For comparison, the receipts for the month of April, 1916, were \$298.75, while for April, 1915, the year before the receipts were, \$135.50. The month of April, this year, being an increase of \$163.25.

RESIGNATION OF S. A. COOK.

Chairman Thompson read the following communication from Hon. S. A. Cook, of Neenah, Wis.
To The Honorable, the County Board, of Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

Gentlemen:
Owing to the sad and final duty we owe to our fellow man, I find I cannot have the honor of meeting with you Tuesday, the 16th, as I had hoped to do and personally meet and become acquainted with all members of the Board and, perhaps, more clearly explain my position and to personally thank every member for any and all confidence you

may have had in choosing me as one of the Trustees of Sunnyview Sanatorium and I hope I may ever be worthy of same.

I herewith tender to your Honorable Body my resignation as Trustee of Sunnyview Sanatorium to take effect at your earliest convenience, but not later than July 1st, 1916. I have given this careful considera-

tion and want you to consider it irrevocable.

Some explanation, I realize, is due to you. The main reason I offer is I think too much of the Sanatorium and the object for which it is intended to treat the matter lightly. I have for years been considered quite a busy person, and for the last few years, and at the present time, it seems more necessary now to give personal attention to same, that I can not possibly find time to do justice to the confidence of the County Board, the Trustees of the Sanatorium, or myself. This I was aware of at the time you honored me with the appointment and as the members of the Trustees and Superintendent of the Sanatorium knew that I was only meeting and acting with them in a temporary manner, until the Board should meet and give me the opportunity to ask to be relieved.

Gentlemen, it is with reluctance I am asking this of you, but I am doing so on my best judgment from a business standpoint, in the interest of the taxpayers of Winnebago County, the manager of the Sanatorium.

and the unfortunate patients.

If, by good management, one patient a month can be returned to their home and family cured, it will be a great good for the money expended. I assume to offer a few suggestions, if none meet your views, I will consider them with the same kindly intent for good that I have in offering them. If it is your wish to have one man from Menasha and Neenah on Board of Trustees of the Sanatorium, I suggest that you select Mr. Henry S. Smith, brother of the late Mr. C. R. Smith, who was so warmly attached to the Institution and had several plans under way for the successful continuance of the Sanatorium and the care and cure of the patients. Or if Henry S. Smith cannot see his way clear to act (that through a reasonable respect to his brother, C. R. Smith, who was loved and respected by all who knew him) that Henry S. Smith be given the opportunity to name as successor to his brother, C. R. Smith, subject, of course, to your approval; I believe it would be wise to give this some consideration.

Mr. Smith's death is a great loss, a good man has gone from among us: His burial takes place Tuesday at 2 p. m. from his home, possibly you may see your way clear to adjourn the meeting and attend the funeral. He was a county official, one whom, had he been spared, you would have known more of his real value.

I hold in high esteem the Superintendent, Miss Anderson, and her efficient assistant and helpers. And with the completion of the improvements under construction and a few additional items which are very necessary for the care and keeping of the property, the county will have a Sanatorium, both as to structure and management, that it will be proud of. But as conditions now exist, I recommend that there is room for a practical man at the Institution for the next two or three I believe that Mr. Thos. Grundy is such a person. months. I do not know if any arrangements can be made with him, but if it can be, I recommend that you arrange with him to put in at least three full days' time each week at the Sanatorium at such compensation as may be agreed upon. I do not know if Mr. Grundy is situated so as to give his time, nor do I believe that Winnebago County expects him to do so. I was in no way a promoter of the proposition for the County to construct a Sanatorium, but the County has it and I am perfectly willing to pay some additional tax to have it reasonably well completed and managed for the purpose it is intended, there is much connected with the Institution that needs prompt and every day care and in time it is possible you may be able to form some consolidation with the County Farm and Hospital which are so efficiently managed.

Again I thank you for the honor you extended to me and I assure you, if the time comes, when I can see my way clear to give the Institution the personal care which I feel I should, I will be pleased to make it known to you, and should there be a vacancy, and it meets your approval, I will take much pride in proving to you my appreciation of your confidence, and if I can be of any assistance, I want nothing of you or the people of Winnebago County but good will and only so much of that as I may be entitled to by my work. But gentlemen, please de

not lightly pass up the present needed improvements for the welfare of the patients and life of the building.

I am with high personal regards to each of you. Very sincerely.

TO APPORTION COST OF SEWER.

Whereas the State Board of Control has asked that the cost of said Sewer, be apportioned to the several institutions, above referred to in

proportion to the benefits derived therefrom, Now, Therefore, be it Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Win-nebago County that the Board of Trustees of the Asylum in conjunction with the Board of Trustees of the Sunnyview Sanatorium be and they are hereby authorized to apportion the cost of the construction of said Sewer to the County Asylum, County Home, County Asylum, Farm, and the Sunnyview Sanatorium, in proportion to the benefits derived there-from; and when said apportionment is completed, file the same with the County Clerk and set forth said findings in the books of the several institutions in accordance with the request of the State Board of Control.

LAND FOR SUNNYVIEW SANATORIUM.

