# WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD COMMITTEES AND THEIR DUTIES

AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE The Agricultural Committee of Winnebago County shall be made up in the manner prescribed by Statute, and shall have the duties and perform the functions imposed upon said Committee by law, and in addition, shall pass upon applications for Seed Loans.

AVIATION COMMITTEE The Aviation Committee shall be composed of five members, and shall have under its supervision the maintenance, construction, and development of the Winnebago County municipally-owned Airport. Said Committee shall in addition and duties as Committee shall, in addition, carry out such functions and duties as may be imposed upon the Committee from time to time by the County Board, the said Committee being at all times responsible to the County Board.

### HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

The County Highway Committee shall consist of five members se-lected in the manner provided by the Statutes of Wisconsin, and its duties shall be as set out in the Statutes of the State of Wisconsin, together with such other duties as may be imposed upon said Com-mittee by the County Royal from the tat the mittee by the County Board from time to time.

## PUBLIC BUILDINGS COMMITTEE

The Public Building Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall care for and keep in repair the Court House Building and grounds, and Sheriff's residence; said Committee shall employ and set up the duties of the Court House custodians, janitors, cleaning women, and telephone operator, assign their hours and work and cause said and telephone operator, assign their hours and work, and cause said employees to account for all of the supplies placed in their hands; said Committee shall make an annual inventory of the contents of the be imposed upon it by resolution of the County Board from time to time.

### SHERIFF'S COMMITTEE

The Sheriff's Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall be the duty of said Committee shall consist of five members, and it are allowance or disallowance or disallowance in the shall be and recommend for be the duty of said Committee to examine, audit, and recommend for allowance or disallowance all claims of the Sheriff, Coroner, Justices Police Radio System of the County; said Committee shall have the right to hire, discipline and discharge employees and also have charge said Traffic Policemen as well as Radio Operators, which can be vested by Winnebago County in any police officer; said Committee shall also advise with the Sheriff on matters affecting law-enforcement in Winnebago County, and shall have charge of the County Ambulance, Iron Lung, and rescue work on the inland waters bordering on or within Winnebago County; shall recommend the price of meals of prisoners; the Committee shall likewise perform such duties as shall be imposed upon it from time to time by the County Board

### WELFARE COMMITTEE

The Welfare Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall have the duty of examining, auditing, and recommending to the County Board, for allowance or disallowance, all claims which have been filed by Municipalities or the State against the County for various types of poor relief; the Committee shall supervise the activities of the Pension poor relief; the Committee shall supervise the activities of the Pension Department, and confer with the Pension Director on any problems precented to his office. The Committee shall also audit and recommend, for allowance or disallowance, medical, dental, and hospital bills and all other bills coming to the Probation Office of Winnebago County, and shall confer with the Probation Officer from time to time on prob-lems presented to that office, and in addition, the Committee shall perform such duties as have heretofore been imposed upon the Poor Committee and Social. Security Committee of the Winnebago County Roard and as shall be imposed upon the Welfare Committee from time Board, and as shall be imposed upon the Welfare Committee from time to time in the future.

### COUNTY FAIR COMMITTEE

The County Fair Committee shall consist of five members, and said Committee shall have the duty of supervision of the county's in-terest in the Winnebago County Fair Association of such appropriations as the County shall, from time to time, make for maintenance and im-provements of said Fair Grounds, and shall, when necessary, advise with the Winnebago County Fair Association.

### FINANCE COMMITTEE

FINANCE COMMITTEE The Finance Committee shall consist of five members, whose duties shall be to formulate the County Budget in accordance with Section 6590 of the Wisconsin Statutes for 1941, and said Committee shall also recommend the budget which shall be submitted at the annual session of the County Board; the Committee shall also advise with the County Treasurer in the matter of the investments of county funds, as re-guired by Statute, and shall also advise with the County Treasurer from time to time when he shall request them to do so; said Com-mittee shall also have the responsibility of providing the necessary in-surance provision for all the properties and employees of Winnebago County, subject to the approval of the Winnebago County Board, and the Committee shall report to the annual November session of the the Committee shall report to the annual November session of the County Board the amount and kind of insurance protection, the person or firm with whom the insurance is placed, the principal, and premiums, and the expiration date of each individual policy.

