#### RULES OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF

#### WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED MAY 7, 1940

I. The meetings of this board shall be held in the supervisors' room, and the hour for daily meetings shall be 10 a. m. and the county board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless to a day certain or sine die.

II. At the first meeting of the board, it shall be the duty of the chairman, or in the case of his absence, the vice chairman, or in their absence, the clerk to call to order.

The clerk shall then call the roll of members.

A quorum being present the board shall proceed to the election of a chairman and vice chairman.

III. It shall be the duty of the chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee viz:

Abstracter and Reg. of Deeds, three; Aviation, five; Bonds and Salaries, five; Budget, four (County Clerk ex-officio); Conservation, three; County Fair, five; Education, three; Equalization, five; Finance nine; General Accounts, five; Illegal Assessments, five; Insane, five; Insurance, three; Investments, three; Judiciary Legislation, five; Justice and Constable, five; Per Diem and Mileage, five; Poor and County Home, three; Printing, three; Public Buildings, five; Rules, three; Sanatorium, five; Seed Loan, three; Sheriff and Coroners, seven; Social Security, five; Tax Deed, five.

IV. A county highway committee consisting of five members to represent cities, towns and villages, and all other elective committees and elective officers, are to be elected annually at the November session of the board.

V. The board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the chairman to prepare the list of committees, and no business can be done unt' the same shall be announced.

VI. The chairman, or in his absence, the vice chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the clerk. In the absence of both the chairman and the vice chairman, a chairman pro tem shall be elected.

VII. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the board provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment corrected.

VIII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

1. Reception of petitions, memorials, accounts, etc.

2. Presentation of resolutions and disposition of same.

3. Reports of standing committees.

4. Reports of select committees.

5. Consideration of miscellaneous business.

IX. Every subject matter that shall come before the board shall be referred to the appropriate committee by the chairman, without motion.

X. The chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the board and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

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XI. The chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and nays, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie, it shall be deemed to have been lost, but any member voting on either side of the question may present the same question again at such a time as provided in Section XXIII.

XII. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the board.

XIII. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committees shall be endorsed thereon.

XIV. Every member previous to speaking, shall rise and address the chair.

XV. When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is to speak first, but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the chair shall speak first.

XVI. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the board.

XVII. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, members voting the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the county board.

XVIII. No account or claim against the county shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the clerk of the board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XIX. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except.

1. To adjourn.

2. To lay on the table.

3. For the previous question.

4. To postpone to a day certain.

5. To commit to a committee.

6. To amend or to substitute.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XX. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XXI. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not again be entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XXII. A substitute shall be opened to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXIII. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding day, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent. XXIV. The previous question may be removed by any member, and the chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put" which, if carried by a vote of twothirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment if any, and upon the main question.

XXV. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be put first.

XXVII. Any of these rules may be suspended upon pending measure by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVIII. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the board until alterated or repealed, as herein provided.

XXIX. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Roberts' Rules of Order," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the board

XXX. Whenever the board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

XXXI. No resolution for the appropriation of money shall be in order until the day after its presentation and reference, except upon the consent of two-thirds of the members of the county board present.

XXXII. All reports, resolutions and petitions must be presented in typewritten form in a quadruplicate so that one copy will be immediately available to the local press, and the same to be read by the clerk of the board.

XXXIII. All resolutions calling for an appropriation of money, and all resolutions, the adoption of which will require an ultimate expenditure of money or an appropriation by the county board, shall be presented to the county clerk of Winnebago county ex-officio member of the budget committee, at least ten (10) days prior to the opening day of the annual November session of the county board, and no bill or resolution calling for a appropriation of money shall be received by the board without the unanimous consent of the board after that time.

Meeting called to order by Arthur E. Hedke, County Clerk.

Roll call showed full board present.

The following supervisors, after severally subscribing to the oath of office were duly sworn as such supervisors. The Honorable Judge D. E. McDonald administered the oath for the twentieth consecutive year. STATE OF WISCONSIN.

The first informal result: Shea, 40; Heckner, 1; Cotter, 1; Sonnenberg, 1. Motion made and seconded that informal ballot be declared formal and J. F. Shea be declared elected Chairman for the ensuing year, CARRIED. Chairman Shea addressed the board and expressed appreciation for the confidence shown in his re-election and asked the continued cooperation of the board members.

The next order of business was the election of a vice Chairman. First Informal vote resulted: R. M. Heckner 27, L. W. Clark 16. First Formal Ballot resulted: R. M. Heckner 30, L. W. Clark 12. R. M. Heckner having received the majority of the votes was declared elected vice-Chairman for the ensuing year. Vice-Chairman Heckner addressed the board, thanking them for his re-election.

A communication from the State Department of Taxation was read, relative to the Supervisor of Assessments duties. On motion accepted and placed on file.

A communication from Wisconsin County Boards Association relative to Civil Service in Pension Department was read and referred to the Social Security Committee.

Motion made and seconded that same rules as governed board the last year be adopted, LOST (accl.)

Motion made and seconded that Equalization Committee be reduced from 9 to 3—one to represent City of Oshkosh, one the northern part of the County and one from the rural section of the county, CARRIED (accl.).

Motion made and seconded that Social Security Committee be increased from 3 to 5, (motion withdrawn).

Motion made and seconded that board adopt the same rules as last year with the exception of Rule No. 26... (ruled out of order) ... Same motion put again and CARRIED (accl.).

