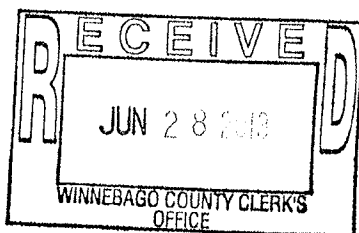

I was incarcerated in the Huber Center at Winnebago county and on Feb. 17 2013 I was at the Menominee park doing community service and they had us lifting a large wet frozen piece of carpet up into a dumpster at least 6-7 ft. high. They had no way to cut the frozen carpet into manageable sizes and just expected that with 5-7 people at a time we could lift it up into the dumpster. While doing this the carpet was resting on my head (as everyone was taller than me) and as I went to lift it up and over I got a sudden sharp burning pain in my right arm, followed by excruciating pain. Returning to Huber I asked the guard if I could go to the hospital, they let me use the phone for a call but I was not able to reach my contacts. The following day I got ahold of one of my contacts and Alycia denied me to leave, she stated that I was inactive Huber because although I had my Federal ID# she wanted the card. After a miserable night of pain and not being able to even get in and out of bed let alone roll over without pain, I also could not get out of bed without help. The next day I was very disappointed when Aluxia denied me. I was granted the right to see a nurse but she insisted after doing an assessment that it was a muscle and I was given a muscle relaxer. I tried to explain to her that this had happened in March the yr. prior and I knew it was a pulled muscle and that I needed to get to my Dr. and get a cortisone shot, she refused to listen or believe me. So I sat there in pain and disabled till the 28th of Feb. until I was released on GPS. I had no relief at all. But otherwise while I was there inmates had to help me get out of bed as I could not get up by myself. I would stay in bed most the day and get up for dinner. So as soon as I was released on GPS I made an appointment with my Dr. Kelly Kruger and she put me on prednisone but found that that was not going to work so she set me up with a pain management specialist for the cortisone shots. When they found out I had no insurance they denied me treatment. Now I had insurance when I was first incarcerated and I was all set up to get out and work, I had my workers insur. I had my proof of contracts for the jobs I had to do, I had paperwork with my federal ID#, but Alycia refused to take the papers with the federal ID # on them even though one of them was a tax return. She stated that I needed the original copy from 14 yrs. ago the original form that was mailed to me when I started my business. The list of requirements to get out for work was given to me and I met all those requirements, it never said it had to be the original form that was mailed to me when I opened my business. She said that because I owned my own business that it was harder to get out to work. I am wanting to see if there is any way I can have the county pay for my arm as I no longer have insurance, as it lapsed while I was in jail and not able to get out to work and keep it paid.
