ORGANIZATION MEETING Tuesday, April 19, 1988

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the County Clerk Dorothy L. Propp at 6:00 p.m., in the Supervisors' Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

By virtue of Chapter 59.05B of the Wisconsin Statutes the April Session of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all business which according to law may come before the Board.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Wagner.

The County Executive Paul W. Stevenson welcomed the new supervisors and guests. Also introduced were department heads and elected officials.

OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY-ELECTED SUPERVISORS

The Honorable William E. Crane, Circuit Court I and the Honorable Robert A. Haase, Circuit Court II administed the Oath of Office to the supervisors.

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors recessed for a short social gathering.

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ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD

ADJOURNED APRIL MEETING Tuesday, April 26, 1988

The Adjourned Meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Ralph R. Nielsen on Tuesday, April 26, 1988 at 6:00 p.m., in the Supervisors' Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Wagner.

Motion made by Supervisor J.C. Pawlowski and seconded that the minutes for the meeting held on April 19, 1988 be approved as corrected. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Mr. Jerry Edgar, an attorney from Madison, Wisconsin appeared before the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, addressing the supervisors on Home Rule. Mr. Edgar represented local government with the additional duties being forced on county government and the counties are not geared to these additional duties. The bill which has been passed contains limited home rule. Home rule in cities and villages is different and is not directly alloted to County Executives and the bill is much broader. The County Executive's duties are much broader in cities and

villages. The County Executive's responsibility is to see about the day to day activities, community function. The County Board establishes policies. Administration is in the hands of the County Executive. Committees must do their home work with assistance of others. It is up to the County Board to make this work. There must be an individual to set priorities. Committees will have more duties thrust on them from the state. Counties will have more work to do as a directive from the state. It was Mr. Edgar's opnion that committees do not open bids according to the Attorney General directive. There are two sections in the statute for setting the budget. Supervisor Gose questioned Mr. Edgar whether or not the County Board has the right to amend any contract approved by the County Executive. Administrative authority formerly delegated to the committees is now the duty of the County Executive. The budget can only be amended by a 2/3 vote of the County Board. The committees will have more work and will be more sophisticated.

WHEREAS, the current medical reimbusement formula does not reimburse most county facilities at an adequate level thereby requiring a local property tax appropriation; and

WHEREAS, counties are faced with compulsory binding arbitration, mandated retirement, size of facilities, types of residents, etc.; and

WHEREAS, currently other states have provided separate methods to reimburse their county facilities; and

WHEREAS, the reimbursement formula in place since 1984 has created a crisis forcing many counties to fund growing deficits; and

WHEREAS, quality care for residents is being jeopardized; and

WHEREAS, the proposal proposes a pass-through of costs for operating county homes with limitations; and WHEREAS, state-wide the main political theme being echoed is property tax relief; and

WHEREAS, a separate medical assistance formula be proposed for county facilities would provide that direct property tax relief;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOVLED that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors hereby endorses the Wisconsin Association of County Homes proposal for a separate medical assistance reimbursement formula for county facilities.

OPPOSITION TO FAA PROPOSED RULE RELATING TO MODE "C" TRANSPONDERS (Docket No. 25531, Notice No. 88-2)

The following Resolution No. 4-488 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, recently the Federal Aviation Administration issued a Notice of Proposed Rule Making entitled **Transponder With Automatic Altitude Reporting Capability Requirement and Controlled Airspace Common Floor.** (Docket No. 25531, Notice No. 88-2); and,

WHEREAS, this rule, if adopted, would have a negative impact on the sport/general aviation community throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, rather than enhancing safety as proposed, it would actually negate safety by overburdening an already overworked air traffic control system and it would divert attention away from those high density traffic areas where it is most needed; and

WHEREAS, in addition, this rule would have a negative economic impact on aircraft owners, pilots, fixed base operators and the entire aviation industry and therefore would have a significant negative economic impact on Winnebago County and the State of Wisconsin; and WHEREAS, this rule would greatly restrict the number of aircraft and visitor who would participate in the annual EAA Convention in Oshkosh; and

WHEREAS, the EAA Convention had an economic impact of \$65,000,000 on our state in 1987 and has become a focal point for aviation worldwide.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors strongly oppose the FAA proposed rule entitled **Transponder With Automatic Altitude Reporting Capability Requirement and Controlled Airspace Common floor.** (Docket No. 25531, Notice No. 88-2).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this County Board urges the U.S. Congress and the Federal Aviation Administration to review the aforementioned proposed rule immediately and take whatever action is necessary to avoid the negative impact hereinbefore indicated.