### GENERAL ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE

The General Accounts Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall be the duty of said Committee to examine and audit and recommend, for allowance or disallowance, all claims against the county audit of which is not specifically delegated to some other committee, including all claims under the Dog License law, at the annual session of the County Board, and all claims for school tuition and school aids.

### INSTITUTIONS COMMITTEE

The Institutions Committee shall consist of five members, and said The Institutions committee shall consist of five memoers, and said Committee shall have charge of the County Home, County Asylum, and Sunnyview Sanatorium; said Committee shall advise with the Trustees of said institutions from time to time, and make recommenda-tions to the County Board on matters of policy in the management and control of said institutions. The Committee shall make an annual inspection of said institutions, and make a report thereof at the November session of the County Board each war: the Committee shall November session of the County Board each year; the Committee shall examine, audit, and recommend, for allowance or disallowance, all local claims from other municipalities for commitment and care of insane, pertaining to the above institutions, and all claims by the State and Municipalities for institutional care allegedly chargeable to Winnebago County.

### JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

The Judiciary Committee shall consist of five members, whose duty it shall be to assist in the making up of the budgets for the Circuit Court, County Court, Municipal Court, Juvenile Court, and Probation Department; said Committee shall also have the duty of supervising and keeping in good order the County Law Library; the Committee shall investigate and report to the County Board on pro-posed legislation affecting counties; it shall be the duty of the Judiciary Committee to meet and recommend standing rules of the County Board. It shall be the responsibility of said Committee to attend to the proper publishing and printing of the proceedings of the Winnebago County Board. Board.

### TAXATION COMMITTEE

The Taxation Committee shall consist of five members, and it shall have the duty and power of equalizing the value of all taxable properties in Winnebago County in accordance with the Statutes of Wisconsin. It shall be the duty of the Committee to examine all claims filed against the County for illegal taxes of whatsoever kind, and the Committee ters pertaining to illegal taxes of whatsever kind, and the county hold and mat-ters pertaining to illegal taxes; said Committee shall also manage and attend to the sale of all properties taken by Winnebago County on Tax Deed, and the Committee shall carry out the said duties in such man-ner as shall have been and shall be, from time to time, prescribed by the Winnebago County Board.

### PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

Said Committee shall consist of nine members, composed of the Chairmen of the following Committees:—Agricultural, Highway, Public Buildings, Sheriff, Welfare, Finance, General Accounts, Judiciary, and Taxation, and the Chairman of said Committee shall be designated by the Chairman of said Committee shall be designated by the Chairman of the Winnebago County Board. Application for addi-tional help in any of the offices of Winnebago County shall be referred to said Committee for study and recommendation back to the County Board. In addition, the Committee shall have the responsibility, from time to time, of investigating the various departments of the county, and on their own initiative recommend whether the case warrants the balition abilition of unnecessary positions. It shall be the duty of said Com-mittee to recommend to the County Board, at the annual meeting in November preceding the election of the county officers, a salary soked-ule to be paid for the ensuing term to the several officers who are to be elected at such election, and to recommend further to the Board, at the annual meeting provide the the the several officers or municipal be elected at such election, and to recommend further to the Boau-at the annual meeting preceding the election of county or municipal judge, and County Supt. of Schools, the salaries to be paid to these of-ficials for the ensuing term, and said Committee shall also recommend, from time to time, the salaries to be paid all appointive officers of employees of the county who work at the Winnebago County Court House. House.