Motion made and seconded that the board nominate a committee composed of the Chairman, vice-Chairman, Clerk and five members of the board to make selections of standing committees for the year. (withdrawn).

On motion, board adjourned until 1:20 p.m.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

Board met pursuant to adjournment and called to order by Chairman J. F. Shea

On motion Equalization Committee be reduced from 9 to 5 members. CARRIED.

On motion Social Security Committee increased from 3 to 5 members. CARRIED.

On motion Finance Committee increased from 8 to 9 members. CARRIED.

On motion General Accounts Committee reduced from 7 to 5 members. CARRIED.

On motion Tax Deed Committee increased from 3 to 5 members. CARRIED.

On motion Committee on Insane increased from 3 to 5 members. CARRIED.

On motion Justice & C. Committee reduced from 7 to 5 members. CARRIED.

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Motion made and seconded that board adjourn until 10 a.m., Wednesday. LOST (acclamation).

The Clerk addressed the board asking for consideration of the following: Audit of the Clerk of Courts Office; a room for the representative to the Income Tax Division; enlargement and appropriation for new County Directory; an appropriation and resolution for Tax Deed expense; and the unfinished business for Clerk of Court's hire under Resolution No. 8 of the March, 1939 Session referred to Judiciary & Legislation Committee and Resolution No. 18 of the November, 1939, Session referred to the Special Salaries Committee.

Motion made and seconded that Rule No. 5 be suspended for this afternoon and the board proceed with the regular business. CARRIED (acclamation).

#### CANCEL TAX DEED-TWELFTH WARD

A communication from Luncoln County relating to the annual Convention of County Boards Association was read. On motion accepted and placed on file. CARRIED

Accounts were read and referred to the proper committees.

#### BIDS, MENASHA WOODENWARE COMPANY

The following Report No. 1 was raed:

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Your Tax Deed Committee respectfully reports that pursuant to resolution adopted by Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, March 15, 1940, they have proceeded to carry out the instructions given them in said resolution.

Your committee has advertised the property formerly owned by the Menasha Wooden Ware Corporation in the Oshkosh Northwestern, Post Crescent of Appleton and Milwaukee Journal, specifying that bids on the property be submitted to the office of the County Treasurer not later than May 6, 1940.

Your committee met in the courthouse, Monday, May 6, and gave careful consideration to the bids submitted, which are compiled as follows:

Bid of Strange Paper Company for \$12,000.00, covering land and buildings on Parcels No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4. This proposal was for purchase on installment plan, \$2,0000.00 as down-payment and balance in thirty-day installments of \$1,000.00 each, first installment to be paid thirty days following date of down-payment, no interest charge to be made by county on unpaid balances.

Bid of Menasha Wooden Ware Corporation for \$3,000.00, covering land and buildings on Parcel No. 1.

Bid of Dave Zimmerman, Chilton, Wisconsin, was for \$1,327, and covered buildings for salvage on Parcel No. 3.

Bid of Ben Weidemann was for \$4,000.00, and covered land and building on Parcel No. 2.

Bid of A-Abbey Wrecking Company, Chicago, Illinois, was for \$3,-200.00, and covered salvage only on all four parcels of property.

Bid of Wm. Friedman Wrecking Company, Chicago, was for \$4,-250.00, covering all buildings for salvage, leaving the rubbish and debris on the premises. This company also submitted an alternative bid of \$2,100.00, which proposal would require removal of all rubbish and debris.

Bid of Advance Lumber and Sales Company, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, asked that the County pay \$750.000 for removal of all buildings for salvage on all four parcels of property.

The bids were all accompanied by the necessary 5% deposit and were legally submitted insofar as the requirements of the resolution passed by the board, demanded.

After giving considerable thought to the difficulties that might be encountered if the county should decide to sell the buildings for salvage and taking into consideration that it would be some time before the buildings could be razed so that the land might be sold, your committee respectfully recommends that the bid of John Strange Paper Company for \$12,000.00, covering Parcels No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4, land and buildings combined and the bid of the Menasha Woodenware Corporation for \$3,000.00, covering Parcels No. 1, land and building combined, be accepted and proper resolution adopted by the County Board authorizing the proper county officials to quitclaim these properties to these organizations.

#### AMEND PENSION ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND A GENERAL ORDINANCE TO CREATE A PENSION DEPARTMENT.

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented: The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County do ordain as follows: Section 1. Section V, of a General Ordinance to Create a Pension Department, adopted by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County on the 23rd day of November, 1937, is amended to read as follows:

#### AVIATION COMMITTEE-AIRPORT

The following Report No. 1 was read:-

To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County :-Gentlemen:-

The Aviation Committee has had under consideration for several weeks the proposition of purchasing the property known as Oshkosh Airport Inc., consisting of 100 acres, and a piece of property of ap-proximately 57.4 acres, known as the Knoke Farm, lying between the Oshkosh Airport and the Soo Line tracks, which would make a total of 157.4 acres

The Committee met on June 6th, 1940 with the officials of the Airport and the Citizens Committee. They also met on the 11th day of July. 1940, with Albert March and Richard Lutz, officials of the Oshkesh Airport, Inc.