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD LANDFILL GAS PROJECT REPORT BY LEONARD LEVERENCE SOLID WASTE MANAGER

-45—

The purpose of this report is to provide the Winnebago County Board a status report of the Landfill Gas Project (L.F.G.)

As previously authorized by the County Board in June, 1987, the Solid Waste Management Board (S.W.M.B.) has pursued and completed an extensive request for proposal process for development of the Winnebago County L.F.G. project at the County's Snell Road landfill site.

The S.W.M.B. has signed an agreement with Solar Turbines Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of the Caterpillar Company, as its vendor to construct a twophase County-owned L.F.G. Collection Migration Control (Phase I) and Optional Gas Utilization Energy Recovery Project (Phase II).

Construction of the Phase I Gas Collection Migration Control System will begin in June, 1988, with a scheduled completion date of October, 1988.

During construction of Phase I, the S.W.M.B. will be testing and closely monitoring the gas generation and collection capabilities of the overall system. At that time (approximately September, 1988) and S.W.M.B. will make a decision and recommendation to the County Board whether to proceed or not to proceed with implemention of the Optional Phase II Gas Utilization Energy Recovery System. If implemented, the scheduled completion date is June, 1989.

The costs for Phase I and II are \$1.7 and \$2.8 million dollars respectively, for a total of \$4.5 million dollars. This amount exceeds tht County Board authorization of August, 1987, for financing \$3.5 million dollars and, therefore, will require an additional \$1 million dollar bond authorization later this year if both Phases I and II are to be implemented.

The S.W.M.B. will be funding the \$1.7 million dollar cost of Phase I from its operating budget during the interim period of time between Phase I construction and determination of Phase II implementation in order to consolidate financing of the entire project into one bond issue. If in the event that the County determines not to implement Phase II, the S.W.M.B. would utilize the County Board's original approval of \$3.5 million dollars to fund the cost of Phase I in order to permit the S.W.M.B. to readjust it's operational budget accordingly.

WHEREAS, the said County, hereinafter referred to as the Sponsor, being a municipal Body Corporate of the State of Wisconsin, is authorized by law (sec. 114.11, Wis. Stats.) to acquire, establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain, and operate an airport, and

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WHEREAS, the sponsor desires to develop or improve the Wittman Field, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

"PETITION FOR AIRPORT PROJECT"

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held prior to the adoption of this petition in accordance with Chapter 114.33(2) as amended, and a transcript of the hearing is transmitted with this petition, and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sponsor that a petition for State Aid in the following form is hereby approved:

1. That the airport which it is desired to develop should generally conform to the requirements for a c) Purchase Transport type airport as defined by the Federal Aviation Administration.

2. The character, extent and kind of utility truck improvements desired under the project is as follows:

a) Renovate/Remanufacture airport beacon

b) Purchase airfield snowblower

with push-type snowplow

d) Purchase new push-type snow plow for existing front end loader

e) Construct a new taxiway to industrial area

f) Conduct new taxiways between north Thangar and FBO ramps, and

g) Replace terminal building roof and ceiling

3. That the airport project which your petitioner desires to sponsor is necessary for the following reasons:

a) To improve airport safety.

b) To reduce local costs of airport operation.

c) To improve snow removal capabilities.

d) To foster greater use of Wittman Field Airport.

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the improvements petitioned for as listed will be funded individually or collectively as funds are available, with specific project costs to be approved as work is authorized, the proportionate cost of the airport development projects described above which are to be paid by the sponsor to the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as the Secretary) to be held in trust for the purposes of the project; any unneeded and unspent balance after the project is completed is to be returned to the Sponsor by the Secretary; the Sponsor will make available any additional monies that may be found necessary, upon request of the Secretary, to complete the project as described above; the Secretary shall have the right to suspend or discontinue the project at any time additional monies are found to be necessary by the Secretary and the Sponsor does not provide the same and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor is required by law (sec. 114.32(5), Wis. Stats.) to designate the Secretary as its agent to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse any funds granted by the United States under the federal Airport and Airway Improvement Act, and is authorized by law to designate the Secretary as its agent for other purposes.

