500 Hmong will come to Wisconsin to live. For the first fifteen months

the Hmong are federally funded. The people have no money, know very little english and have no job skills. The clans are governed by a leader who is usely the father and if there is no father the eldest son is the leader of the clan. They care for their own, use folk medicine and believe that illness is caused by bad wind entering into their bodies. The County Nurses' office has been working with the Hmong families along the following: diagnostic treatment of communical diseases; medicine for one full year; for tuberculosis; hepatitis; lack of education; overuse of the bottle for babies; proper care of ill children; too large families; lack of ventilation in their homes; grief over loss of a member of their family and stress adjusting to a new life. It is very difficult for them to interpret the english language and rely on the opinion of the head of the clan. It takes about five to seven years for a Hmong to learn the english language. The government has cut the funding although the population has increased.

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WINNEBAGO COUNTY'S FLAG

In early 1987, the Winnebago County Constitution Committee decided to have a county flag made as part of the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution projects.

They decided to use the original county seal which featured an eagle as its main focus. The use of an eagle holding an asp in its claws has been on the county seal since 1843, when the County Board adopted the seal from a trade penny issued in 1837 by Dr. Lewis Feuchtwanger.

The flag is on a field of blue, representing the abundant waterways of the county. The circle of red represents the blood shed for the freedoms we now enjoy. The eagle is presented in brown and white, with gold claws and beak.

Before admission of Wisconsin to the Union, the County of Winnebago was created by separation from Brown County in 1840. The county was named for an Indian nation in the area whose land was purchased by the U.S. Government, which in turn opened the land to settlers.

Winnebago County has an actual land area of 286,912 acres. Another 80,000 acres is occupied by streams, rivers and ten surveyed lakes. Lake Winnebago is the largest lake in Wisconsin and one of the largest in the nation contained in one state.

The flags are being displayed at various county offices, courtrooms, and facilities. Flags were also made available to cities and townships at a cost of \$75.00 each. The four-color 3'x 5' custom design printed flags are made of a synthetic fiber called "polydura" and were manufactured by the Collegeville Flag & Manufacturing company of Collegeville, Pennsylvania.

The new Winnebago County flag was presented at the Rededication Ceremony for the Winnebago County Courthouse on July 26, 1987.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY'S BICENTENNIAL COIN

In 1987, in conjuction with the Becentennial of the United States Constitution, Winnebago County, Wisconsin minted a special commemorative coin.

The Winnebago County Constitution Committee debated what should be depicted on the coin. It was unanimounsly decided to have the Courthouse pictured on one side of the coin. What should be depicted on the reverse side of the coin was a bigger question. A decision to honor the county's founding fathers' choice of an eagle holding an asp in its claws for the county seal was made for the reverse side.

The county seal was adopted in 1843 from a trade penny issued in 1837 by Dr. Lewis Feuchtwanger. The Feuchtwanger Cent of 1837 was not legal tender. It was minted by Dr. Feuchtwanger with his desire to persuade Congress to switch from their copper pennies to his alloy of nickel, copper and zinc. To his disappointment, Congress was not willing to make the change. During his campaign to sway Congress, he minted enough coins to get into various areas of the country, and one or more of them found their way to Wisconsin and to Oshkosh.

Although he lost in his effort to have his coin be the official government penny, his design of the eagle was impressive enough to be selected by the Winnebago County Board in 1843 to be used as the official county seal. It is not known if the good Dr. Feuchtwanger was made aware that his design was being used as a county seal.

Having decided on the graphics for both sides of the coin, the Winnebago County Constitution Committee then engaged the advertising firm of Patterson-Ross of Oshkosh to prepare the artwork, which was then sent to the Shaw-Barton Company of Coshocton, Ohio for the coins to be minted.

The coins were made of antiqued bronze, 1-9/16" in diameter, with reeded edges, Shaw-Barton was so pleased with the clarity of the printing on the coin that they are using them as samples in the promotion and sales of other coins.

Plastic display boxes were also obtained from Shaw-Barton in two sizes; one which holds a single coin and was sold for \$3.00, and a double coin box with two coins so both sides of the coins could be displayed, which sold for \$5.00. Stickers were placed on the back of the boxes stating: "Winnebago County Commemorative Coin-Rededication of the Winnebago

County, Wis. Courthouse - July 26, 1987 - Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution - 1987".

Of the 5,000 coins minted, over 4,000 were sold in 1987 through the assistance of area financial institutions and businesses. The remainder are being given as parting gifts to retiring county employees and County Board Supervisors. Valley Bank of Oshkosh is continuing to sell the coins to anyone wishing to obtain them.
