

Sexual Behaviors and Winnebago County High School Students

What are the issues?

- **20.6%** of students reported it was important to them to delay having sexual intercourse until they were married.
- **34.1%** of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse.
- **7.1%** of students reported that they had sexual intercourse for the first time before or at the age of 13.
- **12.6%** of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse with 3 or more people in their lifetime.
- **2.9 %** of students reported that they have had sexual intercourse with 2 or more people in the past 3 months.
- **8.0%** of students reported drinking alcohol or using drugs before the last time they had sexual intercourse.
- **88.9%** of students report they have been taught about HIV/AIDS in school

K-12 skill-based health education addressing risk reduction and abstinence
Early and ongoing parental involvement
School engagement
Education on social norms
Comprehensive HIV/AIDS policies
Evidence-based sexual risk behavior prevention programs
Education on the impact of alcohol and drug use
Developing youth assets
Culturally appropriate teaching strategies
Trained staff
Safe school climate