"DESIGNATION OF SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION AS SPONSOR'S AGENT"

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sponsor that the Secretary is hereby designated as its agent and is requested to agree to act as such in matters relating to the airport development project described above, and it hereby authorized as its agent to make all arrangements for the development and final acceptance of the completed project whether by contract, agreement, force account or otherwise; and particularly, to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse federal monies or other monies, either public or private, for the acquisition, costruction, improvement, maintenance and operation of the airport; and to acquire property or interests in property by purchase. gift, lease, or eminent domain under chapter 32 of the Wisconsin Statutes; and, to supervise the work of any engineer, appraiser, negotiator, contractor or other documents required or requested by any agency of the federal government and to comply with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations relating to airport development projects.

"AIRPORT OWNER ASSURANCES"

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sponsor agrees to maintain and operate the airport in

accordance with certain conditions established by the Secretary under section 114.32(7), Wis. Stats. and enumerated in the Airport Owner Assurances or in accordance with sponsor assurances enumerated in a Federal Grant Agreement.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive and County Clerk be authorized to sign and execute the Agency Agreement and the Airport Owner Assurances authorized by this Resolution.

WHEREAS, Winnebago County owns and operates the Snell Road Landfill under license authority of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR); and

WHEREAS, under authority of Wisconsin Administrative Code NR 500, the DNR conditioned license approval for operation of the Snell Road Landfill subject to the County providing financial responsibility for the entire 111 acre landfill as follows:

1. Closure costs in the amount of \$3,500,000.

2. Long term care costs for a period of 20 years in the amount of **\$4,000,000**; and

WHEREAS, the service and maintenance fees associated with the financial responsibility instrument(s) will be provided from funds in the Solid Waste Management Boards operational budget; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors to approve procurement of the financial responsibility instrument(s).

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the appropriate County officials take the necessary steps to procure a financial responsibility instrument(s) in the approximately amount of \$7,500,000 to provide financial responsibility for closure and long term care costs of the Winnebago County Snell Road Landfill.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the cost to obtain the financial responsibility instrument(s), which is estimated to be 3/4% per annum on the first \$3,500,000 and 1% per annum for the remaining \$4,000,000 credit amount, be made available from the Solid Waste operational budget.

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Ralph R. Nielsen at 6:00 p.m., in the Supervisors' Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Stevenson, County Executive, reported to the County Board that he visited the fair grounds and he is very proud of the work that the Association has accomplished and urged the county board members to attend the fair. Mr. Stevenson reported scholarships have been awarded through Farm Progress Days of which he is a member. The EAA had a record-breaking attendance. The County Executive told the supervisors

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE BY THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO, WISCONSIN OF \$3,710,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES OF 1988, SERIES A, FOR THE PURPOSE SPECIFIED THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE FORM AND CONTENTS OF SAID NOTES; FIXING THE RATE OF INTEREST THEREON; LEVYING TAXES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID NOTES

The following Resolution No. 52-888 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, the County of Winnebago, Wisconsin (the "Issuer"), is presently in need of funds aggregating Three Million Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$3,710,000) to finance closure costs for the Winnebago County Landfill; and WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Governing Body") of the Issuer deems it in the best interests of the Issuer that the funds needed be borrowed in the aggregate amount and for the purposes stated above, pursuant to the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, and upon the terms and conditions set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Issuer, that:

Section 1. For the foregoing purposes, there shall be, and there are hereby, authorized and ordered to be prepared, executed and issued fully registered, negotiable, general obligation notes of the Issuer in the principal sum and to the amount of Three Million Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$3,710,000), which notes (the "Obligations") shall be issued under and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Section 2. The Obligations shall be named "County of Winnebago, Wisconsin General Obligation Promissory Notes of 1988, Series A." The Obligations shall bear as their dated date September 1, 1988 (notwithstanding that they may actually be issued and/or executed on some other date). Each Obligation shall also be dated, as its registration date, the date of its authentication. The Obligations shall be in the form of a single typewritten note in the face amount of \$3,710,000. The Obligations shall bear interest from their dated date at the rate of 6.25% per annum, payable March 1, 1989 and semiannually thereafter on the 1st days of March and September of each year until the principal of the Obligations shall have been paid. Interest shall be payable on an interest payment date to the holder in whose name such Obligation is registered on the Register at the close of business on the 15th day (whether or not a business day) of the calendar month next preceding such interest payment date. The Obligations shall be numbered consecutively as may be required to comply with any applicable rules or customs or as determined by the Municipal Officers executing such Obligations. The Obligations shall be due and payable on March 1, 1990.

