Your Welfare Board begs leave to report that upon the basis of a recent study made by your Welfare Board and a survey made by the State Department of Public Welfare, it is very evident that a great necessity exists for the addition of another Child Welfare Worker in the Winnebago County Welfare Department; that on the basis of the study and survey so made, your Board respectfully requests the passage of the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Super-

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that there be added to the Winnebago County Welfare Department a third Child Welfare Worker with a salary in conformity with the wage schedule adopted for Child Welfare Workers in that department

ment.

That this resolution be effective at the earliest date such worker can be obtained.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sum of \$2,500 be transferred from the contingent fund to the welfare administration fund to provide for the salary and travel expense necessitated by the above resolution.

Special Committee on Alimony Repart

The following Report No. 3 was read:

TO THE HONCRABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Genflemen:

WHEREAS, at the 1952 annual session of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, the Chairman of the Board, with instructions from the County Board, appointed a Special Committee to analyze the possibilities of establishing something definte in a method of handlink delinquent divorce accounts, with the thought that these cases might become potential County Welfare cases, this committee would like to submit the following report:

The Committee met with the Welfare Director, District Attorney, Clerk of the Circuit Court, Divorce Counsel, and the Judges, on different occasions to discuss all the angles of the situation as it now exists.

 We learned that on every court order for support or alimony payment, the Clerk of the Circuit Court is issued a copy of such report and it is filed in his records.

2. All payments ordered must be made to the Clerk of the Circuit

Court and cleared through his office.

3. We learned, however, that after the court orders a party to pay support money on alimony, no action is taken by any one in the Court House, if and when a party ceases paying, unless the supposed recipient makes formal complaint of not receiving payment, or in a case where the recipient would request aid from the County Welfare Department.

4. If a recipient never complains of non-payment, our divorce

records will never show disposition.

This Committee feels that the present method is not proper. We feel that this entire situation should be systemized to a point where each court order, ordering payment, is handled like an account and noted when payment is missed, and something is to be done about it immediately. This procedure would be legal. The Judges are highly in favor of some method to help clear up the present situation.

In view of these facts, this Committee would like to recommend that the Divorce Counsel be given the responsibility of placing all divorce cases on an account basis. He is to see that each case, when it becomes delinquent, is properly notified as such, and when such case remains delinquent for a period of sixty days, the Divorce Counsel is to notify the Judge, who will then take necessary action to show cause. The Divorce Counsel sould be given access to the complete divorce files in the Clerk of Circuit Court's office, for his use at all times.

This Committee would further recommend that if the Board sees it to accept these recommendations and set up some system, that this Special Committee continue to function until the annual meeting, so as to keep in close touch with the situaton, so the Board could have complete facts of what is taking place while this is starting. Then it should be put into the hands of one of the regular standing committees for constant surveillance.

Salary Increase-Divorce Counsel

The following Resolution No. 6 was presented: TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUN-TY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Personnel beg leave to report that they have given consideration to the request for an increase in salary for the Divorce Counsel, submitted to the Winnebago County Board and deferred to a later date by Board action, when there was a possibility that in the near future additional responsibilities for the Divorce Counsel may add to his time and expense considerably.

The Board, in accepting the report and recommendations in Report No. 3 on April 22nd, 1953, has shown their intent in the matter of setting up the divorce payments in Winnebago County, so, therefore, we would like to recommend the passage of the following res-

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the Divorce Counsel of Winnebago County, in addition to his present duties:

Set up the County divorce records on an account basis, namely, have a file where all court orders, for payment, are filed.

2. At the first of every month each and every order is to be

checked to see whether the order has been satisfied, as ordered.

3. If order has not been satisfied, as ordered, he must issue a notice to the party that is delinquent, pointing out the fact that payment has not been received.

4. If this delinquency exists for sixty days, the Divorce Coun-

sel is to notify the Judge.

5. He is to issue to the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, at its regular annual sessions, a report showing the state of affairs in the Winnebago County divorce files.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that because of these added duties, his base salary be increased to \$3,000.00 per year, plus cost of living

bonus, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any and all expenses incurred in discharging these additional duties be cared for solely by the Divorce Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of \$1,500,000 be transferred from the General Fund to the Divorce Counsel Fund to take care of this added expense.