Supervisor Loescher offered the following Resolution, No. 2. To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Gentlemen:

Whereas, no particular amount of land has been set aside for the

Sunnyview Sanatorium, by the County Board, and

Whereas, It is necessary that a certain amount of land be set aside for the Sunnyiew Sanatorium so that the same may be charged off from

the books of the Asylum Farm, now therefore, be it Resolved by the Board of Supervisors, of Winnebago County, that the Board of Trustees of the County Tuberculosis Sanatorium and the Board of Trustees of the County Asylum, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to stake off such number of acres as they shall deem best for the use and benefit of the Sunnyview Sanatorium and when said land is so set aside, a description of said land shall be filed with the County Clerk and also set forth on the books of the several institutions.

COUNTY SYSTEM OF HIGHWAYS.

Supervisor Meeleus, offered the following Resolution, No. 3. To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors, of Winnebago County, Gentlemen:

Whereas it is generally known and conceded, that the present Township system of building State Aid Roads is very unsatisfactory, and expensive and under said Township system, we can only hope to receive one class of road, viz., Macadam, which, on account of the enormous cost of annual upkeep and oiling, will be forever a fixed, heavy burden upon the taxpayers and as the mileage of Macadam roads increases, the annual upkeep increases and will finally work untold hardships upon annual upkeep increases and will finally work untold hardships upon

the taxpayers of Winnebago County, and
Whereas, Macadam roads may prove to be satisfactory where automobile travel is not heavy, a more permanent, hard surfaced road is necessary. essary and most economical on certain of our main traveled highways,

Whereas, Section 1317-M 5-1, gives the County Board's authority to construct or improve any road or bridge within the County upon the County System of prospective State highways and in that event the County shall contribute 60% and the State 40% of the cost thereof. now.

therefore be it

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, that on and after January 1, 1917, Winnebago County System be changed as provided by Section 1317-M, 5-1, so that thereafter the County and State will build the roads, except the bridges, upon the prospective State highway independent of the Towns.

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During the past year letters describing the conditions in each school and making recommendations have been written to each school board, following the visits of either the county superintendent or the supervising teacher. In visiting the schools we have invariably held a conference with the teacher at the close of each visit, at which time criticism of the teacher's work, commendations, and suggestions for improvement were made. Following the visit a letter was written to each teacher, summarizzing these sugges-

During the past year eleven teachers' meetings were held, two general meetings at Oshkosh and two sectional meetings at Omro, Oshkosh, Winneconne and Neenah, and one meeting at Tustin. The programs at these meetings consisted of talks by the County Superintendent, supervising teacher and Miss King of the Omro teachers' training course. The teachers themselves took an active part on these programs, with talks, discussions and practice classes.

The school board convention, which was held December 13, in the circuit court room at Oshkosh, was attended by over 250 school officers and ninety teachers. I know of no other one agency which has been so helpful in bettering conditions in rural schools as this convention where school officers can talk over conditions among themselves and with the county and state

officers.

On September 15 and 16 an institute was held at Oshkosh which was attended by practically every teacher in the county. The object was to familiarize the teachers with the new state course of study which had just been issued. Mr. Larsen, one of the authors of this course of study, Miss Swart of the local Normal school, a special writing teacher, the head of the Omro Training school, and the supervising teacher and County Superintendent, took part in this institute.

Through the aid of the special writing teacher an attempt was made to give the teachers a knowledge of the fundamental principles of the muscular movement system of writing. Plans will be made whereby this special teacher will visit each one of the schools of the county and help each teacher in solving her particular problems in writing. It is hoped that a great deal may be done to overcome the decidedly poor work which has been done in this subject for so many years.

A special attempt has been made throughout the year to keep pupils in school. Many letters have been written to parents requesting that their children return to regular attendance at school, and about fifteen cases were reported to the sheriff for notification. The result has been a better attendance at school, though there is still much room for improvement.

An attempt has been made throughout the year to secure better physical conditions and to improve the methods of teaching. In practically every case the school officers and teachers have shown a very commendable spirit in following out suggestions. A special effort has been made to improve the lighting, seating and general sanitary conditions of the schools. Six schools have changed the arrangement of the windows so that all of the light comes from the left or rear of the pupils. In thirteen schools the seats have been rearranged, so that those of the same size are in the same row, making it unnecessary for pupils to sit on larger seats and use smaller desks. In six schools there have been installed new single adjustable steel seats and desks.

Many of the text books used in this county are old and out of date, and wherever new text books were to be purchased, the best of their kind have been recommended. This change has greatly helped to improve the work

in many of the schools.

In rural schools, as in the city schools, the parents neglect to visit the schools to see just what kind of work is being carried on. To overcome this condition, a special Patron's Day was arranged for during the month of April, at which time over 500 parents in the county visited the schools and saw the work the children were doing.

During the month of March a great deal of attention was devoted, in the agricultural classes, to the subject of corn testing. Practically all of the pupils of the upper four grades in all of the schools tested corn, either for their parents or for nearby farmers. In many cases the results were unexpected, and not only taught the pupils practical agriculture, but also aided the farmers, I believe, in securing a better grade of seed for planting.

Each pupil who took the diploma examinations last spring was required to draw a map of his school district on a definite scale of miles, showing all of the points of interest in the district. About 250 such maps were drawn,

many of which were very creditable.

The county commencement was held this year in the auditorium of the Oshkosh High school. The usual contests took place, in addition, spelling. penmanship, bread making, sewing, map drawing, and the declamatory contest. The winner of a special spelling, arithmetic and writing contest represented the county at the state fair at Milwaukee in September.

