

#### TUESDAY-FIRST DAY.

Supervisors' Room, Oshkosh, Wis.

November 10, 1908, 10 a. m.

The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County convened in annual session at the Court House, in the City of Oshkosh, on the 10th day of November, A. D. 1908, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, and was called to order by Chairman Thompson.

On call of the roll the following supervisors of said county responded. The members after subscribing to the oath of office were duly sworn as such supervisors, by C. D. Cleveland, County Judge:

#### ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

Supervisor Davis nominated John C. Thompson for Chairman and moved, as there were no other nominations, that the Clerk cast the unanimous ballot of the Board for Mr. Thompson. Clerk put the motion which was carried unanimously.

The ballot was cast and John C. Thompson declared elected.

Chairman Thompson in a few well chosen words thanked the members of the Board for the honor conferred.

#### RULES.

Supervisor Kellogg moved the adoption of the rules of the last supervisor year.

Supervisor Audiss moved to amend and that the rules be revised to comply with the statutes and adding certain committees (as follows). Supervisor Kellogg accepted the amendment, and the motion as amended was adopted.

## RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 10, 1908.

1. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to

day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

man, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence,

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairthe Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 13: Finance, 9: General Accounts, 9: Illegal Assessments, 5: Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9; Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9; Insane, 5; Poor and Poor Farm, 5; Workhouse, 3; Corporations, 5: Public Buildings, 5; Roads and Bridges, 5: Per Diem and Mileage, 5: Printing, 5: Bonds and Salaries, 6; County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5:

County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5,

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
- 2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.
- 3. Reports of Standing Committees.
- 4. Reports of Select Committees.
- 5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

- XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:
  - 1. To adjourn.
  - 2. To lay on the table.
  - 3. For the previous question.
    - 4. To postpone to a day certain.
    - 5. To commit to a committee.
    - 6. To amend or to substitute.
    - 7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

AXX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. It an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state

their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may be reafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XVIII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

#### VICE CHAIRMAN.

Supervisor McCallan nominated Wm. S. Audiss for Vice Chairman and moved as there were no other nominations that the Clerk cast the unanimous ballot of the Board for Mr. Audiss. Carried. The ballot was cast and Wm. S. Audiss declared elected.

Supervisor Larrabee moved to adjourn to 2 p. m.
Supervisor Beduhn moved to amend to 9 a. m., Wednesday.
Amendment carried and motion as amended adopted. Adjourned.

#### REPORT OF COUNTY ABSTRACT COMMITTEE.

Supervisor Ream offered report No. 4, as follows:

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Your Committee respectfully reports, that pursuant to the resolution passed at the March, 1908, session of your Board, they did:

First: Employed John L. Day, a competent person and expert abstractor, at an expense of \$58.00, to inspect the work of Ralph Adams, contractor, and that a copy of said Day's report is herewith submitted for the information of the Board.

Second: That your Committee, on the report of said Day and on the advice of the District Attorney, did accept the Tract Index System made by said Ralph Adams, and did make the final payments therefor, due on the original contract, amounting to the sum of \$6,325.00, and in inspecting said work, did give said Ralph Adams a receipt, providing therein that the acceptance of such work and the giving of such receipt should not be construed as or affect the acceptance of so-called extras.

Third: That your Committee took up somewhat the question of extras claimed by said Ralph Adams and considered the report of said Day thereon, but that your Committee believed the bill presented for extras not to be sufficiently itemized and complete to enable your Committee to pass properly on the whole thereof. And your Committee decided to request said Ralph Adams, if he desired said claim acted upon, to present the same in a fuller and better itemized condition to the Board at this November session, and that in accordance with such request, your Committee understands said Adams has filed with the Clerk and presented to this Board an itemized statement of his claim, which will come before the present session for the action of this

Board; and therefore, your Committee did not avail itself of the authority to make any payment on such bill for extras, believing that the whole matter had better come before this Board.

Fourth: That your Committee pursuant to authority given it, purchased a typewriter for the Tract Index System for the sum of \$85.00.

Fifth: Your Committee further reports that the Register of Deeds, acting with the Committee on Bonds and Salaries, did appoint George LeTourneux as Deputy Register of Deeds, to act as Abstract Clerk, and did appoint Miss C. M. McDonald as copyist, at the salaries of \$100 and \$35 per month, respectively, and that arrangements were entered into with the said LeTourneaux and the said Register of Deeds, which are herewith submitted for the information of the Board.