At present there are two child welfare workers in the department and there are 201 children's cases in process. Mrs. Zoerb, who is Supervisor of Welfare for this district, met with the Committee to explain and compare Winnebago County's case load in this respect with other counties, and we find that in all cases where the load runs to 200 cases there are three or more workers.

The Committee further wishes to report that due to the extremely high cost for temporary commitments at Sparta they feel that the addition of another worker would expedite the moving of these commitments to our own foster homes and adoptions, thus cutting the cost of these commitments to about one-eighth of what it now costs the county.

CHANGE IN TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

The following Report No. 4 was read:

TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE WINNEBAGO COUN-TY BOARD:

The Sheriff, Coroner and Safety Committee, together wiith Chief Krippner have made a preliminary study of traffic safety conditions in Winnebago County, and at this time wish to make the following recommendations:

- 1. Establish a speed zone of 45 MPH on Highway 41 in both directions at the intersection with CTH "PP" in the Town of Menacha nasha
- 2. Clearly mark Highway 45 with the intersection of Highway 150 as a dangerous intersection and establish a speed zone on Highway 45 of 40 MPH instead of 50 MPH in both directions.
- 3. Lower the speed limit from 45 MPH to 40 MPH at the intersection of Highways 45 and 114, known as Gillingham's Corners, Die to the vision obstruction from the east on Highway 114, it is further recommended that the terms of the east on Highway 114, it is further than the control of the c recommended that the traffic lights be re-installed as a safety measure at this dangerous intersection.
- 4. At the intersection of Highway 41 and 45, known as Brooks' Corners in the Town of Oshkosh, a speed zone of 45 MPH should be established on Highway 45 Met. established on Highway 45 through the intersection. It is further recommended that an extra lane of concrete be added in the form of a banked curve for northbound traffic turning to the right at this intersection on Highway 41.
- It is recommended that the Highway Department purchase land on the west side of Highway 45 at the intersection with CTH "X," the Town Line Road of Algoma and Black Wolf, and clear shrubbery for a better with CTH. shrubbery for a better view for vehicles approaching this intersection from the west.
- 6. The stop sign at the intersection of CTH "K" and 41 in the Town of Algoma should be erected so that motorists coming from the west can see the size of the size o the west can see the sign before breaking over the incline near this intersection. Another sign before breaking over the incline near this intersection. Another suggestion would be to lower the incline as much as possible much as possible.

- 7. County trunk highways should be center-lined on hills and curves, and curves should be widened where possible. It has been noted that the County Highway Department has center-lined some of the most hazardous hills and should be highly complimented for their cooperation with the County Motor Police in connection with highway safety.
- 8. Our survey also revealed that there is no advance warning sign of a stop sign ahead on any of the town roads approaching an intersection with a main road. We recommend that advance warning signs be placed on the town roads the same as on county and state highways.
- 9. The Committee suggests that the County Board go on record in favor of more severe penalties in court for traffic violators.

10. The Committee would appreciate receiving information or suggestions in regard to any other hazardous conditions existing in Winnebago County.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required, to match and supplement Federal Aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the County Trunk Highway System of said county, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10 (1) of the Statutes.

SECTION III—STATE TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT

(A) WHEREAS: The State Highway Commission has estimated that the sum of One Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$130,000.00) will become available from the appropriation of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954, under Sections 20.49 (4) and 84.03 (3), to be allotted and expended by the State Highway Commission in accordance with the provisions of Section 84.06 for the construction, reconstruction and improvement of the state trunk highway system and connecting streets upon projects which have been approved by this county, and

WHEREAS, there has been received from the State Highway Commission its determination as to the proposed projects and the proposed allocation of such sum,

BE IT RESOLVED, that such projects and the allocation of such sum be approved as hereinafter set forth:

1. The sum of One Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$130,-000.00) previously advanced pursuant to Section 84.03 (5) Statutes, for the improvement of U. S. Highway No. 41 between State Trunk Highway 21 and Brooks Corners.

(B) WHEREAS: There has been received from the State Highway Commission its determination as to proposed projects and the proposed allocation of an unexpended balance from allotments of previous years under Section 20.49 (4) and 84.03 (3),

BE IT RESOLVED, that such projects and the allocation of such

balance be approved as hereinafter set forth:

(a) The sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) for the improvement of U. S. Highway No. 41 the S. T. H. 21—Brooks Corners Road (approximately 4.97 miles.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS, the various highway activities, for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the tme

of making the appropriation therefor.

