Tuesday, April 15, 1952.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 (B) of the Wisconsin Statutes, this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law, may come before the Board

The meeting was called to order by Nell A. Hoffmann, County Clerk

Roll call showed all members present.

The following newly-elected supervisors took the oath of office which was given by Judge D. E. McDonald: Virginia Nolan, Wm. Reimer, Al Evenson and John Geiger Jr.,

The first regular order of business was the election of a Chairman for the ensuing year. Nominations were called for. A motion was made and seconded that the Clerk cast an unanimous ballot for the election of Supv. J. F. Shea. Ballot was so cast and Supv. Shea declared elected Chairman. Supv. Shea addressed the Board, thanking them for the honor.

The next order of business was the election of a Vice Chairman. A motion was made and seconded that the Clerk cast an unanimous ballot for the election of Supv. Joseph Drexler. Ballot was so cast and Supv. Drexler declared elected Vice-Chairman. Supv. Drexler addressed the board.

The next order of business was the consideration of rules for the board. The rules were read and discussed by the board. A motion was made and seconded that an amendment be added to rule 30 regarding mimeograph copies of resolutions to be placed on supervisors desks. Referred to Judiciary Committee. Committee to report back at the afternoon session. Carried.

A motion was made and seconded to accept the rules as read. Carried.

The next order of business was the election of the Welfare Committee. A motion was made that a motion from the floor be dispensed with and the first ballot be informal. Carried. The tellers were appointed, Supvs. Miracle and Steinhilber

The election of a member to succeed Supv. John A. Heigl: Heigl 39, Miracle 1, Carpenter 1, Hughes 1, Tank 1, Wallace 1, Kelsh 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal, carried, Heigl elected for 1 year.

The election of a member to succeed Supv. Geo. Kuettel: Kuettel 26, Wallace 12, Nolan 1, Hughes 1, Miracle 1, Zimmerman 2, Grunski 1, Jackson 1. On Formal ballot: Wallace 26, Kuettel 18, Nolan 1, Hughes 1. Wallace elected for 1 year. Carried.

The election of a member to succeed Supv. Wm. Kelsh: Kelsh 39, Tank 1, Nolan 1, Daggett 1, Zimmerman 1, Grunski 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Kelsh elected for 1 year.

The election of a member to succeed Supv. Frank Metzger: Metzger 37, Nolan 2, Zimmerman 3, Grunski 1, Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Metzger elected for 1 year.

The election of a member to succeed Supv. Charles Yule: Yule 25, Zimmerman 16, Doule 1, Nolan 1, Blank 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Motion LOST.

Formal ballot Yule 26, Zimmerman 17, Doule 1. Yule elected for 1 year.

A motion was made and seconded that the County Asylum and Home be known as the County Hospital and Home, and corrections be made in the Official Directory.

In the General Duties of Committees, the following is to be added to the Personnel Committee's duties, "The personnel committee is to meet with the executive committee of the Courthouse employees' Assoc. a month prior to the Organization and Annual meetings of the County Board." Carried.

Meeting adjourned until 2 P. M. Carried.

### WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE REPORT

The following Report No. 1 was read:  
TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:  
Gentlemen:

We, the Finance Committee, beg leave to report on the Workmen's Compensation Insurance for the year ending April 1st, 1952.

Since April 1st, 1951, there have been 37 cases filed by the employees of the Highway Department, the County Asylum and the Court House, on which we have paid a total amount of \$1,671.09 for medical and hospital care and for compensation. Four of these cases are still open for which we estimate a further expenditure of \$634.00 before closure.

The following chart shows the number of cases, with the amounts spent for medical care and for compensation, by department.

### SUMMER HOURS—COURT HOUSE EMPLOYEES

The following Resolution No. 3 was presented:  
TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WIS  
Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Personnel beg leave to report that they have

met with the Executive Committee of the Winnebago County Court House Employees' Association to discuss labor relations. The employees asked the committee to consider a request for some special arrangement of their working schedule for the summer months. The committee called a meeting of the department heads of the Court House, together with the executive committee of the Winnebago County Court House Employees' Association to thoroly discuss the feasibility of such a plan. After considerable discussion it was decided—(1) The public had the right to have the Court House and its offices open on all Saturday mornings. (2) It was also brought out in a discussion that from past experience during summer months on Saturday mornings the Court House could be amply manned with a skeleton crow of about 50% of normal.

