RULES OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED MAY 2, 1939

- I. The meetings of this board shall be held in the supervisors' room, and the hour for daily meetings shall be 10 a. m., and the county board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless to a day certain or sine die.
- II. At the first meeting of the board, it shall be the duty of the chairman, or in the case of his absence, the vice chairman, or in their absence, the clerke call to order.

The clerk shall then call the roll of members.

A quorum being present the board shall proceed to the election of a chairman and vice chairman.

III. It shall be the duty of the chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee viz:

Equalization, nine; finance, eight; general accounts, seven; illegal assessments, five; justice and constables' accounts, seven; sheriff's and coroners' accounts, seven; insane, three; poor and county home, three; public buildings, five; per diem and mileage, five; printing, three; bonds and salaries, five; abstractor and register of deeds, three; rules, three; education, three; sanatorium, five; budget, four (county clerk ex-officio); county fair, five; aviation, five; social security, three; insurance, three; investments, three; seed loan, three; judiciary and legislation, five; conservation, three.

- IV. A county highway committee consisting of five members to represent cities, towns and villages, and all other elective committees and elective officers, are to be elected annually at the November session of the board.
- V. The board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the chairman to prepare the list of committees, and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.
- VI. The chairman, or in his absence, the vice chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the clerk. In the absence of both the chairman and the vice chairman, a chairman pro tem shall be elected.
- VII. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the board provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment corrected.
- VIII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of husiness shall be as follows:
 - Reception of petitions, memorials, accounts, etc.
 - 2. Presentation of resolutions and disposition of same.

- hsuffice to the appropriate committee by the chairman, without motion.
- The chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order subject to an appeal to the board and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

XI. The chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and nays, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie, it shall be deemed to have been lost, but any member voting on either side of the question may present the same question again at such a time as provided in Section XXIII.

XII. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the board.

XIII. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committees shall be endorsed thereon.

XIV. Every member previous to speaking, shall rise and address the chair.

XV. When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is to speak first, but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the chair shall speak first.

XVI. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the board.

XVII. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the county board.

XVIII. No account or claim against the county shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the clerk of the board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XIX. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except.

- 1. To adjourn.
- 2. To lay on the table.
- 3. For the previous question.
- 4. To postpone to a day certain.
- 5. To commit to a committee.
- 6. To amend or to substitute.
- 7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XX. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XXI. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not again be entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XXII. A substitute shall be opened to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXIII. When a motion or question has once been determined any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration if the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding day, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXIV. The previous question may be removed by any member, and the chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment if any, and upon the main question.

XXV. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be put first.

XXVI. These rules shall not be changed, amended or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXVII. Any of these rules may be suspended upon pending measure by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVIII. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the board until alterated or repealed, as herein provided.

XXIX. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Roberts' Rules of Order," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the board.

XXX. Whenever the board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

XXXI. No resolution for the appropriation of money shall be in order until the day after its presentation and reference, except upon the consent of two-thirds of the members of the county board present.

XXXII. All reports, resolutions and petitions must be presented in typewritten form in a quadruplicate so that one copy will be immediately available to the local press, and the same to be read by the clerk of the board.

XXXIII. All resolutions calling for an appropriation of money, and all resolutions, the adoption of which will require an ultimate expenditure of money or an appropriation by the county board, shall be presented to the county clerk of Winnebago county ex-officio member of the budget committee, at least ten (10) days prior to the opening day of the annual November session of the county board, and no bill or resolution calling for a appropriation of money shall be received by the board without the unanimous consent of the board after that time.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY SAFETY COUNCIL

The following RESOLUTION NO. 4 was presented:

To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County: Gentlemen

WHEREAS it is deemed that Winnebago County should do every-WHEREAS It is deemed that Winnebago County should do everything in its power to promote and advance safety on the highways in view of the terrific toll of injuries and property damage that is being counted daily on the highways maintained by it, and.

