- Test. Treat. Isolate.
 - PCR testing is the preferred testing method completed within 21 days of cough onset.

 - Isolate symptomatic patients for 5 days of antibiotic therapy.

Spotlight: Ciprofloxacin-Resistant Meningococcal Disease

- WI is experiencing an increase in meningococcal disease cases with 6 cases reported in 2024. At least 2 cases have been resistant to ciprofloxacin.
- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) encourages clinicians to be alert for signs and symptoms of meningitis and bacteremia. Health care providers should suspect meningococcal disease in ill and rapidly worsening patients.
- Health care providers should not prescribe ciprofloxacin to prevent meningococcal disease in close contacts of people with invasive meningococcal disease. Instead, providers should prescribe rifampin or ceftriaxone in accordance with <u>CDC</u> recommended chemoprophylaxis regimens for high-risk contacts.