WHEREAS, an investigation and a survey has been made by the State Highway Commission relative to a speed restriction on County Trunk Highway "T" at Larsen, in the Town of Clayton, Win-

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE

The following Resolution No. 40 was presented:

Section 1. WINNEBAGO COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE.

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare is now administering Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent Children, Old Age Assistance, Aid to Totally and Permanently Disabled Persons, Non-Resident Outdoor Relief and Child Welfare and Youth Service in Winnebago County and

Service in Winnebago County, and WHEREAS, Section 46.30 to 46.36 has been repealed and Section 46.22 Statutes, created by Chapter 513, Laws of 1953 (effective January 1, 1954) establishes a County Department of Public Welfare in such county consisting of a County Board of Public Welfare, a County Director of Public Welfare and necessary personnel in such county and

in such county, and
WHEREAS, such County Department of Public Welfare has
the mandatory functions, duties and powers specified by Section
46.22 (4) of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Section 2. COUNTY BOARD OF PUBLIC WELFARE,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the County Board of Public Welfare schall consist of five residents of Winnebago County. The members of such County Board of Public Welfare shall be elected by the County Board of Supervisors in accordance with the rules and regulations of said Board. The members of such County Board of Public Welfare shall be elected from members of such County Board of Public Welfare shall be elected from members of such County Board of Public Welfare shall hold office for a term of one year and may be reelected. The members of the County Board of Public Welfare shall receive the same compensation and per diem as members of county board committees pursuant to Section 59.06 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

(a). At the first meeting of said board the County Board of Public Welfare shall elect from their number, a chairman, vice-chairman, a secretary and such other officers as they deem necessary. Vacancies in such offices shall be filled for the unexpired terms. The chairman shall preside at all meetings when present, and shall countersign all actions taken by the board. In case of the absence of the chairman and vice-chairman for any meeting the members present shall choose a temporary chairman. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Meetings of the welfare board will be held upon call of the chairman of the board. Upon organization of the welfare board, the county clerk shall notify the State Department of Public Welfare of such organization and give the names and addresses of its officers and members. In the event any member, appointed while a member of the Board of Supervisors shall cease to be a member of that board, he shall continue on the county board of public welfare until his successor has been appointed.

(b). The Welfare Board is authorized to meet for purposes herein outline at the compensation rate as set forth in paragraph (a) of this section.

Section 3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUN-TY BOARD OF PUBLIC WELFARE. The county board of public welfare shall supervise the working of the county department of public welfare and shall be a policy-making body and determine the outlines and principles of the administration of the functions, duties and powers applied to said department under Section 46.22 (4) and (5) of the Wisconsin Statutes. Such board may appoint an advisory committee of residents of the county to serve without compensation whenever it determines that there is a need therefor, which committee shall advise with the board on any matters for which they are created.

Section 4. COUNTY DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WELFARE. The county board of public welfare shall appoint a county director of public welfare whose qualifications, compensation, and tenure shall be subject to the provisions of Section 49.50 (2) to (5) of the Wisconsin Statutes and the rules and regulations promulgated there-under. The director so selected shall provide a \$5,000.00 bond to be approved by the Winnebago County Clerk and paid for by Winne-bago County for the faithful performance of the duties of his office and the accounting of all funds that come into his possession or under his direction.

Section 5. DUTIES OF THE COUNTY DIRECTOR. The county director of public welfare shall serve as executive and administrative officer of the county department of public welfare. In consultation and agreement with the county board of public welfare, he shall prepare and submit to the county board of supervisors an annual budget of all funds necessary for the county department of public welfare, and shall prepare annually a full report of the operations and administration of the department. He shall, after consultation and agreement with the county board of public welfare, recommend to the county board of public welfare the appointment and fixing of salaries of employees necessary to administer the functions of the department, subject to the provisions of Sub-section (6) of Section 46.22 and Section 49.50 (2) to (5) of the Wisconsin Statutes and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Section 6. FUNCTIONS, DUTIES, AND POWERS OF COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE. The county department of public welfare shall have the following functions, duties and powers in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the state department of public welfare and subject to the supervision of said state department of public welfare.