## REGISTER IN PROBATE SALARY

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented: To the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, the Register in Probate and County Court Reporter of Winnebago County Court in salary, the Wincheago County Court in Probate and County Court Reports from \$2,400.00 per year and fees for certified copies, to \$2,160.00 per year plus fees for certified copies; that said decrease in salary was

promised by the County Board to be only a temporary decrease; that the present Register in Probate and County Court Reporter has been in the employ of Winnebago County since 1922 and has never had an increase in salary; that the office now pays \$15.00 per month less than it did at the time the present Register in Probate started working there

It did at the time the present Register in Probate started working there over twenty years ago, despite the fact that the amount of work has increased several hundred per cent per year in volume; that present living costs and conditions merit that said salary be at least restored to what it was before the depression cut was made on the said office; THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Super-visors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that the salary of the Register in Probate and County Court Reporter be re-adjusted to what it was previous to the so-called temporary cut made in 1933, namely to \$2,400.00 per year plus fees for certified copies.

We, the Personnel Committee of the Winnebago County Board, to which was referred the resolutions of county employees and officers requesting increases in pay, beg leave to report that we have given careful study to all of said applications for increases, and present herewith our report in the manner following:-

In the first place, the Committee calls attention to the fact that al-most all of the employees and officers presented requests for salary in-creases at this session of the Board, and your Committee felt it only fair that consideration should likewise be given to all employees and

officers, including a few who did not present applications for increases. The Committee also feels that the original Salary Schedule has been monded putied end of the state of the second seco The commutee also reefs that the original Salary Schedule has been amended, revised, and over-turned so many times as to have lost prac-tically all semblence of a salary schedule, and we therefore feel that the salary schedule, and all other resolutions affecting it, should be rescinded so that the slate is clean, and such salary schedule as the Board may adopt shall be the only salary schedule on the books of Win-nebrase. County nebago County

That attached hereto is a summary analysis showing the various offices provided by Winnebago County, together with a statement of the income heretofore attached to the position, together with the in-crease requested at the present time, and, finally, the recommendation which your committee makes in regard to the salary for each of said offices. The Pension Department employees are omitted, as their sala-ties are determined by State Department consistent exceptions. ries are determined by State Pension Department regulations.

Thes are determined by State Pension Department regulations. The Committee calls the Board's attention to the fact that the Committee has recommended increases for the several elective county officials, effective May 1st, 1943, to December 31st, 1943, which is an increase in salary during the term of office of said officials. The Com-mittee directs the Board's attention to the fact that the Wisconsin Legislature has passed a law. which has received the Governor's ap-proval, specifically permitting such an increase during the term of of-fice, and that the Attorney General of Wisconsin has made a ruling that the said Statute is constitutional the said Statute is constitutional.

The Committee took into consideration the fact, also, that the District Attorney has received an opinion from the War Labor Board, ad-vising as follows:--

In all cases where an adjustment in wages or salaries by a state, In all cases where an adjustment in wages or salaries by a beau county, or municipal agency is necessary to correct maladjustments, in-equalities, or gross inequities as contemplated by Executive Order No. 9250, and would not raise salaries or wages above the prevailing level of compensation for similar services in the area or community, the adjustments will be deemed approved without the necessity of filing certificate for the information of the Board or Commissioner." In view of the foregoing ruling the Committee on the advice of

In view of the information of the Board or Commissioner." In view of the foregoing ruling, the Committee, on the advice of the District Attorney, is satisfied as to the regality of the increases. Your Committee points to the fact that in most cases, as the at-tached summary shows, your Committee recommends an increase in pay, and we do this for the reason that we feel that the increase is warranted primarily by the increased cost of living, and also with a view to adjusting inequalities which we have discovered, and the Com-mittee recommends the adoption of separate resolutions which are being mittee recommends the adoption of separate resolutions which are being presented at this session of the County Board, under our signatures.

An opinion has been requested relative to the legality of the action of the County Board in granting salary increases to elective county officials.

Your attention is directed to Bill 52S, which was recently passed by

"Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the contrary, the County Board may increase the salary of an elective county officer for or during his term in office. Any action taken by a County Board since November 1st, 1942, increasing the salary of any elective county officer, and all appropriations therefor, shall be ratified and validated, as if such action and appropriation had been authorized by law. This

paragraph is emergency legislation, and shall expire January 1, 1945 This new enactment abrogates the action of present Section 59.15 (1), which provides that the salary of a county officer shall not be in receased or diminished during the officer's term.