WHEREAS protection of life and property on highways is and rightly should be one of the major activities of government, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Winnebago County Board create and there is hereby created an organization to be known as the Winnebago County Safety Council, for the purposes hereinafter set forth and organized as follows:

set forth and organized as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the Winnebago County Safety
Council to investigate, advise and report to the County Board, Traffic Officers, Highway Comission and other County Officials concerning the best method of providing for the safety and convenience of the public on streets and highways in Winnebago County, to secure information on and provide records of all traffic accidents in Winnebago County to enlist the aid of citizens in the County in the promotion of safety and obedience to law on the highways, and to educate the public in matters

concerning public safety.

SECTION 2. The Winnebago County Safety Council shall consist of fifteen members, who shall be citizens and residents of the County and shall be appointed by the Chairman of the County Board and confirmed by the County Board, at the annual meeting of the Board in November for the following terms:

Four members shall be appointed for a term expiring on January 1st, 1941; four members shall be appointed for a term expiring January 1st, 1942; four members shall be appointed for a term expiring January 1st, 1943; the County Superintendent of Schools, the County Highron Company 1st, 1943; the County Superintendent of Schools, the County January 1st, 1943; the County Superintendent of Schools, the County Highway Commssioner, and the County Sheriff by virtue of their office. Upon the expiration of their respective terms, members of the Council shall thereupon be appointed in the manner heretofore set out, for a term of three years, it being the intention that a portion of the members of the Council shall be appointed annually.

SECTION 3. Within thirty days of their appointment the Council shall meet for the purpose of organization, and to elect a Chairman and Vice Chairman from its membership.

SECTION 4. An employe of the County shall be the Secretary of the Council and shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors. It shall be his duty to notify the members of meetings, to

Supervisors. It shall be his duty to notify the members of meetings, to keep the minutes and account of finances and to do such other duties

as the Council may direct.

SECTION 5 The Council shall hold regular and special meetings

at such times and place as shall be designated by the Council.

SECTION 6. The headquarters of the Council shall be located at the

Winnebago County Courthouse.

SECTION 7. Whenever a member fails to attend three consecutive regular meetings, unless excused by the Council for illness, he shall cease to become a member and a substitute shall be appointed by the Council for the unexpired term. Such substitution shall be reported by the Council to the the Council to the County Board at the next County Board meeting

SECTION 8. Eight members present at any regular or special meet-

ing shall constitute a quorum.

SECTION 9. Each member shall be entitled to one vote on any

SECTION 10. The Chairman will appoint any regular or special committee the Council may deem advisable for the carrying out of its objectives.

SECTION 11. No officer or member of this Council shall have the power to act on behalf of the Council or use its name unless official sanction is granted by the Council at a duly called regular or special meeting

SECTION 12 Commercial advertising of any kind will not be considered or sanctioned by the Council. The Council will however, have

the right to decide the merits of educational advertising SECTION 13. The Council may adopt by-laws, rules, and resolutions as they see fit and not inconsistent with this resolution, and shall report to the County Board all of their doings, findings, and recommendations at the annual meeting of the County Board.

SECTION 14. The annual meeting of the Council shall hereafter be on the third Tuesday in October at the Courthouse in the City of Osbbork Wisconsin

Oshkosh, Wisconsin,

SECTION 15. No person sitting as a member of the Council shall receive any compensation from the County or otherwise, but this shall not be construed to prevent the County Board from appropriating any sums of money to the Council for carrying out the purpose of the Council.

ADOPTION OF TRAFFIC ORDINANCE

The following REPORT NO. 6 was read: To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County: Gentlemen:

The Judiciary and Legislative Committee met at the Courthouse on the 3th day of June 1939, and had under consideration the question of adopting an ordinance regulating traffic and an ordinance for disorderly conduct in Winnebago County.

Captain Stilp, of the Motorcycle Police, has requested that the county adopt an ordinance for disorderly conduct. Under the state law it is necessary that offenders be drunk or disorderly in a public place, and it has been impossible to bring in offenders who are merely creating disturbances, and not in a drunken condition.

The Committee therefore recommends the adoption of the ordi-

nance which is hereto attached.

The committee also recommends that drunken drivers, arrested by the county police, we brought in under a county ordinance. The fine is \$100.000, and the committee feels that this amount should be paid into the County Treasury, rather than into the state, as the county has to feed the prisoners if the fine is not paid and they are committed. The City of Oshkosh has recently adopted a similar policy.