The administration of Aid to Dependent Children under

Section 49.19 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

The administration of Aid to the Needy Blind under Section 49.18 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

The administration of Old Age Assistance under Sections 47.20 to 49.38 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

- (4). The administration of Aid to Totally and Permanently Disabled Persons under Section 49.61 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (5). The administration of relief to county-at-large charges as provided in Section 49.02 (2) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- To administer Child Welfare services under and subject to the provisions of Section 48.315 of the Wisconsin Statutes, thereby administering the functions otherwise administered by children's boards and licensed child welfare agencies.
- To make such investigations which are provided for under Section 322.02 (1) of the Wisconsin Statutes if the court having jurisdiction so directs.
- (8). To perform the duties and functions of a juvenile probation department as defined in Section 48.03 of the Wisconsin Statutes when requested to do so by the Juvenile judge of the county.

- (9). To make investigations relating to relief or welfare administration and admissions to state and county institutions upon request of court, superintendent, district attorney, or any other county officials.
- (10). Furnishing services to the families or persons other than the granting of financial or material aid where such services may prevent such families or persons from becoming public charges or restore them to a condition of self-support.
- (11). To make certification or referral of eligibles for state or federal works or other assistance programs, eligibility for which is based on need when designated to perform such certification or referral services and to certify eligibility for and distribute surplus commodities and foodstuffs.
- (12). Make investigations which relate to welfare services upon request of the State Department of Public Welfare.
- (13). The maintenance of administrative and reporting relationships with all pertinent state departments.
- (14). The department shall administer all laws, rules and regulations of this State pertaining to assistance or welfare services not required by law to be administered by some other department or agency within the county.
- (15). To administer relief to needy Indians under Section 49.046 when appointed by the State Department of Public Welfare.
- Section 7. MERIT SYSTEM STATUS OF PRESENT EMPLOYEES. As provided in Sections 4 and 5, the director and personnel of the county department of public welfare shall be selected in accordance with Section 49.50 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder. Such merit system status as the county director and any other employees of the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare may have on the effective date of this ordinance shall not be deemed changed or interrupted by the provisions hereof.
- Section 8. STATUS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD. Members of the welfare board of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on the effective date of this ordinance shall be and nereby are appointed as members of the county board of public welfare referred to in Section 2 of this ordinance, and shall hold office until their successors have been appointed at the next organization meeting of the county board of supervisors.
- Section 9. REPEAL OF PREVIOUS ORDINANCES IN CON-FLICT HEREWITH. Any provision of any ordinance, resolution or action of the county board of supervisors in conflict with any provision of this ordinance is to the extent of such conflict superceded by the provisions of this ordinance.
- Section 10. OFFICIAL NAME. The official name of the County Department of Public Welfare shall be "Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare."
- Section 11. TRANSFER OF RECORD AND EQUIPMENT. All records, files and equipment of the County Department of Public Welfare are hereby transferred to the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare.
- Section 12. TRANSFER OF UNEXPIRED APPROPRIATIONS. All unexpended appropriations and monies in the County Department of Public Welfare affected by this ordinance at the effective date of this ordinance are hereby transferred to the Winnebago County Department of Public Welfare.
- Section 13. The department shall submit an annual report to the County Board at its annual meeting.
- Section 14. To the end that the county may receive federal and state aid, the department and the board shall observe all laws and rules and regulations of the State Department of Public Welfare.

Section 15. The Wisconsin Statutes referred to in this ordinance are the 1953 statutes.

Section 16. The county clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the State Department of Public Welfare.

Section 17. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force January 1, 1954.

EXTRA PAY—DEPUTY CLERK OF COURTS FOR DIVORCE, ABOLITION OF SPECIAL DIVORCE COMMITTEE

The following Resolution No. 42 was presented:

TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Your Special Committee on Divorce would like to report on the matter of a new system they were ordered to establish for the purpose of keeping a close check on the status of divorce cases in Winnebago County. After meeting with all of the personnel in the Court House familiar with divorce procedure, it was decided to have the system set up in the Clerk of Circuit Court' office. It was decided that the Deputy Clerk of Courts was the logical person to set this up, so she was asked to do so, and keep account of any extra time she had to put in to see it through. She kindly cooperated and we feel she did a splendid job. She spent 225 hours extra time over and above her regular hours on the installation.