During the past year a great deal of interest has been shown in the juvenile grain and poultry clubs. About 500 boys and girls received corn, barley and oats from the University of Wisconsin, which they planted and cared for according to directions. The unfavorable weather for grains was rather discouraging, but in spite of this fact quite a number of those who received the seed exhibited their products at the Omro, Winneconne and Winnebago county fairs.

On November 9 and 10, a poultry institute was held at the Masonic hall at Omro. The institute was conducted by four men from the University of Wisconsin. We are planning to hold seveeral more shows and institutes in

various parts of the county during the remainder of this year.

Under the new law giving state aid to teachers for having successfully taught more than one year in the same school, \$1,385.88 was given to 42 teachers in this county, ranging in amount from \$15 to \$72. This law has tended to keep some of the teachers in their former positions and has accordingly been of value in bringing about this result.

During the past year the salary and expenses of the supervising teacher for a period of about nine months amounted to \$916.43, which has been refunded to the county by the state. This money will now form a permanent fund for the supervising teacher and it will not be necessary to make an appropriation for his salary and expenses this year.

In compliance with section 698, chapter 37, of the Statutes, I have, during the past year, written the school officers of each district, summarizing the conditions and making recommendations. The law also provides that copies of these letters and reports, and also of the reports of the supervising teacher, must be kept on file in the superintendent's office. The number of these letters and reports has been large and the old paper files have proved entirely inadequate, and I therefore recommend that the Board of Supervisors make such appropriation as shall be necessary in order to secure a suitable letter file with at least two compartments.

The law provides that each superintendent shall keep on file all pupils' and teachers' examination papers, state pamphlets and sample books which come into his possession. The amount of such material has become so large that it has been necessary to pile it up in the windows, on the table and on the floor. I should be pleased if this Board would make provision for the placing of some shelves in the inner room, where this material might be taken care of.

PETITION FOR COUPE ROAD.

The Coupe road in the Town of Menasha has become impassable, owing to the nature of the subsoil, its proximity to Lake Winnebago, and its nearly equal level with that body of water, make the building of a permanent road surface thereon an engineering feat beyond the power or ability of the township to perform; and,

Whereas, Said Coupe road and the one with which it merges are the only roads from the east which can possibly benefit the cities of Menasha and Neenah, through facilitating rural exchange, hemmed in as they are by Lake Winnebago on the east and south and the bridgeless Fox river on the west and the energetic competitive city of Appleton on the north; and

Whereas, said Coupe road constitutes the one impassable obstruction

in the trip around Lake Winnebago, a trip which every citizen of our County would enjoy and which would be rendered many times more enjoyable were conditions of said Coupe road removed; and in view of the gallant and partially successful effort made by the citizens of the cities of Menasha and Neenah to collect a fund sufficient, when duplicated by County and State, to complete a sixteen-foot concrete surface over this 297 rods of highway,

We, the undersigned members of the Town Board of the Town of Menasha, hereby petition your honorable body for an appropriation sufficient to complete said Coupe road job, estimated at \$4,000.00.

PROBATION OFFICER'S REPORT.

Frances Brayton offered her Report, No. 27, as follows: To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen:

My work as probation officer has been two-fold, viz: looking after the delinquent and dependent children who have been brought into Juvenile Court and the Mothers' Pension cases.

There have been twenty cases in Juvenile Court since Jan. 1, 1916. One family of children was abandoned by both father and mother. Others were taken from immoral homes where the children were having little chance of becoming honest and sef-respecting citizens. A tiny baby was taken to Sparta and a girl who had run away from the Home of the Good Shepherd was found and persuaded to go back.

Often the case of delinquent girls are cases of delinquent parents, Many fathers and mothers have forgotten the time when they were young and the needs which they had. When the changes which have come in these modern times in the life of young people have come many parents who do not know the right way to control their children and who try to do it by arbitrary force instead of by kind reasoning, and some do not care enough to even be arbitrary. One little girl of sixteen led in wrong ways by her own mother was taken by the Court and placed on probability. probation. She was put in a good home where she can go to school. The change in her has been noted by those who are interested, and there is every hope that she is going to develop a strong, good character. She was put in a good home where she can go to school.

Another girl, headstrong and defiant, quarreled with her parents and They made petition to have her sent to the Industrial School at once, but their consent was finally gained to allow her to be placed with a good family to work. It was not many weeks until a reconcilia-tion was brought about and now both parents and the girl are glad she

was given the chance.

We feel that it is a great deal better for a girl to be given a trial outside an institution, and often kindly interest and understanding will

awaken a desire to do differently.

In the Mothers' Pension Department there have been fifty-eight applications. Thirty-three families with a total of ninety-five children are receiving pensions; two who were granted pensions have since married, thirteen were disallowed for various reasons and ten were still

unacted upon because there is no more money.

After the application is received, the case is investigated and a committee of three consider the facts. The particular circumstances of each family are taken into consideration and a budget is made out for the amount needed for food, fuel and rent, the earning capacity of the Mother is noted, and a report is made to the judge.

It is interesting to see the way the pension is working. The Mothers are almost all women who are capable, and who are bringing up their children well. They feel that they have not been placed in a class with paupers but that they are receiving the help the mother state should give them in giving their children the chance which the death or disability of the wage earner would otherwise have taken away. A number of mothers who have felt they would even sacrifice their children's best good before they could ask for city help have felt differently about the pension and have had the assistance they so badly needed.