The Committee therefore recommends that the traffic ordinance, submitted herewith, be adopted by the County Board.

TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR WINNEBAGO COUNTY

The following RESOLUTION NO. 19 was presented; To the Board of Supervisors Winnebago County, Wisconsin: Gentlemen

A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS OF SAID COUNTY.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:-

SECTION 1.

DEFINITIONS-

(1) VEHICLE. Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a public highway, excepting vehicles used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

(2) MOTOR VEHICLE. Every vehicle, as herein defined, which is

self-propelled

(3) OPERATOR Any person who is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

(4) HIGHWAY. A highway is every way or place of whatever nature open to the use of the public as a matter of right, for the purpose of vehicular travel

SECTION 11.

It shall be unlawful for any person who is a habitual user of narcotic drugs, or who is subject to epilepsy, or any person who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotic drugs, to operate any vehicle upon any nighway.

SECTION III.

It shall be uniawful for any person to operate any vehicle upon a highway carelessly and heedlessly, in wilful or wanton disregard of the

rights or safety of others, or without due caution and circumspection, or in any manner so as to endanger or to be likely to endanger the property, life or limb or any person, or without due regard to the traffic, surface width of the highway, and any other condition of whatever nature then existing.

SECTION IV

(1) Any person violating any of the provisions of Section II of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof. in addition to any other penalty provided by law shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the county or municipal jail for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(2) Any person violating the provisions of Section III of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be purished by a fine of not to exceed Ten Dollars for the first offense, and for the second or each subsequent conviction within one year thereafter by a fine not to exceed Twenty-five Dollars.

SECTION V

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage and publication. Dated June 13th, 1939.

The following REPORT NO 16 was read:
To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen:

The Highway Committee met on the 14th day of June, 1939, at the office of E. M. Bird Highway Commissioner, and had under consideration the resolution dated June 13th, for the construction of a temporary bridge over the Fox River in the Village of Eureka, and the providing of a passenger ferry until a foot bridge is constructed, all cost to be paid out of the Eureka Bridge Fund.

After the consideration the Committee recommends to the Board

After due consideration the Committee recommends to the Board

that the resolution be adopted.

The Board also had under consideration the matter of erecting a

temporary twenty foot roadway bridge, with the use of barges. The Committee, after careful investigation finds that there are only two barges available—one of the Carl G. Neumann Dredging Company, which is 40 feet long and one of the Cook & Brown Lime Company, which is 142 feet long. The Cook & Brown Lime Company barge would not be practical, due to the fact that one end comes to a point and it would be difficult to use it in the middle of a stream for a roadway. It might be used, however for one end next to the bank. This, however, would not leave a movable span in the center of the bridge, as required by the War Department. The only other alternative would be to use the forty foot barge, which would require the construction of structural approaches from both banks to the barge. There is also the question as to whether or not the War Department would approve a forty foot span at this point.

The Committee cannot, at this time, give a reliable estimate as to the cost of this structure. The only estimate that the Committee has is from the Wisconsir. Bridge & Iron Company, now constructing the bridge, which has given a figure of \$25.00 per foot in erecting the same, and \$10.00 per foot for dismantling it. This estimate would be approximately \$7,000.00 The cost of operation would have to be borne by Winnebago County.

This afternoon the Wisconsin Bridge & Iron Company, of Milwaukee, telephoned the Highway Commission that the estimate of \$2,000.00 for a foot bridge was cancelled. In the estimate of \$2,000.00. a Lift Bridge was not figured; therefore their new estimate for a foot bridge is \$3,500.00. They further stated that they would install a barge furnished by the county, to be used as a ferry back and forth across the river, build the approaches, and have it ready for use, for the sum of an estimated \$5,000.00. The ferry would then be turned over to the County for operation.

The rental of the Cook & Brown parge for six months would be \$1,200.00, and the rental of the Neumann barge is \$1.00 per day.

The Committee leaves it to the discretion of the Board as to whether or not a temporary roadway bridge should be constructed. Dated June 14th, 1939.