The Committee also attempted to have a man come to Oshkosh from the Federal Aeronautics Authority, but was unable to do so due to the fact that the Oshkosh Airport is not municipally owned The Committee was advised that under the Civil Aeronautics Authority the Government will expend one hundred twenty-five million dollars on a 80%-20% basis-in other words, the county furnish 20% and the Federal Government 80%.

This afternoon the Committee called the Hon. Frank B. Keefe. Congressman from this District, and were advised that while no money was available, other than W. P. A., at the present time legislation is now in the process of being completed, whereby money will be avail-able under the Civil Aeronautics Authority for improving municipally owned airports.

The Committee finds that various countles thru-out the state have municipally owned airports.

The Committee, on making an investigation of the present property of the Oshkosh Airport, Inc., finds that there is a natural terrain and good drainage to the 20th Street sewer. The runways are of crushed gravel and the North and South runways are 2660 feet in length and the East and West 1660 feet in length. There are no high tension wires or other obstructions hindering free access to the airport.

At present time there are no water connections with the City of Oshkosh all water being supplied by a well. In order to put in water.

the cost, based on income equivalent to eight consumers, would be \$600.00. If a WPA project could be arranged there would be very little cost. The premises, at the present time, consist of 100 acres, on which is located a concrete block building. 80x96 ft., capable of housing ten to

eleven planes, depending on size; a beacon light, fencing, and runways. The Committee feels that if the County Board desires to purchase the present airport of 100 acres it should be made conditional upon obtaining the 57.4 acres, known as the Knoke farm, and some assurance that Federal legislation will be passed and that Federal funds would be available to improve the lands if purchased.

The price asked by the Oshkosh Airport, Inc., is \$34,000.00 for the 100 acres. The price asked by Greenlaw-Thomas for the additional acreage is \$11,000.00 or a total purchase price of \$45,000.00 Dated July 15th 1940.

#### ACCOUNTS UNCOLLECTIBLE

#### CHIPPEWA COUNTY

Herbert Hendricks, total account \$132.45, for relief given in this case, all in year 1930, and settlement in the amount of \$66.23 or half of the claim was recommended by the District Attorney and made on that basis for the reason that the whereabouts of the family was unknown and the burden of proof of settlement being on Winnebago County it would have been difficult if not impossible to prove their case.

#### COLUMBIA COUNTY

Oscar Lindell, total amount of relief \$89.00. It appeared that the City of Oshkosh had provided \$83.70 of the amount claimed, after there had been a duly entered removal order. It was possible to collect only \$5.30 worth of relief advanced prior to the removal order. DODGE COUNTY

Gerhardt Moerke, total account \$815.81. In this case it appeared at the trial that the family had lost its legal settlement in Dodge County and was a county-at-large charge. The case was therefore dismissed by the Industrial Commission.

Ben & Dell Tollard. In this case the total claim on our books was \$953.35. Of this \$24.50 had been advanced by the town as attorney fees to have the Tollards removed from the township The Industrial Commission allowed all items on the account except this, declaring that attorney fees are not collectable items of relief so that part of the bill will have to be written off.

#### FOND DU LAC COUNTY

Carlton Cundy, total account \$23.91. The Commission decided there was insufficient proof of their settlement so that they could make decision one way or another. The burden of proof was on Winnebago County to establish settlement beyond a reasonable doubt.

Gerald Waite case involves .08, and collection of that amount does not merit the expense involved.

#### LANGLADE COUNTY

Frank Gaborski case involves 64c. As in the Gerald Waite case the amount involved is so small that it does not warrant action to recover it.

Ellen Johnson, total account \$297.40 At the hearing the Industrial Commission found the last relief was given in June 1927, and rendered a decision that it was outlawed before our action was commenced.

Velma LeMay, total account \$130.98. Relief was furnished in the

years 1926 and 1927 and in searching through the records we were un-able to obtain satisfactory proof of the filing of verified claims. Ernest Frayer, total account \$86.57. In this case the city of Neenah filed the affidavit setting out the wrong township as legal settlement, so that it was hopeless to try to collect the relief granted from the municipality where the relief recipent actually had had a legal settlement.

#### MILWAUKEE COUNTY

Bud Warner, total amount claimed \$16.98. The auditors found this was an incorrect charge made by the bookkeeper ONEIDA COUNTY

F. Omniszek, total account \$2.00. This case appears to be a very ancient case dating back to 1926 and only involves \$2.00. It is therefore recommended that it be written off.

#### PRICE COUNTY

Leonard Webb, total account \$9.13 It appears that the recipient Leonard Webb gave an incorrect affidavit as to his legal settlement and left Winnebago County before it was possible to obtain another affidavit with the correct information. For that reason it is recommended that the account be written of as uncollectable.

#### ROCK COUNTY

Arthur Helser, total account \$1,801.48. This case was tried before the Industrial Commission and appeared from the defendant's evidence that the Arthur Helser family had moved from Beloit in Rock County into Illinois in the year 1924 and had completely lost his legal settlement in the state of Wisconsin and that thereafter the family had been continuously on reliet and had not gained a legal settlement in any municipality in Wisconsin. These facts did not appear on the affidavit filed by the Helsers when they originally applied for relief in Winnebago County, and in view of proof of these facts it was impossible to collect this account.

Ed. Helser claim was in the amount of \$457.52, for relief furnished back in 1927. Due to the fact that we were unable to secure witnesses and due to the age of the claim, we deemed it advisable to settle this claim for \$220.00 so that it is necessary to write off the balance in the amount of \$177.52.

