- This month, there has been a confirmed case of measles in southeast Wisconsin.
- Measles is a Category 1 Reportable Disease and suspected/confirmed cases must be immediately reported to the local health department.

Spotlight: RSV

- An RSV immunization is available for certain populations.

Spotlight: Current Drug Shortages Affecting Treatment of Syphilis and Gonorrhea

- A recent shortage of penicillin G benzathine (syphilis treatment) and Gentamicin (gonorrhea treatment) could create treatment challenges.

Spotlight: Congenital Syphilis in Wisconsin

- In recent years there has been an increase in congenital syphilis cases in Wisconsin.
- All pregnant patients should be screened for syphilis <u>at least three</u> times during pregnancy.