A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY RELATING TO THE DEPOSITING OF RUBBISH OR DIGGING ON COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAYS

The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County do ordain as follows

Section 1. Any person who shall throw, leave or deposit on any County Highway or any County Trunk Highway any weeds, sod, brush or other waste or rubbish shall be liable to a forfeiture of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$2.00); and every person other than a County or State official or employe who shall draw nother print or port waste or state official or employe who

and every person other than a County or State official or employe who shall draw, paint, print or paste upon any culvert, bridge or guard rail or any County Highway shall be liable to a like forfeiture.

Section 2. No person shall make any excavation in any county road or highway or shall in any manner disturb any road, highway or bridge, unless he shall first have secured a permit therefore from the County Highway Committee. Such permit shall contain the statement and be subject to the condition that such road, highway or bridge shall be restored to its former condition and that the work shall be shall be restored to its former condition, and that the work shall be constructed subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed

by said committee, and be performed and completed to the satisfaction by said committee, and be performed and completed to the satisfaction of said committee, and that the person obtaining said permit shall be liable to said county for all damages which may occur during the progress of said work or as a result thereof. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this subsection shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

Gentlemen:

Herewith follows my 21st annual preliminary report of the Winnebago County Fair and Exposition. The final report will be the auditor's report, which will be filed in the County Clerk's office when completed later in the year.

The 1939 Winnebago County Fair marked still another advance in the progress of Winnebago County. With new educational features and many new and novel attractions, this year's event presented a wide and varied appeal to fair patrons. The Type and Production Show in the Cattle Department was entirely new and required an additional expenditure of over \$300.00 for premiums, bringing the total premiums paid in that department up to a total of \$1,183.00. This was the first Type and Production Show ever put on by a county fair in Wisconsin. and drew much attention and praise from many visiting fair officials. Over \$1,000.00 additional money was spent on premiums in 1939. the total premiums paid being \$5,371.34 There was a substantial raise in the premiums paid to 4-H Club exhibits, this department being paid a total of nearly \$1,400.00 in premium purses. This unusual expenditure of money for the junior farmers was not in vain, as they staged the The 1939 Winnebago County Fair marked still another advance in of money for the junior farmers was not in vain, as they staged the best junior exhibits in the history of the county. Over 2,000 premium checks were issued in the various departments and all departments

showed an increase in both quality and volume of exhibits.

Col. J. B. Schneller of Neenah. who had charge of Midway Attractions, reported \$1,720.00 as our percentage on shows and rides. Treasurer Carl F. Fugleberg reported \$14,125.55 in ticket sales. Among the major expenditures. \$5,371.34 was spent for premiums, \$2,150.00 for race purses, \$1,000.00 for fireworks, \$3,750.00 for acts, \$1,200.00 for electrical control of the major expenditures. \$3,000.00 for permanent improvements. The amounts paid out for advertising, printing, judges, superintendents, music, ribbons and badges, water, gatemen, watchmen, police, ticket sellers, supplies, labor on grounds, and clerical help, will be classified by the auditor in his report, which will be filed with you at a later date, as well as with the state department. The Judiciary and Legislation Committee met at the office of the District Attorney at the Court House, in the City of Oshkosh, on Saturday, November 18th, at 9:00 o'clock A. M.

The Committee first had under consideration the General Ordinance of Winnebago County relating to the depositing of rubbish or digging on County Trunk Highways. The Committee recommends the adoption of

this resolution.

The Committee then had under consideration the proposal as to whether or not Winnebago County should withdraw from the Unemployment Compensation Act, which is Chapter 108 of the Wisconsin Statutes, pursuant to the privilege granted through the amendment to the Act of Chapter 245, Laws of 1939, which became effective July 17th, 1939. The Committee, after due deliberation, felt that it would be advisable for Winnebago County to withdraw inasmuch as the benefits which were paid during the time that the county was subject to the Act are out of proportion to the sums paid by Winnebago County into this special fund. The Committee feels that a resolution which will be presented by this committee, allowing Winnebago County to withdraw from the provisions of the Unemployment Compensation Act. should be adopted, and recommend that this be done.