#### MARATHON COUNTY

Robert Feavel, total account \$164.85. This account is from 1924-1925 and 1927. Affidavits were filed by the village of Omro and the city of Oshkosh charging legal settlement in different places none of which apparently were correct. We have a notation in the County Clerk's office stating that this account was to be written off as uncollectable in 1926.

#### WAUSHARA COUNTY

Florence McCelland total account \$76.85. This account together with the Oscar Nelson case involving \$211.77, involved the same county and same township as defendants. These dated back to 1927 and were settled with the townships for \$45 and \$177.50 respectively so that the amount of \$31.85 and \$34.27 respectively should be written off as a loss on the two accounts. Because of the age of the claims and the difficulty of securing witnesses it is felt that the settlements were very advantageous to Winnesses to Winnesses to winnesses were very advantageous to Winnebago County,

Jacob Neuman. The auditors found an erroneous charge of \$11.52 against this account. It is therefore uncollectable.

#### MARATHON COUNTY

Joseph Butrem. There was a difference of 1c in the amount of the checks that they forwarded for payment of this account. It is recommended that it be written off.

#### VILAS COUNTY

Woodrow Packard. In this case Vilas County paid all but 62c and the party has since become a charge of this county and as the account is so small it is recommended that no action be taken to collect it.

Whereas it is advisable at this time to have the Committee enter into negotiations to determine the actual price for which these properties could be bought, and the Committee be empowered to obtain options at the lowest price obtainable, and then report back to the Board of Supervisors for final determination

#### AIRPORT REPORT

The following Report No. 4 was read. To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:-Gentlemen:-

The Aviation Committee met this morning at the Court House, in the City of Oshkosh.

Present: Kitz, Kittleson, Dreger, Metzig, Schultz and Shea.

The purpose of the meeting was to draft a report to the Board of the activities of this Committee since the last session of the Board. We respectfully submit the following report:-

On July 26th the entire committee visited the airports of Madison and Milwaukee, for the purpose of determining what kind or class airport was needed by Winnebago County.

On July 31st the entire committee met with S. J. Wittman and

Richard Lutz, and went over the Oshkosh Airport grounds. We also inspected two pieces of property between Oshkosh and Neenah.

On August 6th the committee met with Mr. Todd, of the Civil Aeronautics Authority and Mr. Torkelson, of the State Planning Board and discussed the requirements of a Class (3) Airport, and the need of an airport in this particular location.

The committee at that time thought it would be more advisable to subdivide into three groups so that more work could be accomplished in the short period of time. The sub-committees were as follows:--

(1) Kittleson and Dreger.

(2) Schultz and Metzig

(3) Shea and Kitz.

On August 8th Supervisors Kittleson and Dreger traveled to Madison to interview WPA officials to determine whether or not Federal funds would be available for a county airport, if the same was established. They were advised to make immediate application for funds so that they would be available when the land was purchased.

As a result thereof an application for \$210.000.00 was immediately filed. This includes the sponsor's and the Government's share, and also included the land which would have to be purchased by the sponsor.

Supervisors Schultz and Metzig were delegated to interview property-owners surrounding the present airport and airport officials. This they proceeded to do on August 8th.

Supervisors Shea and Kitz were delegated to interview the Northwest Airway officials at Minneapolis, which they did on August 9th. Their purpose was to determine whether or not passenger and mail planes would use the Winnebago County airport facilities if one were established. No definite assurances as to time were given, but a very definite interest was shown in the proposed airport.

On August 10th the sub-committees met to discuss the question as a committee of the whole

The Committee felt that approximately 300 acres of land would be necessary to construct a Class (3) airport

The Committee therefore makes the the following recommendations: (1) That Winnebago County establish a county airport.

(2) That said airport be at least a Class (3) airport, which would require minimum run-ways of 3,500 feet. The committee feels that anything less than a Class (3) airport would not meet the requirements of Winnebago County.

(3) That the Board appropriate the sum of \$75,000.00 from the General Fund, to be set up in an Airport Fund, for the purchase of the present airport site, and sufficient additional land surrounding the present airport site to constitute a Class (3) airport.

(4) That Winnebago County take immediate advantage of Federal Aids to secure sufficient funds to complete the construction or erection of a Class (3) airport.

The committee did not submit a resolution at this time as they would like to have the Board go over this report and then a resolution can be drawn up in accordance with the wishes of the majority of the Board.

#### SANATORIUM COMMITTEE—UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

The following Report No. 7 was read: To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:-Gentlemen:-

At the last November session of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, it was brought to the attention of your Committee on Sanatorium that Sunnyview Sanatorium had not been charged for the amount of the unemployment compensation contribution paid by the county for that institution from July 1st, 1934, to July 1st, 1939. This amount was included in the appropriations made by the Winnebage County Board of Supervisors.

Upon investigation we found this fact to be true. Because of this, Sunnyview Sanatorium did not include same in their weekly per capita cost. At a meeting in March of the trustees and committees of both cost. At a meeting in March of the trustees and committees of both counties, a memorandum of the payments made to the reserve fund for Sunnyview Sanatorium for each year from July 1st, 1934, to June 30th, 1939, was given. This was the first definite knowledge the trustees had that the institution might become liable for the payment of this amount to the county. This memorandum drew a protest from the Double of Drustees addressed to the V fully and the second Board of Trustees, addressed to Mr. J. F. Shea, Chairman of the Board. This letter of protest was taken up with the District Attorney, who ruled that they were under the Act, unless their employees were paid a yearly salary, and therefore exempt.