One mother had seven children, several others have four and five. One delicate little mother had worked in a factory from early morning till late at night to keep her little family of children together. They had to be left to others to care for during the day and their mother had not only to struggle to meet their needs, and with her own weariness, but she had to worry that the children were not being disciplined or cared for. Now she has a pension. She takes work she can do at home, and looks after the children. The refined, cheerful atmosphere of that home certainly makes one believe that that pension is an economy to the state.

Some very appealing cases are still waiting until a larger appropriation is made and we hope that the funds will be forthcoming to care

for these also.

REPORT OF SUPERVISING LIBRARIAN.

Miss Julia Rupp offered the following report No. 30, covering period from October, 1915, to Oct. 1, 1916: The Honorable Board of Libraries and the Board of Supervisors of Winne-

bago County

Gentlemen:-The steady and continued demand throughout the County for the traveling libraries, together with the spirit of cooperation manifested in all directions, is proof that this plan of education as well as recreation is well worth while.

Two days were given this fall for the annual visits and thirty-one stops

were made.

The records show that the books of the fifty libraries were drawn 4.489 times, an average circulation for each library of eighty-nine. The largest circulation of any one library was 679, at Winneconne.

One new station in Nepeuskun Township was established, and the sta-

tion at Zittau, which was discontinued last year, was reestablished.

There are now four stations which have two libraries each; the one at Larsen, placed with Mr. Porter, in the Farmers' bank, is one of the most satisfactory stations in the County.

At Winneconne, the libraries supplement the village library, which is maintained by the Woman's Civic club.

At Waukau, Mrs. Jennie Steele, who has had experience with school libraries, has taken charge of two.

Eureka has also had two libraries for some time.

All libraries, with the exception of those kept on hand for exchange

purposes, have been placed or spoken for for the winter.

The total number of books added was 151. Of this number 149 were added by purchase and two by gift. Twelve were discarded on account of their worn condition, making the total number now in the collection 2,841.

COMMITMENTS TO SANATORIUM. Memoralizing the Legislature.

to build a Tuberculosis Sanatorium, for those suffering from tuberculosis, and

Whereas, all other County Institutions are operated in such a manner as to place the burden of keeping indigents on the County in which the indigent has a legal settlement, now, therefore, be it

regular session, do hereby respectfully memorialize the Legislature at the next session of the Legislature, to amend section 1421-10 to 1421-16 inclusive, by striking out, wherever used, the words "legal resident," and insert thereof wherever used in said section, the words "legal inhabitant" and by adding a new section, known as 1421-12 as follows:

Any indigent person suffering from tuberculosis, who has been a resident of the State for at least one year, shall be received into the institution within the limits of its capacity, determined by the State

Board of Control.

Before such person shall be admitted, he shall file an application with any County Judge, setting forth the fact that he is unable to pay for his care and treatment. County Judge shall make a thorough investigation of the case and in order of commitment shall recite and make an order, finding which County the said indigent had a legal settlement and forward to the institution which said indigent is committed to, and the said Superintendent shall keep an accurate account and file the same with the County Clerk in which County the Court finds said indigent to have a legal settlement, on or before October 1, each year, and said County Board of the County in which the indigent had a legal settlement, to allow and pay for said keep of said indigent.

SANATORIUM.

Supervisor Loescher offered the following Report, No. 52:

To the Honorable the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Gentlemen:—At your meeting in March the matter of straightening out work that had been left over by outgoing Trustees was turned over to the Sanatorium Committee to dispose of as best they could.

Your Committee met and took under consideration the cisterns, plumbing, and such matters as came before them, and made the following set-

tlements:

Contracts for cisterns, \$1,360.00; settled for \$1,300.00.

Plumbing, \$435.00; settled for \$375.00.

Various small accounts were allowed and ordered paid by the Trustees. In the matter of the expense of heating, as you all know, the former haring plant was changed by the Trustees from a vapor into an ordinary steam plant, and at the present time is being converted back to its former standard, the expense of the change amounting to \$699.05.

This matter, as all foregoing matters, was taken up with the former Trustees or their heirs, and the accompanying letter is the result.

There is much to be accomplished at the Sanatorium, but there seems to be much required to gain the results expected. We hereby refer you to the report and recommendations of the Trustees, who recommend that water and light be furnished the institution from the Asylum supply; also storm sash on the entire building; the varnishing of floors and decoration of walls and ceilings; a conveyance so that patients may get from car or station to the Sanatorium, and so that it may be possible to maintain the help required. Shades must be provided. As your building is being filled to the

porches, patients in the rooms must have some place to exercise and lounge about. It is unfair to request them to remain in their small rooms when outdoors awaits them; they cannot be exposed to the hot sun in summer, neither to the cold winds of winter, without some protection.

Therefore, be it Resolved, That the sum of \$20,000.00 be appropriated for

the maintenance, that all money derived for state aid be put into this fund,

as it is received from the state from time to time. Be it also

Resolved, That the following sums be appropriated and placed into the Building fund to the credit of the Sanatorium Committee, for the purposes designated as follows:

"It is because you are in every respect a true man, such a one as

the good Lord makes only once or twice in a generation.

Thus it is that I can confidently say, that you hold not only the respect, but the affection and love of every member of the Board.

"Conscious in our own minds of this feeling toward you, and realiz-ing your faithful work for the county, we, the members of this Board and the County Officers of Winnebago County have thought it fitting and proper at this time, to present you with a little memento which may, in the future, recall to you pleasant relations with this Board and its

"This is the matter that we are referring to you, trusting that

you will accept it in the spirit in which it is given.