The committee also had under consideration the question of furnishing the Wisconsin Taxpayer to members of the County Board and county officers. The Wisconsin Taxpayer is a four page printed bulletin giving vital and authoritative facts on government problems, which information is of great value to County Board members and county officers. The cost is fifty cents for one year's subscription, or three years for One Dollar. The Committee recommends that a resolution be adopted, authorizing the subscription to the Wisconsin Tax-payer for three years for each member of the Board and each county officer. A resolution has been separately drafted for this purpose.

Such permit shall contain the statement and be subject to the condition that such road, highway or bridge shall be restored to its former condition, and that the work shall be constructed subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by said committee, and be performed and completed to the satisfaction of said committee, and that the person obtaining said permit shall be liable to said county for all damages which may occur during the progress of said work or as a result thereof. Any person who shall violate the of said work or as a result thereof. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this subsection shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the Court.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and

INSURANCE COMMITTEE

The following Report No. 33 was read: The Honorable Board of Supervisors, Winnebago County, Wis. Gentlemen:

Your committee on Insurance submits the following report relating to all forms of insurance as carried by Winnebago County at the present time, and also covering changes which have taken place during the past year:

NEW COURTHOUSE. On June 15, 1939, one-fifth of this insurance was cancelled and re-written for a period of five years. This conforms to the plan of paying one-fifth of the insurance premium each year.

FAIR GROUNDS. All insurance was renewed as it fell due and the rates were checked to assure the best rate possible was being obtained. Minor adjustments were made to agree with values and additions.

Minor adjustments were made to agree with values and additions.

COUNTY ASYLUM. All insurance due during the vear was renewed as it fell due. Rates were checked and found to be as low as it was possible to obtain. Two minor fire losses were paid since making last report.

SUNNYVIEW SANATORIUM. Very little insurance fell due this year but all was renewed with no change in amounts or coverage. Rates have been checked and found to be as low as possible to obtain. The cost of Fire Department, call service in case of a major fire has been covered for a small additional premium.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT. Fire insurance on equipment and trucks Workmen's Compensation, Public Liability on operations as well as Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance was written on low bid Insurance at the new county garage was re-written in the amount of one-fifth of the total, following the plan to have one-fifth of the coverage fall due each year. Insurance on buildings moved from workhouse to new county garage was adjusted to cover at the new location. One loss was paid in the amount of \$25.00, and another loss of \$1,000.00 Both losses were on trucks that burned. Other equipment has been covered under the fire policy as it was added during the year.

STEAM BOILER INSURANCE. The Steam Boiler Insurance Policy covering such objects in all County Buildings has been renewed during the year. The Boilers at the new and old county garages have been added to the policy. In making a complete survey of all steam boilers,

air tanks, hot water tanks, and other pressure machinery, it was found that several items that should have coverage are not at the present time listed in the policy. Most of these items are air tanks, hot water heater tanks and pressure objects.

ASSISTANT TO DISTRICT ATTORNEY

The following Report No 48 was read: To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, Gentlemen:

I herewith present my report as attorney representing the Winnebago County Pension Department covering our activities in suits against other counties and municipalities for recovery of amounts of relief

furnished by Winnebago County to persons having legal settlement in other counties.

Complaints were filed against Langlade County, and the Industrial Commission set the date of July 5, 1939, for a hearing at Shawano. At the request of the City of Antigo the Kempfer case was adjourned, and the Frayer case was adjourned at our request because of the failure of one of our subpoenaed witnesses to appear. We recovered \$31.50 in the Funck case and \$121.59 plus witness fees in the case of William Green. Payment was made voluntarily in the Grey case. The LeMay case was dismissed because we were unable to make proof of verified claims having been sent to the defendant, and the Johnson case was dismissed as having been outlawed in June, 1933. The two adjourned cases will be tried the next time the Industrial Commission sets a date for hearing against Langlade County.

We then tried two actions against Columbia County in the Crossman and Lindell cases. In the former, which was hotly contested, we recovered \$281.39, the full amount of relief furnished; in the Lindell

case we recovered \$5.30.