At a meting of the trustees and committees at the Sanatorium on May 28th, 1940, the question of billing the Sanatorium for their contribution for the year July 1st, 1939, to June 30th, 1940, was dis-cussed. At the request of the Board of Trustees, Miss Mattson, Supt. of Sunnyview Sanatorium, requested Mr. Floyd Wright that billing be made which me down made, which was done.

At meetings on June 5th and 6th of the Committee, the additional weekly per capita cost for the years July, 1934, to June, 1939, inclusive, were figured out, copies of which are herewith attached. The total amount is \$4,022.86.

Following a meeting of the trustees and committees of both counfor \$464.81, covering contribution for the year July 1st, 1939, to June 30th, 1940, for the reason that the Board of Trustees were of the opinion that employment was handled at the institution in such a way as they could be reasonably excluded from the defined payroll.

Your Committee Chairman, Mr. Wright, and Mr. Paul Hobbs, District Examiner of the Unemployment Compensation Department, discussed the matter of Rule No. 4, which pertains to exclusion of employees of governmental units who are paid on an annual salary basis. A copy of this rule was sent to Mr. Davis. Mr. Davis, in reply, wrote the following better: wrote the following letter:-

"July 3, 1940-Mr. Floyd L. Wright

Office of County Highway Commission Court House,

Oshkosh, Wisconsin, Dear Mr. Wright:

Replying to your letter without date received today quoting rules of the Industrial Commission regarding governmental employees and the unemployment insurance act.

The trustees are familiar with this act and have knowledge of the rules which you quote. All employees of the sanatorium at the present time, and for the past several years, have been employed under a verbal contract, the nature of which fully exempts the institution from the requirements of the unemployment insurance act under this ruling.

In the past, and so long as Winnebago County chose to pay for this unemployment insurance from the county funds, the matter was one under which no decision or ruling on the part of the trustees of Sunnyview Sanatorium was proper. Now that Winnebago County is taking action to collect such unemployment insurance from the sanatorium funds, for which the trustees are responsible, the trustees have no alternative except to refuse to pay such bill on the grounds that it is an unnecessary expense not properly chargeable to the operation of the institution, and therefore cannot be legally authorized to be paid from sanatorium funds.

We are informed by the sanatorium committee of Fond du Lac County that the Fond du Lac County institutions are exempt from the provisions of this unemployment insurance act, and the Fond du Lac County trustees have been instructed by this committee specifically not to allow the bill for \$464.81 rendered by your department to cover such unemployment insurance expense for the year from July 1, 1939 through June 30, 1940 through June 30, 1940.

The trustees are willing to discuss this situation with any state authorities who feel that they have jurisdiction, but we do not believe there are any such state authorities who by expressing opinions or rendering decisions, can relieve the trustees of legal responsibility to see that no sanatorium funds are improperly disbursed."

This letter was used by Mr. Hobbs as a basis for discussion with the commission at Madison. Mr. Hobbs alo requeted that an audit be made of the unemployment compensation records.

Mr. Merriman, the auditor, made such audit. While here he in-formed Mr. Wright that if we drafted a letter of certification covering Rule No. 4, and have same signed by the head of the institution, and sent to the commission, they would, in all likelihood, grant the ex-clusion. Such a certification was drafted has been signed and sent to the commission. If exclusion is granted, and we have every reason to believe that it will, there is a possibility of a credit being entered of the amounts mentioned in this report. If such is the case the mat-ter will be closed, and it will not be necessary for the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors to take any action on the various amounts due Board of Supervisors to take any action on the various amounts due from other counties as herewith attached.

The Asylum Trustees have been kept informed regarding the progress of this matter.

#### REPORT OF AVIATION COMMITTEE

The following Report No. 1 was read:-

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY:-Gentlemen:

Since the last meeting of the Board held on August 13th, 1940, the Committee has been active in attempting to decide upon sites to recom-mend to the Board and in attempting to decide upon sites to attainmend to the Board, and in obtaining options at the best prices obtainable. The

The first meeting of the Committee was held on August 23rd. entire committee was present, and Mr. Spark of Neenah was present He had no definite proposition to offer to the Committee as far as sites were concerned. One site was suggested by him, and the Committee visited this site which was beautiful to the committee of County visited this site, which was located at the northwest corner of County Trunk A and GG, in the Town of Vinland. The Committee also con-sulted with Mr. Mar Black and G sulted with Mr. Max Block and Grover C. Cowling, regarding the site.

The Committee again met on August 26th. All members were pres-ent but Mr. Shea. The Committee divided into two groups-one group consisting of Supervisors Schultz and Schultz and CODconsisting of Supervisors Schultz and Dreger, and the other group consisting of Supervisors Kittleson, Kitz, and Metzig.