Section 3. The Obligations shall be subject to redemption at the option of the Issuer as a whole, but not in part, on March 1, 1989 and on any interest payment date thereafter at the principal mount thereof and accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Notice of an intended redemption of the Obligations shall be given by mailing such a notice not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the registered holder of each Note to be redeemed at his address shown on the Register; provided, however, that failure to give any such notice by mailing as aforesaid or any defect therein shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of the Obligations if notice by publication has been given in **The Bond Buyer** published in New York, New York, or in an equivalent financial newspaper or journal published in New York, New York or Chicago, Illinois, not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption.

Section 4. The Issuer shall be the registrar and paying agent for the Obligations.

Section 5. The principal of each Obligation shall be payable upon its presentation and surrender at the office of the Treasurer in the Principal Office of the Issuer. The interest (360-day basis) on each Note shall be paid by check drawn by the Issuer payable to the order of the holder in whose name such Note is registered on the Note Register (determined as of the date described above) and mailed to such person on the last business day prior to the interest payment date at the address shown in the Register.

The Issuer may treat the person in whose name any Obligation is registered on the Register as the absolute owner of such Obligation for all purposes whatsoever under this Resolution.

Each Obligation may be transferred or exchanged at the principal office of the Registrar for a like aggregate principal amount of the same maturity and interest rate in authorized denominations, only by a written assignment in form and substance satisfactory to the Issuer and duly executed by the person in whose name such Obligation is registered on the Register or by such person's duly authorized legal representative. The Issuer shall issue new Obligations as shall be required to accomplish transfers or exchanges as aforesaid. The Issuer shall register such transfer or exchange in the Register. All registrations, transfers and exchanges shall be accomplished in such manner that no increase or decrease in interest or principal payable on such Obligations results therefrom.

Unless future rules and practices of the secondary market stipulate that transfer fees be paid by the transferor or transferee of previously registered Obligations, all costs of such transfers or exchanges will be paid by the Issuer.

Section 6. Each of the Obligations shall be in substandtially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A. The Obligations may be issued in typewritten or definitive form.

Section 7. The Obligations shall be signed by the then Chairperson and Clerk and sealed with the corporate seal of the Issuer. In case either of the officers whose signatures appear on the Obligations shall cease to be such officers before the issuance of the Obligations, such signatures shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes to the same extent as if they had remained in office until such delivery.

Section 8. The sale of the Obligations is hereby awarded and confirmed to the First Wisconsin National Bank of Oshkosh, Oshkosh, Wisconsin (the "Purchaser") at the price of \$3,710,000 for the entire issue of Obligations, plus accrued interest from the dated date to the date of delivery of the Obligations (the "Purchase Price"). The contract executed and presented to the Governing Body by the Purchaser to purchase the Obligations is hereby approved and accepted. The Chairperson and Clerk (hereinafter called the "Officers of the Issuer") are hereby authorized and directed, in the name of the Issuer, to execute said contract. The Officers of the Issuer are hereby authorized and directed to take such further steps as may be necessary to complete the sale of the Obligations, including arranging for a specific time and place of closing of the sale.

The Officers of the Issuer be and they are hereby authorized and directed forthwith to take all necessary

steps to arrange delivery of the Obligations to the Purchaser in accordance with the terms and conditions of the proposal received from the Purchaser and this Resolution, and to execute and deliver the Obligations to the Purchaser upon payment by it of the Purchase Price plus any accrued interest.

