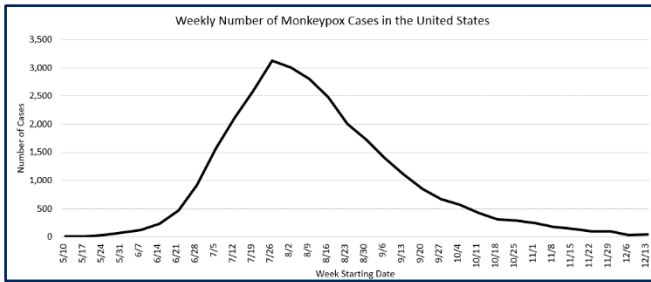

Key Points:

- Mpox does not spread easily to others, and the risk of Mpox spreading widely throughout our community remains low.
- Getting [vaccinated](#) ([information on who should receive vaccine](#)), asking your healthcare provider [to test you](#) if you have [a rash](#) consistent with monkeypox, and [isolating](#) if infected continue to be important tools in reducing spread of the virus.
- Winnebago County Health Department is currently offering the JYNNEOS Mpox vaccine, by appointment only, to individuals at risk of infection based on the [Wisconsin Department of Health Services](#) prioritization. To make an appointment or see if you are eligible, call 920-232-3026 or email wchd.cd@winnebagocountywi.gov.