The larger group visited Mr. Lutz and Metzig. rounding the present Airport, in attempting to get cost of present Air-port and surrounding lands and the titled the Vinland port and surrounding lands, and the other group visited the Vinland

Street land owners for the same purpose. The smaller group, in the afternoon, visited Mr. Grundman, and A". also visited the landowners of the suggested site on County Trunk "A". and GG, to-wit, Albert Yost, Albert Karow, and Grover Cowling. Mr. Block was absent from his home at the time, and Supervisor Schultz

Block was absent from his home at the time, and Supervisor Schultz agreed to visit him later and report back on his findings. The next committee meeting was held on September 4th. At this time a committee appointed by the different organizations of Oshkosh were present, to-wit, Mr. Bart Heiss, Mr. Whitman, Mr. G. Nevitt, Mr. A. Shunway, Mr. C. Steiger, and Mr. E. Iwick. Later Mr. Spark and Mr. Radke of Neenah arrived. The latter two had no information to submit, but merely stated that the Neenah people would not support the present location if it were selected by the County Board

Showing, but intrify stated that the recentar people would not support the present location, if it were selected by the County Board. The question of sites was discussed, with arguments pro and con by all committees. Mr. Shea suggested that the committee hire an engineer and have elevations of land taken on the sites to establish the approximate cost of improvements necessary for the laying of run-ways, etc. The visiting committees were satisfied with this suggestion.

On the same day the Committee met with Mr. Schroder and Mr. Diestier, about one mile East of the village. The Committee later that afternoon, motored to the proposed site near Winneconne, and made an inspection of the site and consulted with the owner. The Committee left Winneconne and went by way of Omro and

looked at land along Highway 21, between Oshkosh and Omro. The Committee then agreed to have Mr. Shea consult Mr. Piasecki, Manager of the Milwaukee County Airport regarding engineering services for the various sites, which might be submitted to the County Board.

The findings of the Committee are attached hereto marked Exhibits "B" "C". "D", "E", and "F".

The Committee again met on September 16th, and Supervisor Dreger was instructed to have Len Schultz, Engineer, and a helper of the Coun-ty Highway Department, accompany him to the proposed air sites No. 2 and 3, to take levels of the land and make an approximate cost of rough grading, etc., and submit the findings to the next Aviation Committee meeting, which was held on September 21st. At this meeting all members were present; also Thomas F. Cosgrove, Engineer, and Major F. E. Piasecki, Manager of the Milwaukee County Airport; also

Dresent were George P. Nevitt and H. W. Nankervis, of Oshkosh, Wilbur Sparks, Elmer Radtke, and E. A. Rhoades, of Neenah, The four proposed sites were visited that day and verbal reports were made by Mr. Cosgrove and Mr. Plasecki, They agreed to make a written report and present it to the Committee.

They felt that the necessary work required to repair proposed Sites No. 3 and 4, would be too great on account of the condition of the land. They felt that proposed Site No. 1 was the most reasonable and pro-posed Site No. 2 as a second choice after due consideration of all factors involved.

The Committee met again on September 25th. Mayor Oaks was present at this meeting and presented his arguments regarding a de-fense program, and assured the committee that sewer and city water would be forthcoming without any cost to the county. Mr. Morgan and Mr. Scholl were questioned with regard to fees

for preparing topographical maps. These fees ran in excess of the amount appropriated, and therefore nothing was done on that subject.

The Committee then hired the McMahon Engineering firm to prepare preliminary plans for right-of-ways, etc., at a cost not to exceed

A committee also decided to get options on all lands per-taining to proposed Sites No. 1 and 2. A committee of three members consisting of Supervisors Schultz, Kitz, and Dreger, met on October 2nd, for the purpose of obtaining options on proposed air sites No. 1 and 2. This work continued until Outphon 2nd Dreger was no all the approximate optional on sub-October 3rd. During these two day options were obtained on all the necessary land, with the exception of Mr. Nolte, who refused to sign an option unless he received a substantial payment therefor.

The cost of the land, including the Runke farm, is set forth in

Exhibit "G" attached hereto. The Committee submits herewith Exhibit "H", which shows the present assessed valuations for tax purposes of the lands included in

proposed sites No. 1, and 2. Supervisors Shea Kitz. Kittleson, Schultz and Dreger after due con-sideration, recommend to the Board that if the county should decide to

purchase a site that proposed Site No. 1 be purchased, and as a second

choice, proposed Site No. 2. Supervisor Metzig, after some consideration, feels that proposed Site No. 2 should be purchased as first choice, and proposed Site No. 1 as a second choice. Dated October 11th, 1940.

#### EXHIBIT "C"

#### "AIRPORT SITE NO. 1"

#### 20TH STREET ROAD, TOWN OF ALGOMA

DESCRIPTION

This proposed airport site is located on the 20 Street Road, County Trunk K, joining the south city limits of the City of Oshkosh, one quarter mile west from Highway 45 and 26, three-quarter mile east from Highway 44, and two and one-half miles southwest from down town section of Oshkosh.

The proposed field consists of the present airport and other lands making a total of 297.7 acres.

The field being fairly level having a high point at the southwest corner of the present airport of 10 feet above the northeast corner. Other lands that will have to be purchased are somewhat lower than the high point mentioned.

The high point should be removed to a lower point which would require the removing of approximately 3,000 cubic yards of dirt at a cost of \$900.00.

After the high point is removed the land would have a natural drainage in all directions.

Approximately 16,000 cubic yards of filling may be required to level off some parts of the field towards the south and southwest ends which will cost approximately \$8,000.00.

will cost approximately \$3,000.00. This location can have connections to city sewer and water system. A private fire hydrant can be installed on the airport field for fire protection.

A private road separates the airport and the Soo Line Railway tracks at the northeast corner of the field.