Your Committee therefore recommends the passage of the following resolution:

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the Court House and its offices be kept open for business from the hours of 8:00 o'clock A. M. to 12:00 o'clock noon, and from 1:00 o'clock P. M. to 5:00 o'clock P. M. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and Saturday from 8:30 o'clock A. M. to 12:00 o'clock noon; this schedule to commence from May 5th, 1952, and to continue through September 6th, 1952, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that all employees of Winnebago County Court House work eight hours per day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays during that period, and that each employee should be entitled to every other Saturday off during the term of this schedule.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the department heads of the Court House arrange the schedule of Saturday shifts to conform with this resolution—this to be done to maintain proper efficiency in all departments during the term of this schedule.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this new summer schedule be on a strictly trial basis, and that in case of any abuse of these privileges by any employee or if it should appear that the Court House or its offices were not functioning efficiently, so as to cause a hardship on the general public, or for any other cause, which the County Board would find, the County Board of Supervisors could at any time, by presentation of a proper resolution, change this summer schedule to a working schedule they deem right.

Gentlemen:

At your request I am submitting a list of the duties that I have performed from October 1, 1951 to October 1, 1952.

During this period 91 judgments of divorce were granted in Circuit Court and 40 judgments of divorce were granted in County Court. I was present at all these hearings since most of them were default actions.

I appeared in Circuit Court 51 mornings during this period and also 11 times in the afternoon, making a total of 62 appearances in this Court on divorce hearings. In County Court I appeared 36 times in the morning plus 6 times in the afternoon making a total of 42 appearances in this Court. My total appearances in both Courts was 104.

During this period I have had approximately 714 conferences regarding reconciliation, support money, alimony, visitation and pre-divorce conferences. I have also had 29 conferences after 7:00 P.M. in the evening.

I have written approximately 512 letters regarding support money, alimony, visitation hours and also reconciliation letters trying to get the parties to appear in the office so that I might be able to effect a reconciliation.

I have had innumerable telephone conversations during all times of the day and night which I have not kept track of because they are too numerous.

I have issued approximately 66 Orders to Show Cause and have also drawn up 66 Orders of the Court which is a follow-up of the original Order to Show Cause. I have also drawn up one commitment order.

I have spent many hours checking the records in the office of the Clerk of Courts in order to determine the arrearage on which to base my letters for support money payments and also my Orders to Show Cause on which I bring a delinquent person into Court.

I would like to appear before the County Board to further explain my position and ask that an increase be given me as Divorce Counsel for Winnebago County commensurate with my present duties.

Your Committee on Personnel beg leave to report that they have thoroughly investigated all modern bookkeeping equipment, with an eye toward a more efficient bookkeeping system for the county books, as ordered by Resolution No. 4, on May 13th, 1952, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. They wish to report that they feel nothing could be accomplished with automatic bookkeeping equipment at this time that would add to the efficiency of our bookkeeping system or expedite the operation of it in any way. They do wish to report, however, that during the investigation, which was done with the assistance of the County Clerk, it was definitely brought out that this county needs the full-time services of an Auditor to assist the County Clerk in his/her care of the books. It was felt that along the way somewhere, while this county was growing to its present stature, there should have been added a new classification in the County Clerk's office, and that this classification should require the employ of a person of high qualifications for bookkeeping, auditing, etc. This employee would meet with the Finance Committee at their regular monthly meetings for auditing bills, etc., and to do other duties which the County Board would instruct the Clerk to issue to this employee.

Your Committee met with Mr. Young, of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel, and he highly recommended this classification. Mr. Young brought out that in all counties the size of Winnebago they have a classification of this sort.

Your Committee also met with Mr. Timm, of the Wisconsin State Auditing Department, who has audited the Winnebago County books the past several years. He also stated that this classification is a definite necessity in Winnebago County.