Section 9. The sale of the Obligations shall be understood to be conditioned upon the Issuer furnishing to the Purchaser at any mutually acceptable place in the continental United States, the written. unqualified approving opinion of the law firm of Foley & Lardner, Attorneys, bond counsel of Milwaukee, Wisconsin, evidencing the legality of the Obligations, together with the Obligations, a transcript of the proceedings relating to the issuance of the Obligations, and the usual certificates showing no litigation threatened or pending affecting the legality of the Obligations or the right of the Issuer to issue them at the time of the delivery of the Obligations. Said opinion shall also state that the Issuer has power and is obligated to levy and collect taxes for the payment of the Obligations and the interest thereon upon all property within the Issuer subject to taxation by the Issuer, without limitation as to rate or amount, to the extent the necessary funds are not provided from other sources, and shall also state that interest on the Obligations earned by the respective holders thereof is exempt from present federal income tax.

Section 10. In order to provide for the collection of a direct annual tax sufficient in amount to pay, and for the express purpose of paying, the interest on the Obligations as it falls due and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity, there is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property of the Issuer, in addition to all other taxes, a nonrepealable, direct, annual tax in an amount sufficient for that purpose. This tax shall be from year to year carried into the tax roll of the Municipality and collected in addition to all other taxes and in the same manner and at the same time. This tax shall be in the following amounts:

(a) Levy for the year 1988 in the amount of \$231,875.00 being the sum of:

\$115,937.50 for interest due on March 1, 1989; and \$115,937.50 for interest due on September 1, 1989. (b) Levy for the year 1989 in the amount of \$3,825,937.50 being the sum of: <

\$3,710,000.00 for principal due on March 1, 1990; and \$115,937.50 for interest due on March 1, 1990.

Section 11. The proceeds of the said taxes, when collected by the Treasurer, shall be placed and kept by the Treasurer as a separate fund irrevocably pledged for paying the principal of and interest on the Obligations so long as any such Obligations shall remain outstanding, to be known as the County of Winnebago, Wisconsin General Obligation Promissory Notes of 1988, Series A Debt Service Fund (the "Debt Service Fund"). Any accrued interest and any premium received at the time of delivery of the Obligations shall be paid over to the Debt Service Fund. Interest on or principal of the Obligations falling due at any time when there shall be on hand in the Debt Service Fund insufficient funds for the payment of such principal and interest shall be paid promptly when due from other funds of the Issuer.

Section 12. The sale proceeds of the Obligations (exclusive of any accrued interest or premium received) shall, forthwith upon receipt, be placed in and kept by the Treasurer as a separate fund to be known as the County of Winnebago, Wisconsin General Obligation Promissory Notes of 1988, Series A Borrowed Money Fund (herein referred to as the "Borrowed Money Fund"). Moneys in the Borrowed Money Fund, including the earnings thereon, shall be used solely for the purpose for which borrowed or for transfer to the Debt Service Fund as provided by law. The Treasurer may pay any costs relating to the issuance of the Obligations or the investment of the Borrowed Money Fund out of said Fund.

Section 13. Notice of the sale of the Obligations, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, shall be published forthwith in the official newspaper of the Issuer. The Clark shall obtain proof, in affidavit form, of such publication; and compare the Notice as printed with Exhibit B to ascertain that no mistake has been made therein. Section 14. The appropriate officers of the Issuer are further authorized and directed to prepare and furnish the Purchaser and the attorneys approving the legality of the Obligations, certified copies of proceedings and records of the Issuer relating thereto and to the financial condition and affairs of the Issuer and such other affidavits, certificates and information as may be required to show the facts relating to the legality of the Obligations as appear from the books and records under their custody or control, or as otherwise known to them, and all such certified copies, affidavits, certificates and information, including any heretofore furnished, shall be deemed representations of the Issuer of the facts recited therein.

Section 15. The Issuer hereby designates the Obligations as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the purposes of Section 265(b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

Section 16. The Issuer covenants that it will comply with all requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 that must be satisfied subsequent to the issuance of the Obligations in order that interest thereon be (or continue to be) excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes.

Section 17. The officers of the Issuer, attorneys for the Issuer or other agents or employees of the Issuer are hereby authorized to do all acts and things required of them by or as a consequence hereof for the full punctual and complete performance of all of the provisions hereof.