#### EXHIBIT "D"

#### "AIRPORT SITE NO. 2"

#### VINLAND STREET ROAD, TOWN OF VINLAND

DESCRIPTION:

This proposed airport site is located at the southwest corner of County Trunk J, and JJ, in the Town of Vinland, one-half mile west from Highway 45 and 41, one mile east from Highway 110 one mile north of Oshkosh city limits and three miles northwest from down town section of City of Oshkosh.

This proposed field consists of 454.4 acres, less 10.4 acres which is to be retained by Geo. Gallinger, one of the owners of the property considered.

The land being fairly level near the east and west lines and having a shallow section running from the south-east to the northwest corner of field which now seems to drain both directions from the center.

Present elevation on field from high to low point is eleven feet, which is from the center on east line to the center of field. The acreage is large enough for a Class 4 Port.

This location requires a private sewer and water system for toilet facilities,

All buildings pertaining to headquarters on this field should be located on the east end Vinland Street Road.

Several wooded sections will have to be removed which will make all landings and take-offs clear.

Approximately 75,000 cubic yards of dirt on high points will have to be removed, costing 30c per yard, \$22,500.00.

The C. & N. W. Railway tracks join the entire south line of the field.

A high line is now located on J, which can be lowered or relocated at a cost of \$400.00.

In case it is necessary to make the field nearly level it will require a considerable amount of hauled in filling.

#### EXHIBIT "E"

#### "AIRPORT SITE NO. 3"

#### COUNTY TRUNK "A" TOWN OF VINLAND

DESCRIPTION:

This proposed airport site is located at the northwest corner of intersection of County Trunk A and GG, in the Town of Vinland, Three miles east of Highway 45 and 41, five miles south from the City of Nee-

miles east of Highway 45 and 41, ive miles south from the City of the nah, eight miles north from the City of Oshkosh. The proposed field consists of 336 acres of land. The field being fairly level on all outer lines, having a five foot rise at the center of the Yost property, and a shallow area from the south-west to the northeast corner which must be tiled and filled in. The surface water from the southwest of the surrounding property must pass over the shallow area of the field. This shallow area should be filled in at least two feet and approximately 3.000 lineal feet of 21 be filled in at least two feet and approximately 3,000 lineal feet of 21 inch tile piping should be laid from the southwest corner towards the northeast corner to take care of the water.

A permit will have to be required from Grover Cowling, for a ditch from the east property line over to County Trunk A. This location requires a private sewer and water system, and in case the rock is too near the surface the system might not be approved by the Induction County Coun by the Industrial Commission.

This location has no railroad facilities, unless land is purchased up to the C. & N. W. Railway tracks near the west end. The high-line now passing over-head on the east line of the Yost

property will have to be removed and the high-line on county trunk GG changed which will be an approximate cost of \$1,200.00.

The present stone quarry on the Yost property will have to be filled in, which will require approximately 27,000 cubic yards of filling at 50 cents per yard, \$13,500.00. Approximately 1,100 cubic yards of dirt will have to be moved at a cost of 25 cents per yard, \$277.75.

Approximately 18,000 cubic yards of filling will be required for grading field at 55 cents per yard, \$9,000.00. Approximately 3,000 lineal feet of 21 inch cement tile will have to be laid at a cost of \$5,250.00.

Several wooded sections will have to be removed to provide clear landings and take-offs.

#### DESCRIPTION:

#### FOOD STAMP PLAN

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented: WHEREAS, the farmers of Winnebago County and those engaged in the pursuit of agriculture in the State of Wisconsin and the other states comprising the United States are and have been confronted with serious economic problems for many years in that they have not been receiving prices for products raised on their farms which are com-parable to prices they are forced to pay for items that are required and necessary for their living and farming operations, and WHEREAS. and necessary for their living and farming operations, and WHEREAS, a large proportion of the population of Winnebago County are engaged in farming in its various and diversified forms, and WHEREAS, the Food Stamp Plan has now been successfully in operation in every state in the Union for a full and sufficient time to observe and conclude that it is of great benefit to agriculture in the removal of those agricultural products which, due to lack of buying power of potential consumers have resulted in an overabundance and surplus and which are being made available to those clizens that are receiving public aid and assistance by private purchase through the normal channels of business in the form of food for human consump-tion and tion and

WHEREAS, there appear to be favorable possibilities of Winnebago County being designated as an area for the expansion and operation of the Food Stamp Plan, provided the County of Winnebago will de-posit into an imprest fund the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,-000.00) to be known as the Winnebago County Stamp Plan Revolving Fund—said fund to be used wholly and exclusively for the purchase of Orange Colored Food Order Stamps from the Treasury Department of the United State superscript and to be used using the propagated by the United States government, and to be at all times represented by Orange Colored Food Order Stamps as cash or the equivalent thereof, and

WHEREAS, said Revolving Fund will be and is necessary for the inauguration and operation of the Food Stamp Plan in Winnebago County

### SPECIAL ATTY.-RELIEF ACCOUNTS

To THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN Gentlemen:

I herewith submit my report as attorney representing Winnebago

County in the matter of collections of non-resident relief from other counties in the state.

