

Key Points:

- Mpox does not spread easily to others, and the risk of Mpox spreading widely throughout our community remains low.
- Getting <u>vaccinated</u> (<u>information on who should receive vaccine</u>), asking your healthcare provider <u>to test you</u> if you have <u>a rash</u> consistent with monkeypox, and <u>isolating</u> if infected continue to be important tools in reducing spread of the virus.
- Winnebago County Health Department is currently offering the JYNNEOS Mpox vaccine, by appointment only, to individuals at risk of infection based on the <u>Wisconsin Department of Health Services</u> prioritization. To make an appointment or see if you are eligible, call 920-232-3026 or email wchd.cd@winnebagocountywi.gov.