If it shall keep the time for you as truly as you have served us and as faithfully measure time as it runs as you have faithfully discharged the duties of your position, we feel that it will be all that can possibly be expected of it.

"This little article, which we hope will keep time for you, will, we trust. remind you that you are at all times a welcome guest at the sessions of the Board and at the places of business and homes of its

members.

"I will not say more, except to again assure you of our most friendly feeling, and our strong regard and our earnest wishes for your future health, long life and prosperity."

On presentation of the watch by Chairman J. C. Thompson, Dis-

trict Attorney McDonald replied:

"Mr. Chairman, Members of the County Board, and County Officials. "I do not know what I might say that would express my feelings after listening to the presentation speech by the Chairman. My feelings

today are such that it is impossible for me to express them. I appreciate more than words can utter the kindly feeling that this Board has towards me. I wish to say that some members of the Board may have in the past thought that I was a little harsh and arbitrary on some of the questions that came before you for consideration but I want to take this time to say to you and each of you, that the only thought I had at those times was a feeling of duty which I owed to the public, and not a personal feeling in any of the matters that have come up before the Board.

"I want to thank the Board for being so kind and considerate towards me at all times and under all circumstances, and I want each and every member to feel that I have the interest of the County just as much at heart after I am out of office as I did while I was holding office, and I want the members to feel as free to consult me on any matter, as they have in the past.

"This token of esteem will be remembered by me during my whole life, and the thought that I have worked with you for eight years will be a bright spot in my life.

"I again thank each and every one of you and the County Officials who so thoughtfully remembered me in this beautiful present, and bid

you all good-bye."

After recess the Finance Committee returned and Supervisor Laabs reported that the youchers and orders had been destroyed.

EDUCATION.

Supervisor Morrissey offered the following Report, No. 15: To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors, of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen:-Your Committee on Education to whom was referred the matter of preparing a resolution memorializing the legislature to do away with the Committee of Common Schools and Supervising Teacher at the November session, beg leave to report as follows:

Your committee met in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools on the 16th day of December, 1916, and there appeared before your committee at said time, the County Committee on Common Schools and Supervising Teacher, and after thorough discussion of the question referred by the said officers and discussions of the statutes in question. your committee reports as follows:

- 1. That it is the opinion and belief of your Committee on Education that the law creating the County Committee on Common Schools and Supervising Teacher, has not as yet had a full and fair trial, and that it should remain in effect until thoroughly tried out.
- That the County Committee on Common Schools serves a valuable purpose as an Appellate Court in the case of appeals from the Town Board of Supervisors.
- That it is one of the duties of said committee to prepare maps of the School Districts of the County, which we believe is a valuable service.
- That it is one of the duties of the Committee on Schools to appoint the Supervising Teacher and as we believe, that the office of Supervising Teacher should be retained. We feel it necessary that the committee in question be retained to make such appointment.
- 5. We believe that the County Committee on Education is intended to and does work for the betterment of the Common Schools of the County.
- We believe that it is as necessary and proper for the portion of the County outside of the Cities to have a Committee on Education as it is for the Cities to have a separate school board.
- 7. We believe that necessity exists for the improvement of the rural schools, which will be worked out through the work of the County Committee on Education and the Supervising Teacher.
- We find that each year, of the persons entering the teaching profession, twenty-five per cent, are without previous experience and are in need of the supervision furnished by the Supervising Teacher.
- 9. We believe that the proper supervision of teaching in the Rural Schools by the Supervising Teacher will mean a great saving in time and opportunity on the part of the Rural School children.
- 10. We believe that the State of Wisconsin is making great progress in the education and training of the Rural School children and that the County Committee on Education and the Supervising Teacher are an important aid in bringing about this improvement.
- 11. We believe that it is not possible for the County Superintendent of Schools to perform the duties of his office in a proper manner and give proper supervision to the County Schools and that for that reason, the office of Supervising Teacher should be retained.

Therefore, for all the reasons hereinbefore set out, it is the belief of your Committee on Education, that the said County Committee on Education and the office of Supervising Teacher should be retained as a part of our school system, and we so report.

Therefore, we have carefully outlined a Trunk Line System on the attached County Map, which we believe to be just and fair to all units of government in the County.

We therefore beg leave to submit the following resolution for your consideration.

County State Road and Bridge Committee. To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin. Gentlemen: - (1) Be it Resolved, That the following parts and portions of the County System of prospective state aid highways are hereby declared to be Trunk Lines, and shall hereafter be known as the County Trunk Line System of Winnebago County, and containing in all 142 miles.

TRUNK LINE NO. 1.

Fond du Lac-Oshkosh-Neenah-Appleton and Dale Road.

Beginning at the South County Line between Sections 31 and 32, Town 17 N., Range 17 E., thence in a northerly direction through the towns of Black Wolf and Algoma to the City of Oshkosh at the South end of Doty Street, thence from the north end of Jackson Street at the City Limits of Oshkosh, due north through the Towns of Oshkosh, Vinland and Clayton to the North County Line between Sections 1 and 2 in Town 20 N., Range 16 E., known as the Yellow Stone Trail. Also beginning at the southwest corner of Section 36, Town 20, Range 16 E., thence in a northeasterly direction through the Towns of Clayton and Neenah to the City Limits of Neenah at the west end of Winneconne Avenue, thence from the north end of Main Street at the north city limits of the City of Neenah in a northeasterly direction to the north County line near the northwest corner of the N E ¼ of Section No. 1, Town 20, Range 17 E., containing in all 26½ miles.