The question then is as to whether or not the Legislative enactment is unconstitutional, by reason of the provisions of Article 1V. Section 26, of the Wisconsin Constitution, which reads:—"The Legislature shall never grant any extra compensation to any public officer, agent, servant, or contractor, after the services shall have been rendered or the con-tract entered into; nor shall the compensation of any public officer be increased or diminished during his term of office."

It has been repeatedly held that an elective county official is not a public officer within the provisions of said Article IV, Section 26 of the Wisconsin Constitution, above quoted. State ex rel. Sommer vs. Erickson, 120 Wis, 435; Sieb vs. Racine, 176 Wis, 618 (1922); 29 O. A. G. 139,

The following language appears in State ex rel. Sommer vs. Erick-

son, Supra:-"True, the Constitution provides that the compensation of no public officer shall be increased or diminished during his term of office. Sec. 26, art. IV. But it was held many years ago that such provision only applies to officers who receive a fixed salary from the public treasury of the state." Milwaukee County vs. Hackett, 21 Wis. 613; Rooney w Milwaukee County vs. Hackett, 21 Wis. 613; Rooney vs. Milwaukee County 40 Wis 26; State ex rel. Martin vs. Kab, 50 Wis, 178; 6 NW, 557. "This being so, it is obvious that the act in question was not invalidated merely because it authorized the change in the compensation of the sheriff during his term." (At Page 442 of the opinion)

In respect to Senate Bill 52S, which I have quoted, the Attorney General was asked by the State Senate whether or not they had the power to enact such a bill, and the question was answered in the af-firmative, in an opinion of the Attorney General to the Senate dated March 2nd, 1943. The caption of the opinion is as follows:— "The Legislature might without County Unorder to increase the

The Legislature might authorize County Boards to increase the salaries of elective county officials during the terms of office for which they are elected. Article IV of Section 26, Wisconsin Constitution is not employed at the terms of the section 26, Wisconsin Constitution is not applicable to county officials."

Accordingly, I am satisfied that the action of the County Board, in the granting of salary increases to elective officials of Winnebago County, is strictly in accordance with law.

This is Section 65.90 (5) of the Statutes, wherein there is required "a vote of two-thirds of the entire membership of the averagination of the averagination of the section of the complete the section of the complete the section of the complete the section of the section membership of the governing body of such municipality," as a condition precedent to altering the budget.

I am advised by the Attorney General that under the Budget Law there must be a vote of two-thirds of the 44 elected members of the Winnebago County Board, and that a two-thirds majority of the mem-bers present on a given day, if less than two-thirds of the full 44 members, is not sufficient.

Your Board of Trustees of the County Asylum Farm and County Home submits the following list of figures and recommendations for your approval.

The replacement of a Cow Barn, two Silos and repairing the Hog House, buildings that were destroyed by fire on July 2, 1943.

Replace the Cow Barn, size 120x40 feet. We suggest to build the new Barn on the present foundation (this foundation has been re-paired), plus an addition of 30x40 feet to be used as a storeroom for feed These buildings are to be built as nearly freproof as possible. Asbestos shingles are to be used on roof and gables, which takes care of all outside exposures. We are not including any storage above the base-ment. As for the basement, the ceiling will be constructed with a fir-proof asbestos sheet and a coverage of insulation known as Rock Wool between the joist. This ceiling applies to the Cow Barn only, where we house 64 cows. The cost of this building as per the bid of Mr. Jeske will be \$8,950.91, which includes the addition to the barn and proper ventilation in the basement, furnished by the Longergan Company. ventilation in the basement, furnished by the Jamesway Company.

The Silos. We suggest that they be constructed of concrete, 14 feet in diameter and 60 feet in height. They are to be located on the East end of the Barn Barth ellow end of the Barn. Both silos are to have a cement roof, at a total cost of \$2,200 no of \$2,200.00.