Sixth: That it was found necessary to employ Mr. Mitchell, who was thoroughly acquainted with the system, to assist in opening and starting the system for the County, and that your Committee did employ him and he did act for such purpose, and was paid therefor the sum of \$111.75, and your Committee asks that its doings in such behalf be ratified and approved.

#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT.

Trustee G. H. Charlesworth read Annual Report No. 5, of the Trustees of the County Asylum and Superintendent of Poor Farm, as follows:

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: The Board of Trustees of the Asylum for Chronic Insane of Winnebago County, Wis., respectfully submit herewith their report of the institution, covering the year ending June 30, 1908:

The principal change at the institution during the year was the election of a new superintendent and matron in Mr. and Mrs. Manuel

A number of substantial improvements have been made during the year: the installation of 100 new hospital iron beds with mattresses; the installation of five new closets with necessary plumbing; improving the sanitary condition and service of the wards; new steel and concrete floor in laundry and concrete floor in refrigerator room, with fitting up of soap room with vats and steam pipes; increasing the efficiency of the laundry; and building 4,000 feet of concrete walks in asylum grounds.

As the County Board are aware, the maintenance of our new poor house, of which we are justly proud, is a source of added expense over that of the old one, which appears in our report of current expenses for both institutions, added to which we have made some necessary improvements in the way of screens, pipe covering and some extra finishing and building of a kitchen storm house.

We have contracted for 1,500 tons of West Virginia splint lump coal screened, f. o. b. state hospital, at \$3.95 per ton, on orders before October 30, 1908, and \$4.10 per ton after that date, which will supply the asylum and poor house until July 1, 1909.

The unfavorable weather of last year lessened the amount of farm production, so we have been obliged to buy quite a quantity of potatoes and some other provisions this year, usually raised in sufficient quantity to take care of the wants of the two institutions.

The general repairs with the advancing age of the institution buildings slightly increases our current expenses, but we feel, considering the price of food stuffs and clothing, that our per capita is remarkably low.

Following is a tabulated statement of the expenditures for the last fiscal year, commencing July 1, 1907, and ending June 30, 1908.

Referring to the recommendation of our board in its report a year ago for a cold storage building, we would again urgently recommend to your honorable board that necessary appropriation be made to provide our institution with storage facilities in shape of a root cellar to enable us to keep farm vegetables during the winter, as with present accommodations the County loses a considerable amount every year in vegetables going to waste because of lack of proper accommodations to care for same. The expense of a good root cellar would be about \$3,000.

The trustees desire to express their approval of the business management and the fine condition of the asylum, poor house and farm. Also their confidence that the superintendent and matron (Mr. and Mrs. Manuel), and those working under them have done everything in their power to make the institution a cheerful and comfortable home for the patients.

#### COUNTY PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

Frank Brockway, County Physician, read his Report No. 6, as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the County Asylum and Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wis.:

Gentlemen: I herewith respectfully present to you my report as County Physician for the fiscal year ending July 1, 1908.

#### COUNTY ASYLUM.

I have visited the county asylum as usual, twice a week regularly, and at other times when sickness made it necessary.

During the first quarter of the year there were two deaths, one, a middle-aged woman, from tuberculosis. and the other an old man, who died of senile dementia.

In the second quarter there were three deaths, an old man from paralysis, a young man, an idiot from gastritis, and a middle aged woman, an epileptic, died in epileptic convulsions.

During the third quarter there were three deaths, a man dying of heart disease complicated with dropsy, an old woman of paralytic dementia, and a young woman of consumption.

In the last quarter of the year there were four deaths, a man dying of consumption complicated with hemorrhage of lungs, an elderly woman of paralysis, an old woman of heart disease and an old man of senile dementia. These deaths were evenly divided between males and females.

Aside from these cases, which were all chronic, there was little illness that developed into anything serious. There have been no accidents aside from a few minor sprains or bruises during the entire year, which is an excellent showing for an institution of this size.

There were no contagious diseases in the asylum during this year.

The sanitation of the building has been improved by the installation of toilet rooms, accessible from the dormitories, thus doing away with the night boxes, which were offensive and unsanitary.

The building has never been in a better sanitary condition than since this improvement was made.

The inmates have been well fed and comfortably clothed, and the best of care given them by the superintendent and matron, and the attendants who have ably assisted them.

#### THE COUNTY POOR HOUSE.

I have made regular visits twice a week to the poor house and special visits when called.

There was one death in July the first month of the year, one in August, one in September, one in October, two in November and two in December.