The system as set up shows the complete divorce picture, how it stands at the end of each month, so the Divorce Counsel can proceed systematically in his duties on divorce delinquents. The system, as installed, has been working well on a trial basis since June 1st, 1953. It was done this way so that it could be determined how much extra time would be necessary in the Clerk of Court's office each month to keep the system moving properly. It averages to about forty hours per month so that it will be necessary to place that amount in the Clerk of Court's budget for 1954, if the Board sees fit to allow the system to continue. It is apparent to all concerned that this method is getting results, and these results will increase as the system gains momentum. Your Committee highly recommends that it be kept going.

In view of the fact that expenses were incurred on the installation and the trial run, we would like to recommend the passage of

the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that a check for the sum of \$562.00 be issued to the Deputy Clerk of Circuit Court to cover 225 hours of extra time spent on installation, and that another check in the sum of \$390.00, to cover the extra time spent in the six months' trial period, be issued to the Deputy Clerk of Circuit Court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the money be transferred

from the General Fund to cover the above expenses.

Your Special Fair Committee and the County Fair, Park and Conservation Committee, beg leave to report that they have had several meetings with the officers of the Winnebago County Fair Association, and that they have tentatively arrived at an understanding, and have drafted a lease, under the terms of which Winnebago County will lease to the Fair Association, for a period of 25 years, all of the lands and buildings found on the Fair Grounds proper.

The Fair Association will, upon the execution and delivery of this lease, deed over to Winnebago County, for One Dollar and other good valuable considerations, all of their right, title, and interest in the lands and premises which they own, except two lots on Kentucky Street. Under the terms of this conveyance Winnebago County will then have sole title to the entire area known as the Winnebago County Fair Grounds

Under the terms of the lease the Association agrees to hold annually a County Fair in keeping with the standards set in the past, and that they will, in addition, have the right to hold such other activities as they deem fit and proper. That they will be entitled to all of the income derived therefrom, excepting that should their reserve exceed \$35,000 they would then turn such excess over to Winnebago County. providing the same has not been designated by them for making repairs on the premises.

That all permanent improvements to be made on the premises must be made by the County Board, and that no permanent improvements can be made by the Association without the consent of the County Board.

That the Fair Association will maintain proper liability insurance, holding Winnebago County harmless from any injury sustained as a result of the operation of any activities thereon, or in preparation or removal before and after any materials used in such activ-

Winnebago County, on the other hand, will, at its own expense, keep proper fire and extended coverage insurance on all of the build-

In general, Winnebago County will have full title to all of the property of the Winnebago County Fair Grounds, and will lease the same to the Fair Association for a period of 25 years, under the terms of the lease. The lease provides for the execution thereof by the Chairman of the County Board and the County Clerk.

On the basis of this report, your Special Fair Committee and the Winnebago County Fair, Park and Conservation Committee

Your Special Day Parole Committee beg leave to report to the County Board as follows:

Your Committee was appointed pursuant to action taken by the County Board to investigate and explore the advisability of placing into operation the Day Parole Plan, also known as the Huber Act, in Winnebago County. Your Committee met with officials of other counties, as well as with the Judges of this County, and the Sheriff and other persons who would be affiliated with such a program. After considerable study they recommended to the County Board that a position be created, known as "The Day Parole Officer," and, accordingly, such an officer was appointed, and is now in charge of the plan.

In December of 1953 the Legislature, through the enactment of Chapter 682 of the laws of 1953, provided that the Sheriff shall, from the earnings of the prisoner, charge such prisoner for his room and board. The Courts of this county who come in contact with persons sent to the County Jail have provided that the Sheriff charge said prisoners \$2.00 per day room and board, based on a seven-day week for such period of time as such prisoner is employed. This amount was possibly derived from the action taken by the County Board previously in permitting the Sheriff to charge Winnebago County \$2.00 per day for persons working under the Huber Act. Presently this amount is being charged by the Sheriff and is paid to the treasury of Winnebago County and the Sheriff is billing Winnebago County in accordance with the provisions of the order of the court.

Your Committee feels that they have now completed their work and would suggest that this Committee be dissolved, and that the further supervision of the Day Parole Officer be delegated to some other existing committee

Your Committee would therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the Sheriff be permitted to charge Winnebago County at the same rate of \$2.00 per day, based on a seven-day week for such period of time as such prisoner is employed under the Huber Act, which said sum is the amount so collected by the Sheriff from such prisoner.
