

# Together, We Can Prevent Lead Exposure!



**Lead is toxic, especially in young children. Even low levels of lead can result in damage to the brain, developmental delays and learning disabilities.**



## **GET YOUR CHILD TESTED FOR LEAD**

Children who are lead-poisoned may not act sick. **Contact your healthcare provider and ask for a lead test. If you do not have insurance, contact Winnebago County Public Health for a free lead screening.**



## **TAKE ACTION**

Lead-based paint found in older homes is the most common cause of lead poisoning. Winnebago County Public Health's Lead Safe Homes Program removes lead hazards from homes and rental properties, often at no cost. **If your home was built before 1978, and children or pregnant people live in it or visit, contact us to see if you're eligible for testing and removal of lead in your home.**