Section 18. All prior resolutions, rules, ordinances or other actions of this Governing Body or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions or adoption hereof shall be and the same are hereby rescinded insofar as they may so conflict.

Section 19. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof.

Section 20. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the

(1) EMERGENCY 911 SYSTEM.

There is hereby established an enhanced 911 Emergency Telephone Number System to be operated and maintained by the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department at its Law Enforcement Center in the City of Oshkosh, which shall be in accordance with the plan and contract submitted to the telephone utilities involved in its operation and/or the Wisconsin Public Service Commission, all pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 146.70 of Wisconsin Statutes, which was created as Section 1836gm of Wisconsin Act 27 on July 31, 1987.

(2) COST ASSESSMENT.

All telephone service users in Winnebago County which have access to a 911 Emergency Telephone System shall be required to pay the cost of said system as authorized by Wisconsin State Law, Sec. 146.70(3), Statutes, and as determined by the telephone utility companies serving such users in Winnebago County.

(3) COST LEVY AND COLLECTION.

All telephone utility companies serving Winnebago County shall bill the service users for all of the costs referred to in section 30.04 and Wisconsin State Law, Section 146.70. Stats, and as approved by the Wisconsin Public Service Commission, and as part of the regular billing to those service users. The actual user service fee shall be 25¢ for the first 36 months of service and therefter 16¢ per month, but in no instance exceed 40¢ per access line per month. All revenues collected from the user service charge must be applied to the actual, authorized costs incurred in the installation and maintenance of the enhanced 911 Emergency Telephone Number System.

(2) Negotiations with developer for reimbusement of county expenses for survey and appraisal.

(3) The developer must negotiate with the FAA and State concerning any approvals, restrictions or easements which are proposed for the site.

(4) that if the negotiations between the developer and the FAA or Wisconsin Department of Transportation result in more permissive use of the property that the County Will have the final established use reviewd by the appraiser for purposes of establishing a new per acre value and that will be the County's offer to sell the property, and

(5) that the sale of the property by Winnebago

County is contingent upon the County negotiating sufficient protections requiring the developer to have acquired the remainder of the project parcels prior to acquisition of the County-owned property, and other reasonable conditions to protect the interests of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the sale of the 9.837 acre parcel of County-owned land located in the area of STH 44 and USH 41 and as indicated on the attachments to this resolution is approved subject to the terms and conditions as hereinbefore provided.

TO REENACT SECTION 9.02 AND 9.03 OF GENERAL CODE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN (Peace and Order Provisions)

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Attorney General has ruled that counties are unable to use the citation method to enforce violations of county ordinances for which there is a statutory counterpart unless authorized to do so by the Wisconsin Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the 1987 Wisconsin Legislature as a result of Act 389, has created the following legislation:

"the governing body of any county, town, city or village may by ordinance adopt and authorize the use of a citation to be issued for violations of ordinances **including ordinances** for which a statutory counterpart exists."

(Sec. 66.119 (1) (a) Wis. Stats.); and WHEREAS, Act 389 became effective November 1, 1988.



NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County does ordain as follows:

An Ordinance of Reenact Sections 9.02 and 9.03 of the General Code of Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

(Sections 9.02 and 9.03 are on file.) This ordinance shall be effective upon passage and publication as provided by law.

9.02 PEACE AND ORDER. (Disorderly conduct and unlawful use of telephone.) (1) AUTHORITY. This section of the Code is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.07(64), Wisconsin Statutes.

(2) PROHIBITED CONDUCT. (a) Disorderly Conduct—No person shall, in a public or private place, engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly conduct under circumstances in which the conduct tends to cause or provoke a disturbance.

(b) Unlawful Use of the Telephone. No person shall engage in the following conduct:

1. With intent fo frighten, intimidate, threaten, abuse or harass, make a telephone call and threaten to inflict injury or physical harm to any person or the property of any person.

2. With intent to frighten, intimidate, threaten, abuse, harass or offend, telephone another and use any obscene, lewd or profane language or suggest any lewd or lascivious act.

3. Make or cause the telephone of another repeatedly to ring, with the intent to harass any person at the called number.

4. Make repeated telephone calls, whether or not conversation ensues, with intent solely to harass any person at the called number.