On September 28th we tried the Collier case against Fond du Lac County and the Kohnke case at the same time. Full recovery of \$106.69 was recovered in the Collier case, and the Kohnke case was dismissed because at the time the complaint was filed the Industrial Commission had no jurisdiction to hear cases involving claims for school tuition furnished non-residents. Since this action was begun, Chapter 242 of the laws of 1939 was passed, and we shall commence proceedings anew in the Kohnke case, as Chapter 242 may be interpreted to permit us to recover school tuition. The Potratz case, set for hearing on that date, was adjourned at the request of the defendant, but will be set for a later date, and you will hear a report at some subsequent time.

On July 11, 1939, we traveled to Juneau. Wisconsin, and tried the Art Helser case and settled the Ed Helser case. In the Art Helser case it appeared that Art Helser and his family had moved across the state line into the state of Illinois back in the year 1924 and had completely lost its settlement in the State of Wisconsin; that sometime thereafter this family moved back into Wisconsin and was on relief ever after that time, finally coming to Winnebago County and applying for relief in 1929. We carried them for a period, and then Mr. Howman secured a removal order sending them back to Beloit, which was very fortunate for the county as they would otherwise be costing Winnebago County a tremendous amount for relief annually which as the matter now stands and ever since said removal order. Rock County has to bear. This claim would never have been carried on our books were if not for the fact that when the Helsers applied for relief in 1929 they made an affidavit stating their legal settlement to be in Beloit, whereas the truth of the matter was that they had lost it many years before.

The Ed Helser case was settled for \$280.00, which in our opinion was a good settlement in view of the fact that the claim was over

twelve years old.

On July 6, 1939, we took up a series of cases against Waushara County. Waushara County has at times been on the county system of relief and at times been on the town system of relief, as have most of the other counties in the state with the exception of Winnebago County, and in these cases against Waushara County we followed our usual practice of commencing the action against the town for settlement as well as the county. In seven of the cases against Waushara County, the action was dismissed as against the county, so that we had to enforce our claims against the townships involved. Two of these towns were represented by attorney, and they settled for \$45.00 in one case and \$177.50 in the other case. Both cases involved claims twelve to fifteen years old, and we felt that the settlements were very advantageous to the county In the other five cases we took default judgments against the townships for a total amount of \$21850, being in each case the full amount of our claim plus witness fees.

This left eight cases which were properly tryable against Waushara County. That county, as most of the supervisors probably know, contested our claims on the alleged theory that Winnebago County with its relief department and method of administering relief did not comply

with the provisions of the statutes, and under a strict interpretation of the statute we should not be entitled to recover. The disputed cases, involving claims totaling between \$800.00 and \$900.00, were tried on both stipulation and testimony. Thereafter, both counties filed several briefs, and early in November the Industrial Commission entered an order in favor of Winnebago County and requiring Waushara County to pay the full amount of all claims. Waushara County thereupon appealed the case to the Circuit Court of Marathon County pursuant to Chapter 242 of the laws of 1939, and this case was argued on November 17th before Circuit Judge Leicht Waushara County filed an additional brief, and I am now working on our brief. These cases are of vital importance to Winnebago County, as if we lose them on appeal we will be at a serious disadvantage in recovering most of our other claims, and we will further be compelled to change our method of administering relief. On the other hand, many counties are watching the case with interest, and if we win, will undoubtedly adopt methods similar to those utilized by our county. We are making an intensive research of the law and are sparing no effort in order to be successful in these cases because of what we have at stake.

To date, we have received adverse decisions in four of these cases out of a total of twenty-eight cases in which I have appeared. One of these cases involved school tuition, and we plan to start this action over again. Payments were made in a number of cases under threat of suit, and we believe that as time goes on payments will be made voluntarily in many other instances by counties who feel that they do

not care to risk a suit.

I will make reports similar to this from time to time as the cases

are decided.

REPORT—RADIO COMMITTEE

The following Report No. 61 was read.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wis. Gentlemen:

Your committee on rules to which was referred the resolution signed by Supervisor Howard N. Howe in which it is proposed to create a special committee to be known as the Radio Committee of the Winnebago County Board, whose proposed duties would be to have charge of all matters pertaining to Police Radio Station WAKE, met at the Court House on December 1st and have given careful consideration to

the aforesaid resolution.