During the last six months of the year there was but one death, which occurred in April, 1908.

Of these deaths seven were males and two females. All were people of advanced age.

One died of cancer, one of paralysis, and the other of old age, usually with complications of heart disease.

There were no births during the entire year, an unusual but gratifying record.

The building has been in good sanitary condition and the inmates well cared for.

#### THE COUNTY JAIL.

In July, the first month of the year, there was a death at the jail from delirium tremens, complicated with a weak heart. Aside from this, there has been about the usual amount of minor ailments, but nothing that has proved to be serious.

The sheriff and his assistants have given the prisoners good food and the best of care, and the building has been kept in a sanitary condition.

#### THE WORK HOUSE

There have been several sick calls to the work house, besides which I have made several visits of inspection.

There was one death this year, in June, 1908, a sudden attack of delirium tremens.

The food furnished the prisoners has been wholesome, and they have been given excellent care.

All of the County institutions have been closely looked after by the officers, trustees and committees in charge, and any needed improvements made as promptly as possible.

In closing I wish again to thank the Board of Supervisors, the Asylum Trustees, and those in charge of the County institutions for their assistance to me in my work.

Gentlemen: I think that under the circumstances, and all the difficulties and opposition we have had, and the short space of time we have had, that the above is a very good showing of what can, and should be done after the citizens of Winnebago County know how much more convenient it is to be able to come to their own office, for it is an office, and a work especially created for them, where they can come and get information desired, free of charge, and I trust as freely given by those employed in the department. We have, so far as was in our power, endeavored to do our duty toward all who have come to us either in person or by letter. The system has proven and is proving very satisfactory in every respect and no error has so far been found in the records.

I would like at this time to make two or three recommendations to your body. The first is that you increase the salary of my assistant,

Miss McDonald, for the compensation is not adequate to the work, and I can say for her that she has proven herself a very efficient and competent assistant and is entitled to the demand asked, it is not every one who can do the work required of her. While many stenographers might be able to copy anything that is dictated or put before them, not many have had the experience that Miss McDonald has had in this line of work, for she has done abstract work for a number of years prior to this, therefore that experience is certainly worth more than \$35 per month, and I strongly urge and hope that the committee on salarise will see to it that the increase is made to go into effect at once, so that she may derive the benefit of it this month of November, if it can possibly be arranged.

My second recommendation is that the County purchase another typewriter. While the one we are now using has done the work thus far, it should be used only for work done in our indexes, for the reason that the carriage used for our large index sheet or leaves is so heavy that it will soon render the machine worthless. While by purchasing another we can use that for making abstracts only and our present one for the records.

My third one is that a card should be put in every newspaper published in Winnebago County, not only in the English ones, but all others of foreign publication, and that to be in their language. Where it is a daily paper, leave the card in for such a number of days as will be necessary to give the people a chance to see it, and where it is a weekly the same proportion, simply to let the citizens of Winnebago County know that we are ready to serve them, if only to see how we are working the system.

I trust, gentlemen, that these recommendations will be approved by your honorable body, after due consideration.


SUPERVISOR OF ASSESSMENT REPORT.

Supervisor of Assessments D. M. Shea, offered his Report No. 8, as follows:

To the Honorable, The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin,

Gentlemen: In compliance with the statutes, I hereby present my annual report for the year 1908.

There has been some improvement in the assessment of the county the past year, particularly in the town of Poygun, where the assessment was increased over 1907 about 25 per cent., bringing the assessment of the real property up to 100 per cent., based on inspection made by the Supervisor of Assessment.

The State Tax Commission places two methods at our disposal to arrive at the full value of the real estate of the different districts, namely: the selling or market value as shown by prices in the transfer of real estate for a period of from three to five years, and the inspection by the Supervisor of a number of pieces not less than twenty, in each assessment district of the county. The first or sales method, the Commission recommended as being the only method which can be used to arrive accurately at the true value; the second, or inspection method, is left at our disposal, although the commission do not recommend it. In fact, they discourage its use.

I have this year, as in the past, used the inspection method. The results will be found in table 8 of this report. Tables 1 to 7 inclusive, show the assessment, also all changes made by the Supervisors in the different kinds and classes of personal property.

Table 9 shows the total assessment of the real and personal property, also the total of real and personal property, the changes made by the Supervisor in each instance and the results of the same.

Special Form "B" shows the number of pieces inspected by the Supervisor in each district, the total true value as fixed by the Supervisor, the total assessment as fixed by the local assessor and the ratio of the assessment to the true value.