TRUNK LINE NO. 2.

Oshkosh-Omro-Poysippi-Omro-Eureka Road. Waupun-Oshkosh-Winneconne-Winchester-Omro Road.

Beginning at the south County line near the south ¼ line of Section \$1, Town 17 N., Range 16 E., thence in a northeasterly direction through the Towns of Nekimi and Algoma to the southwest city limits at the end of Oregon Street, and beginning at the north city limits of Oshkosh at the north end of Algoma Street, thence in a northwesterly direction through the Towns of Oshkosh, Winneconne, Winchester to intersection of Trunk Line No. 3 at the northeast corner of Section 23, Town 20 N., Range 15 E., and beginning at the south ¼ line of Section 13, Town 19 N., Range 15 E., thence in a westerly direction through the Village of Winneconne to the center of Section 20, Town 19 N., Range 15 E., thence due south through the Village of Omro, containing in all 34 miles.

TRUNK LINE NO. 3.

Neenah-Menasha-Winchester-Wolf River Road.

Beginning at the east County Line in Section 13, Town 20 N., Range 17 E., thence in a westerly direction to the east city limits of the City of Menasha at the east end of Plank Road Street, thence from the west city limits of the City of Neenah at the end of Main Street, in a north-westerly direction through the Towns of Neenah and Menasha to the southeast corner of Section 18, Town 20 N., Range 17 E., thence due west through the Towns of Menasha, Clayton and Winchester and Wolf River to the north County Line in Section 5, Town 20 N., Range 14 E., containing in all 22 miles.

TRUNK LINE NO. 4.

Oshkosh-Omro-Poysippi-Omro-Eureka Road.

Beginning at the village limits of Eureka and running in a northeasterly direction through Section 28 and between Sections 22 and 27 east thence north to intersection with Section 23, thence east through Sections 23 and 24, Town of Rushford and through Section 19, Town of Omro to Village of Omro; also, beginning at the west County Line between Sections 19 and 30, Town 19 N., Range 14 E., thence in an easterly and southeasterly direction through the Towns of Poygun and Omro, through the Village of Omro, thence to the city limits of Oshkosh, as shown on the County Trunk Line Map, containing in all 28 miles.

TRUNK LINE NO. 5. Oshkosh-Ripon-Berlin Road.

Beginning at the south County Line between Sections 31 and 32, Town 17. N., Range 15 E., thence in a northerly and northeasterly direction through the Towns of Utica, Nekimi and Algoma to the southwest N., Range 14 E., northeast through Towns of Nepeuskun and Rushford beginning at the west County Line between Sections 6 and 7, Town 17 city limits of the City of Oshkosh at the end of South Park Avenue, and to section line between 25 and 26, Town of Rushford, thence east through Town of Rushford, Omro and Algoma to the city limits of Oshkosh at the end of South Park Avenue, containing in all 34 miles.

(2) Be it Further, Resolved, That after January 1, 1917, the County will pay fifty per cent (50%) of the cost of improving a portion of the prospective state aid highway system, not included in the County Trunk Line System but making connection with the same or with an adjoining County system by grading, draining, surfacing or improving in other manner approved by the State Highway Commission, provided that no tax of less than \$500.00 or more than \$1.000.00 shall be voted by a town or village in any one year and that the whole joint town and county fund shall be used in making one continuous improvement.

And that all appropriations under this resolution shall be expended

under the supervision of the County State Road and Bridge Committee and County Highway Commissioner, in the same manner and under the same provisions as the state aid funds are expended upon the Trunk Lines.

(3) Be it further, Resolved, That all money appropriated for the year of 1918 be placed on Trunk Line Roads Nos. 1 and 2, for the year of 1919 to be placed on Trunk Line Roads Nos. 3 and 4 and for the year 1920 to be placed on Trunk Line Roads Nos. 5 and 1, as designated on the New County Road Map.

DISALLOWING CLAIM OF EX-SHERIFF, D. R. WILLIAMS.

Supervisor Stanley offered the following Report No. 1. To the Honorable, the County Board of Winnebago County. Gentlemen:

Your Committe on Bonds and Salaries to which was referred the question of extra compensation to former Sheriff Williams for board of prisoners, report as follows:

1—That in our opinion the County of Winnebago entered into a lawful contract on January 6th, 1915, with D. R. Williams for boarding prisoners, and the county has fully performed such contract.

2—That any understanding between any members of the committee on Bonds and Salaries and D. R. Williams for the payment of any other amounts for board than those set forth in the contract was without the knowledge or authority of said committee as a whole and are not binding on the County.

3-That though it is possible that former Sheriff Williams did not receive for boarding said prisoners the actual cost of so doing, yet your committee is convinced that the County has fully performed said contract, and is not legally bound to pay any additional sums and there-

fore recommend that said claim be disallowed.

OPINION OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY.

The following is opinion of District Attorney, D. K. Allen, on the above and foregoing claim of Ex-Sheriff, D. R. Williams: To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors, Winnebago County,

The following is my opinion in relation to the question referred to the Bonds and Salaries Committee and myself regarding the proposal to pay the former sheriff, D. R. Williams, the sum of \$3.57 per week for the board of prisoners after commitment, in place of the sum of \$3.25 per week, the amount agreed upon in the contract for that purpose.