5. Make a telephone call, whether or not conversation ensues, without disclosing his or her identity and with intent to abuse, threaten or harass any person at the called number. 6. Knowingly permit any telephone under his or her control to be used for any purpose prohibited by this section.

(3) JURISDICTION. This section of the Code shall apply in the unincorporated areas of the County.

9.03 TRESPASS TO LAND.

(1) AUTHORITY. This section of the Code is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.07(64), Wisconsin Statutes.

(2) Sec. 943.13, WISCONSIN STATUTES, INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE. Sec. 943.13, Wisconsin Statutes, to the extent such statutory section requires any act to be performed or prohibits any act is hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this section of the Code as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by Sec. 943.13, Wisconsin Statutes, is required or prohibited by this section of the Code.

(3) JURISDICTION. This section of the Code shall apply in the unincorporated areas of the County.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sponsor that a petition for Federal and (or) State Aid in the following form is hereby approved:

The petitioner, desiring to sponsor an airport development project with Federal and State Aid, in accordance with the applicable State and Federal laws, respectfully represents and states:

1. That the airport which it is desired to develop should generally conform to the requirements for a transport type airport as defined by the Federal Aviation Administration.

2. The character, extent and kind of improvements desired under the project are as follows: acquire land, construct taxiway network on west side of Runway



13/36, sealcoat and mark runways 4/22 and 13/31. 3. That the airport project which your petitioner desires to sponsor is necessary for the following reasons: to meet the existing and future needs of the airport.

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the improvements petitioned for as listed will be funded individually or collectively as funds are available, with specific project costs to be approved as work is authorized, the proportionate cost of the airport development projects described above which are to be paid by the Sponsor to the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (hereinafter referred to as the Secretary) to held in trust for the purposes of the project; any unneeded and unspent balance after the project is completed is to be returned to the Sponsor by the Secretary; the Sponsor will make available any additional monies that may be found necessary, upon request of the Secretary to complete the project as described above: the Secretary shall have the right to suspend or discontinue the project at any time. additional monies are found to be necessary by the Secretary, and Sponsor does not provide the same; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor is required by law (sec. 224.32(5), Wis. Stats.) to designate the Secretary as its agent to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse any funds granted by the United States under the federal Airport and Airway Improvement Act, and is authorized by law to designate the Secretary as its agent for other purposes.

"DESIGNATION OF SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION AS SPONSOR'S AGENT"

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Sponsor that the Secretary is hereby designated as its agent and is requested to agree to act as such in matters relating to the airport development project described above, and is hereby authorized as its agent to make all arrangements for the development and final acceptance of the completed project whether by contract, agreement, force account or otherwise; and particularly, to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse federal monies or other monies, either public or private, for the acquisition, construction, improvement, maintenance and operation of the airport; and, to acquire property or interests in property by purchase, gift, lease, or eminent domain under chapter 32 of the Wisconsin Statutes; and, to supervise the work of any engineer, appraiser, negotiator, contractor or other documents required or requested by any agency of the federal government and to comply with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations relating to airport development projects.

FURTHER, the Sponsor requests that the Secretary provide as per Section 114.33(8) (da) of the Wis. Stat., that the Petitioner may acquire the required land or interests in land that the Secretary shall find necessary to complete the aforesaid project.

"AIRPORT OWNER ASSURANCES"

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sponsor agrees to maintain and operate the airport in accordance with certain conditions established by the Secretary under section 114.31(7), Wis. Stats., and enumerated in the Airport Owner Assurances or in accordance with Sponsor assurances enumerated in a Federal Grant Agreement.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT ______ and ______ be authorized to sign and execute the Agency Agreement and the Airport Owner Assurances authorized by this Resolution.

WHEREAS, the county keeps these funds and may use them to construct, remodel, repair or improve county jails; and

WHEREAS, LRB 1311 revises this assessment so that counties may also use the funds to construct, remodel, repair or improve juvenile secure detention facilities; and

WHEREAS, many counties are currently facing costly decisions concerning construction of federallymandated juvenile detention facilites and this proposal would provide another funding option for such facilites; and

WHEREAS, your Judiciary and Public Safety Committee recommends support of LRB 1311.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors supports passage of LRB 1311 which allows counties to use jail assessment funds for juvenile detention facilities.