I thank you for your courteous consideration of my reports in the past, and for any information which you desire with regard to the enclosed report, I am at your service.

#### REPORT OF POOR AND POOR FARM COMMITTEE.

Supervisor Gustavus offered the following Report No. 19:

Oshkosh, Wis., Nov. 17, 1908.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnehago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen: Your Committee on Poor and Poor Farm to whom was referred the matter of Attendant Lindsay abusing Inmate Jones at County Poor House, respectfully report as follows:

Jones claims to have been kicked by Attendant Lindsay, as well as being dragged through hall up stairs, also cuffed in the face, causing black eye, injuring his back, and other minor bruises. Jones says he had no ribs broken, nor did he say to any one that he had any ribs broken.

Trouble caused by Jones not obeying Lindsay when Mr. Lindsay told him to change his clothes, which were torn.

John Lindsay, an inmate, says that Attendant Lindsay did not kick Jones, nor did he see him strike him, but that Jones tried to strike Lindsay, and considered that Jones was not hurt. He further states that he saw Jones back of building a few days afterwards when he thought no one saw him, and that he walked as straight as any one could, but as soon as he discovered that some one saw him he was again crippled.

Inmate Wetzlaff says Lindsay slapped Jones very hard in his face and dragged him on the floor. Could not say how much Jones was hurt.

Fred Kuehn makes same statement as Wetzlaff.

Chas. Smith (inmate), saw the trouble, but states that he did not see Attendant Lindsay kick nor strike Jones.

Attendant Tom Wiley saw Lindsay have Jones down on the porch floor, and that Lindsay dragged Jones into house. Did not see what happened inside.

Drs. Gordon and Loope examined Inmate Jones and think him in good health at present time, and that if he had been abused as much as he stated, he would not be able to be out on account of his advanced age.

Dr. Gordon stated that he has known Lindsay as an attendant for 17 years in this institution and can personally say that his past record is good.

Attendant Lindsay denies that he hit Jones, but says Jones struck and kicked at him, and that he used force to handle Jones, falling to floor by so doing. Trouble caused by Jones insisting on wearing a pair of pants which were torn, exposing his person, and that Jones refused to change them. Attendant Lindsay admits taking hold of Jones and setting him on floor.

The Committee finds Jones' statement relative to being kicked, disproved. We further find that he is disagreeable and fault-finding, and hard to get along with.

We further believe that the report circulated regarding this affair greatly exaggerated, but nevertheless think that Attendant Lindsay may have used more force than was necessary to control Inmate Jones, Respectfully.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen: The following report is upon the condition and progress of the common schools of Winnebago County, exclusive of the Cities of Neenah, Menasha and Oshkosh.

With very few exceptions the schools are in first-class condition. I note special improvement in the matter of equipment and appliances for heating and ventilation. During the year ending June 30, 1908, there were thirty-four schools in the County which took advantage of the law passed at the session of the legislature in 1907, providing for additional State aid, to the amount of Fifty (50) Dollars per year for three years, to any school furnishing an approved system of heating and ventilation, supplementary readers, academic dictionaries, maps, charts, globes, blackboards, etc.

These are designated as first-class rural schools, and in addition to sharing in the regular apportionment of school funds, are entitled to \$50 per year extra State aid.

Since June 30, 1908, Twenty-six (26) other districts have taken advantage of the law, so that at the present time 60 out of the 96 ungraded schools in the County are fully equipped for doing first-class work.

The teaching force I believe exceptionally strong. Of the 118 teachers now employed in Winnebago County common schools, 14 are graduates of normal schools or universities, 9 hold first grade teachers' certificates, 44 second grade, and 51 third grade. Thus more than half, or 65 of the 118 teachers of the County hold high grade certificates, and have received special training for their work. This I consider a very good percentage.

The principal reason for our being able to hold this better class of teachers is that higher wages are being paid. Consequently, the experienced teachers are remaining in the County rather than going away from home to secure better wages.

You will notice by the following wage schedule that more money is being paid to teachers. The wages are not yet as high as they should be but there is a great improvement in most of the schools.

Beginning August 10, 1908, an institute for five days was held. This institute was conducted by Prof. B. Mack Dresden of the Normal school, by Prof. K. L. Hatch of the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, by Supt. John C. Callahan of Menasha and by the County Superintendent of Schools.

This was the largest teachers' institute in point of attendance ever held in Winnebago County, there being a total enrollment of 105 teachers.