I find that at the January 1915 session of Your Honorable Body, the following agreement was submitted and adopted as Report No. 28:

AGREEMENT WITH SHERIFF BY BONDS AND SALARIES' COMMITTEE.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County. Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Bonds and Salaries submit the following report of a contract entered into with Sheriff-elect David R. Williams for the board of prisoners, as follows: To Whom it May Concern:

This agreement made this 6th day of January, A. D. 1915, by and between the County of Winnebago and David R. Williams, Sheriff-elect.
The said David R. Williams does for and in consideration of a

certain sum hereinafter mentioned, agree to board, wash and mend for certain sum hereinatter mentioned, agree to board, wash and ment for all the prisoners who may be confined in the jail of Winnebago County, and to furnish good, wholesome and well prepared food in sufficient quantity, for \$3.25 a week after commitment, and 25 cents a meal before commitment of twenty-one meals, and all parts of the day or week. The board to be computed on the same basis of 21 meals to make a week's board, and in no case to charge for more meals than are actually furnished; and said David R. Williams agrees to keep the register so as to show the hour of taking in and out of all prisoners.

It is further agreed that no bills shall be presented to the County Board for articles used in the preparation of food for said prisoners, nor in doing the mending and washing for the same; and it is further agreed by and between the said County of Winnebago and said David R. Williams that said County of Winnebago shall provide all heat and light for said jail, sheriff's residence, including fuel for cooking purposes

for said jail and residence.

For and in consideration of the faithful performance of the above agreement by said David R. Williams, the County of Winnebago agrees to cause to be paid to said David R. Williams the sum of \$3.25 per week as above stated.

The statutes of the State of Wisconsin provides as follows: Section 725:

"It shall be the duty of the Sheriff to take the charge and custody of the jails of his County and the persons therein, and to keep them himself or by his deputy or jailer." Section 4950:

The keeper of each prison shall see that the same is constantly kept in a cleanly and healthful condition, each prisoner shall be furnished daily with as much clean water as he shall have occasion for, either as drink or for the purpose of personal cleanliness, and with a clean towel once a week, and shall be served three times with wholesome food which shall be well cooked and with sufficient quantity." Section 4947:

"All charges for maintaining prisoners confined in the County Jail shall be paid out of the County Treasury, the accounts of the keeper of such jail having been first allowed by the County Board." Section 669-12:

"The County board of each county shall have the power at any legal meeting to prescribe the diet of the inmates of the jail and fix the

maximum compensation to be paid therefor.'

The Supreme Court of our state has held that a county is liable to the sheriff for whatever the proper board of prisoners confined in the county jail may actually cost, "including the cost of materials used for food, and of preparing and serving the same, but without any allowance for the sheriff's personal services or for profits in his favor" and the county board cannot bind the sheriff by a resolution fixing beforehand the cost of such board.

(Bell vs. Fond du Lac County, 53 Wis. Page 433)
The same case holds (page 435) that the county board and sheriff may make a contract as to what shall be received and paid for board. If no such contract be made, then the County must pay to the sheriff whatever the proper board of prisoners actually costs, and in such case the sheriff could not be compelled to sustain any loss in the maintenance of prisoners. But is the sheriff voluntarily enters into a contract and it develops that he loses money in the performance of the same the County is under no obligation to reimburse him for any amounts he may have lost by reason of the contract.

In other words, the sheriff is not compelled to enter into a contract with the county for the support of prisoners. He may support them and must then keep an accurate record and if this is done, can compel the county to reimburse him for his actual expenses if there is no contract. From this it will be clear that the county lawfully entered into

its contract with Sheriff Williams in January, 1915.

The theory is advanced by the sheriff that the acts of one or two members of the Committee on Bonds and Salaries would bind the county to pay an additional amount of thirty-two cents per week for the board of prisoners.

I do not believe this position is well taken. In the first place where a written agreement is made between parties, the presumption is strong that such writing represents the entire and actual agreement and ordinarily any facts outside of this agreement tending to show different un-derstanding are closely scrutinized. In the second place, it is extremely doubtful where one or two members of the Committee on Bonds and Salaries could in any way bind the Committee or the County by any such arrangement as that set forth,

In conclusion my opinion is that the County acted wholly within the law in making the contract in question with Sheriff Williams for the support of the prisoners in the county fail and that the County is in no wise bound by the acts of any of the members of the Committee on Bonds and Salaries which acts purport to establish a different agreement.

Gentlemen:-Your County State Road and Bridge Committee has investigated the advisability of selecting a trunk line system of highway and adopting a county unit plan in Winnebago County under the provision of Section 1317 m-5 of the Statutes and beg leave to report as follows:

We have carefully investigated the road situation in the County of Winnebago and believe that the present unit plan of operation does not meet the needs of the County and that the interest of the County as a whole will be best served by operating under the county unit plan upon a trunk line system.

We therefore beg leave to submit for your consideration the following

resolution outlining a trunk line system which we believe to be just and fair by all units of government in the County.

ERNEST RADDATZ OTTO C. ERDMANN F. C. STEINER OTTO C. LAABS,

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

1. That the County continue the County unit plan of building highways
on the proposed State Highway System as provided for in Section 1317m-5
of the Statutes.

2. That the portion of the County system of prospective State Highways to be constructed by the County and State alone under the said provisions of the Statute, and for which the County shall contribute sixty per cent and the State forty per cent of the cost, shall be as follows:

TRUNK LINE, NO. 1.

