Pancake breakfasts have become a popular way for the community to connect with squadron members. The speaker series has been a huge highlight featuring veterans and experts who share their knowledge and experiences with military history.

While engaging with the community is the heart of Squadron 32's mission, they also play a crucial role in supporting EAA Warbirds of America. By educating the general public about military history, they help preserve the legacy of Warbirds and the men and women who flew them.

Membership dues are \$25.00 / year, and they love to see new faces join their meetings. There are only (12) Squadrons in the United States, and one in Buenos Aires.

Another Way To Donate Financially

We here at MVMEC are continuing to advance into the area of online technology. Our newest addition is the use of QR codes to enable supporters to use their phones to donate monies to our organization. All a donor needs to do is scan the code and tap the link that comes up. They will be taken to a page where they will enter their donation amount and proceed to checkout. At checkout they will have the option to express checkout using Apple or Google pay (depending on them having one of those apps installed on their phone) or they can enter their credit card information and finish the donation. All transactions are secured through the Square Retail system, which the museum currently uses for cash register sales at the Gift Shop. We will be deploying these QR codes soon. Watch for them!

COLLECTIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE



Looking back over the last several years, we have made amazing progress with the collection, especially at the county garage storage facility. At one point, we had three pallets of obsolete fluorescent lights, forty old mercury vapor lights, a pallet of five-gallon paint buckets, several old tires, batteries, junk vehicle parts, old building materials, etc. These have been cleaned out for the most part. The collections committee, along with the exhibits committee, has gone through an estimated five thousand uniforms in storage and picked out most of the deteriorated and unusable uniforms, etc. We are still working on the multiple boxes of paperwork, some of which contain paperwork not even related to the museum that we are paying storage on. I believe we are finally getting the collection down to a manageable amount of better-quality artifacts which will be a great help should we ever lose our storage at the county garage and have to move.

EAGLE SCOUT PRESENTATION



WE BUILD, WE FIGHT! HAPPY BIRTHDAY, SEABEES!

The Father of the Seabees, Rear Adm Ben Moreell, came up with this motto to show the world what this group can do. Which leads to another motto widely accepted, "Can Do". Because of the need for camps, airfields and other structures around the world, the Seabees were formally established in March 1942. They help build some of the first structures at the South Pole.

How did the name "Seabees" come about? It is a clever way to shorten the name of this group of Navy men and women of the **C**onstruction **B**attalion. They can and do build anything anywhere. The Seabees have built bases, airfields, roads, bridges and performed underwater construction, all while providing protection for themselves and those around them. Anything the military needs structurally, the Seabees are there. They are also known for their humanitarian work around the world.



FOUR CHAPLAIN'S DAY

Heroes come in all manners, shapes and forms. It so happens that on February 3, 1943, there were four chaplains aboard the USAT Dorchester. The ship left New York eleven days prior as part of a convoy of three ships and about 900 people. A German submarine fired a torpedo at the ship killing hundreds.

The four chaplains offered what they could right down to their life jackets knowing their own fate. George Fox (Methodist), Rabbi Alexander Goode (Jewish), Rev Clark Poling (Dutch Reformed) and Fr. John Washington (Catholic) were the brave individuals who sacrificed their lives.

Honoring these four religious church leaders is one way of promoting interfaith unity and spirit of service among individuals, so in 1998 the Senate named February 3 as Four Chaplain's Day.