The work done was upon those subjects in which the teachers were found to be deficient. During the year there were held in Neenah and in Winneconne, a series of two-day institutes, in which I believe, the teachers received more real benefit than in the mid-summer institute; since they came at a time when the teachers were actively engaged in school work, and there being a smaller number present, problems of the school room could be taken up and discussed in a manner impossible when a large number were present.

Two regular examinations were held during the year. One in March and one in July and August. In these examinations 162 persons were examined and 68 certificates issued. The following are the educational statistics for the year ending June 30, 1908:



## BOARD OF PRISONERS.

Supervisor Ganzer offered Report No. 24, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Your Committee on Bonds and Salaries submit the following report of a contract entered into with Sheriff-elect John V. Bunn, for the board of prisoners, as follows:

To Whom It May Concern:

This agreement made this 19th day of November, 1908, by and between the County of Winnebago, and John V. Bunn, Sheriff-elect: The said John V. Bunn does, for and in consideration of a certain sum hereinafter mentioned, agree to board, wash and mend for all prisoners who may be confined in the jail of Winnebago County, and to furnish good, wholesome and well prepared food in sufficient quantity for three dollars and twenty-five cents per week of twenty-one meals, and all parts of the day or week. The Board to be computed on the same basis of twenty-one, to make a week's board, and in no case to charge for more meals than are actually furnished; and said John V. Bunn agrees to keep the register so as to show the hour of taking in and out of all prisoners.

It is further agreed that no bills shall be presented to the County Board for articles used in the preparation of food for said prisoners, nor in doing the mending and the washing for the same; and it is further agreed by and between the said County of Winnebago and said John V. Bunn, that said County of Winnebago shall provide all heat

and light for said jail, Sheriff's residence, including fuel for cooking purposes for said jail and residence.

For, and in consideration of the faithful performance of the above agreement by said John V. Bunn, the County of Winnebago agrees to cause to be paid to said John V. Bunn, the sum of three dollars and twenty-five cents per week, as above stated.



## MEMORIALIZING THE LEGISLATURE.

Supervisor Ream offered Resolution No. 1, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, and the Members of the Senate and Assembly:

Whereas, The County Board of Winnebago County, have adopted a system of tract indices or chain of title system, and

Whereas, Said Board is desirous of creating an abstract department to take care of the work in making abstracts, and

Whereas, It is necessary for the Legislature to pass some laws on the subject; Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That our representatives in the State Legislature are hereby requested to use every endeavor to secure the passage of a law in form and substance, as follows:

To create section 762 M, of the Statutes relating to the County Abstractor.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly. do enact as follows:

Section 1. There is added to the Statutes a new section to read, Section 702 M. 1. Whenever any county shall adopt tract indices or a chain of title system, the County Board of Supervisors of any such county may create a department to be known as an Abstract Department, either in connection with, or independent of the office of the Register of Deeds, as said County Board shall deem it advisable. The County Board may elect a competent person for a term of two years, who shall be known as the County Abstractor, who shall have charge of and operate said Abstract Department, that the County Board shall cause to be furnished a seal for said County Abstractor, and the said County Abstractor shall place said seal on each and every abstract issued by him. The Register of Deeds shall be eligible to the office of County Abstractor, and may hold both offices at the same time. The County Abstractor shall at all times, on demand of any person and on payment of the fee therefor, make and deliver to any such person, an Abstract of Title to any land in such county.

2. Before entering upon the duties of his office the County Abstractor shall execute and file with the County Clerk, a bond in the sum as the County Board shall prescribe, not less than \$5,000, conditioned for the faithful and impartial performance of the duties of said office to the best of his ability, and to pay to the Treasurer of his county all money that shall come into his hands by virtue of his office, and to deliver up to his successor in office all books, records, maps, deeds, mortgages and other things, belonging to said office.

3. The County Board shall fix the salary of said Abstractor, provide such clerical assistance as may be necessary, and fix their compensation, and shall fix the fees to be received for the compiling and furnishing of Abstracts, and may at any time prescribe regulations for the operating and conduct of said department. All fees received for the compiling and furnishing of abstracts shall be paid into the County Treasury. The County Board may, by two-thirds vote of all the members of said Board, discontinue the furnishing of abstracts. Be it further

Resolved, That the County Clerk shall cause to be sent to our members of the Legislature, a copy of this Memorial.