Your Committee would like to recommend the passage of the following resolution:--

WHEREAS, there is a definite need in the County Clerk's office for the establishment of the classification of County Auditor, to replace the present classification of Account Clerk,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the classification of County Auditor is hereby established in the Clerk's office of Winnebago County, to replace the present classification of Account Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that at all times the person secured to fill this classification is to be interviewed and screened by the Personnel Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, and to be employed only with this Committee's final authority.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the employee in this classification is to do the county bookkeeping, under the supervision of the County Clerk, and, in addition to that, he/she is to meet with the Finance Committee at their monthly meetings to assist in auditing the county bills.

### SPECIAL HOSPITAL BLDG. COMMITTEE REPORT

The following Report No. 26 was read:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY,  
WISCONSIN:—

Gentlemen:

Your Special Hospital Building Committee herewith submits its report as to the general status of the new Winnebago County Hospital.

The financial report as of October 31, 1952, has been presented and a copy furnished each member of the County Board.

With respect to the building itself there are a few items yet to be completed, such as the bases for none Therapy bathtubs, for which the George A. Fuller Company wanted an extra, which the committee felt was too excessive and which we expect to sublet at a lower figure.

Your Committee met with Mr. Murphy of the George A. Fuller Company in connection with the cracked floors in the auditorium basement known as "D" Building. The architect and the George A. Fuller Company each cut out sample sections of this floor. The samples varied in thickness from 3 inches to 6 inches. Examination of these samples failed to show any signs of defectiveness as to construction or consistency. The George A. Fuller Company therefore deny any responsibility for this cracking condition. However, after considerable discussion, they agreed to lay an asphalt tile floor in the entire basement area of the auditorium at their expense. Your Committee accepted this proposition and the asphalt tile floor has now been laid.

While the total capacity of the hospital is 339 beds, your Com-

mittee decided to furnish and provide for only 300 beds at this time and accordingly contracts for all furniture and equipment are based on this number. Most of the furniture and furnishings have been contracted for and shipments are arriving daily. The only items which we are experiencing any delay is in connection with beds and lockers. This delay, as you know, is due to the recent steel strike. However, we expect delivery of the beds about December 1st and lockers about the latter part of December.

Roads and parking areas have been constructed by the Highway Department, and consist of a 9-inch bed of stone and stone screenings at present and a 3-inch mat of blacktop to be applied next spring. Curbs and sidewalks are to be constructed next spring also.

Your Committee met with the trustees of the hospital and discussed with them the additional funds required to operate the new institution after its completion. It was generally agreed that it was difficult to determine just what additional funds would be required, especially in view of the fact that the help situation is becoming quite a problem in the light of demands for shorter hours.

Under the circumstances, therefore, it was agreed that any amount arrived at would be no more than a guess until after we had the experience of a year's operation. The trustees, therefore, requested an additional appropriation of \$25,000.00 to cover the period from January 1, 1953, to June 30, 1953, and \$75,000.00 for the fiscal year 1953-1954. However, through an oversight or otherwise, the request filed by the trustees calls for an additional \$25,000.00 for the period from January 1, 1953, to June 30, 1953, and \$50,000.00 instead of \$75,000.00 for the fiscal year 1953-1954. While the committee sanctioned the original request of \$100,000.00, we feel that the \$75,000.00 actually requested should be sufficient, especially in the light of size of the accumulated surplus as shown by the annual report of the institution.

Your Committee has also discussed with the trustees of the hospital the question of conversion of the present asylum to a home for the aged. We understand that under the building code certain changes must be made to accommodate and properly house a specified number of occupants. However, the trustees expressed a desire to use the building in its present condition for a period of time and defer any renovation of the of the building until after they have had some actual experience in operation.

Your Committee also has had under consideration the disposition or utilization of the old county home remains. Upon the request of the trustees sometime shortly after the County Home fire, we recommend utilizing a portion of this structure as a machine shop and shed underground, and grain storage bins overhead. However, the County Board at that time did not concur with this recommendation. The trustees at this time still feel that a portion of his basement area should be used to provide for a machine shop and shed and granary which they urgently are in need of. Due to the heavy annual financial burden our budgets have had to carry in the last several years on account of the hospital building program, your committee hesitated to ask for any appropriation for this purpose.

We therefore would welcome instructions from your honorable body as to whether or not we are to obtain plans, sketches, and estimate of cost for utilizing a portion of this basement area for a machine shop and shed and granary, or if it is desired to abandon using these underground installations.