The Committee on Rules is in unanimous agreement that it would be inadvisable for the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors to adopt a resolution of this nature, for the following reasons which seem con-

clusive to your committee, towit:

First, the Police Radio Station WAKE had its inception in the Sheriff's and Coroner's Committee which is charged with the responsibility of looking after matters pertaining to that department. growth of Station WAKE to its present importance in the County as an almost indispensible tool in the operation of the Sheriff's department can largely be attributed to the faithful and untiring efforts of the That Committee is thoroughly Sheriff's and Coroner's Committee. familiar with the needs and requirements of Radio Station WAKE. new committee we feel would lack the knowledge and experience now possessed by the committee now in charge of Radio. Regular standing committees of the Board, while experiencing occasional changes in the personnel of the committee, seldom if ever, are entirely composed of new members, therefore, the experinc of such standing committees is a continuing process which makes for greater efficiency as the years go by

Second: Your committee feels that the Radio is so important a part of the efficient operation of the County's protective arm that its operation and control should be vested in one body. Separate control over Radio would in our opinion lead to friction and what is now acknowledged as a smooth functioning mechanism would most likely

become disrupted with a consequent loss to Winnebago County.

Third: Your Committee feels that inasmuch as several other counties are associated with Winnebago County in the operation of Police Radio WAKE, a sudden change of committees would have an unfavorable psychological effect on such counties as are now contributing to the cost of maintenance of Station WAKE. The present Sheriff's and Coroner's Committee were instrumental in selling these counties the idea of radio and undoubtedly a change in committees at this time would be decidedly disturbing in every way

Your committee, therefore, begs to report that it is unanimously agreed that the change contemplated by Supervisor Howe's resolution

does not meet the approval of your Rules Committee.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ILLEGAL ASSESSMENTS

The following Report No. 62 was read:

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Illegal Assessments to which was referred the resolution signed and presented to the Winnebago County Board Supervisor Josseph Cater under date of November 15th, 1939, and which resolution proposes to waive the payment of all the interest, penalties, publication and redemption fees, upon the payment of the original amount of delinquent real estate taxes, other than special assessments for the years 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935 and 1936, provided the full amount of such original tax is paid on or before October 1st, 1940, has received the careful consideration of your Committee on Illegal Assessments.

Your committee is in agreement that the passage of this resolution is not advisable at this time for a number of what this committee feels are very good reasons, among which we may cite the following; teels are very good reasons, among which we may cute the following; to wit: The waiving of such interest, penalties and other fees would constitute an injustice and be a discrimination against those delinquent taxpayers who within recent troublous years have by self-denial managed to square their tax accounts with Winnebago County. It is also the opinion of your committee that such action by the Winnebago County Board would tend to encourage some taxpayers to permit their taxes to go delinquent. The fact that the last year has witnessed a trend of a substantial nature toward delinquent taxpayers settling up their delinquent taxes encourages your committee to entertain a requirement. their delinquent taxes encourages your committee to entertain a reasonable hope that this trend will continue without the necessity of the board offering such palliative measures, which, while permitted under legislative enactments, have never to your committee's knowledge been tested in the courts as to their constitutionality. Resolutions such as that in question have within recent years had the careful consideration of your Committee on Illegal Assessments and of the County Board and have been uniformly rejected by the board. This committee sees no urgency in the present instance for departing from the almost traditional attitude of Winnebago County as regards such measures as contemplated by the resolution herein considered.

Your committee, therefore, respectfully reports to your flonorable Body that we see no merit in this resolution and we recommend that

the resolution be rejected.

Your Tax Deed Committee respectfully submits the following report relating to property in the City of Menasha formerly owned by the Menasha Woodenware Corporation. The Menasha Woodenware Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "Corporation," have chosen to pay taxes on a part of their holdings and on the balance have given a Quitclaim Deed to Winnebago County. The Quitclaim Deed was given under date of December 28, 1939, after notice of intention to take tax deed had been served. The Quitclaim Deed covered property described

and includes several large buildings. The County Treasurer acting under instructions of Winnebago County ordinance pertaining to tax deed matters, placed insurance in the amount of \$32,000.00 on the buildings pending action of the Tax Deed Committee.