Fond'du Lac - Oshkosh - Neenah - Appleton and Dale Road.

Beginning at the South County Line between Sections 31 and 32, Town INN, Range 17 E., thence in a northerly direction through the towns of Black Wolf and Algoma to the City of Oshkosh at the South end of Doty Street, thence from the North end of Jackson Street at the City Limits of Oshkosh, due North through the Towns of Oshkosh, Vinland and Clayton to the North County Line between Section 1 and 2 in Town 20 N., Range 16 E., known as the Yellow Stone Trail: Also beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 36, Town 20, Range 16 E., thence in a Northeasterly direction through the Towns of Clayton and Neenah to the City Limits of Neenah at the West end of Winneconne Avenue, thence from the Northeasterly direction to the North County Line near the Northwest corner of the Northeast's of Section No. 1, Town 20, Range 17 E., containing in all 26½ miles.

TRUNK LINE, NO. 2.

Waupun — Oshkosh — Winneconne — Winchester — Omro Road.

Beginning at the South County Line near the South 4 line of Section 31, Town 17 N., Range 16'E., thence in a Northeasterly direction through the Towns of Nekimi and Algoma to the Southwest City Limits at the end of Oregon Street, and beginning at the North City Limits of Oshkosh at the North end of Algoma Street, thence in a Northwesterly direction through the Towns of Oshkosh, Winneconne, Winchester to Intersection of Trunk Line No. 3 at the Northeast corner of Section 23, Town 20 N., Range 15 East, and beginning at the South 4 line of Section 13, Town 19 N., Range 15 E., thence in a Westerly direction through the Village of Winneconne to the center of Section 20, Town 19 N., Range 15 E., thence due South through the Village of Omro, containing in all 28 miles.

TRUNK LINE, NO. 3.

Neenah - Menasha - Winchester - Wolf River Road.

Beginning at the East County Line in Section 13, Town 20 N., Range 17 E., thence in a Westerly direction to the East City Limits of the City of Menasha at the East end of Plank Road Street, thence from the West City Limits of the City of Neenah at the end of Main Street, in a Northwesterly direction through the Towns of Neenah and Menasha to the Southeast corner of Section 18, Town 20 N., Range 17 E., thence due West through the Town of Menasha, Clayton and Winchester and Wolf River to the North County Line in Section 5, Town 20 N., Range 14 E., containing in all 22 miles.

TRUNK LINE, NO. 4.

Oshkosh - Omro - Poysippi - Omro - Eureka Road.

Beginning at the Village Limits of Eureka and running in a North-easterly direction through Section 28 and between Sections 22 and 27 East thence North to Intersection with Section 23, thence East through Section 23 and 24, Town of Rushford and through Section 19, Town of Omro to Village of Omro, also, beginning at the West County Line between Sections 19 and 30, Town 19 N., Hange 14 E., thence in an Easterly and South-easterly direction through the Towns of Poygun and Omro, through the Village of Omro, thence to the City Limits of Oskkosh, as shown on the County Trunk Line Map containing in all 26 miles.

TRUNK LINE, NO. 5.

Oshkosh - Ripon and Oshkosh - Berlin Road.

Beginning at the South County Line between Sections 31 and 32, Township 17 N., Range 15 East, thence in a Northerly and northeastly direction thrown the Towns of Utica, Nekimi and Algoma to the Southwest City Limits of the City of Oshkosh at the end of South Park Avenue; and beginning at the West County Line between Sections 6 and 7, Township 17 North, Range 14 E., thence Northeasterly through the Towns of Nepeuskun and Rushford to Waukau Village thence North through Waukau Village to the Section Line of Section 25, thence East through the towns of Rushford, Omro and Algoma to the City Limits of Oshkosh at the end of South Park Avenue containing in all 30 miles.

Be it further Resolved, That all monies appropriated for the year 1918 be placed equally on Trunk Line Roads Numbers 1 and 2 for the year 1919, equally on Trunk Lines Nos. 3 and 4 and for the year 1920, equally on Trunk Lines Number 5 and 1 as designated on new County Road Map, and thereafter in rotation in same manner from year to year until said Trunk Lines are completed.

Rules of the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County. Adopted, May 17, 1916; Amended March 8, 1917.

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day

to day until adjourned, unless to a day certain or sine die,

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairman as authorized by Ch. 110. of 1903.)

III.

It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 9; Finance, 7; General Accounts, 7; Illegal Assessments, 5 Justices and Constables' Accounts, 7; Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 7: Insane, 3; Poor and Poor Farm, 3; Workhouse, 3 Corporations, 3; Public Buildings, 5: Roads and Bridges, 5; Per Diem and Mileage, 5; Printing, 3; Bonds and Salaries, 5; County Abstract and Tract Index System, 3; Education, 3; Sanatorium, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can

be done until the same shall be announced,

The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of

business shall be as follows:

Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

Reports of Standing Committees. Reports of Select Committees.

Consideration of Miscellaneous Business

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

The chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when

a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address XII.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be

entertained except:

. To adjourn.

2. To lay on the table.

- 3. For the previous question.
- 4. To postpone to a day certain.
- To commit to a committee.
 To amend or to substitute.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same

stage of the proposition.

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unani-

mous consent.

XXII. The previous quetsion may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shait then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise," If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall

be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

RULE XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

XXIX. No resolution for the appropriation for money shall be in order until the day after its presentation and reference, except upon the consent of two-thirds of the members of the County Board present.