The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, in session assembled, do hereby memorialize the Legislature to pass an act, a copy of which is hereto attached, and is hereby referred to, and made a part of hereof:

Be It Resolved, That a copy of this resolution and a copy of the bill attached, be sent by the County Clerk to each of our members of the legislature

A bill to amend Section 710, of the Statutes, as amended by Chapter 231 of the laws of 1907, relating to the bonds of the County Treasurer.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 710 of the Statutes, as amended by Chapter 231 of the laws of 1907, is amended, to read as follows:

Counties worth \$30,000,000, and with depository other than Treasurer, bond minimum and maximum. Section 710. The bond of the County Treasurer shall be in a sum to be fixed at not less than twice the amount of all taxes directed by the County Board, to be levied and received by the Treasurer during the ensuing year and have three or more sureties, and shall be conditioned in substance as follows: Whereas, the above bounden..... was elected to the office of County Treasurer of the County of..... on......now, therefore, the condition of the above obligation is such that if the said...... and his deputy, and all persons employed in his office, shall faithfully execute the duties of said office, and if the said ......shall pay, according to the law, all money that shall come to his hands as Treasurer, including all drainage funds, and shall render a just and true account thereof whenever required by the County Board, or by any provision of law, and shall deliver to his successor in office, or to any other person authorized by law to receive the same, all moneys, books, papers and other things appertaining or belonging to said office, then the above obligation shall be void; otherwise to be and remain in full force; provided, that in every county the taxable property of which shall exceed in valuation the sum of \$30,000,000. the bond of the County Treasurer shall be in a sum to be fixed by the County Board of Supervisors, in its discretion, at its annual meeting in November prior to the commencement of the term of office of such Treasurer, which sum shall not be less than the amount, nor exceed twice the amount of all taxes directed by the County Board to be levied and received by the Treasurer during the ensuing year, with like sureties and conditions as hereinbefore required; and provided, further, that where the County Board of any County shall have designated as the Depository of the County fund any other person than the County Treasurer, and have fixed the bond of such Depository as required and authorized by these statutes, then, and in such case, the County Board, by resolution, may so modify the amount of the bond to be exacted from the County Treasurer as it may think best, except that such modifications shall never permit the County Treasurer's bond to be less than \$100,000, nor more than twice the amount of all taxes directed by the County Board, to be levied and received by the Treasurer during the ensuing year.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

#### MEMORIAL TO LEGISLATURE.

A bill to amend Section 8 of Chapter 361, of the laws of 1905, otherwise known as Section 1421-8, of the Statutes, relating to persons affected with tuberculosis.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 8 of Chapter 361, of the laws of 1905 (otherwise known as section 1421-8 of the Statutes), is hereby amended to read as follows:

All persons admitted as patients to the sanatorium shall pay to said institution the cost of their maintenance. The charges for any patient or patients may, however, be paid by any person or persons, or society. termination of such sum shall be made by the Superintendent and the State Board of Control. Any person who is unable to pay the charges for his or her support, may be admitted to such sanatorium, after it has been determined by the examining physician that such person is suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis, provided, however, that before such person shall be admitted to the sanatorium, he or she shall file a statement with the judge of the probate court of the county within which he or she resides, setting forth the fact that she or she is unable to pay the regular charges. judge, upon presentation of the report of the duly authorized examining physician that said person is afflicted with pulmonary tuberculosis, shall make an investigation, and if he finds that said applicant or his legal representative are actually unable to pay such charges, shall approve in writing the application of such person, and thereupon shall submit such report with his approval thereon to the Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors of the County, of which such person is a resident, and if he shall approve thereof, said judge shall immediately forward to the superintendent of the sanatorium, a certificate in writing that such person is unable to pay said charges, and that he or she is a resident of the county in which said application has been so approved by him, and that such application is also approved by the Chairman of the County Board of said County.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in the Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. There is added to the statutes, a new section to read: "Parole of Females Committed to the Industrial Schools, section 493-B; whenever any female under the age of 21 years shall have been heretofore or hereafter committed to any one of the Industrial Schools of this State, pursuant to law, the Judge or Magistrate who ordered or adjudged such commitment may, whenever he shall deem it for the best interests of such female, and upon the written request of the Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors of the County from which such female was committed, parole or discharge such female from such Industrial School, and in case such female is conditionally released or paroled from any such school, she may be returned thereto at any time before arriving at the age of twenty-one years, upon the written order or direction of such Judge or Magistrate."

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from, and after its passage and publication.



Resolved, That the schedule of salaries hereby fixed, shall be and remain the salaries of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, and his deputy, until further action thereupon, by the County Board, as provided by section 2, of chapters 376, of the laws of 1907.