A meeting of the Tax Deed Committee was held on January 8, 1940, for the purpose of inspecting the property thus acquired and discussion of the possibility of disposing of the property. The committee found the buildings to be in 2 bad state of repair and it was questionable, with one exception, if the buildings could be used for any purpose. The one exception was a five-story brick building formerly used as a paint shop by the Corporation. It appeared to the committee this building might be used for light manufacturing purposes if a purchaser could be obtained. The old sawmill was especially in a state of

repair so that it was very doubtful if it would be possible to realize anything on the sale of it either for salvage or any other purpose. Another four-story brick building known as the barrel factory, although in a bad state of repair, might be sold to advantage because of salvage value. This building contained considerable machinery which probably would be used for scrap-iron. Some of the other wood-working buildings might be worth something for salvage.

The property itself is located on the canal running through the City of Menasha and has a spur trailroad between the canal and the buildings and another spur railroad between the rear of the buildings and the Fox River. The land is suitable for a manufacturing site and, in view of this, the committee feels the land value should be con-

At this meeting the Tax Deed Committee decided to continue the amount of insurance placed by the Treasurer and adjourned the meeting for one week.

On January 17, the committee met and decided to reduce the insurance from \$32,000.00 to \$10,000.00, placing \$8,000.00 on the paint shop, \$1,000.00 on the barrel factory and \$1,000.00 on the woodworking buildings. The committee discussed all angles pertaining to the sale of the property and instructed the Treasurer to let it be known through publicity and any other contacts he might have with salvage companies that Winnebago County would dispose of this property as soon as possible obtaining the highest price possible. Invitation was extended to make offers to the county and such offers would be submitted to the County Board at the March session.

It seemed advisable to the Tax Deed Committee that the property be sold in its entirety if an offer is made. In the event an offer is not received covering the entire premises, it would be next best to sell it in two separate parcels. The committee felt that by obtaining offers on any part or all of the buildings, such offers would form a basis in determining the marketable value of the property. Any offers received will not be binding on the County Board, but, if the Board felt that such offers constituted a fair value, they would be in position to accept the offer and dispose of the property at an early date.

The committee further recommends that in the appliance of the salary schedule, if adopted by the Board, any employee, who at the time of the adoption of the schedule has been employed for six months

or more, will become eligible for second year ratings.

The committee further recommends that the employees in the first year bracket receive no vacation; that the employees in the second year bracket receive one week's vacation with pay; that employees in the third year bracket, and thereafter, receive two weeks' vacation with pay.

The committee further recommends that there be seniority in all departments, in that when an older employee leaves the employ of the

county the junior employees would then advance.

The committee further recommends that, so far as advisable, when vacancies occur in any office, new employees be selected from the present county employees, it being the intention of the committee to allow present employees to better themselvs by advancing when vacancies occur.

The committee further recommends that Resolution No. 65, adopted on the 6th day of December, 1939, furnishing gas, oil, and grease to the motorcycle officers, be rescinded, inasmuch as the committee has provided for salary increases, to cover these expenditures, in the Schedule.

The committee further recommends that all resolutions in conflict with the present salary schedule be rescinded.

The committee further recommends that the following resolution be adopted:-

Be It Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago Coulnty, that the salary schedule, (excluding that of County Supt. of Schools and the County Judge). set forth in the report of the Special Committee be and the same hereby is adopted, effective April 1st, 1940.

Be It Further Resolved, that Resolution No. 65, adopted by the Board of Supervisors on the 6th day of December, 1939, be and the same hereby is rescinded, and that the balance of the sum of \$3,500.00 set up in the budget for the year 1940, for the furnishing of gas. oil.

Be It Further Resolved, that the sum of \$3,700.00 be appropriated from the Contingent Fund for the purpose of paying the increase in

salaries from April 1st, 1940, to the end of the year.

Be It Further Resolved, that employees in the first year bracket receive no vacation; that the employees in the second year bracket receive one week's vacation with pay; that employees in the third year bracket, and thereafter, receive two weeks' vacation with pay.

Be It Further Resolved, that all previous resolutions in conflict

herewith be and the same hereby are rescinded.