The Hay Storage Barn is to be located 200 feet East of the silos. The size proposed is 80x36 feet with 14-foot posts, and a gable root This barn is solely for the purpose of storing baled hay. The construction is asbestos shingles for the root and board lumber for the sides and ends, at a cost of \$298777at a cost of \$2,987.77.

The Hog House is not totally destroyed, and we propose that it be repaired at an expense not to exceed \$400.00. It will not be long before a new Hog House will have a new Hog House will have to be built, with proper ventilation.

Total cost of replacement of these buildings is \$14,538,68.

Your Board of Trustees begs to offer the following: That your Board approve the itemized settlement with the fire adjuster, Mr. Mortimer Hastings, in settlement for our fire insurance loss: Cow Barn \$3,700.00, Brick Silo \$300.00, Concrete Silo \$30.00, General Barn Painting \$330.46, Horse Barn Painting \$364.00, Vehicles and Equipment \$376.40, Fire Department Runs \$200.00, Wring \$126.73, Hog House \$1,-641.91, Hay and Straw \$1,385.00, and a saving on our insurance of \$282.05, making a total of \$15,006.55.

Also, your Board of Trustees would greatly appreciate it if your body would adopt a resolution approving the expenditure of at least the amount of our insurance collected for the replacement of buildings that have been destroyed by this fire.

(e) Pursuant to Sec. 49.26 (4), Wisconsin Statutes, as amended by Chapter 522, Laws of 1943, the District Attorney is desigamended by Chapter 522, Laws of 1943, the District Attorney is designated and authorized to act for the county generally to collect old age assistance liens and claims, and claims for hospitalization, institutional care and general poor relief; and the District Attorney is further authorized to compromise the payment of any such claim, except old age assistance claims as provided in Section 49.26 (4) with the approval of the Pension Director, but such compromises shall be made only when the collection of the full amount would produce undue hardship upon the debtor or the debt is otherwise uncollectible.

Section 3. (f) The provisions of this Amendment shall supersede any inconsistent provision of any other amendment, ordinance or resolution relating to the subject matter of this Amendment.

Section 3. (g) The County Clerk is hereby directed to transmit to the Division of Public Assistance of the State Department of Putic Welfare a certified copy of this Amendment.

Section 3. (h) This Amendment shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### PURCHASING AGENT ORDINANCE

The following Redrafted Resolution No. 33 was presented: A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY RELATING TO PURCHASE OF OFFICE SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR CERTAIN COUNTY GOVERNMENTAL DEPARTMENTS. THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY DO OBDAIN AS FOUND OWN.

ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: SECTION ONE (1). The Purchasing Agent shall be elected at the November, 1943, session of the County Board and annually thereafter in the same manner as other elected county officials are elected, and shall

the same manner as other elected county officials are elected, and shall have the following duties and powers relating to purchase of office supplies and equipment, pursuant to provisions of Chapter 59.07 (7) Wisconsin Statutes, and Chapter 56, Laws of 1943. (2). The Furchasing Agent shall purchase in the name of Winne-bago County such supplies as may be necessary for carrying on the routine functions of all of the various county departments located in the courthouse, such supplies to include the following: Stamps, ink, pencils, stationery, typewriter and adding machine ribbons, binders, nuclage, all grades and types of paper, rubber band and erasers, staples, pens, special printing, various blank forms and orders, assessment and plates, envelopes and other miscellaneous items coming in the same general category, but shall not include books purchased by the Super-intendent of Schools. All departments shall requisition for purchase all above supplies through the Purchasing Agent may, as his best judgment determines,

carry supplies in stock ordinarily used by various county departments, especially so when purchase in quantities will create a saving for the

county or a convenience for himself or county departments.

(4). The Purchasing Agent shall honor any and all requisitions made on him by department heads or an employee of his department when acting under his direction and furnish such items and articles as are requisitioned at the earliest possible time.