At the present time Winnebago County is carrying on its books \$ At use present time Winnebago County is carrying on its books at cases, but of this sum during the year. 89 have been paid, leaving a balance of 265 cases in which the counties of claimed settlement have not made payments for the relief this county allegedly furnished. In dition to this, during the year of 1940, complaints have been filed with the Department of Public Welfare involving 58 cases. Of these 58 cases Department of Public Welfare has not handed down its decisions in be balance. Out of the 255 cases there are all cases involving tuiting Department of Public Welfare has not handed down its decisions in a balance Out of the 265 cases there are 31 cases involving tuita charges and of this 31 all the relief furnished by Winnebago County except the tuition has been paid. In each case the defendant county has refused to pay the tuition on the grounds that the State Depar-ment of Public Welfare does not have jurisdiction to compel payment of that part of our claim in each case which covers tuition. There are several cases now before the department involving items of tuition which the defendants have filled demurrers. A question of law is ther-by presented which will be determined by the department at an early by presented which will be determined by the department at an early date. If the department makes a ruling unfavorable to the county of the tuiling another than the second secon the tuition question, an attempt will be made to recover the same through the circuit court or other court having jurisdiction.

There are at the present time 185 cases against various counties throughout the state upon which complaints have not as yet been find

As many of you know, the last Legislature reorganized the Indi-As many of you know, the last Legislature reorganized the Indi-trial Commission and transferred jurisdiction of Non-resident relief cases from that commission to the State Department of Public Weitar. Two new examiners, who were unfamiliar with the work, were retained by the State Department of Public Welfare and for that reason ther have not been able to set down for heaving with the score for which Winhave not been able to set down for hearing all the cases for which winnebago County has filed complaints.

I should point out also that it is impossible for the personnel in the Pension Department to draft all the complaints necessary to st the entire 185 necessary to make the entire 185 necessary to start all the complaints necessary to start all the complaints necessary to start all the entire the entit the entire the en Last year comthe entire 185 cases for hearing at the present time. plaints were filed in 65 cases and this year in approximately 60.

I am gratified to report that Circuit Judge Leicht at Wausau en-tered judgment in our favor last April in the group of cases in which Waushara County are the state of the st Waushara County was the defendant and in which the question in Waushara County was the defendant and in which the question in volved was whether or not relief has been administered by Winnebago County in compliance with the statutes. Had the ruling been advess to Winnebago County, we would not have been able to collect any of the non-resident relief.

Your attention is directed to the fact that we have, during the last two years endeavored to file complaints against the counties which owed us the largest amounts of relief and I refer specifically to the following counties: owen us the largest amounts of relief and I refer specifically to no following counties: Chippewa. Columbia, Dodge. Fond du Lac. Ind Langlade, Marquette, Rock, Shawano, Taylor, Clark, Trempealeau, Washington, Waushara, Calumet, Forest, Lincoln, Portage Manitowar, Marathon, Milwaukee and Outagamie. With reference to these coun-ties, complaints have been filed in all cases involving substantial amounts and in all cases which concide

amounts and in all cases which are old. Last year complaints were filed in cases involving \$16,239.07 and this year the total amount sought to be recovered by suit aggregated \$3.504.82

On the sixth page of the annual report of the Pension Department of the sixth page of the annual report of the Pension Department of Winnebago County filed this year, appears a statement of the present status of these cases and indicates that at the close of the year 1939, we were carrying on our books (\$45,303,55. As to relief due this county from other counties, the same table shows that the balance due from other counties as of Sortember 29, 100 and 100 and 100 and other counties as of September 30, 1940 was \$36.568.89.

We have made greater progress these last two years in getting these non-resident relief claims away from our books than has been made in the last 15 years. If content relief of the second sec the last 15 years. If greater speed is desired, it will be necessary to obtain additional help in the need is desired, it will be necessary records tain additional help in the matter of going through the clerk's record and obtaining the data necessary to make out the complaints. The staff in the Pension Department staff in the Pension Department cooperated in every way possible priling the complaints in these cases as my personal knowledge and the figures submitted in the various reports will amply bear out. The can be devoted to this work by the fast that they have rout mutine work be devoted to this work by the fact that they have regular routine work to do. As far as the trial work is concerned, you are advised that hear-ings have been held in the cases in which Outagamie and Portage counties were the defendants. This involved 19 cases of which 7 were after discussion. Of this group of 12 cases, 4 were settled for approximately 70 per cent of the amount demanded in the complaint and the

imately 70 per cent of the amount demanded in the complaint and the balance the defendants in each case agreed to pay in full. So far the Department of Public Welfare has not handed down it decisions in the cases in which there were hearings. In 2 other cases involving Calumet and Shawano County, the De-partment of Public Welfare will render a decision upon agreed state-ment of facts and briefs. On an additional case tried last spring, but heretofore not reported on by me, involving the town of Rosendale as defendant, the Department of Public Welfare rendered its decision in favor of Winnehere County.

favor of Winnebago County. In summation I would say at the present rate of disposition of these cases, there will probably be hearings on over half of the last of the cases within the next year and within two years the work should be cleaned up so that only the current cases remain.

From the report of the Pension Administrator, covering the years 1939 and 1940 which are now on file, it appears that the aggregate amount actually received by Winnebago County through the filing of these complaints and the trying of these cases is \$10,850,86. This figure does not include receipts since September 30. 1940, which will when they are tabulated, increase this figure.

I find that there was appropriated for this work in each of the years of 1939 and 1940, the sum of \$800.00. To date, there has been expended from the aggregate appropriation of \$1,600.00, the sum of \$449.27 which sum will be increased for this year by the amount of \$184.45. Respectfully submited
